Fire Brigades Act 1915.

ADDITIONS TO FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1915* (6 Geo. V. No. 2653) it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district, or any country district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and form part of such fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare that, pursuant to the provisions of section 5 (1) of the aforesaid Act, the following portions shall be added to and form part of the several Country Fire Districts specified, that is to say:—

To the Northern Fire District.

All that additional area within 20 chains of the boundary of the Township of Kerang, in the Shire of Kerang.

To the North-Eastern Fire District.

The Township of Corryong, in the Shire of Upper Murray.

To the Eastern Fire District.

The Township of North Wonthaggi, being the whole of Crown allotment 32, Parish of Wonthaggi, in the Shire of Phillip Island and Woolamai.
The Townships of Springvale and Noble Park.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and in the nineteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

MEDICAL ACT 1915. PART II., AND THE DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth, by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Medical Act 1915, Part II.*, and subject to the temporary regulations in clauses 18 and 19 herein set out, hereby repeal the Regulations made by the Board on the fifteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-fourth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, provided that such repeal shall not apply to students who have been previously to the repeal of the Regulations made by the Dental Board of Victoria on the fifth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and approved by the Governor in Council on the seventeenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, apprenticed by virtue of such Regulations to dentists under clause 5 thereof, and as to such students, such Regulations shall continue in full force and effect, and in lieu of the Regulations hereby repealed, and to the extent of such repeal, doth make the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

I. Candidates for the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria and for registration as dentists under the *Medical Act 1915, Part II.*, shall produce evidence of having—

- (a) passed a preliminary examination,
- (b) pursued a course of professional study.

(a) Preliminary Examination.

II. Every candidate shall, before he enters on the course of professional study prescribed from time to time by regulation, produce to the Registrar of the Dental Board of Victoria a certificate that he has matriculated in the University of Melbourne, together with a certificate that he has passed in the subject of physics at either the school intermediate examination or the school leaving examination of that University as a compulsory subject. The Board may, however, accept as equivalent to such certificates any certificate issued by the University of Melbourne that a candidate has passed a preliminary examination entitling him to matriculate in the University of Melbourne and to enter on the dental course.

(b) Course of Professional Study.

III. Students shall pursue their studies for four years and six and a half months (the last six and a half months being known as the fifth or final year) and pass the examinations of each year before the Board. Lectures, demonstrations, and practical work may be attended at the University of Melbourne, the Australian College of Dentistry, and at any public educational institution which may from time to time be prescribed by regulation for the purpose.

IV. Except by special permission of the Dental Board of Victoria—(a) a candidate must pass in all the subjects of a year at one examination, or if the subjects are divided into groups, then in all the subjects of each group at one examination; and (b) no candidate shall be permitted to proceed to Group 1 in the second year unless he has passed in Group 1 of the first year, or to Group 1 of the third year unless he has passed in Group 1 of the second year, or to Group 2 of the second year unless he has passed in Group 2 of the first year, or to Group 2 of the third year unless he has passed in groups 1 and 2 of the second year, or to the fourth year unless he has passed in Groups 1 and 2 of the third year, or to the examination of Group 2 of the final year unless he has completed the examination of Group 1 of the fourth year.

V. (a) Subject to dispensation by the Dental Board of Victoria, in special cases candidates failing at any one examination to complete the whole examination in any group shall repeat the whole work of the year in that group before presenting themselves for re-examination in the subjects of the group.

(b) Candidates failing at any one examination to complete the whole of Group 1 of the final examination shall before re-examination present certificates of three months' additional instruction in general hospital practice.

(c) Candidates failing at any one examination to complete the whole of Group 2 of the final examination shall before re-examination present certificates of three months' additional instruction in—

- (1) Clinical dental surgery.
- (2) Prosthetic dentistry.

VI. During the first year candidates shall attend a course of lectures and laboratory work in each of the following:—

- Group 1—
 - (1) Natural philosophy
 - (2) Chemistry
 - (3) Zoology
 } as for the medical course.
- Group 2—
 - (4) Metallurgy, and in
 - (5) Prosthetic dentistry.

