ISLE OF MAN DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE  
WITHIN THE MEANING OF ACT No. 3397.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of the Isle of Man (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom to which the *Imperial Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1920* extends) for the enforcement within such part of Maintenance Orders made by Courts within Victoria, do now, under the powers conferred by section 12 of an Act of the Victorian Parliament intituled the *Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Act 1925*, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby declare the Isle of Man to be a reciprocating State within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act last referred to.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

## BROADFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1927 WITHIN THE BROADFORD URBAN DISTRICT.

THE Commissioners of the Broadford Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements situated within the aforesaid Urban District and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1927, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be paid half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st day of January, and on the 1st day of July, 1927:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Seventeen pounds or under, according to the municipal value of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One pound ten shillings.

2. On every house or tenement above the value of Seventeen pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of such valuation.

3. On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land, the sum of Ten shillings.

4. The following shall be the charge payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per year, or a quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For a stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of 250 gallons or under, One shilling.
- (3) For each water-trough placed in the street outside business premises and provided with suitable ball tap, Twenty shillings.
- (4) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the event of there not being any contract, Five shillings per cent. on the amount charged and paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
- (5) All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid as agreed upon.
- (6) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the £1 sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Lorne Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for the year commencing 1st day of January, 1927, and ending 31st December, 1927.

2. The minimum rate to be paid annually by every occupier or owner of any house or tenement used wholly or partly as domiciles shall be £2.

3. On all allotments or pieces of land within the Waterworks District, and not rated under the foregoing clause, a minimum rate of Ten shillings shall be charged.

4. Such rates shall be payable in one moiety and shall be due and payable on the 1st day of January, 1927. Interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum from 1st January, 1927, shall be chargeable on any rate not paid on or before 30th September, 1927.

5. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Lorne Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the said rates.

## BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1927 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

No. 1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling-house is erected, of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

No. 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.

No. 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of Ten per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty-five pounds except where a meter is used.

No. 4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings shall be made.

No. 5. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds shall be made.

No. 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

No. 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

No. 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

No. 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance, on the first day of January, 1927.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

## RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, hereby make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the Trust:—

(1) For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Forty shillings.

(2) For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling; the minimum rate shall in no case be less than Forty shillings.

(3) For every unoccupied allotment of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate be less than Fifteen shillings be charged.

(4) For all the lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates; and for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile but within half a mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

(5) For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of £5 sterling, and all water used in excess of 95,000 gallons shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(6) All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be at the following rates:—30,000 gallons for the first Forty shillings of the assessed water rate, and for each additional Twenty shillings of assessed rate or portion thereof, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons. All excess water shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessments.

(7) Water supplied to the Government Department, religious denominations, public parks, bowling greens, and persons outside the Trust District, and those being supplied off rising main, shall be by measurement or special agreement.

(8) The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1927. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied, except water taken from High-street stand-pipe, when a charge of 1s. per load will be made and payable to person in charge thereof.

(9) Such person or persons as the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

(10) No meter shall be affixed until it has been examined and approved, and a certificate from the Board of Works, or some authorized person, be produced for inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being, that such meter is in proper order.

(11) No person, without having previously affixed a water-meter to his service-pipe, shall use for other than domestic purposes water supplied by the Trust. Domestic purposes shall not extend to the supply of water for horses or cows.

(12) Any person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give six days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust, and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

(13) Every meter shall be fixed truly level with connexions above the ground, approved by the Trust's supervising officer, which must, wherever practicable, be level with the ground, and within 3 feet of the building line of the property. Two wrought-iron bends must be affixed on either side of the meter or lead connexion used; the use of elbows will not be permitted.

(14) All service-pipe connexions to Trust mains must (when being renewed or newly installed) be made not less than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, and same to extend from the main to a point where meter is affixed, or 3 feet inside the property frontage line.

## WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1927 (NO. 13).

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law, viz.:—

## By-law No. 13.

The following are the rates and charges which occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1927 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District thereof:—

1. For every house and tenement up to £18 annual municipal value and under, the sum of £2 16s. (Two pounds sixteen shillings) per annum.

2. For every house and tenement of £19 annual value and upwards, an amount of Three shillings to the £1 upon the municipal value of such property.

3. Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-thirds rates.

4. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unoccupied or supplied with water from the works of the Trust of £7 (Seven pounds) annual municipal value and under, the amount of One pound and one shilling (£1 1s.) per annum.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land unsupplied with water from the works of the Trust of £7 (Seven pounds) annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Three shillings in £1 (One pound) upon the municipal value of such property.

6. Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and Government grounds and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement at Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, there shall be a charge for every 200 gallons or under the sum of Ninepence.

8. For a supply during the erection of new buildings, there shall be a charge of Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

9. Except as hereinbefore otherwise provided, the minimum quantity of water to be charged for where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rates which would be payable for the premises so supplied, and for such minimum quantity of water there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and for the water in excess of such minimum, there shall be a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon.

10. The fees to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound; renewals, Five shillings.

11. For every meter supplied there shall be a rental charge of Eight shillings per annum.

That the beforementioned rates and charges shall be payable yearly in advance, or in other cases as directed by the secretary, and shall be payable in one moiety. The payment shall be due on the 1st day of January, 1927, for the year ending 31st December, 1927, and after the 30th day of September, 1927, all rates not paid shall bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

In the construction of this By-law, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the word "Trust" shall mean the Winchelsea Waterworks Trust.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1927.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Rating By-law:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, a sum of Two pounds five shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, and not exceeding One hundred and seventy-eight pounds, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound.

3. For every house or tenement of annual municipal valuation of One hundred and seventy-eight pounds and over, a rate of Twenty pounds.

4. For every unoccupied allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of Two shillings and threepence in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment.

5. For every water-trough, a charge of One pound.

6. The Commissioners may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month after receipt of the notice beforementioned, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, provide at his own expense a meter.

