STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.  
BY-LAW NO. 1951.—FOR THE SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER  
FOR IRRIGATION.—SALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY  
DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in Sale Irrigation and Water Supply District.

2. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by and fixed under the supervision of the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the water bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water six inches in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be and is hereby deemed to be a volume of water six inches in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of all lands during the period from the 1st day of July, 1927, to the 31st day of October, 1927, shall be Ten shillings for each and every acre-foot of water supplied.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of November, 1927, to the 30th day of April, 1928, and during the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1928) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law making the irrigation charge for any such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any lands during any such period, the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

7. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of November, 1927, to the 30th day of April, 1928, and during the period from the 1st day of October in every year (beginning with the year 1928) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year, shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

8. The charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of all lands during the period from the 1st day of May to the 30th day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1928), shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed by the By-law making an irrigation charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned during the last preceding period ending the 30th day of April in each year.

9. An acre-foot of water shall be and is for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

10. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the water bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

11. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a water right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission at Maffra fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

12. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

13. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

14. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the water bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

FOR IRRIGATION.—FISH POINT IRRIGATION AND WATER

All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked; but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated, as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked, prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion.

3. All water supplied for irrigation from the works of the Commission shall be paid for by measure; all gauges or appliances for measurement shall be of a form and pattern approved by the Commission, and shall be constructed by, and fixed under the supervision of, the Commission; and all quantities of water supplied shall be computed by the water bailiff or such other officer as may be appointed by the Commission for that purpose.

4. In the absence of any specific means of measurement the quantity of water supplied shall be ascertained by accounting a watering as being a volume of water six inches in depth over any area watered, and for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge a watering shall mean the application of water to land for the purpose of irrigation, and a watering shall be, and is hereby deemed to be, a volume of water six inches in depth over any area watered.

5. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1927) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as set out in the By-law, making the irrigation charge for such period, and if a supply is obtained in excess of any water rights apportioned to any lands during such period the charge for such excess shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed in respect of the water apportioned to the lands as rights.

6. The charge for the supply of water for irrigation of lands other than those to which water rights have been apportioned during the period from the 1st day of September in every year (beginning with the year 1927) to the 30th day of April in each succeeding year shall be as agreed upon between the Commission and the persons requiring the water.

7. The charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of all lands during the period from the 1st day of May to the 31st day of August in every year (beginning with the year 1928), shall be at the same rate of payment per unit of volume as that imposed by the By-law making an irrigation charge for the supply of water for the irrigation of lands to which water rights have been apportioned during the last preceding period ending the 30th day of April in each year.

8. An acre foot of water shall be, and is, for the purposes of this By-law and any By-law making an irrigation charge, deemed to be such quantity of water as would cover an area of one acre to a depth of one foot.

9. Applications for the supply of water for irrigation shall be made in writing to the water bailiff in charge of that portion of the district in which the land to be irrigated is situated, or to such other officer as may be authorized by the Commission to receive applications.

10. Charges for water supplied for irrigation, other than water supplied under a water right, shall be payable at the office of the Commission, at Kerang, fourteen days after the date such water is supplied.

11. Such person or persons as the Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said charges.

12. All persons taking water from the works of the Commission shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Commission may direct.

13. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be operated only by the water bailiffs of the district, or such other officers as may be authorized by the Commission.

For every boiler used to generate steam for milling or other industrial purposes, a charge of Ten pounds shall be made, the Council reserving the right to discontinue the supply when necessary to conserve a domestic supply for householders.

No person shall attach a hose to any tap or pipe for the purpose of watering gardens. Any person so using water without written permission from the Council will be liable to be prosecuted.

The above rates shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1928, and such person as the Bet Bet Shire Council may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the above said rates.

5. Fixed steam-boilers, exceeding two horse-power, £3 per annum; and portable steam-boilers, exceeding two horse-power, £2 10s. per annum.

