PROCEDURE TO BE OBSERVED IN REGARD TO THE LEGALIZATION OF DOCUMENTS BY THE TURKISH AUTHORITIES.

THE following copy of a note received from the Turkish Embassy, through the Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs, relative to the procedure to be observed in regard to the legalization of documents by the Turkish authorities, is published for general information.

TRANSLATION (D.F.N.).

The Embassy of the Turkish Republic has the honour to inform H.B.M.'s Ministry of Foreign Affairs that, according to the terms of a communication from the Republican Government, in order to make a power of attorney (procuration) valid for the purposes of the Turkish judicial authorities, it must be drawn up by a notary public and legalized by the Turkish Consulate, or else directly drawn up by a Consulate of the Republic.

In addition, any document which may have to be produced before a Turkish tribunal must be accompanied by a translation made by a Consulate of the Republic, or by a notary public in Turkey.

The Embassy of the Turkish Republic requests H.B.M.'s Ministry of Foreign Affairs to be good enough to inform the competent authorities to the above effect, and has the honour, &c.

ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Five hundred and sixty-five thousand and eighty-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, and in the eighteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

Cemeteries Act 1915.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE KENMARE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Cemeteries Act 1915, the Trustees of the Kenmare Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say) :-

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the Government Gazette, and from and after such publication all Rules and Regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right of obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On weeks days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a police magistrate, or justice of the peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place on that day; and on payment of the special fee as provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be reopened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

DISTRICT EXTENDED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

ALTERATION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHEPPARTON.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the municipal clerk of the municipal district of the Borough of Shepparton, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the locality to be affected, doth hereby alter the regulations (1) and (2) made on the fifth day of October, 1915, exempting from the Saturday Half-holiday shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Shepparton, and fixing the hours of closing such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays by substituting therefor the following Regulations, that is to say:—

- (1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Shepparton within the municipal district of the Borough of Shepparton shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915* (No. 2650) as amended by section 4 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1919* (No. 3048), so far as the closing hours on Saturday, Friday, and Wednesday are concerned.
- (2) All such shops shall be closed in each and every week during the whole of each year from the hour of—
 - (a) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday,
 - (b) Six o'clock on the evening of Saturday, and
 - (c) Five o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF CLUNES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the municipal district of the Borough of Clunes of the particular classes to be affected, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made on the twenty-seventh day of October, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*) within the municipal district of the Borough of Clunes shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Thursdays.

Separate prices for funerals and removals must be stated for adults, for children above five years, under fourteen years of age, and for children under five years of age including stillborn—one sum is to be stated for each, including interment, conveyance, railway charges, and all other charges whatsoever, except ministers' fees; also for funerals under clause 6 of the conditions.

Tenderers are advised to attach to their tenders lists of their business branches, specifying telephonic connexions, as accessibility and means of prompt communication will be considered in accepting the tenders.

Tenders must state the prices in words as well as in figures, without alterations or erasures.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board for £10 (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The services are to be performed upon an order signed by a member of the Police Force. Under the *Cemeteries Act 1915* (No. 2626), section 50, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of poor persons buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. No claim will be allowed under this contract for any burial respecting which the contractor receives or arranges for any payment whatever from the relatives or friends of the deceased; but in the event of friends or relatives desiring to have the deceased buried in private ground, while availing themselves of the Government funeral they must, in such case, pay all the cemetery charges.

3. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under five years of age, to be provided.

4. The body shall be taken direct to the Necropolis, or to the New Melbourne Cemetery, as the case may be, by rail. Not more than one body shall be carried in the hearse or vehicle at a time. No body shall be retained on the premises of the Contractor. Any infringement of this condition will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £10, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount shall be deducted as in clause 16.

5. Coffins for funerals must be waterproof and sufficiently long, deep, wide, and substantial to bear the corpse and permit it to lie extended at full length, and must be made of 1-in. white pine timber covered with black cloth, and fastened down with screws, and pitched in the seams to prevent leakage. The Contractor shall provide 2 inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

6. In cases of burials of bodies which are, in the opinion of the Department ordering the burial, of a distinctively offensive character, such as of persons drowned and long in the water or such as are in a state of putrefaction from any other cause, or persons who have died from an infectious disease, such bodies shall, on certification of the officer ordering the burial that such precaution is necessary, be placed for burial in zinc-lined coffins, hermetically sealed by soldering the lids of same, such coffins to be provided by the Contractor, of timber 1 inch in thickness.

