SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

RATING BY-LAW No. 41 FOR 1926-1927, MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES, FIXING A SCALE OF CHARGES FOR WATER SUPPLIED BY MEASURE, AND REGULATING THE TIMES OF PAYMENT.

THE Council of the Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Beechworth for the year commencing 1st September, 1926, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

- On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under, a rate of £1 2s. 6d. per annum.
On every house and tenement and allotment above the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15), a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound on the amount of annual valuation as per rate book.
On every vacant allotment or allotments enclosed by one fence under the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15), a minimum charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum where no connexion to main, and One pound (£1) per annum where connected to main, will be made.

The rate shall be payable in one instalment on and after the first day of April, 1927.

Water supplied by measure to any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, or to any other person (except in case of special agreement with the Council) shall be supplied, charged, and paid for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum of water to be charged and paid for in such case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for half-yearly on the 31st March and 30th September of each year.

The foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Beechworth at the Council meeting held on the fourth day of March, 1927, confirmed on the first day of April, 1927, by special resolution, and the common seal of the said Council was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Fruit Act 1917* (No. 2919), to make Regulations for or with respect to standards and methods of packing fruit or vegetables for sale, and for other purposes, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

GENERAL.

1. The Second Schedule of the Regulations made under the provisions of the *Fruit Act 1917* (Part II.), on the twenty-third day of November, 1926, shall be and the same is hereby repealed as from the fifteenth day of June, 1927, and the following is and the same shall be substituted in lieu thereof and shall come into force on and from the sixteenth day of June, 1927.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Grade Standards for Apples and Pears.

Apples or pears intended for sale shall comply with the following provisions:—

(a) Apples or pears described as "Special" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed apples or pears of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and from disease. Superficial blemishes caused by hail-marks or limb-rubs shall not be allowed to a greater extent than 5 per centum (by number) of the total fruit in any case. The fruit shall not measure less than two and one-quarter inches in diameter, and shall be of good colour for the variety.

(b) Apples or pears described as "Standard" shall consist of sound, clean, well-formed apples or pears of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by black-spot fungus, caterpillars, hail-marks, or limb-rubs may be sold, provided that—

(i) the proportion of such fruit does not exceed 10 per centum (by number) of the apples or pears in any case;

(ii) the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple or pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of one quarter of an inch.

Russetting of the surface shall not be deemed to be a blemish if the skin is unbroken. The fruit shall be not less than two and one-quarter inches in diameter, except in the case of varieties which are normally small, in which case the fruit shall be not less than two inches in diameter.

(c) Apples or pears described as "Plain" shall consist of apples or pears of one size and one variety, free from broken skins, and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by black-spot fungus, caterpillars, hail-marks, or limb-rubs may be sold, provided that—

(i) the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple or pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of half-an-inch.

Russetting of the surface shall not be deemed to be a blemish if the skin is unbroken. In the case of apples the diameter of each fruit shall not be less than two inches.

(d) Apples or pears sold in open packages shall consist of apples or pears of one size and one variety, free from broken skins and not seriously blemished or injured by any disease, but fruit slightly blemished by black-spot fungus, caterpillars, hail-marks, or limb-rubs may be sold, provided that—

(i) the total area covered by such blemishes on any apple or pear does not exceed the area contained in a circle having a diameter of half-an-inch.

Russetting of the surface shall not be deemed to be a blemish if the skin is unbroken. In the case of apples the diameter of each fruit shall not be less than two inches.

And the Honorable William Slater, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW No. 75.

Parking of Vehicles in Bluff-road and Balcombe-road.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham, made under Part VII., Division 11, and section 197, of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and also as Rules and Regulations under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and numbered 75, for regulating traffic, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and public places, and for preventing any obstruction thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the *Police Offences Act 1915*, and of every other power it enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham, order as follows:—

Definition of Vehicle.

1. In this By-law "vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human or animal or mechanical or other power, and includes a motor cycle, but does not include a tram or other car running on fixed rails.

Vehicles not to be left in certain parts of Bluff-road or Balcombe-road.

2. The driver of a vehicle shall not leave the same or any part thereof unattended, or keep the same or any part thereof in one position for the space of ten minutes or upwards in the following parts or any portion of the following parts of Bluff-road or Balcombe-road in the City of Sandringham, viz.:—

- (a) All parts of Bluff-road which are south of a line commencing at the intersection of the east side of Bluff-road with the south side of Karrakatta-street, and running due west across Bluff-road to the west side of Bluff-road.
- (b) All parts of Balcombe-road which are north of the northern rail of the electric street railway line and are west of a line commencing at the intersection of the south side of Balcombe-road with the eastern side of Ebdon-avenue, and running due north across Balcombe-road to the northern side of Balcombe-road.
- (c) All parts of Bluff-road and/or Balcombe-road along the curve joining the north side of Balcombe-road and the east side of Bluff-road which lie between the footpath on such curve and the nearest rail of the said electric street railway.

Application of By-law.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout such parts of the City of Sandringham as are specified in the last preceding clause.

Penalty.

4. Any person who is guilty of any act, breach, or default contrary to the above provisions shall be liable for every offence to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

(D) For regulating the conduct of the owners, drivers, and conductors of motor omnibuses plying as aforesaid within the common prescribed space in their several employments, and determining whether such drivers or conductors shall wear any and what badges, and for regulating the days and hours within which they may exercise their calling.

(E) For regulating, either by relation to the nature and dimensions of the motor omnibus, the number of persons to be carried by motor omnibus plying as aforesaid, and in what manner such number is to be shown upon such carriage, and in what position and manner the lamp where required hereby to be placed inside such motor omnibuses is to be placed thereon.