VII. The subjects of the Pass and Honour Examination of the first year shall be—

- Group 1—
 - Natural philosophy
 - Chemistry
 - Zoology
 } as for the medical course.
- Group 2—
 - Metallurgy.

VIII. During the second year candidates shall attend a course of lectures and laboratory work in each of the following:—

Group 1—

- (1) Anatomy, including a course of dissections of the head and neck, thorax, and abdomen.
- (2) Physiology, including biochemistry and biophysics.
- (3) Histology.

Group 2—

- (4) Prosthetic dentistry.

IX. The subjects of the Pass and Honour Examination of the second year shall be—

Group 1—

- Anatomy, including dissections.
- Physiology.
- Histology.

Group 2—

- Prosthetic dentistry.

X. During the third year candidates shall attend a course of lectures and laboratory work in each of the following:—

Group 1—

- (1) Pathology.
- (2) Bacteriology.

Group 2—

- (3) Dental materia medica.
- (4) Prosthetic dentistry.
- (5) Junior operative dentistry (including operative technique).
- (6) Orthodontia.
- (7) Dental anatomy (including histology).

and shall produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the dental practice of the Melbourne Dental Hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction and clinical lectures and operative technique

XI. The subjects of the Pass and Honour Examination of the third year shall be—

Group 1—

- Pathology.
- Bacteriology.

Group 2—

- Dental materia medica.
- Junior operative dentistry.
- Orthodontia.
- Dental anatomy (including histology).

XII. During the fourth year candidates shall attend a course of lectures in each of the following:—

Group 1—

- (1) Medicine.
- (2) Surgery.

Group 2—

- (3) Dental surgery and pathology.
- (4) Senior operative dentistry.
- (5) Prosthetic dentistry.

and shall attend a course of—

- (6) Laboratory work in prosthetic dentistry, of
- (7) Demonstrations in oral surgery, and of
- (8) Demonstrations in extractions and anaesthetics.

and shall produce certificates of having attended during nine months of the year—

- (i) the dental practice of the Melbourne Dental Hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction and clinical lectures,
- (ii) the surgical practice of a general hospital recognized by the University of Melbourne, such attendance to include clinical instruction,
- (iii) the medical practice of a general hospital recognized by the University of Melbourne, such attendance to include clinical instruction.

XIII. The subjects of the Pass and Honour Examination of the fourth year (otherwise known as the Final Examination, Group 1) shall be—

- (a) Medicine.
- (b) Surgery.

XIV. The Final Examination, Group 1, shall be held twice a year, first at the time of the December Annual Examinations, and second at the end of the first term; and there shall be no supplementary examination.

XV. During the fifth year candidates shall attend a course of lectures in each of the following:—

- (1) Oral surgery,
- (2) Prophylaxis and oral hygiene,
- (3) Ethics, jurisprudence, and economics,

and shall attend a course of—

- (4) Laboratory work in prosthetic dentistry, and shall produce certificates of having attended during six months of the year the dental practice of the Melbourne Dental Hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction and clinical lectures.

XVI. The subjects of the Pass and Honour Examination of the fifth year (otherwise known as the Final Examination, Group 2) shall be—

- (a) Oral surgery.
- (b) Dental surgery and pathology.
- (c) Senior operative dentistry.
- (d) Prosthetic dentistry.
- (e) Extractions and anaesthetics.

XVII. The Final Examination, Group 2, shall be held twice a year, first in July, and second at the time of the December Annual Examinations; and there shall be no supplementary examination.

XVIII. Candidates who have passed all the foregoing examinations and fulfilled all the prescribed conditions shall, on payment of the prescribed fees, be entitled to the Diploma of Licentiate Dental Surgery of Victoria, and to registration as dentists.

TEMPORARY REGULATIONS.

XIX. Students who in the year 1926 were in the second or third years of the course shall be required to pass an examination in metallurgy at the University of Melbourne or the Australian College of Dentistry before proceeding to the fourth year of such course.

XX. The Regulation made on the fifteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and approved by the Governor in Council on twenty-fourth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, shall remain in force until superseded by the new Regulation, which shall come into force as follows:—

- (a) The provisions concerning the first year shall be deemed to have come into force on the first of March, 1927.
- (b) The provisions concerning the second year shall come into force for students attending the work of that year in 1928 and subsequent years.
- (c) The provisions concerning the third year shall come into force for students attending the work of that year in 1929 and subsequent years.
- (d) The provisions concerning the fourth and fifth years shall come into force for students attending the work of the fourth year in 1930 and subsequent years.