7. Should any owner or occupier fail to provide a meter when required so to do, the Trust may provide one on hire, and shall charge such owner or occupier the rental of One shilling per month for hire of such meter.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the rate named in the preceding clauses hereof, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

9. The abovementioned rates and charges, except those mentioned in clauses seven (7) and eight (8), shall be payable in one sum yearly in advance on the 1st day of March, 1927.

10. The rates and charges mentioned in clauses seven (7) and eight (8) shall be payable on demand.

11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919* (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Building (Schools) Regulations 1927, shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette* and shall apply or have operation throughout the whole of Victoria. Citation.

2. All regulations heretofore made relating to matters herein provided for are hereby repealed. Repeal.

## PART I.—INTERPRETATION.

	4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
" Approved."	" Approved " means approved in writing by the Commission ; and
" Approval."	" Approval " has a corresponding interpretation.
" Bench."	" Bench " includes table.
" Boarding-school."	" Boarding-school " means any school at which five or more scholars are lodged or boarded for hire or reward, and includes every building used in connexion therewith, whether within the same curtilage or not.
" Class-room."	" Class-room " includes lecture-room, examination-room, studio, laboratory, and every experimental and applied science room.
" Commission."	" Commission " means the Commission of Public Health.
" Door."	" Door " includes gate ; and
" Doorway."	" Doorway " includes gateway.
" Inspector."	" Inspector " means any person authorized by the Commission to inspect schools.
" Laboratory."	" Laboratory " includes every experimental and applied science room and a studio.
" Main lighting wall."	" Main lighting wall " means the wall admitting daylight to the left side of the class when it is at work.
" Passage."	" Passage " includes passageway, corridor, vestibule and lobby.
" Proprietor."	" Proprietor " of a school includes the owner, the occupier, the manager, the trustees, the person by whose authority the school has been or is being or is intended to be erected or altered, or any person having the management or control thereof and also includes the headmaster or head teacher of such school.
" Scholar."	" Scholar " includes student and examinee.
" School."	" School " means any school (not being a State school referred to in Parts I., III., and IV. of the <i>Education Act</i> 1915), and includes buildings appurtenant thereto.
" The Act."	" The Act " means the <i>Health Act</i> 1919 (No. 3041) and any Act amending the same.

## APPLICATION.

Application of regulations.	5. These Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, shall apply to all schools within the meaning of the Act ; provided however that in the case of a school used as such at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations any regulation or part thereof may be waived, altered, modified or varied at the discretion of the Commission.
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## PART II.—APPLICATION FOR COMMISSION'S APPROVAL OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

Erection or alteration of a school. Application to Commission.	6. Whenever it is intended to erect, to alter, or to open any school the proprietor shall make application in writing to the Commission for its approval in the form set out in Schedule A to these Regulations, and such application shall be accompanied by the plans, sections, and specifications referred to in the said Schedule.
Approval of Commission.	7. No school shall be erected, altered or opened until the approval of the Commission has been obtained.

## PART III.—SITE.

Site.	8. No site for any new school shall be approved unless— (a) it is well drained by gravitation into a storm-water drain, channel, watercourse, or the sea ; (b) it is free from any accumulation of decomposing or decomposable organic or other unwholesome dangerous or offensive matter ; and (c) its situation in relation to buildings, factories, works, and dangerous or unwholesome conditions generally in the vicinity is suitable for the purposes of a school.
	9. The Commission may require the site of a new school building to be wholly or partially covered with a layer of mineral asphalt, concrete or other approved impervious material.
Provision for access of light.	10. Every new school shall be so situated in relation to the boundaries of adjoining properties that the distance of such boundaries from any wall of the school wherein is provided any opening or openings for lighting purposes shall nowhere be less than twice the height of the school as measured vertically from the ground surface adjacent to such wall to the level of the top wall plate of such school.

Provided that such distance may with approval be reduced.

## PART IV.—PLAYGROUND.

11. (1) In the case of a new school an area uncovered by building enclosure wall fences or other fixed objects of whatever description and equivalent to at least four times the aggregate area of the floor space of the school shall be provided as a playground for the use of the scholars.

(2) In the case of every school accommodating or intended to accommodate more than 50 scholars of different sexes, a separate playground for each sex shall be provided, and shall, wherever practicable, have a separate entrance from the road or street.

(3) Every playground shall be properly levelled, drained, and enclosed with a fence or wall.

Separate playgrounds and entrances thereto for sexes.

Levelling and draining.

Provided that the Commission may—

- (a) Exempt the proprietor from the obligation to provide a playground ;
- (b) Accept the provision of a playground of a smaller area than that prescribed by this regulation ; or
- (c) Allow the use of a flat roof as a playground.

Requirements as to playgrounds may be modified by Commission.

## PART V.—BUILDINGS.

## DIVISION 1.—CONSTRUCTION.

12. (1) Every school shall be substantially and properly constructed, be dry internally throughout, and kept in a good state of repair.

(2) No wooden building of more than one story or capable of accommodating in the aggregate more than 200 scholars shall be used as a school.

(3) Where a school consists of a building of more than one story approved provision shall be made for rendering the floors above the ground floor sound-proof as far as possible.

(4) Shingle roofs and the lining of walls or ceilings with scrim, hessian, canvas, or similar material, whether treated with chemicals or not, are hereby prohibited.

(5) No room shall be used for school purposes if situated above or below or immediately adjoining any compartment used as a basement, a kitchen, laundry, shop, store, or for a steam boiler, or for the storage of inflammable material unless separated from such compartment by fire-resisting construction.

(6) The introduction of needless projections or recesses facilitating collection of dust, whether on floors, walls, doors, windows, ventilators, or ceilings or furniture, shall be avoided.

(7) Every room used for school purposes shall be ceiled and every room ceiled at the level of the top wall-plate shall have walls at least 12 feet high from the floor surface to the ceiling immediately above, or if the room is ceiled to the rafters and collar beam the height shall be at least 11 feet from the floor surface to the level of the wall-plate and at least 14 feet to the ceiling across the collar-beam.

Provided that in every such case, as well as in that of a roof open to an apex, there shall be provided between the ceiling and the roof covering an insulating layer of approved material.