7. Bodies of deceased persons, with the exception of those provided for under clause 2, must be conveyed to the New Melbourne Cemetery, Fawkner, for burial should the death of such person take place in any sub-district north of the Yarra, excepting bodies buried from the Morgue, and to the Springvale Necropolis should the death take place in any sub-district south of the Yarra, including burials of bodies from the Morgue.

8. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Necropolis and Cemetery Regulations.

9. In the event of the Contractor failing to attend punctually to any order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense incurred, if any, will be charged to the Contractor. Should any circumstance, however, make it necessary in any particular case that an immediate removal to the Morgue be effected, the hiring of another vehicle for the purpose will not be an infringement of the contract.

10. When burials or removals are required to take place on Sunday, or, in the case of any lunatic asylum, burials on the same day as the inquest, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the Necropolis or cemetery authorities in the case of burials will be repaid to the Contractor.

11. The attendance of a minister of the denomination named in the order for the burial must, if practicable, be provided. If for any burial such minister is not available the burial service is to be conducted by the resident chaplain deputed by the denomination, and in cases where no such deputy is appointed by the denomination, or where the religious denomination of the deceased is unknown, the services are to be performed by the resident chaplains alternately, and the Contractor must inform the Police of the hour when the funeral service will take place, so that the friends of the deceased may attend at the cemetery if they wish. Such order to be produced at the cemetery when the Contractor gives the order for interment. The Contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed at the time of the burial, and that he received the fee for so doing. Should the burial service not be performed at the time of the burial no reimbursement will be allowed. The receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

12. Should the religious belief, however, of the deceased preclude the burial being carried out in conformity with the above clause as regards the attendance of the officiating clergyman, the friends of the deceased shall, if practicable, be notified by the police with respect to the service. In the case of foreigners, the Consul of the country to which he is reputed to belong shall also be notified by the Police Department of his decease, in which case, when practicable, he may provide for such service as he may consider necessary.

13. Bodies to be removed to the Morgue shall be placed by the Contractor before removal in shell coffins, zinc lined and water tight, securely closed, and shall be conveyed in suitable covered four-wheeled vehicles. The Contractor shall send two men for the purpose of removing the body to the vehicle, and from the vehicle to the Morgue.

14. Every practicable precaution must be taken in order to prevent offensiveness from decomposition, but in no case of removal must any disinfectant be used without the authority of the medical officer performing the post-mortem examination.

15. Under no circumstances will the Contractor be permitted to use any undue or improper influence with the friends or relatives of, or any other person connected or associated with, the deceased person for the purpose of obtaining any concession or privilege whatsoever in regard to the funeral of such person. Any infringement of this condition will, on report of the Tender Board, subject the Contractor to the immediate cancellation of his contract, the forfeiture of the security money, or such other disqualifications as the Hon. the Treasurer may direct. The decision of the Board as to whether any breach of the condition has taken place to be final and conclusive.

16. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

17. A refusal to execute orders, impropriety, neglect, or delay in conducting the funerals or removals will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted from the Contractor's account or from the security money. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, impropriety, neglect, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the Contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the Contractor may be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

1. 4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. 9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the Land Act 1915 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.

MOOROOPNA HOSPITAL.

THE following By-laws were adopted at a Meeting of Contributors called specially for the purpose on 22nd June, 1927.

F. E. WILLIAMS, President.

1. All By-laws in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, saving all existing rights.

2. These By-laws shall come into operation on the date of the publication of the same in the *Government Gazette*.

3. In these By-laws the word "contributor" shall have the same meaning as in the Act.

The words "the Act" shall mean the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922*, or any amendment thereto.

4. The objects of the Mooroopna Hospital shall be—

- to afford charitable relief, including maintenance and the treatment or cure of, or attention to, any disease or ailment, or any injury consequent on any accident, medical and/or surgical attendance, medicine, nursing assistance, support or aid of any kind or in any form to such persons as are entitled thereto, under the Act;
- to provide facilities for a training school for nurses;
- to provide for carrying out investigation into ailments, diseases, injuries or other matters affecting the human body.

5. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept by the secretary, and shall not be affixed to any deed, instrument or writing except by order of the General Committee at a meeting at which seven members at least are present at the time of making such order.

6. The incorporated institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, and the members of the Committee hereinafter referred to, honorary treasurer, governors and contributors.

7. (a) Any person who was a life governor prior to the commencement of these By-laws shall continue to be such life governor.

(b) Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital, irrespective of subscription, may be elected life governors at any meeting of the General Committee, and shall be entitled to one vote at all general meetings, and to recommend one in-patient and two out-patients in every year.

(c) Any person who at any time has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least Twenty pounds in one donation shall be entitled to be elected a life governor.

(d) Any person who at any time within the twelve months next preceding the date of any meeting or election or any other date in respect of which the question of his being a contributor arises has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least One pound in one donation or produces evidence to the Committee that he has on his own behalf contributed to the institution at least One pound in donations of a less amount shall be a contributor.

(e) Any person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company or firm which at any time within the twelve months aforesaid has contributed to the institution at least One pound in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company or firm, shall be a contributor.

(f) Any person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company, firm, society or club which at any time has contributed at least Forty pounds to the institution in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company, firm, society or club, shall be elected a life governor.

(g) Any person nominated as a contributor by any committee, person or persons who shall organize any public movement with the approval of the Committee or by the employees of any corporation, company or firm, or employer who at any time have contributed at least Forty pounds to the institution in one donation, shall be entitled to be a life governor, or who have at any time within the twelve months aforesaid contributed to the institution at least One pound, whether in one sum or in donations of a less amount, shall be a contributor.

(h) Any person nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will who have allocated at least Fifty pounds to the institution out of any moneys of the testator directed to be paid to the institution under the will, shall be entitled to be elected a life governor.

8. Life governors and contributors shall be entitled to the following privileges:—

- Annual contributors—one vote, and one in and three out-patients annually.
- Life governors—one vote, and recommend three in-patients and six out-patients annually.

9. Recommendations of patients shall be made by tickets as referred to in By-law 8, and shall be used only for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance privately; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the institution admit of their reception.

When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the contributor. Tickets will be issued by the secretary to contributors at time of payment of contribution. Contributors shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the secretary, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and vice versa, one in-patient ticket being equivalent to two out-patients.

10. Every yearly contribution shall be paid in advance, and every first yearly payment shall be calculated from the date of such payment.

11. On all occasions when a poll is taken, life governors and contributors shall have one vote. No salaried officer, paid official, or pupil shall have a vote.

MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.

12. All annual meetings of contributors shall be advertised by the secretary at least twenty-one days, and all special meetings at least seven days before the day on which such meeting is to be held, in such newspapers circulating in the district served by the hospital as the Committee from time to time direct, and failing any such direction then in all newspapers published within 20 miles of the hospital.

13. The annual general meeting of contributors shall be held on some day (except the last) during the month of August in every year, at such time and place as shall be determined by the General Committee, for the following purposes:—

- (a) To confirm the minutes of the previous annual meeting and special meetings (if any), no discussion being permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.
- (b) To receive the report of the general meeting and audited statements of the receipts and expenditure for the year, to the 30th June preceding.
- (c) For the election of president, two vice-presidents, honorary treasurer, and auditors for the ensuing year.
- (d) The election of members of the General Committee for the ensuing year in place of those retiring.
- (e) For the transaction of any business which at least fourteen days' notice has been given.

14. On the day of the annual meeting of contributors, the president, two vice-presidents, honorary treasurer, and one-third part of the number nearest to one-third part of the elected members of the General Committee shall retire from office, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected. The members of the General Committee who so retire shall be—

- (a) all members temporarily appointed by the Committee under By-law 17 (a);
- (b) the members who have been the longest in office without re-election.

15. Any contributor may be elected to any elective office of the institution.

16. No person shall be elected unless at least fourteen days before the day of the annual general meeting there has been delivered to the secretary a written nomination of such person; signed by at least two contributors thereto, and also the written consent of such person.

