DISTRICT HEALTH OFFICER, CLASS "A," PROFESSIONAL DIVISION, DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH.

APPLICATIONS, addressed to the Secretary to the Public Service Commissioner (Victoria), Geological Museum Building, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, and accompanied by evidence of experience and qualifications and a statement of date and place of birth, are invited for the above-mentioned position, up to Wednesday, the 18th May, 1927.

Yearly Salary.—£700, minimum; £850, maximum. (Revised—£741, minimum; £850, maximum.)

Duties.—1. To keep himself at all times properly informed as to the public health and sanitary circumstances of the area to which he is appointed, and to make such inquiries, inspections, and investigations as are necessary for such purposes.

2. To investigate, report, and advise in respect of—

- (a) Outbreaks of infectious diseases;
- (b) Sanitary administration of municipal districts;
- (c) Sanitary matters generally.

3. To perform such duties in connexion with the medical inspection of and the promotion of the health of school children as are prescribed.

4. To advise and assist medical officers of health and inspectors of councils.

5. To carry out such medical work as may be required in relation to any departmental hospital, clinic, or sanatorium.

6. To perform such duties as are imposed by or conferred under the Health Acts, and such other duties as are required by the Chief Health Officer or the Commission of Public Health.

Qualifications.—(a) Medical practitioner, registered in Victoria;

- (b) Degree in or diploma of public health;
- (c) Experience in general practice;
- (d) Practical experience in public health work.

District Health Officers must reside at such place in the Health Area as is required by the Commission of Public Health, and shall be subject to removal from one district to another. The appointment will be on probation for six (6) months.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW NO. 1812.—RATES.—CARRUM WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and in accordance with the provisions of an Order in Council bearing date the 15th March, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th March, 1927, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements within the respective divisions of the Waterworks District of the Carrum Waterworks Trust, as the same are respectively set out and described in the said Order in Council bearing date 15th March, 1927, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 16th March, 1927, that is to say:—

That the respective rates in the pound of the valuation of such lands and tenements in the said several Divisions shall be—

- Division No. 1.—Forty-four pence.
- Division No. 2.—Twenty-two pence.
- Division No. 3.—Twelve pence.
- Division No. 4.—Ten pence.
- Division No. 5.—Threepence.

Provided that a sum of Two shillings shall be the minimum amount of rate to be paid in respect of any land or tenement liable to be rated in such district.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1927, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1927, and shall be payable on the 29th day of April, 1927, at the office of the said Commission, Lonsdale-street, Dandenong.

3. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a Police Magistrate.

The foregoing By-law was made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 17th day of March, 1927, and the common seal of the said Commission was hereunto affixed the 17th day of March, 1927, in the presence of—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF KYABRAM, KNOWN AS "THE RAILWAY RESERVE."

WE, John Cam Wight, Edward Hamilton Henderson, James Graham Finlay, William Pratt, and William Joseph Farrer, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation in the Town of Kyabram, and known as "The Railway Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for

cricket, or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall be publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
