SASKATCHEWAN DECLARED A RECIPROCATING STATE WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE JUDGMENTS (RECIPROCITY) ACTS, AND THE COURT OF KING'S BENCH OF SASKATCHEWAN DECLARED TO BE A SUPERIOR COURT WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE SAID ACTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of Saskatchewan (the same being a part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth of Australia) for the enforcement within such part of Judgments as defined by section 2 of the *Supreme Court Act 1923*, so far as the same relate to Victorian Judgments, Orders, and Awards, do now under the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Judgments (Reciprocity) Act 1925*, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, declare Saskatchewan to be a reciprocating State for the purposes of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts, and that the said Acts shall extend and apply to all parts of Saskatchewan: And do further, under the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of section 2 of the *Supreme Court Act 1923*, declare the Court of King's Bench of Saskatchewan to be a Superior Court within the meaning of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the said *Supreme Court Act 1923*.

REGULATION XXXVII.—TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.— CLAUSES RESCINDED AND REMADE.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 81 of the *Education Act 1915*, doth hereby rescind clauses 14 and 15 of Regulation XXXVII.—Technical Schools—of the Regulations made by Order in Council of the 26th May, 1925, and published in the *Gazette* of the 3rd June following, at pages 1913-2016, and in lieu thereof, doth make the following clauses numbered 14, 15, and 15 (a), that is to say:—

REGULATION XXXVII.—TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

14. There shall be a committee consisting of three representatives of the Melbourne University nominated by the University Council, three representatives of the technical schools nominated by the Minister, and the President of the Apprenticeship Commission, with the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools as Chairman, whose duties shall be to—

- (a) inquire into the qualifications and make recommendations to the Minister concerning all appointments of senior instructors for pure and applied science;
- (b) make recommendations to the Minister concerning the appointments of examiners for pure and applied science;

- (c) modify, alter, and approve courses of instruction for pure and applied science.
- (d) inquire into the curriculum, staffing, and equipment of any technical school desirous of obtaining recognition by the Melbourne University, and make recommendations to the Professorial Board;
- (e) inquire and report to the Professorial Board on any applications from students desirous of receiving University recognition for subjects passed at technical schools.
- (f) make recommendations to the Professorial Board as to what remission, if any, of subjects may be granted to technical school students desirous of proceeding to the Melbourne University;
- (g) make recommendations to the Minister relative to the salaries to be paid to heads of departments and senior full-time science instructors in technical schools;
- (h) make recommendations to the Minister relative to the science departments in technical schools.

15. There shall be a committee consisting of the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools as Chairman, the Inspector of Technical Schools, the Art Inspector of the Education Department, and the President of the Apprenticeship Commission, together with the examiner in the subject concerned, two representatives of the technical schools nominated by the Minister, one or more representatives of organized bodies of employers, and one or more representatives of organized bodies of employees, all of whom shall be selected on account of their expert knowledge and experience of the subject to be dealt with at any particular meeting.

The duties of the committee shall be to—

- (a) inquire into the qualifications and make recommendations to the Minister concerning all appointments of full-time instructors employed in teaching trade subjects in technical schools.
- (b) inquire into the qualifications and make recommendations to the Minister when required concerning appointments of part-time instructors in trade subjects in technical schools;
- (c) make recommendations to the Minister concerning the appointments of examiners for trade subjects;
- (d) make recommendations to the Minister relative to the salaries to be paid to the heads of departments and full-time instructors in technical schools in trade subjects;
- (e) make recommendations to the Minister relative to special equipment required for efficiently teaching trade subjects;
- (f) make recommendations to the Minister relative to the establishment of trade departments in technical schools.

15 (a). There shall be a committee consisting of the Art Inspector of the Education Department as Chairman, the Chief Inspector of Technical Schools, and the Assistant Art Inspector, with two representatives employed as instructors of art in technical schools, and two representatives of applied art who are not employed in technical schools, nominated by the Minister on account of their expert knowledge and experience of the subjects to be dealt with at any particular meeting.

