## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Three million and forty thousand eight hundred and twenty-two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight and One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and in the nineteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, in pursuance of the provisions of section 18 of the Education Act 1915, hereby—

- (1) amend Regulation XXIX.(a) made under the aforesaid Act by deleting "VI." in clause (a); and
- (2) add to Regulation XI. made under the aforesaid Act, by inclusion of the following:—

## XI.(M).—SPECIAL TEACHER'S CERTIFICATE.

A Special Teacher's Certificate will be granted upon examination in the subjects specified below:—

## 1. Practical Work.—

(a) Handwork.—As for 1st Class Infant Teacher's Certificate with certain additions. Candidates will be expected to show skill in making suitable articles, and ability to teach work involving the use of raffia, beads, canvas and wool, waste materials, leather work, wood staining and polishing, and some form of original work.

Account will be taken of work produced by children under supervision of candidate.

(b) Mental Testing.—Ability to apply individual and group tests of intelligence, as judged by efficiency in and suitability for this work when testing under observation. Candidates will be expected to show full familiarity with some revision of the Binet Test, with some accepted group test, and with at least one type of performance test.

## 2. Written Records and Theoretical Work.—

(a) Case Studies.—Each candidate to hand in a note-book containing half-a-dozen case-studies (or fewer, if very extensive ones) carried out by the candidate. These should refer to cases of the type likely to be included in special grades. If possible, reference should be made to remedial work actually carried out with the case.

(b) Theoretical Work.—Candidates will sit for an examination which will be based on the following main topics:—

- (1) Principles underlying the theory and use of tests of intelligence.
- (2) The psychology of individual differences, i.e., a study of the main directions in which children differ from one another, and the educational significance of these differences.
- (3) The psychology of educational abilities, e.g., the relation between general ability and school success; the existence of special subject weaknesses, &c.
- (4) Causes of abnormalities of behaviour (e.g., delinquency) in the light of modern psychology.

3. Before the certificate is granted, candidates will be expected to have successfully conducted an "Opportunity Class" for at least twelve months, or in some other way to have demonstrated ability and suitability for dealing with exceptional children.

*Order and Certificate.*

16. If after reasonable inquiry such officer is satisfied that the applicant requires such cyanide for the lawful purpose specified in the application, he shall give to the applicant a written order in the form set out in Form G in the schedule, addressed to the seller, authorizing such seller to sell to the applicant the cyanide mentioned in such order, and stating therein the purpose for which it is required. He shall also give to the applicant a certificate in the Form II in the said schedule. No fee is payable in respect of any certificate or order.

*Duty of Vendors.*

17. No vendor shall sell or deliver any cyanide to the purchaser unless the purchaser presents the said order and certificate before the sale or delivery to him.

*Procedure where Full Quantity Authorized is not Purchased at one Time.*

18. Should any quantity of cyanide be sold less than authorized in the order the vendor shall at the time of sale endorse on the order and certificate particulars of the date of sale and the quantity actually sold, and shall sign the same, and the purchaser shall also sign it. At any time after the expiration of the time mentioned in the order and certificate as the period in which the poison actually sold is intended to be used the vendor may sell to the same person any quantity of the same poison sufficient to make up the difference between the amount already sold to such person and the quantity mentioned in the order, provided that the vendor shall endorse the particulars of each sale on the said order and certificate, and the purchaser shall sign such endorsement.

*Validity of Order and Certificate.*

19. No order or certificate shall have any validity whatsoever for the purpose of sale or purchase of cyanide after the full quantity of cyanide mentioned therein has been purchased in accordance with the provisions of the order and certificate, nor after six months from its issue.

*Retention of Orders and Certificates.*

20. The vendor shall retain the order and preserve it as a record for not less than three years. The purchaser shall retain the certificate as long as he has any cyanide in his possession. The vendor shall produce the order and the purchaser shall produce the certificate to any police officer or inspector of the Board on demand.

