PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Common-
wealth of Australia, being satisfied that reciprocal provi-
sions have been made by the Legislature of the British Solo-
mon Islands Protectorate (the same being a part of His
Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom and the
Commonwealth of Australia) for the enforcement within such
part of judgments as defined by section 2 of the *Supreme Court
Act 1923* so far as the same relate to Victorian Judgments,
Orders, and Awards, do now, under the powers conferred by
section 3 of the *Judgments (Reciprocity) Act 1925*, by and
with the advice of the Executive Council, declare the British
Solomon Islands Protectorate to be a reciprocating State for
the purposes of the Judgments (Reciprocity) Acts, and that
the said Acts shall extend and apply to all parts of the British
Solomon Islands Protectorate.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated 17th January, 1928, published in the *Government Gazette*, page 84, a "proclaimed period" and "proclaimed areas" were declared pursuant to section 7 of the *Forests Act* 1927 (No. 3549): And whereas the Commission has now reported to the Minister that serious danger from fire or spread of fire in any part of Victoria as specified no longer exists at present: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby amend the said Proclamation so that the "proclaimed period" shall be from the seventeenth day of January, 1928, to the twentieth day of February, 1928, in lieu of the period stated in the said Proclamation of 17th January, 1928.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings shall be made.

5. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds shall be made.

6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.

7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.

8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.

9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the first day of January, 1928.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

RATING BY-LAW No. 42 FOR 1927-1928.

Making a Rate for Water Supply purposes, fixing a Scale of Charges for Water supplied by measure, and regulating the times of payment.

THE Council of the Shire of Beechworth doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, make the following rates and charges upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of Beechworth, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:—

On every house and tenement of the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under, a rate of £1 2s. 6d. per annum.

On every house and tenement above the annual value of Fifteen pounds (£15), a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation as per rate book.

On every vacant allotment or allotments enclosed by one fence under the annual value of Fifteen pounds, a minimum charge of Ten shillings (10s.) per annum where no connexion to main, and One pound (£1) per annum where connected to main, will be made.

The rate shall be payable in one instalment on and after the second day of December, 1927.

Water supplied by measure to any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, or to any other person (except in cases of special agreement with the Council) shall be supplied, charged, and paid for at the rate of 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

The minimum of water to be charged and paid for in such case where water is supplied by measure shall be 500 gallons.

Water supplied by measure shall be paid for half-yearly, on the 31st March and the 30th September of each year.

This By-law shall take effect from the second day of December, 1927.

CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 30.

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon it by the Water Acts, and whose Waterworks District has, for the purposes of the said Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District, make the By-law following:—

The following rates and charges are those which occupiers or owners of land and tenements shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

(a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Three shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the minimum annual amount to be paid shall be Two pounds five shillings.

(b) Occupied or unoccupied land where no water is supplied shall be charged Five pounds per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation, but the minimum amount to be paid shall be Eight shillings.

(c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this By-law, the rate shall be One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

(d) For steam boilers, the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power for each boiler, except in such cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(e) The supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust will in each case determine, and preliminary payment must be made before a supply can be taken or used.

(f) In case of any dispute as to the sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have the power to decide or make a special rate.

(g) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and

threepence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land supplied otherwise than by measure.

(h) The rate hereby made shall be payable on the 1st day of February, 1928.

(i) Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

WANGARATTA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Wangaratta Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following By-law:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes by the Trust:—

(a) On lands and tenements above the annual municipal value of £24 (except in the case of land on which there is no building), a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound.

(b) On lands and tenements of the annual municipal value of £24 or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings.

(c) On land on which there is no building, the sum of Three pounds two shillings and sixpence (£3 2s. 6d.) per centum on the annual municipal valuation, with a minimum of Thirty shillings if water be laid on.

(d) The charges for the supply of water otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes shall not in any case be less than Thirty shillings per annum, except in the case of land on which there is no building, in which case the charge shall not be less than Ten shillings per annum.

(e) For water supplied by stand-pipes or hydrant, Sixpence (6d.) per load exceeding 100 gallons shall be paid.

(f) For water supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic purposes, not including garden use, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(g) Water supplied by meter and consumed for domestic and garden purposes shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the amount of the assessed rate due for the year in respect of the premises supplied, and for all water used in excess the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

(h) For water supplied by meter solely for purposes other than domestic, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year. The Trust may, in cases where deemed necessary, supply water by special agreement upon such terms and conditions as it may determine.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(j) Such rates and charges shall be payable, in advance, by two equal half-yearly instalments, on the first day of January, 1928, and the first day of July, 1928, respectively.

2. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of under Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not be in any case less than One pound eight shillings per annum.

2. For any house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of unoccupied allotments of land shall be Seven shillings for each allotment not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, Fourteen shillings if more than a quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, Twenty-one shillings if more than half an acre but not exceeding three-quarters of an acre, with a maximum charge of One pound eight shillings sterling for any parcel of land within the Urban District.

4. Where any horses or cows are wholly or partially kept on, or at, any land or tenement not supplied by the Trust with water by measurement there shall be payable for every such animal (exceeding one in number) wholly or partially kept as aforesaid (in addition to the assessment rate) a special rate of Six shillings per head per annum.

5. For water in excess of the quantity covered by the above rate supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons. The quantity covered by the rate shall be 1,000 gallons for every One shilling and ninepence in the amount of rates payable.

6. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable yearly on the 31st day of March, 1928.

SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

BY-LAW No. 46.

A By-law of the Shire of Braybrook made under the provisions of section 652 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and numbered 46, for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the Children's Playground situated in Withers-street, Sunshine.

WHEREAS by section 652 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, power is given to the Council of any municipality, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make By-laws or Regulations (*inter alia*) for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places as have been purchased or otherwise provided by the Council for the providing of pleasure grounds or places of public resort or public recreation: And whereas the said Council has provided the land known as Withers-street playground, being the land comprised in Certificate of Title, volume 2433, folio 486414, as a pleasure ground or place of public recreation: Now therefore the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Braybrook (hereinafter called the Council), in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby in respect of the said land hereinafter designated "Children's Playground," make the following By-law:—

1. No person above the age of fourteen years shall enter the Children's Playground, or use any of the swings or other appliances erected thereon. Provided, however, that parents or other attendants shall be at liberty to enter the playground to watch over children who are in their charge.

2. The swings or other appliances erected in the playground shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.

3. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground except for the purpose for which they are respectively provided.

4. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playground.

5. All paper, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the bins provided by the Council for the purpose.

6. Every person in the Children's Playground shall obey the direction of any officer of the Council or other person appointed by the Council to supervise the Children's Playground in respect of his or her conduct therein.

7. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playground.

8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playground, or bring any animal into the same.

9. Any duly appointed officer or servant of the Council or any other person appointed by the Council to be a supervisor of the Children's Playground shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playground any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, or who wilfully damages any of the swings or other appliances or property in the Children's Playground, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to a penalty hereinafter provided for any such offence.

10. Every person who by act or omission shall contravene any of the foregoing provisions, shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £10.

SHIRE OF GLENELG.

BY-LAW No. 18.

A By-law of the Shire of Glenelg, numbered 18, made under section 662 of the *Local Government Act 1915* for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon, and for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in the Public Reserve in the Township of Wando Vale, Parish of Wando, County of Dundas, being section 2, containing five acres, purchased by the Council of the said Shire for the providing of a place of public resort and recreation.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Glenelg order as follows:—

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings, plus tax, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Council first obtained.
9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
12. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Council may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Council in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these By-laws and by any order of the Council.
13. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
14. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district constituted by the said Public Reserve.
15. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.
16. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Dried Fruits Acts to make Regulations for or with respect to the registration, and the renewal or the transfer of registration of packing sheds, and for other purposes, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

REGISTRATION OF PACKING SHEDS.

General.

1. The Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds which came into operation on the 15th day of February, 1927, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.

2. The following Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Packing Sheds, and shall come into operation on the 15th day of February, 1928.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—

"Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias, and all of such fruits shall be deemed to be "dried" within the meaning of this definition if they are either completely dried or in the process of being dried.

"Packing shed" means any building or erection in which dried fruits are stemmed, processed, graded, sorted, or packed for the purposes of trade or sale, whether such building or erection is or is not used for any other purpose.

4. 6. Applications for transfer of registration of dried fruit packing sheds shall be made in the form prescribed in Schedule II. to these Regulations, and be accompanied by a fee of 5s.