17. (a) In the event of any casual vacancy in the Committee the remaining members of the Committee may temporarily appoint thereto some contributor. Such contributor so appointed may continue to be a member of the Committee until immediately before the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee, when he shall retire therefrom as one of those persons who are required to go out of office.

(b) In the event of a casual vacancy in the office of president, vice-president, or of any elective officer, the Committee may temporarily appoint to such office some one of its members; and the person so appointed may continue in office until the next annual meeting.

18. If required by the Committee, or upon the requisition in writing of seven members of the Committee, or of twenty-five contributors, the secretary shall, as provided in By-law number 12, convene a special meeting of contributors, the occasion for calling such meeting being stated in such requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting excepting that for which it shall have been summoned.

19. At all meetings of contributors, the president, or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman. The presiding officer shall have a casting vote only.

20. If at any annual or special meeting of the contributors at least ten contributors do not assemble and proceed to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting, no business shall be transacted at that meeting, but in such event there shall be another meeting of contributors at the same place and the same hour of the same day in the following week, and at this meeting any number of contributors exceeding seven shall constitute a meeting.

21. At all meetings of contributors all questions, except questions involving contested elections, shall be decided by a show of hands, unless before or on the declaration of the result a ballot of contributors is demanded by seven contributors, in which event it shall be decided by a ballot. A declaration by the chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands been carried or otherwise and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the fact; provided, however, that where at least seven contributors so demand, any resolution confirming a By-law shall be decided by a poll as hereinafter provided.

22. When a poll is duly demanded, the chairman shall adjourn the meeting, to admit of the ballot being taken, to a day to be fixed by him, not more than twenty-one days, or less than fourteen days, after the day of the adjournment, notice of which shall be advertised in such newspapers circulating in the districts served by the hospital as the Committee shall from time to time direct, and failing such direction then in all newspapers published within 20 miles of the hospital.

23. At all elections, or when a poll shall have been demanded as provided for in By-law number 22, the election or poll, as the case may be, shall be conducted at the institution, or at such other place as the General Committee may deem advisable, at least one clear day before the day appointed for declaring such election or poll.

Governors and contributors shall be allowed to vote by post if living outside the three-mile radius from the Mooropna Post Office. Ballot-papers, with a special envelope on the inside of the flap of which the life governor or contributor must sign his name, shall be sent out by the secretary seven clear days before the day of the election.

Subscribers within the three-mile radius shall record their votes at the polling booth set aside for the purpose, or they may be allowed to vote by post on applying to the secretary, who will issue the necessary ballot-papers and special envelopes which must be signed on the inside of the flap by the life governor or contributor.

All postal ballot-papers must be in the hands of the returning officer at the close of the poll.

Governors and contributors voting shall vote for the full number of candidates to be elected, otherwise the vote shall be declared informal.

24. The General Committee shall appoint from amongst the members a returning officer, who shall conduct the election, and he shall be empowered to appoint deputy returning officers, if such be considered advisable by him.

25. Each candidate may appoint a scrutineer for such election.

MEETINGS OF GENERAL COMMITTEE.

26. The General Committee shall meet at the hospital for general business on the second Wednesday in each month at half-past Two p.m.; or at such other time and place as the Committee may by resolution decide, and for special purposes at such time and place as may be necessary. Seven members of the General Committee shall form a quorum.

27. Notice of all meetings shall be sent to each member by the secretary at least 24 hours before the time of meeting, stating any special business to be considered.

28. The Committee shall proceed to business as soon after the time notified as there is sufficient number of members present to form a quorum; but if at the expiry of 30 minutes from the time specified there is not a quorum present the meeting shall stand adjourned to such day as the members then present shall direct, not more than fourteen days from the day appointed for such meeting.

29. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting have been confirmed, and the minutes of the House and Finance Committees since the previous regular meeting have been read for information, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

30. No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded until one month after such resolution has been passed, and then only by an absolute majority of the Committee.

GENERAL COMMITTEE.

31. Subject to the provisions of section 52 of the Act, the General Committee shall consist of 21 contributors, comprising the president, two vice-presidents, and honorary treasurer *ex officio*, and seventeen elected members.

