NIGERIA DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF ACT No. 3397.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of Nigeria (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the *Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1920* extends) for the enforcement within such part of Maintenance Orders made by Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intitled the *Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1925*, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare Nigeria to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purpose of the Act last referred to.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation issued on the 11th day of January, 1927, pursuant to section 11 of the *Electoral Districts Act 1926*, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of January, 1927, the several Electoral Districts of the Legislative Assembly, the boundaries of which were proclaimed on the 1st day of December, 1926, were divided into subdivisions as set out in the schedule thereto, with the names and boundaries specified: And whereas the boundaries of certain of the said subdivisions were incorrectly specified, and it is desirable to correct the said boundaries: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, under the powers in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the said *Electoral Districts Act 1926*, by and

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and any other powers hereunto enabling, the following rules are made and shall take effect as from the first day of March, 1927 :—

RULES OF PROCEDURE IN CIVIL PROCEEDINGS.

ORDER XI.

11. Where leave is given in a civil or commercial cause or matter to serve any writ or summons, originating summons, notice, or other document in any foreign country with which a Convention in that behalf has been or shall be made and extended to the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria, the following procedure shall, subject to any special provisions contained in the Convention, be adopted :—

- (1) The party bespeaking such service shall file in the Office of the Prothonotary a Request in the form set out in Form No. 1 hereto which form may be varied as may be necessary to meet the circumstances of the particular case in which it is used. Such Request shall state the medium through which it is desired the service shall be effected, i.e., whether (a) directly through the British Consul, or (b) through the foreign judicial authority, and shall be accompanied by the original document and a translation thereof in the language of the country in which service is to be effected certified by or on behalf of the person making the request and a copy of each for every person to be served and any further copies which the Convention may require, unless the service is required to be made on a British subject directly through the British Consul in which case the translation and copies thereof need not accompany the Request unless the Convention expressly requires that they should do so.
- (2) The documents to be served shall be sealed with the Seal of the Supreme Court for use out of the Jurisdiction and shall be forwarded by the Prothonotary to His Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria for transmission through the diplomatic channel to the foreign country.
- (3) An official certificate transmitted through the diplomatic channel by the foreign judicial authority, or by a British Consular authority, to the Victorian Court, establishing the fact and the date of the service of the document, shall be deemed to be sufficient proof of such service, and shall be filed of record as and be equivalent to an Affidavit of Service within the requirements of Rules of the Supreme Court in that behalf.
- (4) In cases where a Writ of Summons or notice thereof is served pursuant to this Rule, and an official certificate of such service is produced, no endorsement of Service under Order IX. Rule 15 shall be required.

12. Rule 11 shall not apply to nor render invalid or insufficient any mode of service in any foreign country with which a Convention has been or shall be made which is otherwise valid or sufficient according to Victorian procedure and which is not expressly excluded by the Convention made with such foreign country, and extended to the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria.

13. Where in any civil or commercial cause or matter pending before a Court or Tribunal in any foreign country with which a Convention in that behalf has been or shall be made and extended to the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria, a Request for service of any document on a person in the State of Victoria is received by the Prothonotary from the Consular or other authority of such country, the following procedure shall, subject to any special provisions contained in the Convention, be adopted :—

- (1) The service shall be effected by the delivery of the original or a copy of the document, as indicated in the Request and the copy of the translation, to the party or person to be served in person through the sheriff by the process server whom he may appoint or his authorized agent.
- (2) No Court fees shall be charged in respect of the service. The particulars of charges of the person employed to effect service shall be submitted to the Taxing Master of the Supreme Court who shall certify the amount properly payable in respect thereof.
- (3) The Prothonotary shall transmit to the Consular or other authority making the Request a Certificate establishing the fact and the date of the service in person, or indicating the reasons for which it has not been possible to effect it, and at the same time shall notify to the said Consular or other authority the amount of the charges certified under paragraph (2) hereof.

ORDER XXXVII.

6B. Where an order is made for the issue of a Request to examine a witness or witnesses in any foreign country with which a Convention in that behalf has been or shall be made and extended to the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria, the following procedure shall be adopted :—

- (1) The party obtaining such order shall file in the Prothonotary's Office an undertaking in the form No. 2 hereto which form may be varied as may be necessary to meet the circumstances of the particular case in which it is used.
- (2) Such undertaking shall be accompanied by—
 - (a) A Request in the Form No. 3 hereto with such variation as may be directed in the order for the issue thereof together with a translation of such request in the language of the country in which the same is to be executed.
 - (b) A copy of the interrogatories (if any) to accompany the Request and a translation thereof.
 - (c) A copy of the cross-interrogatories (if any), and a translation thereof.

6C. Where an order is made for the examination of a witness or witnesses before the British Consular authority in any foreign country with which a Convention in that behalf has been or shall be made and extended to the Commonwealth of Australia or the State of Victoria, such order shall be in the Form No. 4 hereto, which form of order may be varied as may be necessary to meet the circumstances of the particular case in which it is to be used.

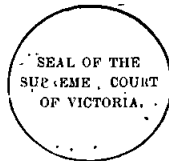

WARBURTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Warburton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1st. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust District, and such rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1927.

2nd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of £25 or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

3rd. On every house or tenement of an annual municipal value of under £25 sterling, the minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings (25s.).

4th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of Ten pounds sterling (£10), or upwards, the sum of One shilling (1s.) in the pound (£1).

5th. For every allotment or piece of land vacant of an annual municipal value of under Ten pounds sterling (£10), the minimum sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.).

6th. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Thirty shillings (30s.) per annum.

7th. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

8th. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement with the Trust.

