Tenders for supply of forage to more than five separate stations in any one district must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit of 10s. for each and every station tendered for, except in the case of the Melbourne District, the preliminary deposit for which shall be \$25 with each tender, irrespective of the number of stations tendered for. 2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned.