13. The sashes of all windows shall be so formed and arranged as to be openable, and shall be furnished with the necessary fittings for opening them and keeping them open to an extent affording a ventilating opening of an area equivalent to at least one-half of the glazed area of the window in each case. The means for opening the said sashes shall in each case be conveniently accessible from the interior of the room to which the window pertains.

14. The space between the under portions of any bath, sink, basin, or wash-trough and the floor of the compartment in which such bath, sink, basin, or wash-trough is situated shall not be enclosed.

15. Boiler rooms and compartments for reception of fuel and ashes shall be placed outside the main walls of the school building and be air-disconnected therefrom.

16. The height of a passage shall be not less than 10 feet. Its width shall be such as shall be determined by the Commission from a consideration of the positions and widths of the necessary exits thereto and therefrom, but shall in no case be less than 6 feet in clear measurement.

17. The materials and methods of construction employed, the methods of calculating and testing, and all work done in relation to the erection of any new school or alteration of any school shall, except when otherwise herein specifically set out or directed, be in accordance with the requirements of the Building Regulations 1924 as far as such requirements may be applicable.

## DIVISION 2.—STAIRWAYS.

Staircases  
and stairs;

18. (1) The proprietor shall cause all stairs required to give effect to the provisions of these Regulations to be placed wherever practicable at the sides or ends of the building and to be well removed from each other. Provided that in case of premises accommodating not more than twenty (20) boarding scholars where, in the opinion of the Commission, it is possible to provide a staircase in a central position, one so placed may be accepted. In such latter case such staircase and all landings, lobbies, and passageways from one flight to another shall be enclosed by walls of brickwork, masonry, cement concrete not less than 9 inches thick, reinforced concrete not less than 4 inches thick or other approved material and the staircase shall be ceiled with fire-resisting material.

(2) All stairs shall have solid square or spandrel steps supported at both ends on brickwork, masonry, or cement concrete, the steps and landing being of approved thickness, and shall be constructed in straight flights without winders, or 'dancers, and shall have half-space or quarter-space landings not less than 3 feet long in the going, as the case may require, at intervals equal wherever practicable, but in no case of more than 15 rises nor fewer than 4 rises, treads being of uniform dimensions, in no case less than 11 inches in the going, measured clear of any nosing or projection, and rises being of uniform dimensions, but in no case more than 6 inches in height. No nosing shall project more than  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches from the riser.

(3) All spandrel steps for stairways not exceeding 3 ft. 4 in. wide shall not be less than 3 inches thick at the smallest part; for stairways exceeding 3 ft. 4 in. but not exceeding 5 feet wide they shall be not less than 5 inches thick in the smallest part, and for stairways exceeding 5 feet wide they shall be of such thickness as shall be specially determined by the Commission in each case.

(4) All windows for staircases shall be protected by wired glass of approved thickness.

Handrails.

(5) All stairways shall be provided with an upper and a lower handrail fixed upon both sides thereof, and continued round the landings and chased into the end of newel walls where these occur.

(6) All doorways affording immediate means of escape to stairway landings shall be fitted with doors made of fire-resisting materials (jarrah, karri, or other hardwood of not less than  $1\frac{1}{4}$  inches finished thickness) and formed in two leaves hung in frames bedded solidly to walls or partitions, and so as to open in the direction of exit or to swing both ways clear of steps, landings, passageways and footways.

19. Where no provision is otherwise made in these Regulations in respect to steps, stairways, and landings, the provisions of Part II., Division VI., of the Building Regulations 1924 shall, with such modifications, alterations and substitutions as may, in the opinion of the Commission, be necessary, be deemed to apply thereto. Provided that wherever practicable all exit stairways shall be encased with fire-resistive construction and the proprietor shall cause them to be used for ordinary passage by the pupils at least once every day during which the floor to which they relate is occupied for school purposes.

## DIVISION 3.—EXITS AND ESCAPES.

Doors opening  
outwards.

20. Every main exterior door from a passage shall open outwards or both outwards and inwards when so required by the Commission.

Landings.

21. Where any exit door opens directly on to a stairway or flight of steps more than 21 inches high, a landing extending at least 3 inches laterally beyond the door jambs, and at least 3 feet in forward measurement, shall be provided at the level of the doorway sill and extend to the head of the said stairway or flight of steps.

22. Every exit door shall be fitted with an approved fastening within the meaning of the Building Regulations 1924.

23. All doors of passageways, bed-rooms, dormitories, bath-rooms, dining-rooms, lavatories, studies or other rooms occupied by the scholars shall be furnished with such fastenings only as will enable them to be readily opened from the inside without the use of a key.

24. All doors across and at the ends of all passageways and the main doors of the building shall be hung so as to open outwards towards the nearest external exit.

25. No drapery or curtains, and no articles, decorations, or material of a combustible, obstructive, or otherwise dangerous character shall be placed in any entrance or exit passage.

For capacities greater than 300 scholars the increment of the aggregate exit width for every additional 50 scholars or portion of 50 shall be 3 ft. 4 in. and the number and distribution of widths of individual exits shall be as determined specially by the Commission and according to the circumstances of each case.

DIVISION 4.—NATURAL LIGHTING.

Natural lighting.

32. The proprietor shall cause every room not being a class or lecture room to be properly lighted with a lighting surface in an external wall of transparent glass in a window or windows equivalent to not less than one-tenth of the floor space of such room for the unobstructed admission of daylight. The requirements concerning the natural lighting of class and lecture rooms shall be as set out in Division I. of Part VII. of these Regulations.

DIVISION 5.—ARTIFICIAL LIGHTING.

Gas pipes.

Precautions against fire.

Gas generators.

Pendent lights.

Gas brackets &c.

Oil lamps or

Precautions against fire.