9th. For water supplied for cricket or bowling grounds, the charge shall be subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10th. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11th. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

12th. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13th. For a temporary supply during the erection of new brick or concrete, or part brick or concrete, buildings, as may be decided by the Trust, minimum charge, Five shillings (5s.).

**TONGALA WATERWORKS TRUST.
ADDITIONAL LOAN OF £110.**

And whereas an application has been received from the Orbost Waterworks Trust praying that the councillors of the municipal district of the Shire of Orbost and the one other person appointed Commissioners of the said Trust shall cease to hold office as such Commissioners, and that they be succeeded by the municipal councillors for the Central Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Orbost and three other persons.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the provisions of the Water Acts, doth hereby declare that the persons holding office as Commissioners of the said Orbost Waterworks Trust, by virtue of their office as municipal councillors of the municipal district of the Shire of Orbost and the one other person appointed Commissioners of such Trust, shall from the date hereof cease to hold office as such Commissioners accordingly, and shall after such day be succeeded by the municipal councillors for the Central Riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Orbost and three other persons.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to the registration, and the renewal or the transfer of registration of packing sheds, and for other purposes, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

REGISTRATION OF PACKING SHEDS.

General.

1. The Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds which came into operation on the 10th day of February, 1926, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.
2. The following Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of February, 1927.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—
 "Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.
 "Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.
4. Applications for registration, or renewal, or transfer of registration of dried fruits packing sheds for the year 1927, which must be accompanied by a fee of £1, must be lodged with the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, before or on the 26th day of February, 1927, and be in the form prescribed in Schedule 1 to these Regulations.
5. Applications for registration must be made in the name of the owner or occupier of the packing shed, or where the owner or occupier carries on business under the name of a registered firm, or under the name of a public company, in the name of such firm or company.
6. Applications for transfer of registration of dried fruit packing sheds shall be made in the form prescribed in Schedule 2 to these Regulations.
7. Registration by the Board of any packing shed shall be subject to the provisions of the Dried Fruits Acts and to any conditions which may be imposed with respect to—
 (a) the suitability of the premises for the stemming, processing, grading, sorting, and packing of dried fruits;
 (b) the observance of the Regulations in force from time to time regarding the grading, packing, branding, &c., of dried fruits;
 (c) the inspection and regulation of packing sheds;
 (d) the payment of the contribution chargeable under the Dried Fruits Act, No. 3418;
 (e) the furnishing of returns from time to time regarding the quantities of fruit received by and forwarded from such packing shed.

REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for all matters and things necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying the Acts into effect, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

RETURNS TO BE FURNISHED BY PACKING SHEDS.

1. The Regulations regarding the furnishing of returns by Packing Sheds which came into operation on the 10th day of February, 1926, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.
2. The following Regulations shall come into force on the 15th day of February, 1927.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—
 "Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.
 "Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.
4. Every owner or occupier of or person in charge of a packing shed shall, from the date on which these Regulations come into force, furnish to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board not later than the Wednesday in each week—
 (a) a return of the quantities of dried fruits actually packed in such packing shed during the week ended each Saturday since the date of the last previous return.
 (b) a return of the quantities of dried fruits delivered by him from such packing shed during the week ended each Saturday since the date of the last previous return.
5. Such returns shall be furnished in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations, and the particulars contained therein shall be verified by statutory declaration when required.
6. Any person to whom this Regulation applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to make a return shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Dried Fruits Act 1924, No. 3380, it is provided that the Minister of Agriculture may require all or any persons having any dried fruits owned by them, or in their disposal, or under their control for the purposes of trade or sale to make returns of such dried fruits in such form, and within the time, and to the persons prescribed: And whereas the Minister of Agriculture, by public notice dated the fifteenth day of February, 1927, in the Government Gazette, and in three daily newspapers circulating within the State of Victoria, has required all persons not being growers of dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias, having in their disposal, or under their control, more than 5 tons of dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias at any time between the date of the said notice and the 31st December, 1927, to make returns of such dried fruits: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

REGISTRATION OF DRIED FRUIT DEALERS.

1. The Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, dated 10th February, 1926, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.
2. The following Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, and shall come into operation on and from the fifteenth day of February, 1927.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—
 "Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias.
 "Dealer" means any person not being a grower of dried fruits who sells in any one year whether on his own behalf or as agent for some other person more than 5 tons of dried fruits but does not include a person who sells only such dried fruits as he buys from dried fruit dealers who are registered as such with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board.
 "Persons" includes body of persons corporate or incorporate.
4. Every person who on the date on which these Regulations came into force was engaged in business as a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, on or before the twenty-sixth day of February, 1927.
5. Every person who, after the date on which these Regulations came into force, engages in the business of a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne. Such registration shall be made within seven days after the date on which he commences to engage in such business.
6. Every person to whom this Regulation applies shall apply for registration in the form prescribed in Schedule 1 to these Regulations, and shall furnish the particulars therein required.
7. Every person to whom this Regulation applies shall furnish to the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, in the form prescribed in Schedule 2 to these Regulations, returns relating to the dried fruits owned by them or in their disposal or under their control, whenever required by the Board. Such returns shall be verified by Statutory Declaration.
8. Any person to whom these Regulations applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to comply with the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

REGULATIONS IN CONNEXION WITH THE VOTE OF FOUR THOUSAND POUNDS (£4,000) FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES, UNDER THE CONTROL OF BOROUGH COUNCILS, TRUSTEES, COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT, ETC.

A SUM of Two thousand two hundred and fifty pounds (£2,250) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,750) shall be dealt with as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1926, and 31st December, 1926, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1927. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A," and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B."

2. The term "Locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purposes, between the 1st January, 1926, and 31st December, 1926, but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to 1st January, 1926.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1926 (*vide* form "A") and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds (£1,750) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park) or to the Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda.