(F) For fixing the rates or fares, as well for time as for distance, to be paid by passengers in motor omnibuses plying as aforesaid, and the mode in which such rates or fares are to be painted or marked on every such carriage.

The aforesaid Regulation was passed by special order of the Council of the City of Bendigo on the 12th day of May, 1927, and was confirmed by the Council on the 9th day of June, 1927.

REGULATION NUMBER 33.

Relating to Motor Omnibuses.

A REGULATION of the Borough of Eaglehawk, Number 33, made under section 217 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and under section 49 of Part Ten of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1915*, in force in the Borough of Eaglehawk by virtue of a by-law of the above-named Borough, Number 24, for the purposes following, that is to say:—

For the repeal of Regulation Number twenty-four, of the Borough of Eaglehawk, so far as the same relates to motor omnibuses plying for hire as municipal stage carriages.

For fixing the following local matters, namely:—

The standings of motor omnibuses plying for hire as municipal stage carriages, whether separately or otherwise, and the number of such carriages to be allowed at any such standing, and the mode in which such carriages are to stand thereon, and the routes and places of call for motor omnibuses plying as municipal stage carriages, and the time during which each such motor omnibus shall be allowed to remain at any such place, and the times and succession for the starting and the running of such motor omnibuses.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk make the following regulation which shall apply and have operation within the whole of the municipal district, that is to say:—

(1) Regulation twenty-four of the Borough of Eaglehawk is hereby repealed so far as the same relates to motor omnibuses plying for hire as municipal stage carriages.

(2) Throughout this regulation the following words and expressions shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—“The Council” shall mean the Council of the Borough of Eaglehawk.

“Municipal Stage Carriage” shall mean a motor vehicle registered under the *Motor Act 1915*, and used in standing or plying for hire for passengers at separate fares, and which upon every journey goes from or comes to any place within the prescribed space for the Borough of Eaglehawk to or from any other place within such prescribed space.

“Omnibus” and “Motor Omnibus” shall mean a motor vehicle duly registered under the *Motor Car Act 1915*, and licensed to ply for hire as a municipal stage carriage.

(3) The several places specified in the Second Column of the Table set out in the Schedule hereto shall be authorized standings for such class or description and for such number of omnibuses as shall in each case be specified in the First and Third Columns respectively of such table; and the times and succession specified in the Fifth Column of such table shall be the times and succession for the starting and running of omnibuses; and the several places specified in the Fourth Column of such table shall, in each case, be the places of call at which omnibuses of the class or description specified in the First Column may stop a longer time than is necessary for the taking up and setting down of passengers desirous of entering and leaving the same: Provided that any place which may hereafter be appointed by the Council, and which may be indicated by a Notice Board affixed or set up in some conspicuous position at or near to such place, shall, in addition to or substitution for the places specified in the foregoing table or any of them, be an authorized stand for such class or description and for such number of omnibuses, as shall be specified in such Notice Board, or (as the case may be) a place of call at which omnibuses of such class or description as shall be specified in such Notice Board may stop a longer time than is necessary for the taking up or setting down of passengers desirous of entering or leaving the same.

(4) (a) Every driver of an omnibus, when standing for hire, shall station such omnibus on the proper authorized standing by this regulation appointed or hereafter to be appointed by the Council for the class or description of omnibus driven by him.

(b) On arriving at a stand appointed as aforesaid every driver shall station his omnibus immediately in the rear of the omnibus or omnibuses occupying such stand, and in such a position that the front of such omnibus shall be facing the same direction as the front of omnibus stationed on such stand immediately in advance of such last-mentioned omnibus.

(c) When one omnibus shall move off any stand the driver of the omnibus immediately in rear thereof shall move forward so as to fill the place previously occupied by the omnibus moving off such stand.

(d) The drivers of the several omnibuses stationed on such stand in the rear of the omnibus moving forward shall, in succession, cause their omnibuses to move forward so that each shall, in succession, fill the place which shall have been previously occupied immediately in advance of such omnibus by an omnibus moving forward in accordance with the requirements of this regulation.

(5) It shall be incumbent on the front omnibus on each stand to start off on its licensed route on the time as set out in the Fifth Column of the said Schedule hereto immediately next ensuing the taking up of such front position on such stand by such omnibus.

(6) The routes for omnibuses licensed to ply for hire as municipal stage carriages shall be as follows:—

(a) Napier-street, Intersection of Denham-street, to the Boundary of the Borough of Eaglehawk, Wood-street, on the Milroy-street route to the stand at View Point, in the City of Bendigo.

From stand at Napier-street, Intersection of Denham-street, Eaglehawk, along Denham-street, Church-street, Willan-street, Barrell-street, Loudon-street, crossing railway line at Nelson-street Gates, along Sandhurst-road, Dowding-street, Wood-street.

(b) Napier-street, Intersection of Denham-street, to the Boundary of the Borough of Eaglehawk, Sandhurst road, on the Arnold-street route to stand, Pall Mall, in the City of Bendigo.

From stand, Napier-street, Intersection of Denham-street, Eaglehawk, along Denham-street, Church-street, Willan-street, Barrell-street, Loudon-street, crossing railway line at Nelson-street Gates, along Sandhurst-road to Boundary.

(c) Napier-street, Intersection of Panton-street, to the Boundary of the Borough of Eaglehawk, Upper-road, on the Wattle-street route to stand, at View Point, in the City of Bendigo.

From stand, Napier-street, Intersection of Panton-street, Eaglehawk, along Panton-street, Victoria-street, Brown-street, Upper-road, to Boundary.

(7) In addition to or in substitution for the routes specified as above such routes as may from time to time be appointed by the Council by resolution in that behalf.
