Factories and Shops Acts.

## DETERMINATION OF THE FARRIERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on 27th September, 1928, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan district as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in the process, trade, or business of a farrier," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 27th day of September, 1928, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

(A) Within the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts :-

(1) Outside the times of beginning and ending work :--

(i) On Saturdays—
Between 8.30 a.m. and 11 a.m.

Double time

(ii) On Fridays-

Between 4.36 p.m. and 5 p.m.

Double time.

(2) Within the hours fixed as the times of beginning and ending work in excess of 44

(B) In any other place:

In excess of 44 hours in any week

(6) Special Rates.—Trole time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, and on 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Royal Agricultural Show Day (in localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the Public Service Act 1915), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Now Year's Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(6) Day and Lates Hause for Parliament of Warre The day and latest hours because the special rate shall only the payable for the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

6) DAY AND LATEST HOURS FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—The day and latest hour when payment of wages is to be made shall be Friday at 4.30 p.m.

(7) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 22 hours be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of forty-two per centum.