*Poisons Book.*

21. At the time of sale and before delivery of any cyanide the vendor shall fill in and the purchaser shall sign the entry in the poisons book kept under the Principal Act.

*False Information.*

22. Any person giving any false information in answer to any question prescribed by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

*Possession of Cyanide.*

23. No person (other than an authorized person) shall have any cyanide in his possession unless he holds a permit or a certificate in the prescribed form.

No person (other than an authorized person) shall have any cyanide in his possession, or use or cause to be used at any place any quantity of cyanide in excess of that specified in the permit or certificate.

*Disposal of Cyanide.*

24. No person in possession of cyanide shall dispose of any cyanide or use or permit the same to be used except in accordance with the Act and Regulations.

*No Gift of Cyanide.*

25. No person shall dispose of any cyanide by gift.

*Custody and Labelling of Containers.*

26. Cyanide shall in all cases be kept by the person who possesses it in safe custody in a closed container duly labelled in accordance with the Poisons Acts and when not in use under lock and key.

*Questions to be Asked of Applicant for Certificate and Order.*

27. Each applicant to a police officer for an order and certificate to purchase cyanide shall truthfully answer the questions put to him by such officer. The questions set out in Form F in the schedule or questions to the same effect shall be asked by the officer. The questions and answers shall be dated and shall be signed by the applicant and the officer.

*Vendor's Questions.*

28. Each purchaser of cyanide on an order and certificate shall truthfully answer the questions put to him by the vendor. The questions set out in Form I in the schedule shall be asked by the vendor.

*Conditions of Sale by Wholesale Dealers and Authorized Persons.*

29. Every wholesale dealer and authorized person entitled to sell cyanide shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) Shall safely keep all cyanide in his possession in a suitable receptacle securely locked and branded legibly and distinctly "Poison" in red letters.

(b) On sale of any cyanide shall—

(I) Deliver the same to the purchaser securely and safely contained in a substantial package so as to avoid risk of breakage or leakage.

(2) Label both the package itself and any other covering or wrapper with the words "Poison" (and in large letters) "CYANIDE OF POTASSIUM," together with the name and address of the vendor.

(c) Shall comply with the other provisions of these Regulations with respect to the production of permits, orders, and certificates entries in the Poisons Book, and signature of purchaser, sales by correspondence, &c.

(d) Shall satisfy himself before the sale is completed of the purpose for which the cyanide is required by the purchaser.

*Conditions of Sales by Correspondence.*

30. In cases where sales and purchases of cyanide are made by correspondence the following conditions shall apply:—

(a) The purchaser shall forward the permit or order and certificate with his letter; or,

(b) If by telegram shall—(1) state in the telegram that he holds a permit or an order and certificate; and (2) shall forward it to the vendor by the next post or produce it to him within forty-eight hours of the purchase.

(c) The vendor must not sell or forward cyanide to any correspondent who is unknown to him.

(d) The letter, telegram, and order shall be preserved by the vendor. The permit or certificate shall be returned by the vendor forthwith to the purchaser.

*Sales by Wholesale Dealers.*

31. A wholesale dealer is entitled to sell cyanide in the ordinary course of wholesale dealing, subject to the provisions of the Poisons Act 1915 of the Act and of these Regulations, to any authorized person holding a permit, or for mining purposes, or for trade purposes, but not for resale.

*Inquiries and Entries.*

32. Every wholesale dealer who sells or disposes of any cyanide shall before delivery thereof to the purchaser inquire his name, place of abode, and occupation, and the purpose for which such cyanide is required, and shall thereupon make a faithful entry of such sale, specifying the cyanide and the quantity thereof, and all such particulars so given by the purchaser, together with the day of the month and the year of such sale in a book to be kept by the wholesale dealer for that purpose in the form following, namely:—

33. Every such entry shall be signed by the person making the same and also by the purchaser, unless he declares himself unable to write, in which event the person making the entry shall add thereto the words "Purchaser cannot write."