6. Steam-boilers used only in the manufacture of sausage meat, at the rate of £1 10s. per annum.

7. Water from the stand-pipe, for every load of 400 gallons or less, 3d. per load.

8. On all tenements (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, a charge of 6s. per annum.

9. The rate shall be payable half-yearly in advance, namely, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1928, and the charges for the supply of water shall also be payable in like manner, or as may be demanded in the case of the service being by meter.

10. Such person or persons as the Council may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

## WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT OF THE CLUNES BOROUGH COUNCIL.

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds and not exceeding Eighty pounds the sum of Two shillings in the pound, and One shilling in the pound on the value exceeding Eighty pounds.

2. On every house or tenement below the annual value of Twenty pounds the sum of Two pounds per annum shall be charged.

3. On unoccupied land or lands on which no tenements are erected and water laid on the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value shall be charged, minimum, Fifteen shillings per annum.

4. On unoccupied land on which no water is laid on or tenement thereon the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the annual value.

5. For water supplied to factories or trade premises using steam, the following amounts shall be charged in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value, viz., One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons per rated horse-power of the boiler or boilers up to 20 horse-power, on every horse-power in excess of 20, the sum of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, minimum, 10,000 gallons per horse-power in excess of 20.

6. For water supplied for irrigation for market gardeners and orchards, the following charges shall be paid in addition to the amount assessed on the annual value of the land:—

For one half-inch service, £2 per acre; minimum, 20s.

For two half-inch services, £3 per acre; minimum, 25s.

For every additional half-inch service, £1 10s. per acre.

For one three-quarter-inch service, £3 per acre; minimum, 25s.

For two three-quarter-inch services, £4 per acre; minimum, 40s.

For every additional three-quarter-inch service, £2 per acre.

Not more than two services per acre are to be allowed unless by written consent of the Commissioners, who shall have regard to the size and locality of the main to supply the extra services.

7. For water supplied to troughs in the streets of the borough, Eighteen shillings per annum in addition to the amount charged for domestic purposes.

8. For water supplied to Government Departments—

Railways, One shilling per 1,000 gallons by meter.

Post Office, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 120,000 gallons per annum.

Police Station, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 120,000 gallons per annum.

State School, One shilling per 1,000 gallons; minimum, 80,000 gallons per annum.

9. Provided the occupier or owner provides a suitable iron trough with ball-cock and locked cover, the following charges per annum shall be paid for stock purposes in addition to the amount charged on the annual value of the land:—

On land not exceeding 20 acres—Twelve shillings and sixpence.

On land above 20 and not exceeding 50 acres—Eighteen shillings.

On land above 50 and not exceeding 75 acres—Twenty-five shillings.

On land above 75 and not exceeding 100 acres—Thirty shillings.

On land above 100 acres—Forty shillings.

The rates and charges shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1928, at the Town Hall, Clunes, and if not paid within six months from due date will bear interest at the rate of six per cent, per annum.

The annual value of lands and tenements shall mean the net annual value of the properties as appearing in the valuation or rate-books of the Borough of Clunes adopted for the year ending 30th September, 1928.

Such person as shall be appointed from time to time for that purpose by the Commissioners is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect, and sue for the recovery of the rates and charges made.

## LAWLOIT WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928 IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF KANIVA.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Lawloit Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rate and charges are those which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Kaniva, as such district has been proclaimed and defined:—

1. *Minimum.*—Every vacant allotment of land whether occupied or otherwise, and being on the pipe line, 15s. per annum.

Every vacant allotment of land within the Waterworks District and not being on the pipe line, 5s. per annum.

For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Sixteen pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Three pounds sterling per annum.

2. *On Valuation Above Minimum.*—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of Sixteen pounds sterling, or more than Sixteen pounds annual value, an amount equal to 3s. 9d. in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

3. *Special Rates.*—For all tenements whether occupied or otherwise in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements whether occupied or otherwise are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements whether occupied or otherwise are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rate.

