Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD CARTERS BOARD.

Note.—(a) On the 14th December, 1926, the powers of the Bread Carters Board were extended to enable it to fix rates for persons employed in or in connexion with any stable in which are stabled the horses used in his trade or business by any person subject to the Determination of the aforesaid Board.

(b) This Determination on 27th February, 1927, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely: The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell: the boroughs of Eaglehawk, Echuca, Hamilton, Sebastopol, and Wonthaggi; the South Ward of the borough of Box Hill; the shires of Dandonoug, Moorabbin, and Mulgrave; the Moorpanyal Riding of the shire of Corio; the township of Kangaroo Flat, in the shires of Marong and Strattfieldsaye; such portions of the shires of Ballarat, Bungaree, Runin-yong, and Grenville as are within a radius of 3 miles of the Ballarat Post Office; such portion of the shire of Humtyle as is within a radius of 10 miles of the Camperdown Post Office; such portion of the shire of Colac as is within a radius of 5 miles of the Geelong Post Office; and such portion of the Shire of Colac as is within a radius of 2 miles of the Colac Post Office.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in the business of a baker or seller of bread," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 27th February, 1927, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(6) DAY AND LATEST HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Thursday, at 5.30 p.m., shall be the day and latest hour for payment of wages.

(7) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.