*Poisons Book.*

34. The Poisons Book required to be kept by the Principal Act by vendors of poisons shall be the book in which an entry must be made at the time of sale of any cyanide in accordance with section 7 of the Act.

*Form of Warrant.*

35. The warrant mentioned in section 10 of the Act may be in the form or to the effect of Form J in the schedule.

declared the deviation on the land described in the First Schedule to such Resolution to be a developmental road and has also declared that such deviation shall be in lieu of the part of the existing road being the land described in the Second Schedule to such Resolution and that such part of the said existing road shall be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.

*Resolution for Declaration of a Deviation under the Developmental Roads Act.*

COREENA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.—DISTRICT EXTENDED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

That the Coreena Waterworks District be extended by adding to the same the lands set out and described in the schedule hereto, and as on and from the first day of July, 1928, such district shall be deemed to be so extended.

SCHEDULE.

Those lands comprised within the following boundaries:— Commencing at the north-eastern angle of the Parish of Gayfield, County of Karkaroo; thence generally westerly by the northern and southerly by the western boundaries of the said parish to its south-western angle; thence generally north-easterly by the southern boundaries of allotments 33, 34, 31, 29, 28, and 16, Parish of Gayfield, and lines connecting those boundaries to the eastern boundary of the said parish; thence generally northerly by the said parish boundary to the point of commencement.

Electric Light and Power Act 1915.

ELECTRIC SUPPLY (PUBLIC PROTECTION)  
REGULATIONS 1928.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Electric Light and Power Act 1915, section 14, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the protection of the persons and property of the public, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electric Supply (Public Protection) Regulations 1928.

2. These Regulations shall come into force on the date on which they are published in the Government Gazette.

3. No person shall within 50 yards of any electric line or works of any undertakers in any street kick any football to a height more than 15 feet above the ground or in such manner or direction that any such line works or apparatus may be hit.

4. No person shall fly any kite balloon or other object in such manner or direction that such object may come in contact with any electric line works or apparatus of any undertakers in any street or road.

5. No person shall without permission of the undertakers pull or interfere with any kite string or appendage wire or similar object improperly resting on or entangled in any electric wire or works in any street or road unless such act be reasonably necessary to obviate danger to persons or property.

6. No person shall throw or project or cause to be thrown or projected any missile or thing or fire any shot or bullet with intent to hit any electric line or works or apparatus of any undertakers being in any street or road or in such manner or direction that any such line works or apparatus may be hit.

7. No person shall fell any tree standing or lop any branch being within 50 yards of any electric line of any undertakers unless such precautions have been taken as in the opinion of the court having cognizance of the matter are ample to prevent the tree or (as the case may be) the branch from striking such line.

8. Any person who commits a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

9. Any member of the Police Force may act as informant in any prosecution for breach of any of these Regulations.

And the Honorable T. Tunnecliffe, His Majesty's Minister in Charge of Electrical Undertakings for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Harbour Boards Act 1927.***REGULATIONS RELATING TO ELECTIONS OF ELECTED MEMBERS OF THE WARRNAMBOOL HARBOUR BOARD.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne,  
the tenth day of July, 1928.*

**PRESENT:**

His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria.

**W**HEREAS by sub-section (8) of section 11 of the *Harbour Boards Act 1927* (No. 3560); it is provided that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to any matter authorized or required to be prescribed under this section, or necessary or convenient to be prescribed for carrying into effect the purposes of this Act relating to elections of elected members of or the constitution of Harbour Boards.

And whereas it is expedient to give effect to the provisions of sub-section (8) of section 11 referred to so as to apply to the election of elected members of the Warrnambool Harbour Board constituted under the provisions of the said Act, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

**PROCEEDINGS TO BE TAKEN FOR ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.**

All proceedings shall be had and taken as nearly as may be as upon an annual election of Councillors under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, with such alterations, modifications, and substitutions as are necessary to extend and apply for the purposes of this Act (excluding any provisions relating to voting by post).