4. *Minimum Water Charge—Excess Meter Charge.*—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per One thousand gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of Three shillings per One thousand gallons for anything over that quantity.

5. *Public Institutions and Others.*—Water supplied to all Government Departments, charitable or other institutions and religious denominations, shall be by measure at Three shillings and fourpence per One thousand gallons, or by special agreement.

6. *Irrigation.*—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

7. *Water Rate Outside Trust's Area.*—Such occupiers and owners of tenements not within the Trust's area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per One thousand gallons.

8. *Water Troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 4 000 gallons per annum at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons.

9. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean the Lawloit Waterworks Trust—Urban District of Kaniva.

10. *Excess Payments.*—Where water meters are affixed, the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

11. *Period of Rate.*—That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year commencing on the first day of January, 1928, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1928, and shall be payable in one moiety due and payable on the first day of January, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

## Rating By-law for 1928.

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house and tenement of up to Ten (10) pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One (1) pound sterling.

2. For every house and tenement of Ten (10) pounds and over annual municipal value, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied piece of allotment of land, a rate of Two (2) shillings in the pound sterling shall be paid up to One (1) pound sterling maximum.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes, it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1928, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

## MORWELL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1928.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1928 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Morwell Waterworks Trust, which district has for the purposes of the Water Acts been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid on the net annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Morwell, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound and ten shillings (£1 10s.).

2. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land the municipal value of which does not exceed Seven pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings (7s.). When such value is over Seven pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every public watertrough, the sum of One pound (£1).

4. For every livery, coach, and carrier's stables, the sum of Five shillings per annum for the first stall, and Five shillings per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds and for stabling, 6 feet is to be considered one stall.

5. When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes, the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the rate named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons, provided that the charge so calculated shall not be less than the rate which would be payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

7. The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may, by such notice, require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.

8. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such special provision as it may deem necessary.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable on the 1st day of January, 1928.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928, No. 43.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupier or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District according to the municipal valuation of such property. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each tenement shall be Two pounds ten shillings. For all tenements and allotments within the standpipe area and not supplied with water the minimum rate shall be One pound five shillings. For all tenements and allotments not within the standpipe area and not supplied with water the minimum rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

2. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons shall (except in cases of special agreement within the Trust) be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings.

3. For all water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust area, the charge shall (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the minimum charge by the Trust. Such minimum charge shall be computed at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling, according to the municipal valuations of the property so supplied. For all water supplied in excess of such quantity, the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings.

4. Such rates and charges, other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1928, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1928.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

## NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

1. *Minimum*.—Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eight pounds sterling annual value, the sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. *Minimum*.—For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eight pounds sterling value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. *On Valuation above Minimum*.—For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Eight pounds sterling or more than Eight pounds sterling value, an amount equal to Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the valuation.

4. *Special Rates*.—For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district situated otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by the reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any standpipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenement or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such standpipe and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

5. *Minimum Meter Charge*.—Excess Meter Charge.—Such owners as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. *Public Institutions and Others*.—Water supplied to the Government Departments, charitable or other institutions, and religious denominations shall be, by measure, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.

7. *Irrigation*.—Water supplied exclusively for irrigation purposes to be paid for by measure, in accordance with the charges fixed by this By-law.

8. *Water Rate outside Trust's Area*.—Such occupiers or owners of tenements not within the Trust's area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. *Water-troughs*.—Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 8,000 gallons per annum, at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

10. *Interpretation Clause*.—In the construction of this By-law the word "Trust" shall mean Nhill Waterworks Trust, and "he" shall also mean "she."

11. *Excess Payments*.—Where water meters are affixed, the excess payments shall be made at the end of each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

12. *Period of Rate*.—That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1928, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1928, and shall be payable in one moiety, in advance, on the first day of January, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rates.