32. Any general meeting of contributors called for the purpose may alter the number of the members of the General Committee, and every such alteration shall take effect immediately before the annual election of members of the Committee next following the making of the alteration.

33. The General Committee shall have power to appoint such sub-committees in addition to the House and Finance Committees as may be considered necessary.

34. The president and vice-presidents shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees, and the treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Committee.

35. No paid officer of the institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

36. The maximum number of legally qualified medical practitioners who may be members of such Committee shall be one-fourth part of the members of the Committee or the integral number nearest to such one-fourth part.

37. No person shall hold any office or place of profit under the corporation, or be concerned or participate in any way in any contract with the General Committee, or in the profit thereof, or of any work to be done under the authority of the same, shall be capable of being or continuing a member of such General Committee, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty members when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, nor to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

But no member of the General Committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter in or before the General Committee in which he shall, directly or indirectly, by himself or his partners, have any pecuniary interest.

38. The General Committee shall control the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all officials and servants, frame rules and/or regulations, for the management of the hospital, present a report to the annual meetings, and manage the affairs of the institution generally.

39. All accounts for payment shall be passed by the General Committee, and the list signed at the meeting by the chairman.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

40. The General Committee shall, at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors, appoint from amongst themselves a House Committee of twelve members, five to form a quorum. The House Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting.

41. The House Committee shall meet once at least in each fortnight, and oftener if necessary, and shall have power to admit patients, and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals between meetings; they shall inquire into all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the institution, recording in the minutes the reason for the non-admission or for dismissal. The House Committee may suspend any officer of the institution, pending inquiry by the General Committee; it may engage and discharge nurses, trainees, and servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly or yearly tenders, and recommend any to the General Committee for acceptance; it shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally.

Some of its members shall fortnightly inspect the wards, kitchen, and other portions of the institution; it shall check the tradesmen's monthly bills, and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the Finance Committee for payment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the institution, under the direction of the General Committee. The House Committee shall make a report in writing to each monthly meeting of the Committee.

FINANCE.

42. A Finance Committee consisting of the treasurer and four other members shall be elected annually by and from the General Committee, at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors. The Finance Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting, and three members shall form a quorum.

43. The Finance Committee shall meet at least once in each month, and shall examine the secretary's cash and other books of account, and compare same with bank pass-book; check additions, and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the treasurer; it shall give all needful instructions to the secretary with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment and submit the same to the General Committee at the monthly meetings, and shall, in conjunction with the president or a member of the General Committee appointed for the purpose, and secretary be empowered to make necessary special payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings; it shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly receipted, and shall examine the returns prepared for Government, and annual statements of accounts.

44. In all cases where books and vouchers are checked by the House or Finance Committees, the signature of some member thereof shall be appended with the date of examination.

45. The secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the institution, and issue official receipt forthwith. Such moneys to be deposited without delay to the credit of the institution in such bank as the General Committee may from time to time determine.

46. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by two members of the Committee and countersigned by the secretary.

47. Previous to signing any cheques for payment, the treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the president or chairman of the meeting of the General Committee, at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the secretary; special payments may, nevertheless, be made during the month, in accordance with By-law No. 43, such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the Committee.

48. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of treasurer, the General Committee may appoint another to hold office until the next annual meeting.

49. Two auditors shall be elected, at the annual meeting each year, and remuneration to be paid to them, if any, shall be then fixed.

In default of such appointment, the General Committee shall make the appointment, and in the event of any vacancy occurring, the General Committee shall fill same.

50. The auditors shall have access to the books and accounts of the institution at all times, and shall, if they consider it necessary, report to the General Committee.

51. The auditors shall, during July in each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial statement, with all books, accounts, and documents relating thereto, and list of contributions and donations, and shall verify to their correctness, and make any special report thereon which they consider necessary to the annual meeting.

SECRETARY.

52. The secretary shall be the chief executive officer of the institution, and he shall be responsible for the due observance by the corporate body of the provisions of the Act in force for the time being relating to hospitals, regulations under the Act, conditions of grant, and all other regulations that may from time to time be issued.