**PREFERENTIAL VOTING**

Preferential voting shall apply only to the election of two members of the subdivision of the municipal district of the City of Warrnambool.

The procedure to be followed to give effect thereto is set forth in the schedule to these Regulations.

**VOTERS' ROLL.**

The voters' roll to be used for the election of members of the Board shall include the names of every person whose name is inscribed on the municipal roll in force for the municipal district in respect of any property rateable, to the municipality and situate within the subdivisions hereafter set forth and described, and every person whose name is included on the voters' roll aforesaid shall be entitled to one vote and no more.

The following persons are hereby appointed to make out voters' rolls for the respective subdivisions to which they are appointed in conformity with the above provisions, and after such rolls have been certified to as correct they shall be printed, and every roll so printed shall be deemed the voters' roll for the subdivision to which the same refers.

**Persons Appointed to make out Voters' Rolls.**

- First Subdivision.—Thomas Fullarton Little
- Second Subdivision.—Richard Laffan.
- Third Subdivision.—Norman Frederic Turnbull.
- Fourth Subdivision.—Lorenzo Crawley.
- Fifth Subdivision.—Henri James Worland.

The following municipal districts, or portions of municipal districts, comprise the following five subdivisions of the Warrnambool Harbour Board:—

- (1) The west riding of the municipal district of the Shire of Heytesbury (excluding the Parish of Jancourt), and the Parishes of Koort-Koort-Nong, Kilnoorat, Marida Yallock, Glenormiston, and Terang, and the part of the Parish of Garvoc included within the boundaries of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden.
- (2) The parts of the Parishes of Yarpiurk and Yangery within the boundaries of the municipal district of the Borough of Koroit.

- (3) The Parishes of Darlington, West, Toorak, Hexham East, Hexham West, Yeth-Young, Connemarren, Mortlake, Wooriwyrite, Kolora, Ellerslie, Ballangeich, Framlingham East, and Keilmambet, and the parts of the Parishes of Chatsworth, Chatsworth West, and Garvoc, within the boundaries of the municipal district of the Shire of Mortlake, and the Parishes of Pom Pom, Nareeb Nareeb, and Boorpool, and the parts of the Parishes of Chatsworth, Chatsworth West, and Caramut within the boundaries of the municipal district of the Shire of Mount Rouse.
- (4) The municipal district of the Shire of Warrnambool.
- (5) The municipal district of the City of Warrnambool.

**RETURNING OFFICERS.**

The following persons are appointed Returning Officers for the following subdivisions for the purpose of this election:—

- First Subdivision.—Thomas Fullarton Little.
- Second Subdivision.—Richard Laffan.
- Third Subdivision.—Norman Frederic Turnbull.
- Fourth Subdivision.—Lorenzo Crawley.
- Fifth Subdivision.—Henri James Worland.

The Returning Officer may, by writing under his hand, appoint a deputy to assist him, or to act in his room at any such election, and such deputy may do all for any of the acts or things which the Returning Officer is authorized or required to do.

**VOTER TO VOTE ONCE AT THE SAME ELECTION.**

No person whose name is included on any voters' roll for any subdivision of the Harbour Board shall be entitled to vote more than once in any such subdivision, and no person having once demanded and received any ballot-paper and voted by the same shall at the same election receive any other such paper or exercise any further right of voting.

**POLLING PLACES.**

The following polling places (localities) are hereby appointed for the taking of the poll for the election of members of the Board in the following subdivisions:—

- First Subdivision.—Cobden, Cobrico, Dixie, Timboon, Scott's Creek, South Eeklin, Curdies River, and Ellengamite, within the Shire of Heytesbury, and Terang, Noorat, Booka, Glenormiston South, and Naroghid, in the Shire of Hampden.
- Second Subdivision.—Koroit.
- Third Subdivision.—Mortlake, Ellerslie, The Sisters, Ballangeich, Hexham, and Framlingham East in the Shire of Mortlake, and Chatsworth in the Shire of Mount Rouse.
- Fourth Subdivision.—Caramut, Woolsthorpe, Winslow, Mailor's Flat, Illova, Dennington, Purnim, Framlingham, Allansford, Cudgee, Fanniture, Garvoc, and Mepunga.
- Fifth Subdivision.—Warrnambool.