A By-law determining the rate which the occupiers and owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District of the aforesaid Trust, that is to say, in regard to

houses and tenements fronting any street in which the pipes of the Trust are laid, and which houses and tenements, if not in such streets, are supplied with water by the reticulation of such pipes.

1. A rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the net annual value of all rateable property of and above Twenty-six pounds (£26) sterling.

2. A minimum rate of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) sterling for such properties valued at a net annual value of less than Twenty six pounds (£26).

For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling on the net annual value of such rateable property over Ten pounds (£10), provided that no such allotment shall pay less than One pound (£1) sterling.

4. For every water trough a charge of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum maximum amount of water for each trough, 30,000 gallons.

5. For every steam boiler, a charge of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) sterling per annum for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for every load of two hundred (200) gallons or under, a charge of Two shillings (2s.) to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling (1s.) for every thousand (1,000) gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water) shall be:—If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling (1s.) per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

9. Such before-mentioned rates and charges will be based on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Orbost for the time being, and (except for stand-pipe and hydrant water) shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1928.

10. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Orbost Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(5) Water supplied to the Government Department, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District, and those being supplied off rising main, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

(6) The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1928.

(7) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be—Under Seven pounds, Seven shillings and sixpence; over Seven pounds, the rate shall be One shilling in the pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

5. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.

Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the assessed rate for the half year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons or such price as may be specifically agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 40,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to engines for cutting firewood to be charged at rate of £8 per annum for each engine.

8. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1928.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

5. The said rate and charges shall be payable in two equal portions, the first on the first day of January and the second on the first day of July, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners shall appoint shall be authorized to receive and demand the rate.

The following are the rates which the occupiers or owners of lands or tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses and tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation shall be paid.

2. For every house or tenement of Seventeen pounds or under municipal value a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds per annum, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes and being within one-quarter of a mile from any main or stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half the above-mentioned rate and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such main or stand-pipe, and within half a mile, one-fourth the before-mentioned rate.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the water rate paid on such lands and tenements. All excess water supplied by measure by the Trust shall be charged at the rate of Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

6. Such owners or occupiers of lands or tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam engines, or stock who are supplied by the Trust with water shall if the Commissioners think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using, such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January and not later than the thirtieth day of June, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (7) of section 3 of the *Electoral (Absent Voters) Act 1927 (No. 3525)*, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Electoral (Absent Voters) Regulations 1927*.

2. In these Regulations—

“Act” means the *Electoral (Absent Voters) Act 1927*;

“District” means Electoral District: any reference to a form shall be a reference to the form in the schedule hereto; and any duty prescribed for a Deputy Returning Officer for any District may be performed by the Returning Officer for that District.

3. The exercise of the right of voting at a polling place as an absent voter is dependent upon the arrangements at the polling place, at which the elector claims to vote as an absent voter, being such as to enable the vote to be recorded without interference with the rights of the electors enrolled for the subdivision for which the polling place is appointed.

4. The declaration of an absent voter pursuant to section 3 (4) (a) of the Act shall be in accordance with Form 100, and shall be printed on an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer for the District for which the elector declares that he is enrolled.

5. Before any person makes any declaration for absent voting the Deputy Returning Officer shall warn him that if he personates any elector for the purpose of voting, or knowingly makes a false declaration, he will be guilty of a misdemeanour.

6. The ballot-paper of an absent voter shall be in accordance with Form 101, provided that the names of the candidates and the name of the district may be either printed or written thereon, and shall be marked, folded, and returned in strict accordance with the directions printed at the foot thereof.

7. Before issuing an absent voter's ballot-paper the Deputy Returning Officer shall—

(a) on the front thereof initial the ballot-paper in the space provided for the purpose, and if not already printed thereon write in the name of the district for which the elector declares he is enrolled, and the surnames and Christian names of all the candidates for that district, and, if the surnames and Christian names of two or more candidates are the same, shall distinguish them by the addition of their residences and occupations; and

(b) on the back thereof insert the name of the district and the name of the polling place where the vote is polled, and the number corresponding with the progressive number recorded by the Deputy Returning Officer in accordance with Regulation 10.