The duties of the committee shall be to—

- (a) inquire into the qualifications and make recommendations to the Minister concerning all appointments of senior instructors in art subjects;
- (b) make recommendations to the Minister concerning the appointments of examiners for art subjects;
- (c) modify, alter, and approve of courses of instruction for art subjects;
- (d) make recommendations to the Minister relative to the salaries to be paid to the heads of Art Departments and senior full-time art instructors in technical schools;
- (e) make recommendations to the Minister relative to the establishment of art and craft classes in technical schools;
- (f) consult, where necessary, with representatives of industrial subjects before fixing any course of art or craft work; and
- (g) draw up a list of those trade subjects which are closely associated with the applied art department in a technical school.

And the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF NEPEAN, AT PORTSEA.

WE, Sydney Clarence Martin, Francis Augustus Bonner Daly, Henry Wilson, William Henry Goss, and William James Watson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 13th March, 1928, as a site for Public purposes in the Parish of Nepean, at Portsea, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the power conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1915:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve except by means of the ramps or other openings provided, and no person shall climb the cliffs in the Reserve.
3. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
4. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces on the Reserve as the Committee think necessary. Any person using or lighting fires or causing or permitting fires to be used on the Reserve, save in such fireplaces, except by special leave or direction of the Committee of Management, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.
5. No person shall damage in any way the trees, grass, or other vegetation in the Reserve.
6. No person shall climb or jump over any fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names in the fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein, or otherwise disfigure, injure, destroy, or remove the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements, or any survey pegs, or permanent marks therein.
7. No horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, save as herein-after provided, are allowed in the Reserve, and the owner of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals so wandering shall be liable to prosecution, and, in addition, such horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals may be impounded.
8. Certain portions of the Reserve have been set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in custody, and care of those using the same, provided that the owner or user for the time being of any horses found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Reserve shall be guilty of any offence against these Regulations.
9. No person shall tether, or cause to be tethered, on any part of the Reserve, except as otherwise herein provided, any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals.
10. Motor cars are allowed on the Reserve only in the place set apart for the purpose.
11. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserve, or in any public or private bathing-box, boat shed, or other buildings upon the Reserve.
12. No person shall use the closets or urinals, or any portion of such closets or urinals, for any purpose other than that for which the same are constructed, and shall then only use such portions of such closets and urinals as are specially constructed for such purposes.

13. Certain portion of the Reserve has been set apart by the Committee of Management for the use of persons desirous of swimming or bathing horses in Port Phillip Bay under such conditions as the Committee may from time to time determine, and then only before 8 a.m. and after 6 p.m.

14. No person, except workmen employed by the Committee of Management in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs, or grass.

15. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, waste paper, bottles, or any other litter on any part of the Reserve, except in the receptacles provided for that purpose.

16. No person shall camp on any part of the Reserve, except those specially set apart for that purpose, and then only after obtaining a permit, subject to such fees and conditions as the Committee may determine.

17. No person shall erect any booth or other structure, or offer for sale any article in the Reserve, without permission of the Committee of Management in writing.

18. No person shall throw any stone or other hard substance, nor play cricket or any other game with a hard ball within the Reserve.

19. No person shall break glass of any kind in the Reserve, or leave therein on the beach anything which would injure bathers.

20. No person shall discharge any firearms or air-guns in any part of the Reserve.

21. No person shall erect any bathing-box or boat shed in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

22. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless decently attired from neck to knee, and no person shall leave or enter the Reserve in bathing costume only, and no person shall loiter on the beach in bathing costume only.

23. No person shall use, or cause to be used, any bathing box or boat shed for residential purposes.

24. No person shall conduct or take part in any public meetings or entertainments in any part of the Reserve or foreshore without the previous written permission of the Committee of Management.