The Returning Officer appointed for each subdivision shall appoint for the taking of the poll some building within the locality specified in these Regulations for the purpose.

**TIMES FOR TAKING POLL.**

The poll shall in the case of the Fifth Subdivision commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon, and in the remaining subdivisions the poll shall commence at Eight o'clock in the forenoon and close at Five o'clock in the afternoon.

**MUNICIPAL CLERKS TO FURNISH INFORMATION TO RETURNING OFFICERS AND PERSONS APPOINTED TO MAKE OUT VOTERS' ROLLS.**

It shall be the duty of the Municipal Clerk of every municipality comprised in any subdivision of the Warrnambool Harbour Board on the request in writing by any person appointed under these Regulations to act as Returning Officer or to make out a voters' roll to furnish forthwith any information required by such person for the purposes of the election of elected members of the Warrnambool Harbour Board.

**PENALTIES.**

Any person guilty of any breach of the Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

**SCHEDULE.*****Preferential Voting as Applied to the Subdivision of the City of Warrnambool.***

1. The following provisions shall apply at all elections where two members are required to be elected for the same subdivision.

***How Votes to be Marked by Voter.***

2. When a person receives a ballot-paper instead of striking out the name of any candidate for whom he does not intend to vote he shall mark his vote on the ballot-paper by placing the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference and shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

***Invalid Ballot-papers.***

3. A ballot-paper shall be rejected at the close of the poll if it does not indicate the voter's first preference for one candidate and his contingent votes for all the remaining candidates.

***Returning Officer to Ascertain Results of Polling.***

4. The Returning Officer shall in manner hereinafter provided ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate.

***Procedure where only Two Candidates.***

5. Where there are only two candidates both candidates shall be declared duly elected.

***Procedure where more than Two Candidates.***

6. At elections where there are more than two candidates the procedure by the Returning Officer and Deputy Returning Officers to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate shall be as follows:—

(1) Immediately upon the close of the poll the Returning Officer and every Deputy Returning Officer at the polling-place at which each presides shall in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) and of no other persons—

- (a) open the ballot-box at the polling-booth at which he presides;
- (b) arrange the ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected;
- (c) count all such first preference votes given for each candidate respectively;
- (d) make and keep a record of the number of votes counted from each ballot-box; and
- (e) abstain himself from inspecting the writing upon the back of the ballot-papers and take care that the same is not seen by any person.

(2) Each Deputy Returning Officer shall—

- (a) certify a list of the number of such first preference votes given for each candidate at the polling-place at which he presides and transmit such certified list to the Returning Officer together with sealed parcels containing the ballot-papers and copy of voters' roll.

(3) The Returning Officer shall—

- (a) make out in respect of the polling-booth at which he presides a list of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) seal up in separate parcels in respect of the said polling-booth the ballot-papers and voters' roll in like manner as is required in the case of Deputy Returning Officers.

(4) The Returning Officer shall as soon as practicable—

- (a) ascertain from the certified lists received from Deputy Returning Officers the number of first preference votes given for each candidate; and
- (b) add the first preference votes so given for each candidate to the votes counted by himself in favour of each such candidate so as to ascertain for the whole subdivision the number of first preference votes polled by each candidate respectively.