33. The proprietor shall—

- (a) Cause all gas pipes laid after the coming into operation of these Regulations to be of iron or other metal of equivalent pressure resisting power;
- (b) cause every gas generator provided on the premises to be of approved design and placed in an approved position;
- (c) Cause all pendent gas, oil and electric fittings to be at least 6 ft. 8 in. above the level of the floor of the compartment, and every gas, oil and electric wall bracket to be rigidly fixed, and all wooden walls, wooden ceilings or other inflammable material of a fixed character situated within 4 feet vertically or 18 inches laterally of any gas light or oil lamp to be protected from excessive heat by either a hanging or a fixed incombustible shield or by other approved means.
- (d) not cause suffer or permit to be used—
  - (i) Oil lamps other than those having metal fonts or receivers, or
  - (ii) Any lamp not secured to a fixed metal bracket or securely suspended by metal chains or metal rods.

33A. Electric lighting or power installations in all schools shall comply with Part III. of the Building Regulations 1924, Regulations 90 to 110.

DIVISION 6.—LAVATORIES AND BATHS.

Floor surfaces impervious and drained.

Walls. Dado.

Light and ventilation.

Washbasins.

Baths.

34. (1) The floor of every lavatory shall be formed of or covered with impervious material and its surface adequately graded for drainage to an approved outlet.

(2) The walls to a height of 6 feet above the floor shall be finished so as to be hard, smooth, impervious, and washable.

(3) Every lavatory shall be lighted and ventilated to the approval of the Commission.

(4) Wash-hand basins shall be provided at the rate of at least one basin for every 25 day scholars.

35. When in connexion with any school not being a boarding school baths are provided, they shall be in number, location, design and equipment to the approval of the Commission.



## DIVISION 7.—DRAINAGE.

36. Efficient drainage shall be provided for carrying off all foul water and all rainwater from open surfaces such as roofs and yards to a proper outlet or outlets. There shall be no foul water drains near windows or near inlet ventilators or perflators of the buildings. Drainage and drains.

37. No drain shall be provided beneath any building unless absolutely necessary. When the use of such a drain is unavoidable, such drain shall be properly ventilated and constructed of impervious cast-iron pipes having caulked lead joints, and when required by the Commission embedded in cement concrete.

38. All drains shall be laid with sufficient and even gradient, and present smooth and impervious internal surfaces and water-tight joints.

39. All closed foul-water drains shall be effectually ventilated so as to discharge all foul vapours well above the level of the chimneys, windows, ventilators and other openings. All waste and overflow pipes from baths, lavatory basins, sinks, and like fittings shall be air disconnected from any foul-water drain by an approved method.

40. All waste pipes shall be trapped, the trap being located as near as possible to the bath, lavatory, basin, sink, or like fitting.

41. The provisions of Part II., Division X., of the Building Regulations 1924 relating to drainage shall also extend and apply to all schools within the meaning of these Regulations.

## DIVISION 8.—CLOSETS AND URINALS.

42. (1) The proprietor shall provide on the premises approved closets and urinals properly constructed and conveniently situated at the rate of:— Closets and urinals.

(a) For school buildings where not more than 75 scholars are accommodated—1 closet for every 15 females and 1 closet and 1 urinal for every 25 males. Number required.

(b) For school buildings where the accommodation is for more than 75 scholars—1 additional closet for every additional 35 females and 1 additional closet and 1 additional urinal for every additional 50 males.

(2) Such closets and urinals shall comply with the following requirements, viz:—

(a) They shall be decently screened. Screened and air-disconnected.

(b) They shall be completely air-disconnected from class-rooms, passages, and other compartments.

(c) Urinals may be and include a pedestal basin and any stall, trough or similar compartment capable of accommodating one individual user at a time. Where the premises are seweraged a lift-up pedestal closet shall be deemed to be an urinal, and where a trough or similar urinal is in use every complete 18 inches of available length thereof shall be deemed one urinal. Urinals.

(d) Each urinal shall be adequately flushed by means of an automatic flushing cistern. Where in the Commission's opinion water is not available for flushing purposes or suitable means for disposing of flushing water are not available it may approve of the installation and use of an urinal not requiring to be flushed with water. Flushing.

(e) Walls, divisions, and floors of urinals or urinal enclosures liable to be fouled shall be smooth, impervious, and durable. Walls.

(f) Every such floor shall slope towards an impervious channel situated under the urinal stalls or at the bottom of the back of the urinal. Floors.

## DIVISION 9.—GENERAL SANITARY PROVISIONS.

43. The proprietor shall make approved provision for—

(1) The collection and conveyance to the open air of vapour from washing boilers, fumes from gas stoves or other gas cooking or heating appliances, and from bath heaters of every description from which products of combustion are given off; and Control of unwholesome vapours.

(2) The collection, conveyance and disposal without causing nuisance, offence or danger to the health, of all refuse and drainage of the premises. Refuse and drainage collection.

## PART VI.—BOARDING SCHOOLS.

## DIVISION 1.—GENERAL.

Restriction of use of wooden &amp;c. buildings.

44. No building of more than one story, if constructed of wood or partly of wood or other inflammable material, nor any apartment situated under or over or in lateral communication with a shop or store or wholly or partly over a basement or a cellar, shall be used as a boarding-school.

Sleeping-room &amp;c. to be air-disconnected and fire isolated from certain other rooms.

45. No bed-room, dormitory, living-room, or study shall have any direct aerial connexion with any kitchen, scullery, larder, dairy, cleaning-room, lavatory, bath-room, box-room, boot-room, cloak-room, hat-room, or soiled linen-room, or with any sanitary convenience.

46. No room shall be used as a bed-room or dormitory if it be situated immediately adjoining any compartment used as a kitchen, laundry, shop or store, or for housing a steam boiler or for the storage of any inflammable material unless it be separated therefrom by fire-resisting construction.

## DIVISION 2.—BED-ROOMS AND DORMITORIES.

Bed-rooms and dormitories.

47. In every bed-room, dormitory, or sleeping apartment, the proprietor shall provide for each of the scholars, staff, and servants to be accommodated therein floor space and cubic space as follows:—

Air space and floor space.

- (a) In the case of a boarding school in use as such at the time of the coming into operation of these Regulations, not less than 540 cubic feet of air space nor less than 54 feet of floor space.
- (b) In the case of a house or premises coming into use as a boarding school after the coming into operation of these Regulations, not less than 600 cubic feet of air space nor less than 60 square feet of floor space.

