PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.

SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF BENALLA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Violet Town described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Violet Town and annexed to the Shire of Benalla.

Area described in Petition.

Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 91, Parish of Warrenbayne; thence southerly by a road to the north boundary of allotment 80C; thence westerly by a road to the north-west corner of the last-named allotment; thence southerly by a road along the western boundaries of allotments 80C, 81A, 81B, 82, and 82A to the north-west corner of allotment 7A, Parish of Boho; thence southerly by the west boundaries of that allotment and allotments 28, 8, and 25, Parish of Boho, and allotments 13A and 12A, Parish of Lima, to a road at the south-east corner of the last-named allotment; thence southerly by that road to the north-west corner of allotment 4; thence easterly by a road along the northern boundary of that allotment to the western boundary of allotment 17A; thence southerly by part of the western boundary of that allotment to its south-west corner; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of allotments 17A and 16A to the eastern boundary of the shire; thence northerly and westerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that their reasons for desiring severance are that, owing to the geographical situation of this area, all their trading is done in Benalla, which is a town of considerable importance, having good market yards, banks, stores, and other facilities; and by having their rates received into Benalla Shire that shire would be justified in improving roads leading into and through this area, which would be very beneficial to all.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the South Riding of the Shire of Violet Town and annex such area to the Warrenbayne Riding of the Shire of Benalla.

SHIRE OF WERRIBEE.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF WERRIBEE AND ANNEXATION TO CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Werribee described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Werribee and annexed to the City of Williamstown.

Area described in Petition.

Commencing at a point formed by the intersection of the west side of Challis-street (which said street forms part of the western boundary of the City of Williamstown) with the railway line from Melbourne to Geelong; thence bounded on the east by the said street to its intersection with Kororoit Creek-road and by a direct line continuing from the said street proceeding in a southerly direction to Port Phillip Bay; thence on the south by the said Port Phillip Bay to the Government road immediately east of powder magazine; thence on the west by the said road known as Government road proceeding in a northerly direction to its point of intersection with the said railway line from Melbourne to Geelong; thence on the north by the said railway line home to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that the said area is in close proximity and easier of access to the City of Williamstown than it is to the Town of Werribee; that the said area can be more effectively administered and governed from Williamstown than from Werribee; that the trade and business of the said area are mainly conducted with the localities on the railway line from Melbourne to Williamstown, and the traders are mainly served from that direction and very little business is done with Werribee; that the interests and activities of the said area are essentially more urban than those of other parts of the Werribee Shire; and that annexation with the said City of Williamstown will mean that such urban tendencies will receive more sympathy and development.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Werribee, and annex such area to the City of Williamstown as a new Ward to be called the Altona Ward.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE FROM SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA AND ANNEXATION TO SHIRE OF BARRARBOOL.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Winchelsea described in the petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Winchelsea and annexed to the Coast Riding of the Shire of Barrarbool.

Area described in Petition.

Commencing at the north-west corner of the Parish of Angahook; thence south-west and south along that parish boundary to the Painkalac Creek; thence westerly along that creek to the north-west corner of Crown allotment 34, Parish of Boonah; thence south to the south-west corner of allotment 34; thence west to the north-west corner of allotment 30; thence south to the south-west corner of allotment 30; thence southerly to the north-west corner of allotment 8, Parish of Lorne; thence southerly along the western boundaries of allotments 8, 7, 6, and 5 to the shore of Bass Strait; thence generally north-easterly along the shore of Bass Strait to the mouth of Salt Creek; thence westerly along that creek to the starting point.

The petitioners state that to reach Anglesea one has to traverse the Barrarbool Shire roads, and the Barrarbool Shire Council cannot be expected to maintain the roads whilst the Winchelsea Shire collects all the revenue. Consequently the roads in Anglesea territory are neglected.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described from the Shire of Winchelsea and annex such area to the Coast Riding of the Shire of Barrarbool.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA FROM THE SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Shepparton described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Shepparton and constituted a new municipality under the name and title of the Borough of Shepparton.

Area described in Petition.

Commencing at the intersection of the Goulburn River with Balaclava-road; thence easterly by that road to Verney-road; thence southerly by that road to Dookie-road; thence easterly by that road to Lockwood-road; thence southerly by that road to Benalla-road; thence westerly by that road to Archer-street; thence southerly by that street to the Broken River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence northerly by that river to the point of commencement.

The petitioners state that their reasons for desiring severance are that the area proposed to be severed comprises a closely-settled and populous town with rateable property therein of the annual value of upwards of Forty thousand pounds, and only three councillors out of fifteen are elected by the rate-payers within the said portion; and the petitioners believe that the local government affairs of the ratepayers within the said portion can be more effectively managed by a Council elected by the ratepayers within that portion only.

The petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency the Governor in Council may be pleased to sever the area above described, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of the Borough of Shepparton; such municipality to be subdivided into three wards, to be called the North, Central, and South Wards.