***Counting of Votes by Returning Officer.***

7. The Returning Officer shall with the assistance of such officers as he deems necessary and in the presence and subject to the inspection of such of the scrutineers as choose to be present and the poll clerk (if any) but of no other persons—

- (a) open all the sealed parcels containing used ballot-papers;

- (b) arrange such ballot-papers by placing in separate parcels all those on which a first preference is indicated for the same candidate and the full contingent votes are also given for all the remaining candidates omitting ballot-papers which require to be rejected.

***Ascertaining Result of Poll.***

8. (1) The first vacancy shall be filled in the following manner:—

- (a) The candidate who has received the largest number of first preference votes shall if that number constitutes an absolute majority of votes be elected;
- (b) If no candidate has received an absolute majority of first preference votes a second count shall be made by the Returning Officer,
- (c) On the second count the candidate who has received the fewest first preference votes shall be excluded and each ballot-paper counted to him shall be counted to the candidate next in order of the voter's preference;
- (d) If a candidate then has an absolute majority of votes he shall be elected, but if no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the process of excluding the candidate who has the fewest votes and counting each of the ballot-papers to the continuing candidate next in order of the voter's preference shall be repeated until one candidate has received an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary) and the candidate who has received an absolute majority of votes shall be elected.

(2) The second vacancy shall be filled in the following manner:—

- (a) The Returning Officer shall re-arrange all the ballot-papers under the names of the respective candidates in accordance with the first preference votes indicated thereon except that each ballot-paper on which a first preference vote for the elected candidate is indicated shall be placed in the parcel of the candidate next in order of the voter's preference;
- (b) The Returning Officer shall then count the ballot-papers in the parcel of each candidate and ascertain the total number of votes given for each candidate;
- (c) If a candidate then has an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary) he shall be elected, but if no candidate then has an absolute majority of votes the scrutiny shall proceed as provided in paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of the last preceding subsection until one candidate has received an absolute majority of votes and the candidate who has received an absolute majority of votes shall be elected:

Provided that in the application of the said paragraphs (b) and (c) any reference to first preference votes shall be read as a reference to all the votes counted to a candidate in pursuance of this sub-section.

(3) If on any count two or more candidates have an equal number of votes and one of them has to be excluded, the Returning Officer shall decide which shall be excluded; and if in the final count for filling any vacancy two candidates have an equal number of votes the Returning Officer shall decide by his casting vote which shall be elected.

(4) In this section—

- (a) "continuing candidate" means a candidate not already elected or excluded from the count; and
- (b) "an absolute majority of votes" means a greater number than one-half of the whole number of formal ballot-papers, and the casting vote (if any) of the Returning Officer shall be included in reckoning an absolute majority of votes.

***Adjournment of Count of Votes to be Announced.***

9. If on the polling day the count of the votes by the Returning Officer cannot be completed he shall adjourn such count and inform the scrutineers and the officers appointed to assist him at such count as regards the time and place when and where such count will be continued and conducted by him.

10. The count of the votes may from time to time be adjourned as the Returning Officer may deem necessary until it has been duly completed; and each adjournment shall be announced by the Returning Officer to the scrutineers and the officers assisting him.

July 11, 1928

*Before Adjournment Ballot-papers, &c., to be Sealed in Ballot Boxes.*

11. Before every adjournment of the count of the votes—

- (a) all ballot-papers and other documents connected with such count shall be placed in one or more ballot boxes; and
- (b) the Returning Officer shall then in the presence of such scrutineers and officers as are present seal such ballot box or boxes; and before recommencing the count the seal on such ballot box or boxes shall be exhibited unbroken to such of the scrutineers and officers as are present.

12. In declaring candidates duly elected the provisions of sub-section (5) of section 144 of the Local Government Act 1915 shall have full force and effect.

*Separate Parcels to be Enclosed in Packets According to Class and Sealed, &c.*

13. At the conclusion of the count of votes the Returning Officer shall comply with the provisions of section 145 of the Local Government Act 1915.