Provided that where sleeping-out accommodation is used the cubic space and floor space shall be as required by the Commission after consideration of the aspect, light, ventilation, and other circumstances of each case.

48. The proprietor shall not accommodate more scholars than the cubic space and floor space allow when calculated in accordance with the provisions of this Division.

Beds.

49. The proprietor shall provide a separate bed with adequate bedding and bed clothing for the use of each of the scholars, staff, and servants, and shall not permit any dormitory to contain more than twenty (20) beds.

Ventilation.

50. The proprietor shall provide suitable ventilators so placed and of such capacity as will ensure the adequate ventilation of every bed-room or dormitory with an allowance of not less than 24 square inches of airway for every single bed in such bed-room or dormitory.

Prohibition of use of certain linings.

51. Use of canvas, duck, or other flimsy porous absorbent or inflammable fabric for the covering or lining of class-rooms, bed-rooms, or dormitories is hereby prohibited.

## DIVISION 3.—BATHS, LAVATORIES, &amp;c.

Bath-rooms.

52. The proprietor shall provide on the premises in situations convenient to the bed-rooms and dormitories properly equipped, constructed, lighted, drained and ventilated bathrooms and lavatories, having impervious floors, in accordance with the following requirements:—

- (1) In cases where there is a public water supply and where the scholars do not exceed 10 one bathroom fitted with combined plunge and shower bath, and for every additional 10 scholars or fraction of 10 one additional plunge or shower bath; provided that the number of plunge baths shall be in the proportion of one to 20 scholars.
- (2) In cases where there is no public water supply and where the number of scholars does not exceed 10 one bathroom fitted with combined plunge and shower bath, and for every additional 20 scholars or fraction of 20 one additional plunge or shower bath.
- (3) Lavatory basins not less in number than the baths herein required except in cases where the bed-rooms and dormitories are fitted with wash basins connected with an approved drainage system.

Lavatories.

## DIVISION 4.—KITCHENS, &amp;c.

Kitchen.

53. The proprietor shall provide—

Scullery.

- (1) A suitably situated kitchen of approved dimensions;
- (2) A scullery conveniently situated in relation to the kitchen, and furnished with approved sink and draining board; such sink and draining board, where fitting against any wall or partition, shall be properly flashed thereto with sheet lead.

- (3) A larder or larders suitably constructed and fitted, properly lighted and ventilated, not in direct communication with any living-room, bed-room, bath-room, laundry, wash house, or sanitary convenience, nor placed under a stairway, and effectually protected from steam fumes and offensive or unwholesome gases and vapours. Larder.
- (4) Effectual means for the exclusion of flies and other vermin and, as far as practicable, dust from every compartment wherein food is stored, cooked, prepared, or served. Protection of food from vermin.

## PART VII.—CLASS-ROOMS.

## DIVISION I.—CLASS-ROOMS (INCLUDING LECTURE-ROOMS).

54. Instruction or examination of scholars shall not be given or conducted in class-rooms other than those approved for the purpose. Instruction &c. to be given only in approved rooms.
55. (1) A floor area of at least 15 square feet and an air space of not less than 150 cubic feet for each scholar shall be provided in each class-room. Class-rooms. Floor space. Cubic space.
- (2) The length of a class-room shall in no case be more than one and two-thirds ( $1\frac{2}{3}$ ) times its breadth, nor exceed 32 feet. Its breadth shall not exceed twice its height as measured from the floor surface to the highest part of the glass in the windows of the main lighting wall, which wall shall be situated on the left-hand side of the class, and the windows shall contain glass of such quality, thickness, area, position, and of such degree of cleanliness as shall ensure that the illumination of the interior of the class-room by means of daylight shall not be less than 5 candle-feet at every surface required to be illuminated for purposes of school-work. Proportions. Illumination.
56. The class shall in every case face in the direction of the greater length or longer axis of the room. Position of Class.
57. (1) Desks in class-rooms shall be single or double, and if not adjustable shall in respect of the relative positions of the front edge of the seat and of the nearer edge of the desk be of the "plus" or "zero" type as depicted in the diagrams in Part XIII. of these Regulations. Type of desks.
- (2) The top of each desk shall have a surface slope of about 15 degrees below the horizontal towards the user. Desk slope.
- (3) The front row of desks shall be at least 7 feet from the front wall of the class-room unless the room be less than 14 feet in width, in which case the distance may be reduced to 6 feet. A clear space of at least 18 inches shall be left between the main lighting wall and the row of seats and desks nearest to it, likewise a clear space of at least 12 inches between the opposite wall and the row of seats and desks nearest to it. Provided that in the case where double desks are used such latter space shall be at least 2 feet. Situation and arrangement of desks.
58. In every class-room where seats are arranged in tiers such seats shall be so disposed that each sitter shall have a free unobstructed view of the lecture table and black-board. Class-rooms where seats are arranged in tiers.
59. Every black-board shall present a matte surface, and shall be placed in the most advantageous position for view by the class. Black-boards.
60. Every class-room shall have a main lighting wall which shall be an external wall. Lighting Main lighting wall.
61. (1) The windows of every class-room shall be glazed with clear sheet glass to an extent equivalent to at least one-sixth ( $\frac{1}{6}$ ) of the floor area of the room, or if the main lighting wall has, in the Commission's opinion, actually for practical purposes a southern exposure the ratio shall be increased to not less than one-fifth ( $\frac{1}{5}$ ) of the floor area. Class-room windows.
- (2) In every case not less than three-fourths ( $\frac{3}{4}$ ) of the glazed lighting surface required by this regulation shall be in the windows of the main lighting wall, and the balance disposed of as far as practicable in the opposite wall in the form of supplementary windows as hereinafter provided. Windows, main and supplementary.
- (3) If there is no second external wall the whole of the glazed lighting surface required by this regulation shall be disposed in the main lighting wall. When only one external wall.
- (4) Every window shall be readily openable at the top and at the bottom to an extent of not less than 50 per cent. of the area of opening between inside beads, or, in the case of French or casement windows, between the sash frames. Windows to be openable.
- (5) The lowermost edge of the clear glass in each window in the main-lighting wall shall be from 3 ft. 6 in. to 4 feet above the adjacent floor surface, and the uppermost edge of such glass shall, when the sash is closed, be as close as practicable to the ceiling. Levels of windows in main lighting wall.