EXAMINATIONS.

XXI. The annual examinations before the Board shall consist of—

- (a) Pass examinations or pass and honour examinations for the different years of study; and
- (b) Where supplementary examinations are allowed, the same shall be held not less than six weeks subsequently to the pass examination.

Any student who has failed in any subject or subjects at the last previous examinations shall, except where otherwise expressly provided, be permitted to present himself at the supplementary examination.

XXII. Any student who has failed in one or more subjects at any annual examination shall require re-examination at the ensuing supplementary examination in such subject or subjects only.

XXIII. The annual examination of the first, second, and third years shall be held yearly, in the last quarter of the year, except when otherwise directed by the Dental Board of Victoria.

XXIV. In all examinations there shall be at least two examiners appointed by the Board.

XXV. All examinations may be partly written, partly oral, and partly practical.

XXVI. No student shall, except by special permission of the Board, be permitted to enter upon the examinations of a more advanced year of study unless and until he has fulfilled the educational requirements and passed the examinations of the previous year at one examination, and for this purpose the annual examination and the subsequent supplementary examination shall be deemed to form one examination. The Board may allow any student to pass the subjects of the first, second, or third year in groups in accordance with the Regulations of the University of Melbourne for the Degree of Bachelor of Dental Science.

FEES.

XXVII. The fee for each annual examination shall be £5 5s., and for the supplementary examination £1 1s. An additional fee of 10s. 6d. shall be payable for entry for honours at the annual examination. If a candidate fail to pass at any examination, his fee shall not be returned. The fee for Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria shall be £5 5s.

XXVIII. Persons who have completed the whole or part of their dental studies in any dental college outside Victoria which may be from time to time recognized by regulation, and shall produce evidence thereof satisfactory to the Dental Board of Victoria, may be allowed credit for the same in the determination of their status in the curriculum, but shall be otherwise subject to the provisions of these Regulations. 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Poisons Regulations, 1928," and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In the case of any poison the name of which is inserted in the third part of the Second Schedule of the *Poisons Act 1915*, as provided by section 33 of the *Poisons Act 1927*, the bottle or other vessel, wrapper, or cover, box, or case immediately containing the same shall bear thereon printed conspicuously, in addition to the word "Caution," the words "Use strictly in accordance with the directions."

The foregoing Regulations were recommended by resolution of the Board at its meeting held on the eleventh day of July, 1928.

REGULATION XXXI. (A).—CLASSIFIED ROLL (SECONDARY SCHOOLS DIVISION).—QUALIFICATIONS OF TEACHERS.

1. (a) The following qualifications shall be required for the respective classes on the Classified Roll, Secondary Schools Division, viz.:—

(i) Teachers other than those referred to in (ii), (iii), and (iv) below:—

Class V.—The Diploma of Education.

Class IV.—A degree in Arts or Science, or the Diploma of Education; and four years' approved experience as a teacher, of which two shall be in Class V.

Class III.—A degree in Arts or Science and the Diploma of Education; and eight years' approved experience as a teacher, of which four shall be in Class IV.

Class II.—A degree in Arts or Science and the Diploma of Education; and four years' approved experience in Class III.

Class I. (Men).—A degree in Arts or Science and the Diploma of Education; and four years' approved experience in Class II.

Class II. (A) (Women).—A degree in Arts or Science and the Diploma of Education; and four years' approved experience in Class II.

(ii) Teachers of Manual Arts—

Class V.—Course of training for Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate or equivalent technical qualifications, and one year's training as a teacher.

Class IV.—Trained Manual Arts Teacher's Certificate or Drawing Teacher's Secondary Certificate; and four years' approved experience as a teacher, of which two shall be in Class V.

Class III.—Drawing Teacher's Secondary Certificate and eight years' approved experience as a teacher, of which four shall be in Class IV.

Class II.—Art Teacher's Certificate and four years' approved experience in Class III.