*Deposit Moneys.*

14. The moneys paid to the Returning Officer by or on behalf of the candidates shall be dealt with in manner provided by section 154 of the Local Government Act 1915 as altered as if in the said section for the word "votes" wherever occurring there were substituted the words "first preference votes."

*Form of Ballot-paper.*

15. For the purpose of giving effect to these provisions the form of ballot-paper shall be prescribed as follows:—

*Form of Ballot-paper.*

Candidates' names (arranged in alphabetical order of surname, thus)—

BROWN, Alfred.  
JONES, Robert William.  
ROBINSON, Samuel James.  
SMITH, John.

*Directions.*

You must not strike out the name of any candidate. You must place the figure 1 opposite the name of the candidate whom you wish to be elected.

You must then place opposite the name of each of the remaining candidates the figures 2, 3, 4 (and so on as the case requires) to indicate the order of your preference for each such candidate.

The ballot-paper so marked by or for the voter must be dropped by you into the ballot box.

You must not take this ballot-paper out of the polling-booth or to any place in the polling-booth save to one of the compartments provided or to the ballot box.

Unless otherwise specified in the schedule the firewood tendered for must consist of either box, red or white gum, or peppermint, or proportions of each. Tenders for messmate will not be entertained. Tenderers to specify in their tenders the kind or kinds of these woods, and the proportions of each kind tendered for.

The firewood for Werribee is to be tendered for at per ton weight of 2,240 lbs.

Printed forms of tender, giving full particulars, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, Gisborne-street, Melbourne, the Clerks of Courts at Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, and Geelong; and the Medical Superintendents at Sunbury Asylum and Inebriates' Institution, Lara, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, State or Commonwealth Treasury bonds or Government debentures, or references to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits. Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

Security will be required either by bank guarantee (bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Savings Bank deposit book, or bank deposit receipt, in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, cash deposit, or Victorian or Commonwealth Government bonds or debentures, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, *and having the words "Tender for Firewood at ..."* (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. Under these contracts firewood may be ordered by Commonwealth Government Departments and head teachers of State schools within the areas prescribed, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must, with the exception of box blocks and wattle, be split out of large timber, and of the kind or kinds specified in the schedule, and must be dry, perfectly sound, and of good burning quality, and cut into billets of the lengths stated in the schedules, such billets to be not less than four inches nor more than six inches in any diameter. The long wood to be of the diameters as specified in the respective schedules. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. Box blocks must be the best of their kind, dry, and perfectly sound. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve or Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

4. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase the firewood at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

5. Melbourne District will include a radius of six miles from the Elizabeth-street (Melbourne) Post Office.

6. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be five feet high, and of the width of the length of the firewood specified in the various schedules, with space between stacks for measuring; and the billets or lengths are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack, and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply.

7. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery. If after delivery has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the firewood so rejected or returned.

8. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department concerned his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any place that the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality or description, the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.

10. If the board shall decide that the firewood is not of proper quality or description, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor failing which it will be procured elsewhere and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition 4.

11. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or the officer authorized to accept delivery will have the power to reject such firewood as is deemed of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must supply firewood of satisfactory quality and description in its stead, failing which firewood will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 4.

12. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 4. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

13. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

14. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

## SHIRE OF BENALLA.

BY-LAW NO. 25.

A. By-law of the Shire of Benalla, made under sub-section (9) of section 197, and sections 610, 630, and 635 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 25, for regulating the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the municipal district, for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences, and for appointing tolls and dues to be demanded from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling any cattle in the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and from any person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle any licensed yards or premises within the municipal district.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market situated in the Shire of Benalla, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle.

2. The said market shall be open daily for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle, on every lawful day, from sunrise to sunset. A "fortnightly market" shall be held commencing on Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of March, 1928, and subsequently on every alternate Tuesday, provided in the event of any "fortnightly market" day falling on Christmas Day or a public holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable, the Council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said "fortnightly market."

