NOTICE TO CLERKS OF PETTY SESSIONS.

RETURNS OF CONVICTIONS UNDER THE MOTOR CAR ACT 1915.

THE Chief Commissioner of Police has brought under notice the great difficulty caused in compiling and keeping correct records in the Motor Registration Office, owing to the fact that full particulars as to the names and addresses of offenders convicted under the above Act, together with the numbers of the licences of such offenders, are not in all cases inserted in the returns of such convictions furnished pursuant to Circular Memorandum No. 407 of the 3rd July, 1925.

Strict compliance on the part of clerks of petty sessions with the requirement of the circular memorandum is therefore enjoined, and a serious view will be taken of any cases of non-compliance that may be brought under notice.

The long wood to be not less than nine inches nor more than eighteen inches in any diameter. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

4. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

5. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

6. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between stacks for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply.

7. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the article so rejected or returned.

8. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

10. If the board shall decide that the firewood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 4.

11. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such firewood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 4.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mule, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 1.

PREVENTION OF THE WASTE AND UNDUE CONSUMPTION OF WATER.

THE Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), pursuant to and under the powers given by the Water Act 1915 and under every other power enabling the Trust in that behalf, doth hereby, for the prevention of the waste and undue consumption of water supplied from any part of the works of the Trust make the following By-law:—

Watering of Gardens.

Owing to the danger of shortage of water for domestic purposes in the months of December, January, and February, due to the waste and undue consumption of water caused by watering gardens, the watering of gardens by persons supplied with water by the Trust (hereinafter called "consumers") is regulated as follows:—

1. In the months of December, January, and February, watering of gardens by consumers is prohibited between the hours of six o'clock and nine o'clock in the forenoon and between the hours of five o'clock and seven o'clock in the afternoon on any day in the said months.

2. For the purposes of the following clauses the district supplied with water by the Trust is divided into a Northern area and a Southern area divided by a line formed by Baillie-street, Horsham, commencing from the western boundary of the district and continuing along Baillie-street in an easterly direction to the eastern boundary thereof.

(a) In the Northern area watering of gardens by consumers is prohibited on each Monday, Wednesday, and Friday in the months of December, January, and February.

(b) In the Southern area watering of gardens by consumers is prohibited on each Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday in the months of December, January, and February.

Waste of Water.

3. Any person who shall wilfully or negligently allow water supplied by the Trust to run to waste shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.

Penalty.

4. Every person guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for the first breach thereof to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for each second or subsequent breach thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Trust the fourth day of October, 1927.

Second.—Tootgarook pre-emptive right, Crown allotments 43, 47, 51, 53, 13A, 13B, 12, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, section A, Parish of Wannaeue; Arthur's Seat pre-emptive right, Parish of Wannaeue; the whole of the foreshore reserve adjoining Port Phillip, in the Parish of Wannaeue.

Third.—The whole of the Village of Rosebud, in the Parish of Wannaeue.

Fourth.—The whole of the Township of Dromana, including the foreshore reserve and reserves for public purposes.

Fifth.—Crown allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, section 1, Parish of Kangerong; Crown allotment 5, section 3, Parish of Kangerong.

Sixth.—The whole of the land contained in lodged plans of subdivisions numbers 5041, 5066, and 5070, part of Jamieson's special survey, Parish of Kangerong.

Seventh.—Crown allotments 28, 29, 30, 31, 35, 37, 38, 39, Parish of Balnarring; the whole of the Township of Tulum, Parish of Balnarring.

Eighth.—Crown allotments 136, 137, 138, 139, Parish of Bittern.

Ninth.—The Township of Morradoo, Parish of Bittern; Crown allotments 130A, 130B, 131, 89, 88, 92, 93B, 93A, 87, 95A, 78, Parish of Bittern;

and, unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. Every proprietor and every occupier of any premises shall, once at least every seven days, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of the pan becoming less than 2½ inches below the brim of such pan, cause to be emptied or cleansed every pan in every pan closet on or belonging to such premises.

5. The Council of the said Shire of Flinders may at any time and from time to time license or authorize any person to remove night-soil from premises in the above-described area, and may at any time revoke such licence or authority.

6. No person shall remove any night-soil from any premises in the area set out in this By-law except the person duly licensed by the Council, and no proprietor or occupier shall permit any night-soil to be removed from such premises by any unlicensed or unauthorized person.

7. No person shall place any strops, rubbish, or ashes in any pan.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall provide in every pan closet a suitable deodorant or disinfectant and every proprietor or occupier shall see that the contents of every pan are sufficiently deodorized or disinfected.

9. On and after this By-law coming into operation, every closet on every premises in the prescribed area shall be furnished with a double pan service, to be provided by the said Council, under which, once in every seven days, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the daytime in a suitable conveyance, and a clean pan shall be left in its place. Should such removal not be sufficient to keep the level of the contents of the pan at least 2½ inches below the brim, then the proprietor or occupier of such premises shall notify the person licensed by the Council for the removal of night-soil that extra service is required; and such licensed person shall provide such extra service.

10. All pans shall be removed in a suitable conveyance, so constructed that the pans shall be properly covered from observation, and so as to prevent the escape therefrom of any noxious or offensive effluvia.

11. All night-soil when removed from the premises shall be disposed of in an efficient and approved manner at an approved depot and according to the regulations in force from time to time. After every pan has been emptied it shall be thoroughly washed and disinfected and drained according to the complete satisfaction of the Health Inspector.

12. The internal surface of every pan, before it is first used, shall be coated with well-heated tar, and such coating shall be renewed whenever deemed necessary by the Health Inspector.

13. The proprietor or occupier of every premises in the prescribed area shall maintain every pan closet on such premises in good repair and a cleanly condition.

14. The Health Inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

15. To provide for the proper removal of night-soil, the proprietor of every house or tenement shall pay to the Council such sum annually as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the Council for the emptying of each pan and removal of the night-soil. Such payment shall be for the cleansing of each pan once in each seven days, and if extra service is required every proprietor or occupier shall pay to the person authorized by the Council to receive such payment such sum for each additional cleansing of each pan as may be fixed from time to time by resolution of the Council. The annual charge shall be payable and paid by each proprietor of any premises in one payment in advance. The amount charged for extra service shall be paid at the time of such extra service. In the case of new service the proprietor shall pay to the Council the cost of the first pan supplied, and the Council will maintain at their own expense such pan. The amount in default in either case to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

16. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall, for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
