SOUTHERN RHODESIA DECLARED A RECIPRO-CATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE JUDGMENTS (RECIPROCITY) ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of Southern Rhodesia (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia) for the enforcement within such part of Judgments as defined by section 2 of the Supreme Vourt Act 1923, so far as the same relate to Victorian Judgments, Orders, and Awards, do now, under the powers conferred by section 3 of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Act 1925, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, declare Southern Rhodesia to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts, and that the said Acts shall extend and apply to all parts of Southern Rhodesia. Rhodesia.

SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

BY-LAW NO. 95.

Sill's Bend Reserve Regulations.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 95, for regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the Reserve known as Sill's Bend Reserve, adjoining the Heidelberg Park.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg order as follows:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, statuery, fountains, fish, or any property in the said Park, Reserve, land, or ground, or throw stones or any missile, beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange-peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

beat carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or leave bottles therein, paper, orange-peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said Park, Reserve, land, or ground, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, posts, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council, shall bring into the said Park, Reserve, land, or ground, any horse, vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein closed for plantation or other purposes.

4. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve except as above provided, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any Justice, for any damage done.

5. No children under five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the said Park, Reserve, land, or ground unless in the charge of adult friends or nurses.

6. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said Park, Reserve, land, or ground any act of indecency, shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the said Park, Reserve, land, or ground.

8. The Council shall have the power to let the Park, Reserve, land to authorize such club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

10. N

person, and One shilling for each child under the age of twelve years.

11. No person, except members of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employees of the Council on duty, shall enter any portion of such Park, Reserve, land, or ground when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.

12. No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

13. No person shall carry firearms in or through the Park, Reserve, land, or ground, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein, unless by authority of the Council.

14. No person shall engage in training, or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the Park, Reserve, land, or ground without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wagers for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such Park, Reserve,

land, or ground.

16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employees engaged in the Park, Reserve, land, or ground, by conversation

gaged in the Park, Reserve, land, or ground, by conversation or otherwise.

17. No person shall sell or offer for sale within such Park, Reserve, land, or ground any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making amusement, without the written permission of the Council.

18. No person shall remain in such Park, Reserve, land, or ground at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in such Park, Reserve, land, or ground.

20. No persons shall assemble in the Park, Reserve, land, or ground for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission in writing of the Council.

21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the enclosure known as Sill's Bend Reserve.

Definitions.

- "Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and
- "Priced truts" hears ared currants, three satisfies, and dried lexias.

 "Packing shed" means any building or crection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or crection is or is not used for any other purpose.
- "Registered packing shed" means a packing shed regis-tered with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board.
- 4. Every person in whose name a packing shed is registered shall contribute in respect to the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1927, a sum equal to the one-fortieth of a penny per pound of the quantity of 1927 season's dried fruits sold from such packing shed, and also of the quantity of such dried fruits forwarded therefrom for purposes of trade or sale.
- 5. Payment of such contributions shall be made to the Secretary, Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins place, Mel-
- 6. Payment of such contributions shall be made as follows:-
 - (a) Where the amount does not exceed £10, in one sum
 - on or before the first day of July, 1927.

 (b) Where the sum exceeds £16, in one sum or on before the first day of July, 1927, or in four equal instalments payable on the first day of July, August. October, and November, 1927.

BY-LAW No. 100.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, and every other power thereto enabling in that behalf, do hereby make the following By-law, numbered 100, of the said Shire for regulating the construction of crossings over footways and channels and for repealing By-laws numbers 59 and 95.

- 1. By-laws 59 and 95 of the Shire of Colac are hereby re-
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the Shire of Colac.
- 3. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides, drives, or leads any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinaftementioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the Council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the institute additional proportion. to the footway or channel as the justices adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.
- 4. If any land fronts to, adjoins or abuts upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, leading, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway, or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land desires that a crossing for horses or other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel and gives a notice in writing of such his desire to the Council, and in such notice describes the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulations as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction) at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the Council appoint for the purpose, to make such crossings according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

Every such person who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing be made shall before giving notice to the Council as herein provided deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided and in accordance with the specification in the schedule hereto.
- 6. If any crossing has been made in any respect contrary to this By-law or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the Council, if they see fit, to cause the same to be altered so as to conform hereto and to such regulation respectively, and to recover in manner in the Local Government Act 1915, provided the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing leads, but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the Council or their officers might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.
- 7. If any private street, or road, or right-of-way meets at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there is no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street, road, or right-of-way to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the Council if they see fit to make, in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf and the schedule hereto, a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the properties abutting on such private street, road, or right-of-way such portion of the expenses of such making as bears to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tement bears to the whole rateable value of all the properties so abutting. so abutting.
- 8. If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street, or road, or right-of-way has been made before the coming into operation of this By-law, but is in any respect not in accordance with any regulation made hereunder and the schedule hereto, the Council may, if they see fit, cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation or such schedule, and if such crossing has been made contrary to any By-law

in force at the time of making the same, the Council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

- 9. If any crossing be out of repair and the person liable bereunder to maintain or repair the same for seven days after notice from the Council to that effect neglects properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing remains so unrepaired a sum of Forty shillings, and the Council may, if they see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.
- 10. It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say :-

For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making and constructing the same; the mode of laying and bodding such materials; the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclinations, or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise in like manner.

11. In any case where the owner of any land fronting to or adjoining or abutting upon the footway of any street or road desires that a crossing for use of foot passengers only be made over the channel, the provisions of this By-law shall apply with the following modifications:-
