IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1915, I*, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder as special days to be observed as Bank Holidays and Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

(4) Any person who is guilty of any act, breach, or default contrary to the above provisions shall be liable for every offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

WINGROVE-STREET TENNIS COURTS REGULATIONS.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 93, for the control and management of the Tennis Courts provided on the Reserve belonging to the Council, situate in Wingrove-street, Alphington.