8. (1) When a claim of any person to vote as an absent voter has been rejected, and such person alleges, pursuant to section 3 (5) of the Act, that his claim to vote should not be rejected, such person shall be permitted to vote on making a declaration in accordance with Form 102, setting out the grounds of his allegation.

(2) The said declaration may be printed on the back of an envelope addressed to the Returning Officer for the district in respect of which the elector claims to vote or may be printed on a separate form and securely attached by gum or other adhesive substance to such envelope and shall be used in substitution of the declaration prescribed by Regulation 4.

9. If any elector who claims to vote as an absent voter satisfies the Deputy Returning Officer that he is blind or that his sight is so impaired, or that he is so physically incapable that he is unable to vote without assistance, or that he is unable to read or write, the Deputy Returning Officer, at the request of such voter, and for him, and in the presence of a witness if so desired by such voter, shall—

(a) fill in the form of declaration with the required particulars relating to the enrolment of the elector, as requested by such elector;

(b) read over to the elector the form of declaration;

(c) require the elector to sign the form of declaration—

(i) in his own handwriting if he is able to do so; or

(ii) with his mark as his personal signature if he is unable to sign his name in his own handwriting;

(d) cause the signature of the elector, if made by means of a mark, to be witnessed;

(e) complete and attest the declaration;

(f) mark and fold the ballot-paper for the elector;

(g) enclose the ballot-paper in the envelope bearing the absent voter's declaration; and

(h) securely fasten the envelope and deposit it in the ballot-box.

10. The Deputy Returning Officer shall make a record of the full name of each elector who has voted at his polling place as an absent voter, together with the name of the district and subdivision for which the elector declares that he is enrolled, as indicated on the form of declaration, number each entry consecutively, commencing with number 1, and at the close of the poll shall forward the record duly certified to the Returning Officer for the district in respect of which the Deputy Returning Officer is appointed.

11. The Returning Officer, on receipt of the records of absent voters forwarded to him by the Deputy Returning Officers pursuant to Regulation 10, shall compile extracts from such records (repeating exactly the full particulars as set out in such records) in respect of each separate district, and forthwith transmit the said extracts to the respective Returning Officers for such districts.

12. Immediately after the close of the poll the Deputy Returning Officer who is authorized under the provisions of *The Constitution Act Amendment Acts* to open the ballot-box, shall, without opening any envelopes containing absent votes—

(a) place in a separate parcel the envelopes addressed to the Returning Officer for each district for which the electors declared that they were enrolled; indorse on each parcel the total number of envelopes contained therein, and add his signature and the date;

(b) forthwith transmit the parcel by registered post to the Returning Officer for each such District:

provided that the parcel in respect of the district for which the Deputy Returning Officer is appointed may be transmitted to the Returning Officer for that district, together with the sealed parcels transmitted pursuant to section 259 of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*, or by any such other safe and expeditious means as may be directed by the Returning Officer for that district; and

(c) immediately advise, by telegraph or by such other expeditious means as may be available, each Returning Officer concerned of the total number of envelopes bearing absent voters' declarations so forwarded to him.

13. Upon the receipt by a Returning Officer of all envelopes containing absent votes, the Returning Officer shall, in the presence of the scrutineers present and poll clerk (if any), but of no other person, deal with the said envelopes and ballot-papers as follows:—

(a) produce all envelopes containing absent voters' ballot-papers and check the envelopes with the extracts of records of absent voters received by him pursuant to Regulation 11;

(b) place in one parcel the unopened envelopes bearing the duly signed and attested declarations of those persons who he is satisfied are enrolled for and entitled to vote in respect of his district, accept for further scrutiny the ballot-papers contained therein and place a mark opposite the name of each of such persons, on a certified copy of the roll to be used by him for the purposes of the scrutiny;