Rear glass line (6) The extreme rear glass line in the main lighting wall shall be not more than 18 inches from the rear cross or return wall or partition of whatsoever kind, and the extreme front glass line in the main lighting wall shall be not less than 7 feet from the front cross or return wall or partition of whatsoever kind.

Supplementary windows. (7) When it is not practicable to place the supplementary windows in an external wall opposite the main lighting wall, or where the wall opposite the main lighting wall is not external, such windows shall be placed in a rear cross or return exterior wall behind the scholars, in either of which cases the lowermost part of the glass in each window shall be not less than 7 feet above the floor surface.

Use of front lighting and skylights forbidden. (8) No window in a wall in front of the class and no skylight, except with the approval of the Commission, shall be used for the illumination of a class-room.

Lighting of night-school. Candle-power of lamps. 62. (1) In the case of class-rooms used for night-school purposes, artificial lighting shall be provided by means of an approved lamp or lamps, so placed that there shall be at least one 16 candle-power lamp to each component 50 square feet of floor space.

Situation of lamps. (2) Every such lamp shall be so placed vertically and horizontally in relation to the desks, and so equipped as in the Commission's opinion to secure as far as practicable from the left side of the scholars an effective diffusion of sufficient light upon the desks and black-boards, and without recourse to the use of unprotected lights, the use of which in a class-room is hereby prohibited.

Lighting. 63. Every class-room, together with all exits, shall be properly lighted, so as to render all exits, passages or other ways therein and therefrom to the available public thoroughfare or thoroughfares at all times readily visible during the whole time the scholars are on the premises.

Commission may require more light. 64. If notwithstanding compliance with the foregoing provisions for the natural or the artificial lighting of any class-room, as the case may be, the Commission is satisfied that in any part of such class-room the means for lighting are inadequate, additional provision to the approval of the Commission shall be made whether for admission of more light or the better diffusion of light as appears to it to be necessary.

Internal surfaces of walls &c. 65. The internal surfaces of walls and partitions of class-room shall be hard, smooth, impervious, and washable up to a height of at least 6 feet above the floor level. Such surfaces shall be of a light greenish-grey or other light colour having a light-absorbing power of not more than 40 parts per centum, and ceilings shall be white.

Ventilation. General provisions. 66. The provisions of Part II., Division VII., of the Building Regulations 1924, shall, subject to the following alterations and substitutions, extend and apply to all class-rooms, and shall for such purpose be deemed to be incorporated with these Regulations.

In Regulation 73 of the said Building Regulations 1924, for 1 square inch shall be substituted 10 square inches, and for 2 square feet shall be substituted 15 square feet in respect of ventilation airway in relation to floor area of class-rooms.

#### DIVISION 2.—LABORATORIES, EXPERIMENTAL AND APPLIED SCIENCE ROOMS AND STUDIOS.

Floor space. 67. In no case shall the floor space for each scholar be less than 30 square feet.

Working benches, &c. 68. Working benches in every laboratory shall be not less than 4 ft. 6 in. apart, shall have a width of not less than 2 ft. 3 in. in the case of single and 4 ft. 6 in. in the case of double benches, and shall be of such length as to allow not less than 3 ft. 6 in. run for each scholar at single or for each pair of opposite scholars at double benches. The average intensity of lighting in the working plane shall be not less than 8 candle-feet.

General provisions. 69. In the case of every laboratory the following provisions shall also apply, viz. :—

Shelves. (1) All shelving shall stand 12 inches clear of the floor ;

Concealed pipes. (2) All chasing or other recessed work containing gas pipes, water pipes, air pipes, vacuum pipes, waste or other pipes shall be fitted so as to be readily opened for purposes of inspection.

Bench tops impervious. (3) Bench tops shall be made impervious to water by ironing paraffin wax into them or by some other approved method.

Sinks and basins. (4) Every sink or basin in a bench top shall be sunk with its upper edge slightly below the surface of the bench top so that spilt liquid may readily drain from such surface into the sink or basin.

- (5) Every sink or basin and every drain and waste channel for conveyance of acid drainage shall be formed of such materials or lined with such protective coating as shall in the Commission's opinion render it sufficiently acid-resisting. Acid drainage.
- (6) Where any process causing, producing, emitting, or discharging any offensive fumes, vapours, gases, or dust is used, there shall be provided means, whether in the form of fume or stink-cup-boards, closets, or hoods and aprons, extract flues and fans or other devices so designed, arranged, located, and operated as to be, in the opinion of the Commission, adequate for collection and control of such fumes, vapours, gases, or dust as closely as practicable to the origin thereof and for conducting them as directly as possible to the outer air without allowing them to mix with the general atmosphere of any compartment of the school. Treatment and disposal of offensive fumes, vapours, gases or dust.
- (7) Where electric energy is available it shall be used for the purpose of actuating fans for the extraction of such offensive fumes, vapours, gases, or dust. Electrically driven fans.
- (8) Where dust, fumes, vapours, or gases are produced on so small a scale as in the Commission's opinion not to be offensive, and when the Commission so approves, the general ventilation may be effected by the use of the "natural" system in accordance with Part II., Division VII., of the Building Regulations 1924. Provided that for each person accommodated the area of clear airway provided alike in inlet and in outlet ventilators shall be at least 20 square inches, otherwise an approved system of ventilation by mechanical means capable of supplying 50 cubic feet of normally fresh air per person aforesaid per minute shall be provided. General ventilation of laboratories, &c.
70. In every chemical laboratory—
- (1) the main lighting windows shall be so distributed that there shall be a window opposite, and in the Commission's opinion conveniently near, the outer end of each working bench; and Windows in chemical laboratories.
- (2) Every working bench shall as far as practicable be arranged so that its greater length is at right-angles to the walls in which the windows are situated. Positions of working benches in chemical laboratories.