25. No entry to the beach by vehicles will be permitted, except on the road set apart for that purpose.

26. No stand or other material shall be removed.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than £5; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £10.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twelve in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for

cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status), within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall let publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game, or sport within the Reserve on Sunday.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

15. No person shall remove any sand, stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee

WE, Frederick John Jude, Charles King Simmons, and Reginald Angus Smales, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of the 30th November, 1920, as a site for a Race-course in the Parish of Mildura, and known as the "Mildura Race-course," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve, which shall be parcelled out in the following divisions, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, but

no person shall be allowed on the first of the said divisions, or to enter any of the buildings on the Reserve, on days on which admission fees are not being imposed, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained:—

1st Division.—Grand stand.

2nd Division.—Saddling paddock.

3rd Division.—Judge's box, secretary's, stewards', and jockeys' rooms, and weighing yard.

4th Division.—The remainder of the reserve.

2. No person shall enter at any race meeting into any of the said divisions, nor bring any horses or vehicles therein, except on production of a ticket to be issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing him in that behalf, and then only in such part or parts of the said divisions as shall be indicated on the ticket, and only on the days for which the ticket is issued; but the ticket-holder shall not remain in any of the said divisions, or any part thereof, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run, unless with the consent of the Committee of Management.

3. No person, except the judge and any persons he may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box at any race meeting.

4. No person shall enter the weighing stand, or the weighing yard, or the approaches thereto, except persons authorized by the Committee of Management so to do, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses whose jockeys are being or are about to be weighed.

5. The following persons shall not be admitted to any division of the Reserve:—

- (1) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a disqualified person by any competent racing tribunal.
- (2) Any person proved to the satisfaction of the Committee of Management to be a defaulter.
- (3) No person shall remain on the said Reserve after having been warned off the same under this Regulation.

6. All persons paying for admission to any of the said divisions, or any part thereof, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he or she shall, on demand, produce, and if required surrender, to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of same.

7. The Committee of Management may let the Reserve for racing purposes on such terms and conditions as it may consider reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the fee payable therefor shall not exceed the sum of Ten pounds per day. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand, or any portion thereof, or any booth or buildings in the Reserve, and persons allowed to train or exercise horses in the Reserve, shall abide by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the Reserve, and to the buildings and other erections for the time being thereon.

8. No person shall take any dog into any part of the said Reserve or into any buildings thereon.

9. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

10. No person shall damage in any way any trees, shrubs, or flowers at any time planted or growing in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

11. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, nor roll or throw stones in the Reserve.

12. No person shall put in the Reserve any live-stock without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. No person shall place or erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure or stand, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, or for any other purpose, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall offer for sale any goods, chattels, articles, or provisions on any part of the Reserve without having first obtained a permit, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

15. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations for young trees or shrubs.

16. Any person committing in the Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall, together with any horses or vehicles in his possession or care, be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and is or may be in possession of, a ticket of admission to any of the said divisions, or any part thereof:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing on the racing track, or any part of it, during a race meeting.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Being found in any part of any of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or if required, not surrendering to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand production of same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the said divisions where such person be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management, or any person deputed by them, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by such person, and that such person's ticket has been lost.
- (8) Obtaining admission to any part of any of the said divisions when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.

17. No person shall carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker except in or on such portions of the Reserve as may be specially set apart for the purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the conditions imposed by the Committee of Management.

18. The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve, or any part thereof, on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for race meetings, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult to the first and second divisions of the Reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Fifteen shillings.

For admission of every adult to the fourth division of the Reserve, such sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings and sixpence.

18A. The fee payable for admission to the Reserve for training or exercising horses shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse.

19. Provided always that the Committee of Management may exempt any member of a race club wholly or partially from the payment of all or any of such charges or fees, and that the moneys so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be utilized in the permanent improvement of the Reserve for racing purposes, or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or in the planting of trees or shrubs in the Reserve, or in such other manner in or upon the Reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing purposes.

Every person offending against any of these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown Lands, or any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF BULLA.

BY-LAW No. 11.

Opening of Roads and Streets Regulations.

A By-law of the Shire of Bulla; made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 11, for regulating the opening of roads and streets for the installation of water, gas, or electricity, and for fixing the fees payable for permits or licences to open or break up any street or road or displace the materials thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bulla order as follows:—
