THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS COLONY DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE JUDGMENTS (RECIPROCITY) ACTS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of The Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia) for the enforcement within such part of judgments as defined by section 2 of the *Supreme Court Act 1923*, so far as the same relate to Victorian Judgments, Orders, and Awards, do now under the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Judgments (Reciprocity) Act 1925*, and with the advice of the Executive Council, declare The Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts, and that the said Acts shall extend and apply to all parts of The Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the seventeenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Grade Standards for Bananas Regulations*, and shall be read and construed as part of the *Fruit and Vegetable Packing Regulations* of the twenty-third day of November, 1926, and shall apply to bananas for sale, and shall come into operation forthwith.

## GRADE STANDARDS FOR BANANAS.

2. All Cavendish bananas shall be packed according to size, and the variation in length of fruit in any one case shall not exceed 1½ inches. No bananas measuring below 5½ inches in length by 4 inches in circumference shall be allowed to be marketed.

When varieties other than Cavendish are marketed the name of the variety shall be marked on the case.

NOTE.—All measurements in length are to be taken on the outside of the curve from the junction of the fruit at the stem-end to the top of the fruit.

##### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR THE PUBLIC GARDENS IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WANGARATTA, KNOWN AS "WARRINA PARK."

**THE** Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the twenty-seventh day of April, 1926, in the Municipal District of Wangaratta, as a site for Public Gardens, known as the "Warrina Park," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fence or gates in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or on any building in the Reserve, or cut names on or otherwise injure or deface the fences, trees, buildings, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or being the owner or having the possession, care, custody, control, or supervision thereof, shall suffer or allow such horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals to be in or graze or wander upon the Reserve without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvements of the Reserve and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall take or drive any carriage, cart, or any other vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal into the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and no horse or other animal drawing such carriage, cart, or other vehicle shall whilst in the Reserve be detached or unharnessed therefrom or left without a person being in charge thereof.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained; and no person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any article or thing without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall enter any building in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any person having entered such building shall leave the same on being requested so to do by any member of the Committee of Management or by a police constable or Crown lands bailiff.

10. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

11. The maximum of scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for sports, fêtes, entertainments, or holidays amusements shall be as follows:—

For admission of every person such sum exclusive of entertainment tax as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling. Provided that the net amount received by the Committee of Management, after providing for any necessary prizes and disbursements in connexion therewith, shall be used and appropriated towards the maintenance and improvements of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be made annually to the Board of Land and Works. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall upon demand produce, and if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

12. Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the Land Act 1915 for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

## BY-LAW NO. 169.

## Residential Areas.

A By-law of the City of Prahran made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 169, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas, and prohibiting within such area the use of any land, or the erection, adaptation for use, or the use of any building for the purpose of certain trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran order as follows:—

1. The areas within the municipal district of the City of Prahran herein prescribed shall be residential areas, that is to say, all land abutting on the following streets and to a depth of 200 feet from the frontage of such land to any of such streets respectively, viz.:—

Densham-road.	Linden-court,
Jessamine-avenue.	Elgin-avenue.
Landale-road.	Kingsley-court.
Stonchaven-court.	

2. No person shall in any such residential area use any land, or erect, or adapt for use, or use any building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement, except the business of a dressmaker, milliner, or teacher, in which not more than three persons are employed, or a business or trade carried on by an individual without any employee or assistant in a private dwelling on which no advertisement or sign is displayed indicating the nature of the business or trade carried on therein other than a plate approved by the Council and affixed to the front of such dwelling.

3. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building a notice requiring him to pull down and remove such building within a time to be named in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice, the Council may pull down and remove such building and sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of such pulling down and removal, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

4. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any Court in respect of such offence.

## Health Act 1919.

## SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

## BY-LAW NO. 51.

## BY-LAW RELATING TO THE COLLECTION, REMOVAL, AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Moorabbin, viz.:—All that area of land commencing at the intersection of Thomas-street and North-road, and bounded as follows:—By the northern boundary of the municipality, easterly along North-road to Tucker-road; thence southerly along Tucker-road to South-road; thence easterly along South-

road to Chesterville-road; thence southerly along Chesterville-road to Argus-street; thence easterly along Argus-street to Wilson-street; thence southerly along Wilson-street to Johnston-street; thence south-easterly along Johnston-street to Silver-street; thence easterly along Silver-street to Cavenagh-street; thence southerly along Cavenagh-street and the prolongation thereof to the southern boundary of the municipality; thence along the southern and western boundaries of the municipality to the commencing point; and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Refuse” includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Commission and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance.

21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution adopting this By-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin on the 17th day of January, 1927, and confirmed on the 21st day of February, 1927.