(c) place in another parcel the unopened envelopes bearing the declarations of those persons who he is satisfied are not enrolled or are not entitled to vote in respect of his district, or whose declarations are not duly signed and attested, fasten and seal the parcel, endorse thereon the words “Absent voters' ballot-papers rejected at the preliminary scrutiny”, and add the name of his district, his signature, and the date:

Provided that an absent voter's ballot-paper shall not be rejected at the preliminary scrutiny by reason only of the fact that—

(i) the Deputy Returning Officer has omitted to attest the declaration of the elector, if before the declaration of the poll the Deputy Returning Officer certifies that the omission was due to inadvertence and that the declaration was as a matter of fact duly signed in such Deputy Returning Officer's presence; and

(ii) there is an omission or incorrect or insufficient description or misdescription in respect of any of the particulars required by law to be contained therein if the Returning Officer is satisfied that the voter is entitled to an absent vote;

(d) place the envelopes containing the ballot-papers which he has decided to accept for further scrutiny before him on a table in such a manner that the face only of each envelope bearing the address of the Returning Officer shall be visible;

- (e) without further examining the declaration of any voter, or permitting any other person to do so, withdraw from the envelope each ballot-paper contained therein, and without inspecting or unfolding such ballot-paper, or allowing any other person to do so, forthwith deposit the folded ballot-paper in a locked and sealed ballot-box for further scrutiny; and

- (f) place the envelopes in a parcel endorsed with the words, "envelopes bearing absent voters' declarations from which ballot-papers have been withdrawn for further scrutiny", fasten the parcel, add the name of the district, his signature, and the date.

14. At the further scrutiny the Returning Officer shall open the ballot-box referred to in Regulation 13 (e), examine the absent voters' ballot-papers contained therein, reject all informal ballot-papers, and count the first-preference votes given for each candidate on all unrejected ballot-papers.

15. (a) The provisions of The Constitution Act Amendment Acts in regard to the rejection of invalid ballot-papers shall apply to absent voters' ballot-papers.

(b) An absent voter's ballot-paper shall not be rejected as invalid merely because the surname only of any candidate has been written thereon if no other candidate has the same surname, or of the entry of a wrong Christian name or address, or occupation, or of any mistake in spelling, where there is no doubt as to the identity of the candidate.

(c) An absent voter's ballot-paper shall not be rejected as informal merely because of a formal defect therein through the name of the wrong district appearing thereon, or the omission of the name of the district, if the name of the district for which the elector is enrolled appears in the declaration of the elector.

16. The Returning Officer shall enclose all ballot-papers, rolls, envelopes, and records relating to absent voting in the sealed parcels specified in section 281 of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1915*; provided that—

- (a) the ballot-papers admitted for further scrutiny in accordance with Regulation 13 (e) shall be placed in the sealed parcel of "used ballot-papers";
- (b) the ballot-papers rejected at the preliminary scrutiny in accordance with Regulation 13 (c) shall be placed in the sealed parcel of "set aside ballot-papers"; and
- (c) all rolls, envelopes, records, and other papers shall be placed in the sealed parcel of "rolls, books, or other papers".

# ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF MELTON.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Exford-road, in the Shire of Melton (declared to be a developmental road under the Developmental Roads Act, which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd January, 1924, on page 178) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board, in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said first cited Act, has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

All that piece of land in the Parish of Djerriwarrh, the boundaries of which are as follow:—Commencing at an angle in the eastern boundary of the existing road through allotment C, section 4, of the said parish, distant 350 deg. 19 min. 101.2 links from the junction of the said road boundary with the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence by lines bearing respectively 269 deg. 52 min. 82.4 links; 358 deg. 50 min. 549 links; and 170 deg. 19 min. 556.6 links to the point of commencement, which said piece of land is particularly delineated and shown coloured red on survey plan No. 2014, lodged in the office of the Country Roads Board.