He shall attend all general and special meetings of contributors, all meetings of the General and other Committees; take minutes of the proceedings, and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose; he shall keep the records of the institution, conduct all correspondence, call all meetings, giving proper notice thereof, and carry out the directions given to him by any of the Committees.

53. He shall be responsible for the conduct of all clerical business, and shall keep the necessary books of accounts, under the direction of the Finance Committee.

54. He shall compile all necessary returns, statements and reports required by the Government, and by any of the Committees.

55. He shall devote his time exclusively to the service of the hospital, and, under the direction of the General Committee, he shall, as secretary, be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all By-laws and Regulations of the institution; he shall comply with the Regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.

56. He shall enter into a guarantee for the sum of £300 in some guarantee company approved of the General Committee. The General Committee shall be responsible for the payment of the premium on such guarantee.

57. He shall have the power to suspend any member of the nursing staff after consultation with the senior resident medical officer and the matron. He shall have the power to suspend or dismiss any other employee, and, if necessary, appoint a temporary substitute. Any such suspension or dismissal shall be reported to the House Committee at its next meeting.

58. He shall also hold the position of house steward, and shall, under the direction of the House Committee, order, receive, examine, take charge of, and distribute all articles supplied, and be responsible for the cleanliness and good order of the buildings and grounds.

59. He shall collect subscriptions and donations to the funds of the institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the Committee. He shall furnish to contributors from whom he receives contributions of £1 and upwards the necessary admission tickets. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least in every week, he shall copy all entries in a duplicate book to be kept at the institution.

60. The Committee shall, if it thinks fit, appoint a collector from time to time, and make regulations prescribing his duties.

HONORARY TREASURER.

61. The duties of the honorary treasurer shall be to supervise the receipt of all moneys and the payment of all accounts which have been passed by the Committee. He shall see that proper accounts of receipts and payments are kept in the books provided for that purpose, which shall be laid before the Committee at each monthly meeting. He shall see that all moneys are deposited to the hospital account in such banks and in such form as the Committee shall direct. He shall cause to be prepared by the secretary quarterly returns and statements, satisfying himself that the items and additions are correct, and sign such returns. He shall present an annual financial statement to the annual meeting.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

62. The honorary medical staff shall be responsible to the General Committee for the welfare and the treatment of the patients in the hospital.

63. The honorary medical staff shall consist of duly qualified medical practitioners, who must be members of the British Medical Association, and who must reside not more than ten miles from the hospital. The General Committee shall have power at any time to increase or reduce the number of the honorary staff.

64. There shall be seven honorary medical officers, who, in consultation with an Advisory Board, shall arrange the medical and surgical work of the hospital amongst themselves in the manner best calculated to ensure efficiency.

65. Immediately these By-laws come into force, the General Committee shall make the first appointments to the honorary medical staff, in accordance with By-laws 63, 64.

66. Except as provided in By-law 65, the honorary medical staff shall be elected by the General Committee after receiving the report of an Advisory Board.

67. The Advisory Board shall consist of seven members, four (one of whom shall be the president) being chosen by the General Committee from amongst its members, but excluding

committeemen practising as medical practitioners, two shall be chosen by the members of the honorary medical staff from amongst themselves, and one by the Goulburn Valley Branch of the British Medical Association.

The members of the Advisory Board shall be chosen in the month of September of each year, and shall hold office until their successors shall have been elected. Any casual vacancy may be filled for the remainder of the annual term from the body amongst whose representatives the vacancy has occurred. Four members to form a quorum. The president, who shall be chairman; shall have a deliberative vote, and, if necessary, a casting vote.

63. Should any of the appointments to the Advisory Board not be made by the honorary medical staff, or the Goulburn Valley Branch of the British Medical Association, within four weeks of the vacancy occurring, the General Committee shall have power to fill such position or positions from amongst its own members.

69. The Advisory Board shall meet as soon as possible after its appointment, in order to arrange with the honorary medical staff for the carrying on of the medical and surgical work of the hospital, and thereafter as often as convened by the president, in order to report to the General Committee on applications for positions on the honorary medical staff, and on applications for the positions of resident medical officers.

