Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE HORSEHAIR BOARD.

NOTE. - This Determination, on the 2nd November, 1928, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of preparing horsehair for trade or sale," has made the following Determination, namely:—

Note .- On the 16th June, 1913, the powers of the Horsehair Board were extended to enable it to deal with rates for cowhair

(1) That on the 2nd November, 1928, the last previous Determination of the Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) OVERTIME.—Any employee who works for any time in excess of 48 hours in any week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.
- (4) SPECIAL RATES.—All work done on Sandays, Good Friday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), and Christmas Day, shall be paid for at the rate of double time, and for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, and Boxing Day, the rate of payment shall be time and a half, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above holidays, the special rates shall be payable only for the day so substituted.
- (5) Time Wages.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three and a third per centum.
- (6) PIECE-WORK .- That the lowest piece-work prices to be paid to persons for doing work of the kinds specified in the following Schedule shall be-