3. The sales of cattle shall be commenced not earlier than 9 o'clock a.m., and shall be conducted in the order following:—

- First—Pigs.
- Second—Fat Sheep.
- Third—Fat Cattle.
- Fourth—Store Sheep.
- Fifth—Store Cattle.
- Sixth—Horses.

4. No sales shall be held in the yards on any day other than that specified in the By-law, but special days may be appointed by the President for the time being and Secretary of the Shire of Benalla in their discretion.

5. The Council shall appoint a Market Inspector, whose duties will be as follows:—

- (a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of the Local Government Act relating to markets are duly observed.
- (b) To demand and collect all market tolls and dues.
- (c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case they seem to such Inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle being roped within the market yards before 5 o'clock p.m. on the day of sale, except with the consent of such Inspector.

6. No person shall obstruct the Market Inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market, without the consent of the Market Inspector; nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct, within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

7. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls or dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied, and if any cattle be not removed within twenty-four hours of the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

8. The fat and store cattle shall be offered by the auctioneers who shall draw lots for precedence of selling, and the time for each auctioneer shall be allotted in respect of the various classes of cattle as follows:—

*Fat Pigs.*—Time to be allotted at the rate of 120 per hour. No auctioneer shall sell for more than one hour at a time, and in the event of any auctioneer failing to complete his sale in the allotted time he shall be allotted half-time for the balance remaining unsold.

*Store Pigs.*—Time to be allotted at the rate of 100 per hour. No auctioneer shall sell for more than one hour at a time. Any auctioneer having been allotted his full time, and failing to complete his sale, shall be further allotted half-time for the balance remaining unsold.

*Fat Sheep.*—Time to be allotted at the rate of three minutes per pen. All fat sheep shall be disposed of before any store sheep are offered. In the event of any auctioneer failing to complete his sale in the allotted time, he shall be allowed one-half time per pen for his unsold lots, and failing to complete his

sales within the specified time, he must cease selling, and dispose of unsold lots by private contract. No auctioneer shall sell more than an hour at a time.

*Fat Cattle.*—Time to be allotted at the rate of 100 per hour. No auctioneer shall sell for more than one hour at a time. In the event of any auctioneer not completing his sales in the specified time, he shall be allotted half-time for any remaining unsold, and, failing then to complete, the balance shall be then included in the sale of store cattle.

*Store Sheep.*—Time to be allotted at the rate of three minutes per pen. No auctioneer shall sell for more than one hour at a time, and the conditions for failure to complete within the specified time shall be similar to those applying to the sale of fat sheep.

*Store Cattle.*—Time to be allotted at the rate of 150 per hour. No auctioneer shall sell for more than one hour at a time. Any auctioneer having been allotted his full time, and failing to complete his sales within that time, shall be further allotted half-time for the balance remaining unsold.

Provided that no additional time over the period of one hour shall be allotted to any one auctioneer until all other auctioneers selling on that day cattle of a similar class shall have completed their allotted time of one hour.

9. All auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than ten (10) minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers, and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time.

10. In case of any dispute arising as to the priority of right to offer by auction, the Market Inspector's decision shall be final.

11. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

12. The Council may licence any yards or premises for the sale of cattle outside a radius of seven (7) miles from the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and the annual licence fee shall be Two shillings and sixpence for each yard or premises so licensed.

13. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach of this By-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

## APPOINTING TOLLS AND DUES.

1. The Council of the Shire of Benalla shall demand, receive, and have of and from every person selling any cattle in the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and from every person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle any licensed yards or premises within the municipal district and outside the said Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, the several sums of money, as for tolls or dues hereinafter appointed, in that behalf, that is to say:—

2. The Council of the Shire of Benalla shall demand, receive, and have of and from every person offering for sale any cattle in the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards which shall not have been actually sold fees at half the above rates.

3. The above fees in addition will be charged for cattle left in the yards and not removed within 24 hours of the close of the market; such cattle may then be removed by the Market Inspector at the expense of the owner thereof.