70. The members of the honorary medical staff first appointed under By-law 65 shall hold office for a period of one, two, or three years, as shall be determined by lot immediately after their appointment. Two shall retire after one year, two after two years, and three after three years, and shall be eligible for re-election. Thereafter all honorary medical officers, except those appointed to casual vacancies, shall be elected for a period of three years; in the case of casual vacancies the method of election shall be as already provided for, and the medical officer so appointed shall hold office for the unexpired portion of the term of the medical officer to whose position he has been elected, and shall be eligible for re-election.

71. Should any member of the honorary medical staff neglect to perform or fulfil his duties satisfactorily, the General Committee, after having referred such matter to, and having received a report thereon from the Advisory Board, shall have the power to remove such medical officer, and appoint a substitute for the unexpired portion of his term.

Each honorary medical officer shall give the necessary attention to and instructions regarding the patients under his care, and shall record in a book kept for the purpose the date and hour of each visit; he shall also see that the necessary history sheets and records concerning his patients are properly kept.

72. The total bed accommodation of the hospital shall be equitably divided amongst the members of the honorary medical staff.

The secretary shall prepare a bed list in accordance with this principle.

The senior resident medical officer shall have charge of the bed list and shall admit patients under the various members of the honorary medical staff in such a way as to ensure to them an equitable distribution of all cases.

Notwithstanding the foregoing a member of the honorary medical staff may request in writing the admission of a particular patient under his care, but if he be at the time not entitled to an admission, he shall forego the next patient who otherwise would have been admitted under his care.

No patient shall be permitted to exercise a choice as to which member of the honorary medical staff shall treat him, but this shall not apply to any patient suffering from any infectious disease.

75. Every honorary medical officer on the staff shall vacate such office and be ineligible for re-appointment on attaining the age of 60 years, but as regards any member of the honorary medical staff appointed at the time these By-laws first come into operation, the General Committee may by a three-fourths majority of those present at a meeting, extend the retiring age.

74. The General Committee may appoint as consulting medical officer any medical officer who has served as an honorary medical officer to the institution for a period ten years, and has ceased to hold such office.

75. The consulting medical officer shall only attend the hospital in consultation with, and at the request of the medical officer in charge of the case.

76. All appointments on the honorary medical staff, except those first appointed under By-law 65, shall commence from 1st January in each year.

The members of the honorary medical staff shall meet at the institution once in every month, and oftener if necessary, to consider matters which may be referred to them by the secretary or which may arise in the course of their professional duties at the institution.

They shall appoint their own chairman, who shall have a deliberative vote; and, if necessary, a casting vote; and the secretary shall act as secretary.

Minutes of the proceedings shall be kept by the secretary, and any necessary reports made through him to the House or General Committees.

77. During the absence of a member of the honorary medical staff his duties shall be carried out by his fellow members as the chairman of the staff shall decide.

78. The honorary medical staff shall in all respects comply with the By-laws and Regulations of the institution.

RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF.

79. The resident medical staff shall consist of one senior resident medical officer and one junior resident medical officer, but such staff may be varied from time to time by the General Committee when deemed necessary.

80. The appointment of each shall be for a period of twelve months, or such other period as the General Committee may determine.

81. The General Committee shall reserve the right to terminate the appointment on giving four weeks' notice of intention to do so.

82. The appointment of resident medical officers shall be made by the General Committee, after receiving a report on the applicants from the Advisory Board.

SENIOR RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

83. The senior resident medical officer shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner, who shall not engage in private practice, but shall devote his whole time and attention to the duties of his office. He shall, for preference, be a man who has had previous experience for at least one year as a member of a metropolitan hospital staff.

84. He shall exercise a general supervision over all patients in the hospital, and he shall be responsible, under the honorary medical officers, for the carrying out of such instructions as are given in regard to the treatment of cases, and shall at once report to the honorary medical officer in charge of a case any special circumstances or conditions which may arise, and act to the best of his judgment pending the attendance of the honorary medical officer.

85. He shall attend all accident cases and other urgent cases without delay, and shall report without undue delay all patients admitted to the honorary medical officers concerned.

86. He shall at once report in writing to the secretary any misconduct or neglect of duty which may come to his knowledge, and if such complaint be not attended to, he shall report the same in writing to the House Committee at their next meeting.