Class I. (Men).—Art Teacher's Certificate and three years' approved experience in Class II.

Class II. (A) (Women).—Art Teacher's Certificate and three years' approved experience in Class II.

(iii) Teachers of Domestic Arts—

Class V.—Course of training for Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate or equivalent technical qualifications; and one year's training as a teacher.

Class IV.—Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate or equivalent technical qualifications; and four years' approved experience as a teacher, of which two shall be in Class V.

Class III.—Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate or equivalent technical qualifications; and eight years' approved experience as a teacher, of which four shall be in Class IV.

Class II.—Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate or equivalent technical qualifications; and four years' approved experience in Class III.

Class II. (A).—Trained Domestic Arts Teacher's Certificate or equivalent technical qualifications; and four years' approved experience in Class II.

(iv) Teachers of Commercial Subjects—

Class V.—Course of Training for Trained Teacher's Certificate (Commercial Subjects) or equivalent technical qualifications; and one year's training as a teacher.

Class IV.—Trained Teacher's Certificate (Commercial Subjects); and Final Examination of an approved Institute of Accountants or the Diploma of Commerce; and four years' approved experience as a teacher.

Class III.—Degree in Commerce and eight years' approved experience as a teacher.

Class II.—Degree in Commerce and four years' approved experience in Class III.

Class I. (Men).—Degree in Commerce and three years' approved experience in Class II.

(b) Where a teacher is of outstanding ability, the Classifiers may, in lieu of the academic qualifications set out in (a) above for appointment to Classes III., II., II. (A), and I., recognize approved experience for 15, 20, 30, and 30 years respectively as equivalent to the requirements for a degree or diploma (as the case may be).

2. Proved efficiency as a teacher shall be regarded as one of the main factors in determining the eligibility of any teacher for appointment to any class.

3. Other qualifications than those specified above may be recognized if deemed by the Classifiers to be of equivalent value for the respective classes.

their liabilities incurred in the establishment and conduct of such undertaking on debentures then unredeemed, overdraft, and trade creditors on the one hand, and the amount of the cash held by the undertakers in hand, or at the bank, book debts owing to the undertakers in respect of the said undertaking, and any sinking fund held at the Treasury in respect of the said debentures on the other. Such transfer shall come into force and have effect from the date of approval hereon.

His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, pursuant to the provisions of section 15 of the *Motor Car Act 1915* (No. 2702), make the following Regulations, namely:—

36. (a) Every owner of a motor car used for carrying passengers for hire, or for carrying goods for hire or in the course of trade shall at the time of application for registration supply the member of the Police Force inspecting such car with the load capacity of the vehicle, as specified by the maker, and such information shall be inserted in the application and in the registration certificate.
- (b) Every owner of a motor car used for carrying passengers for hire or for carrying goods for hire or in the course of trade which was registered prior to 30th December, 1927, shall on applying for renewal of registration forward with such application for renewal the load capacity of the vehicle as specified by the makers, and such information shall be inserted in the registration certificate.

In respect of all roads and streets lying within the boundaries of the Townships of Beaconsfield and Berwick, in the Shire of Berwick, it is hereby declared and ordained that the rate of 20 miles per hour is the limit of speed which shall not be exceeded by any motor car while travelling or in motion on any part of the roads and streets above specified, and that no person in charge of any motor car shall on such part drive or allow the same to be driven at a rate in excess of the speed so limited.

SANCTUARIES FOR NATIVE GAME.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and His Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Game Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation direct that the parts of Victoria hereunder described shall be localities in which, from the first day of January to the thirty-first day of December (both days inclusive) in each year, it shall be unlawful for any person to kill or destroy any native game included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1915*.

PARTS OF VICTORIA REFERRED TO.

1. Parish of Timberroo, County of Karkaroo; containing 3,908 acres, more or less, being allotments 21, 24, 25, 29, 30, and 31 in the said Parish, and known as the Timberroo Timber Reserve, together with all roads that intersect the said timber reserve.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserves, nor roll nor throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserves (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purpose of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserves, nor erect therein any dwelling, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of Management of such fees as it may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fee shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee of Management may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) by way of guarantee for due care in the removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.
