### Income Tax Act 1915

### NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the State Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months 1st July, 1927, to the 30th June, 1928, consisted of salary, wages, allowance, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, or annuity, and whose incomes within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts carned in or derived from Victoria amounted to Two hundred and one pounds or upwards, is hereby required to make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of August, 1928, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Acts or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of August, 1928

Every such return shall be addressed to the State Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the State Income Tax Office, Elizabeth House, Elizabeth-street, Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Act liable to be prosecuted, and to pay a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and will be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

### SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.

### RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust in pussions of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following By-law:—

By-law for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District:—

- 1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound (£1) sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Eleven pounds (£1) and upwards situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust is hereby made for the year 1928.
- 2. The minimum rate for such properties valued at less than Eleven pounds (£11) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings (20s.).
- s. on each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds (£5) sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Ten shillings (10s.) per annum. 3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the
- 4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the watering of private gardens or distribution otherwise on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons up to an amount equal to what the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises; and at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid. an amount aforesaid.
- 5. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than equal to Two shillings (2s.) in the pound (£1) on the municipal valuation of the Shire of Shepparton for the year 1928 of the property so supplied. so supplied.
- 6. For every steam boiler or engine using water the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

- 7: Water supplied to Government departments, public gardéns, cricket grounds, bowling greens, show grounds, cattle yards, sheep dips, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per
- 6. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.
- 9. For a temporary supply during the laying down of any new works, or the erection of new buildings, or repairs, or additions, the charge shall be by meter measurement at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, which shall include supply of meter. The meter, with box enclosed, shall be supplied by the Trust, and shall be fixed by the Trust's officer or officers. The applicant for the temporary supply shall have all pipes and connexions to the main ready before the meter is so fixed. All persons requiring a supply of water under this clause shall first notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purposes until authorized, in writing, so to do. The Trust's officer or officers shall be entitled at any time to go upon the premises to inspect and supervise the meter and the supply and use of the water.
- 10. Such rates are hereby payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in the said year 1928. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.
- 11. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Violet Town Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be levied on all rateable properly, according to the valuation for the time being for the Municipal District of Violet Town for the Year 1923, with a minimum charge of Two pounds, but the minimum rate on all vacant allotments shall be Two shillings in the pound on such municipal valuation.
- 2. The rate for water troughs shall be at the rate of Two pounds for each trough.

## Regulating Sand Pits.

A By-law of the Shire of Heidelberg made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and particularly under and with reference to the 10th section of the Local Government Act 1921 and section 2 of the Local Government Act 1924, and numbered 96, for prescribing residential areas and prohibiting the use of land therein for a certain class of trade or business.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

the Shire of Heidelberg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

1. The Fairfield, Ivanhoe, and Heidelberg Ridings and the respective areas comprised in or constituting the same, all of which are within the municipal district of the Shire of Heidelberg, are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

2. Subject as hereinafter provided, the use of any land within the said residential areas is hereby prohibited for the purpose of the following class of trade or business, that is to say: The digging and excavation therefrom of loam, sand, gravel, garden soil, or filling soil, and the sale thereof or otherwise for the purposes of sale or trade of or in such loam, sand, gravel, garden soil, or filling soil: Provided, however, and it is expressly declared that this By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law.

3. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence, and in the case of successive convictions in respect of successive similar offences, to a minimum penalty of Two pounds and a maximum penalty of Twenty pounds for each successive similar offences, to a minimum penalty of Two pounds and a maximum penalty of Twenty pounds for each successive similar offences, to a durther penalty of not less than Ten shillings per day on which an Ten pounds per day for each and every day on which an Ten pounds per day for each and every day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any Court, as the case may be.

## Residential Areas.

A By-law of the Shire of Mornington made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1915 and section 10 of Act No. 3167, and numbered 36, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting within such areas the use of any land, or the erection, adaptation for use, or the use of any building for the purpose of certain trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mornington order as follows:—

1. The areas within the municipal district of the Shire of Mornington herein prescribed shall be residential areas, that is to say :-

## Residential Areas.

- (1) The whole of the North Riding of the said shire, save and except-

    (a) All land abutting on the east side of the Main-street and to a depth of 250 feet from the frontage of such land to such street,

    (b) All land abutting on the north side of that portion of the Point Nepean-road which extends from Tanti-avenue (or road) to Main-street, and to a depth of 200 feet from the frontage of such land to such portion of such road.

    (c) All land abutting on the north side of that portion of Barkly-street which extends from Main-street to the railway, and to a depth of 250 feet from the frontage of such land to such portion of such street,

(d) All the land bounded on the south by Barkly-street.

by the extension further northwards of the west
side of Murray-street, on the north by Blake-street,

  2. No person shall in any such residential area use any land, or erect or adapt for use, or use any building for the purpose of any trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement, except the business of residential flats or a boardinghouse or lodging-house or place for the accommodation of boarders or lodgers, or a dressmaker, milliner, or teacher in which not more than three persons are employed, or a business or trade carried on by an individual without any employee or assistant in a private dwelling on which no advertisement or sign is displayed indicating the nature of the business or trade carried on therein other than a plate approved by the Council and affixed to the front of such dwelling.

  3. If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to this By-law it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building within a time to be named in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice the Council may pull down and remove such building and sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expense of such building down and removal, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

  4. Nothing in this By-law shall be deemed to preclude the

the expense of such pulling down and removal, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

4. Nothing in this By-law shall be deemed to preclude the continuance of the use of any building in the said residential area for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or to preclude the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension, involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership, or for such other purpose as the Council of the said shire thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

5. The expression "person" in this By-law shall include a person or persons, company or corporation, or the lessee, tenant, agent, or employee of any person.

6.