#### DIVISION 3.—MISCELLANEOUS.

71. (1) The proprietor shall in every laboratory, sloyd-room, or work-room provide guards for— Proprietor to guard dangerous machinery &c.
- (a) All dangerous parts of the machinery;
- (b) All dangerous appliances used in or in connexion with the laboratory or any such room; and
- (c) All dangerous parts of the laboratory or any such room.
- (2) In any laboratory, sloyd-room or work-room— Protection of young persons and women from machinery.
- (a) No female unless her hair is cut short or securely fixed and confined close to her head by net or otherwise, and no male wearing any apron or loose garment, shall be allowed to work among or near moving machinery; and
- (b) no male under eighteen years of age, and no female of any age, shall be allowed to clean machinery whilst the same is in motion, or to work between the fixed and traversing part of any self-acting machine while the machine is in motion by the action of steam, water, or other power.

#### PART VIII.—ASSEMBLY HALLS.

72. Assembly halls shall be subject to the provisions of the Building Regulations 1924. Assembly halls.

#### PART IX.—CLOAK-ROOMS.

73. Cloak-rooms of sufficient size and number adequately furnished with shelving and hooks for the reception of the scholars' hats and cloaks shall be provided on the premises of every school, and shall be subject to the conditions following, viz. :— Their size and number.
- (1) They shall be situated conveniently near to the class-rooms and passages, but shall be completely air-disconnected therefrom and from all occupied rooms; Situation.
- (2) They shall not be located in basements, and shall be thoroughly cross-ventilated; Ventilation.
- (3) Fittings for the reception of hats and cloaks shall be so arranged as to secure complete circulation of air around such clothing as far as practicable. Hat and cloa fittings.

PART X.—FIRE EXTINGUISHING APPLIANCES.

Fire extinguishing appliances.

74. (1) Fire hoses and/or chemical fire-extinguishers, hand fire buckets or other means of preventing and extinguishing fires, shall be provided in such number and position as the Commission shall direct, but not less than one bucket or extinguisher shall be provided for each 500 feet of floor area.

Chemical fire-extinguishers.

(2) Chemical fire extinguishers shall be only such as provide for the forcible ejection of fire-extinguishing liquid of neutral or slightly alkaline re-action, and of about two gallons apiece.

PART XI.—DRINKING WATER.

Air disconnexion of supply from sanitary conveniences.

75. (1) There shall be complete air-disconnexion of every pipe or cistern from which water is drawn for human consumption from every sanitary convenience or other source of unwholesome effluvium.

Filters.

(2) Every filter shall be readily accessible and capable of being effectually cleaned, and shall be so cleaned as often as may be necessary for maintaining a sufficient and wholesome output of water.

Use of leaden pipes prohibited

(3) Use for water supply purposes of pipes made of lead or other unwholesome or poisonous material is hereby prohibited.

PART XII.—ENFORCEMENT OF REGULATIONS.

Responsibility of proprietor.

76. The proprietor of any school in which there is a contravention of any prohibition made under these Regulations, or a failure to do any act directed by these Regulations to be done, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

Offence and penalties.

77. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds; and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

- (a) the position of the school building in relation to the boundaries of the site to any existing buildings or outbuildings on the site or adjacent thereto and to the thoroughfares rights-of-way or lanes upon which the site of such building abuts also whether or not such rights-of-way or lanes are under the proprietor's sole control;
- (b) the names of adjacent public thoroughfares;
- (c) the provision for access to such thoroughfares from such building;
- (d) the position and dimensions of the playground or playgrounds and of the enclosure fences or walls thereof and of the street or road entrance thereto;

(2) Plans and sections drawn to a scale not smaller than 1 inch to 8 feet (1/96) of each floor of the building and specifications showing—

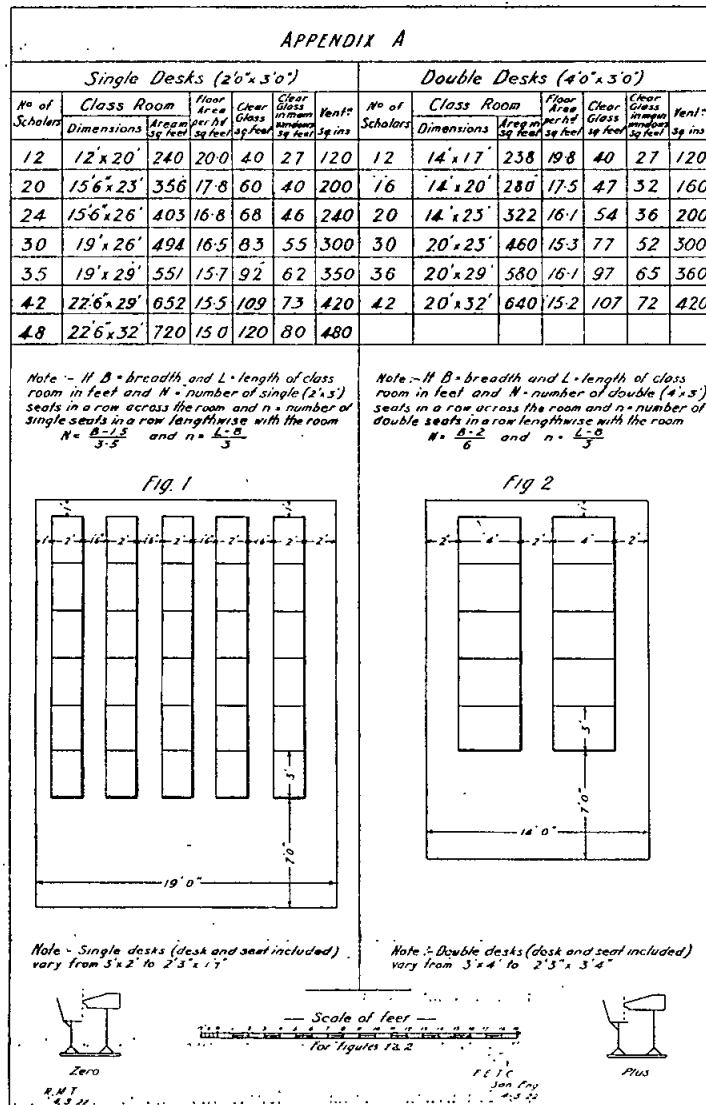
- (a) the nature of the structural connexion if any with any existing building;
- (b) nature of soil and depth of foundation below ground surface, stating particularly whether the ground is—
  - natural (loam, sand, gravel, clay, sandstone, limestone, rock);
  - "made" ground (containing refuse—organic or inorganic, solid or liquid);
- (c) nature of materials of construction;
- (d) position and spacing and scantlings of beams floor-bearers and joists
- (e) thickness and heights of walls positions of damp-proof courses nature and finished colour of linings or internal coatings of walls and ceilings and nature of heat insulation for ceilings;
- (f) the internal length width and height of each room or passageway in figures;
- (g) position of each doorway window ventilator and fireplace or other provision for warming class-rooms or laboratories;
- (h) area of glazed lighting surface of each window also in the case of night-schools the means for artificial lighting of class-rooms or laboratories and the positions (vertical and horizontal) and candle-powers proposed for lamps and in each class-room the direction by means of an arrow in which each class is intended to face and the position and clear widths of all gangways;
- (i) the least width and headway of each stairway if any and dimensions of landings treads (exclusive of nosing) and risers and positions of handrails;
- (j) form and pitch of roof;
- (k) the purpose and use to which each and every room is to be put;
- (l) the designation of rooms by letters and numerals in order in the manner prescribed in the said Regulations;
- (m) the positions and dimensions of all cloak-rooms lavatories baths closets and urinals;