87. He shall have charge of all instruments and appliances, both medical and surgical, as well as all drugs and medicines, and shall submit an inventory of the same to the House Committee, through the secretary, at least once a quarter.

88. He shall from time to time requisition to the House Committee for such instruments and appliances, drugs and medicines as may be required, such requisition to be countersigned by two members of the honorary medical staff.

89. He shall not conduct or allow any post-mortem examination without first notifying the secretary, and obtaining the written authority of the honorary medical officer who attended the deceased, or of the House Committee (unless directed by the Coroner); but in the event of such honorary medical officer requiring such examination, the whole of the honorary medical staff shall be notified of the time of same. A post-mortem may be carried out only if no objection has been lodged by a responsible relative within twelve hours of death, or by the patient to a responsible officer of the institution prior to his death.

90. He shall be responsible for all matters connected with the care of the patients and sanitary arrangements of the hospital, and for the administration of the out-patient department. He shall make such arrangements as will ensure that he and the junior resident medical officer are not absent from the institution at the same time.

91. He shall lecture, if required, to the members of the nursing-staff on a set programme to be approved of by the House Committee.

92. In the absence of the junior resident medical officer, the senior resident medical officer shall attend to his duties in addition to his own.

JUNIOR RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

93. The junior resident medical officer shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner who shall not engage in private practice but shall devote his whole time to the duties of his office.

94. He shall be under the direction of the senior resident medical officer, whose instructions he shall strictly carry out. He shall perform the duties of the senior resident medical officer during the absence of that officer.

95. Till a dispenser shall be appointed the junior resident medical officer shall act as dispenser.

MATRON.

96. There shall be a matron appointed by the General Committee on such terms and conditions as may from time to time be determined. Her duties shall be set out in the Regulations, and she shall be properly registered under the Nurses Registration Act 1923, or any amendment thereof, and shall hold, in addition to her general certificate, her obstetric certificate.

OPERATIONS.

97. No one shall be present at the time of any operation or post-mortem examination except such persons as may be connected with the institution or members of the medical profession.

98. The senior resident medical officer shall post in the honorary staff room a list of operations to be performed from day to day.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

99. Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the resident medical officer cannot be delayed may be received at any time without ticket (provision for obtaining a ticket after three days in residence must be made), and

the admission of patients in ordinary cases, recommended by subscribers' tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) by the secretary and the honorary medical staff, or, in the absence of such staff, by the secretary and resident medical officers; such admissions to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

100. Every in-patient and every out-patient who is admitted into or maintained by, or received any relief from the institution shall be liable to contribute towards the funds of the institution according to his or her means. Patients shall pay such fees as may be fixed by the House Committee, and the payment of same must be made weekly. In addition to the amount so due such person shall, if he obtained admission in consequence of any false statement made by him regarding his circumstances, be liable to pay to the institution a sum of not more than Twenty pounds, recoverable in a court of petty sessions.

101. No insane person, except on remand for medical examination; no one having a contagious or infectious disease, except in the wards provided for such respective purpose; nor any one who, in the opinion of the honorary medical staff or the senior resident medical officer, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; nor, except under special circumstances, shall patients be admitted from other districts where hospitals exist. Provided that the House Committee or officers of the institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases.

OUT-PATIENTS.

102. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either), but not requiring admission to the institution shall be treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a governor or contributor.

REGULATIONS.

103. The Committee shall have power from time to time to make, repeal or alter Regulations not inconsistent with these By-laws generally for the internal management of the hospital, and in particular for prescribing the duties of the honorary resident medical officers, matron, sisters, nurses, trainees, probationers, and all other members of the staff of the hospital, and for the more efficient carrying out of these By-laws.

BY-LAWS.

104. All alterations, amendments, or additions to the By-laws shall be made at a meeting called specially for the purpose, such meeting to be advertised twice in such newspapers circulating in the districts served by the hospital as the Committee shall from time to time direct, and failing such direction then in all newspapers published within 20 miles of the hospital, at least seven days before the meeting at which the same are to be considered, and such alterations, amendments, or additions shall be made available to subscribers. 6455