- (n) the nature and extent of the provision for water supply to and drainage of the premises and for fire extinction and the means available for saving life in the event of a fire; and
- (o) in any system of mechanical ventilation the positions of all intakes and other openings ducts motors fans or other appliances for impelling air into or extracting air from the building and of all screens tempering coils humidifiers filters or eliminators and in any system of heating the positions of boiler mains tanks radiators motors or fans;
- (p) as prescribed above in the case of the block plan, the scale and the signed name and postal address aforesaid.

And the Honorable Jas. McDonald, for and on behalf of His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

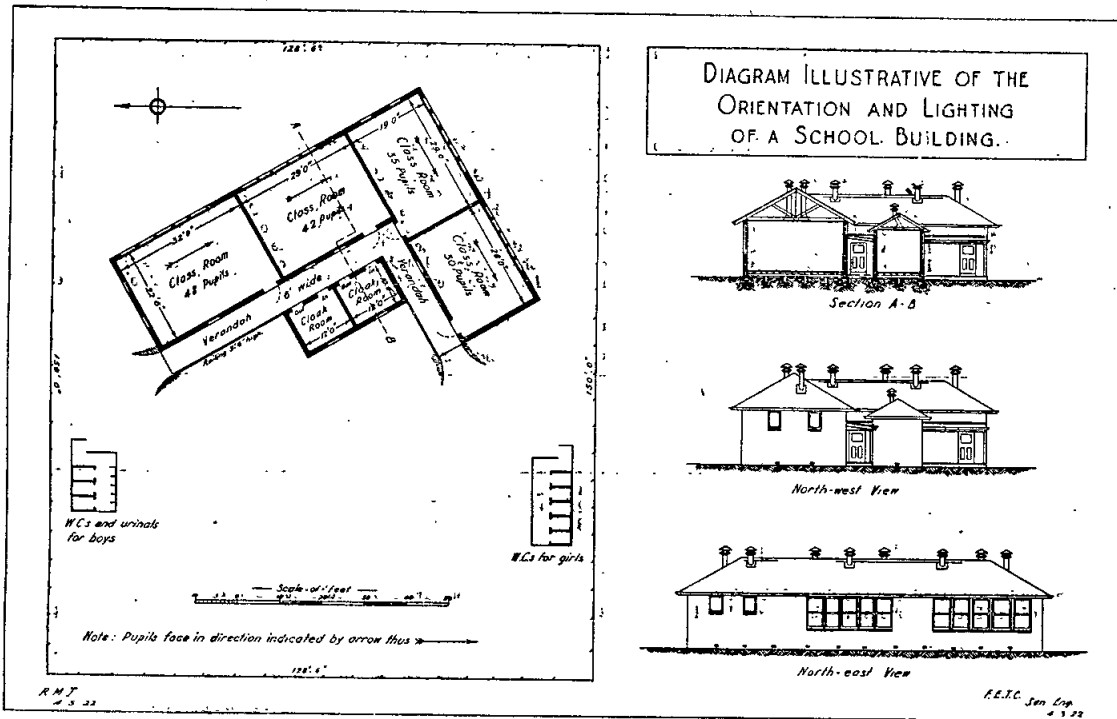

 FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.**

**U**NDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Fire Brigades Act 1915* (section 39), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke paragraph 1 of regulation No. 18 of the Regulations of the Country Fire Brigades Board (approved by the Governor in Council on the 31st January, 1922), and, in lieu thereof, doth make the following paragraph, which has been prepared by the Country Fire Brigades Board and approved by the Minister (that is to say):—

Officers and members of brigades who shall have efficiently served as registered firemen for not less than twelve (12) years in any one or more brigades under the Country Fire Brigades Board shall be entitled to the Board's Long Service Badge; and officers and members of brigades who shall have similarly served for not less than ten (10) years shall be entitled, on retirement, to a Certificate setting forth the term of service. Firemen with twenty (20) years' service may wear a red clasp below the badge; with twenty-five (25) years' service an additional white clasp; and with thirty (30) years' service an additional blue clasp. Applications for badges, certificates, and clasps must be made on the forms provided by the Board for such purpose, and they must be certified to by the applicant and the captain and the secretary of the brigade. Service as a reserve member is not to be counted in the periods of service mentioned in this Regulation, except in the cases of the Ballarat City, Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong brigades.