7. Registration by the Board of any packing shed shall be subject to the provisions of the Dried Fruits Acts and to any conditions which may be imposed with respect to—

- the suitability of the premises for the stemming, processing, grading, sorting, and packing of dried fruits;
- the observance of the Regulations in force from time to time regarding the grading, packing, branding, &c., of dried fruits;
- the inspection and regulation of packing sheds;
- the payment of the contribution chargeable under the Dried Fruits Acts;

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the *Dried Fruits Act 1924*, No. 3380, it is provided that the Minister of Agriculture may require all or any persons having any dried fruits owned by them, or in their disposal, or under their control for the purposes of trade or sale to make returns of such dried fruits in such form, and within the time, and to the persons prescribed: And whereas the Minister of Agriculture, by public notice dated the fourteenth day of February, 1928, in the *Government Gazette*, and in three daily newspapers circulating within the State of Victoria, has required all persons not being growers of dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias, having in their disposal, or under their control, for the purposes of trade or sale, more than 1 ton of dried currants, dried sultanas, or dried lexias at any time between the date of the said notice and the 31st day of December, 1928, to make returns of such dried fruits: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria doth order as follows:—

REGISTRATION OF DRIED FRUIT DEALERS.

1. The Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, dated 15th February, 1927, are hereby and the same shall be repealed.

2. The following Regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the Registration of Dried Fruit Dealers, and shall come into operation on and from the seventeenth day of February, 1928.

Definitions.

3. For the purpose of these Regulations—

"Dried fruits" means dried currants, dried sultanas, and dried lexias, and all of such fruits shall be deemed to be "dried" within the meaning of this definition if they are either completely dried or in the process of being dried.

"Dealer" means any person not being a grower of dried fruits who buys or sells in any one year whether on his own behalf or as agent for some other person more than 1 ton of dried fruits but does not include a person who sells only such dried fruits as he buys from dried fruit dealers who are registered as such with the Victorian Dried Fruits Board.

"Person" includes body of persons corporate or unincorporate.

4. Every person who on the date on which these Regulations came into force was engaged in business as a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, on or before the twenty-ninth day of February, 1928.

5. Every person who, after the date on which these Regulations came into force, engages in the business of a dealer in dried fruits shall register with the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne. Such registration shall be made within seven days after the date on which he commences to engage in such business.

6. Every person to whom this Regulation applies shall apply for registration in the form prescribed in Schedule I, to these Regulations, and shall furnish the particulars therein required.

7. Every person to whom this Regulation applies shall furnish to the Secretary to the Victorian Dried Fruits Board, Collins-place, Melbourne, in the form prescribed in Schedule II, to these Regulations, returns relating to the dried fruits owned by them or in their disposal or under their control, whenever required by the Board. Such returns shall be verified by Statutory Declaration.

8. Any person to whom these Regulations applies who fails, neglects, or refuses to comply with the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than One hundred pounds.

AMENDMENTS TO FORESTS REGULATIONS 1925.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of February, 1928.

PRESENT:

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 55 (1) of the *Forests Act 1915*, and section 65 (1) of the *Forests Act 1918*, doth by this Order make the amendments to the Forests Regulation, dated 7th April, 1925, as set out hereunder:—

Clauses 1 to 8 inclusive, Twentieth Schedule, pages 17 and 18, and clauses 1 to 19, Eleventh Schedule, page 15, to be deleted, and there shall be inserted in lieu thereof in each case the following:—

1. The Forest Officer may at any time by notice in writing suspend the work of a licensee or of his servants or his employees in the forest for any breach of the conditions of his licence, and the licensee or his employees or servants when so suspended shall at once cease work in the forest till the Commission gives its decision as to the breach so committed.
2. The Commission may at any time cancel this licence for any breach of its conditions, and for any such breach it may also forfeit the deposit or any portion of it lodged under it by the licensee.

CONDITIONS OF EUCALYPTUS OIL LICENCE FOR LEAVES FOR OIL STILL.

3. The work of cutting and removal of leaves, twigs, or branches shall be subject to the control of the Forest Officer, and shall be carried out in sections, each section being properly cut over and cleaned up before another section is entered on.
4. If during the period for which this licence is issued, the Commission deems the resumption of the whole or any part of the land described in the licence necessary for the purposes of the *Forests Acts*, the Commission may resume possession of the land, or of part thereof, without giving compensation to the licensee for so doing.
5. The licence shall be produced by the licensee upon the request of any Forest Officer or police constable.
6. The licensee shall lodge a sum of £..... as a guarantee of strict compliance with the conditions of his licence.
7. In cutting old mallee or other eucalyptus growth the stems shall be cut close to the surface of the ground, and all waste stems and debris shall be properly stacked, and burnt in safe weather only.
8. In cutting eucalyptus growth other than mallee, no sapling of a greater diameter than 2 inches at butt shall be cut unless marked for felling by a Forest Officer. All marked saplings so cut shall be paid for by the licensee at usual royalty rates.
9. In treating seedling and coppice growth, at least one such seedling and coppice of the straightest and most vigorous growth shall be left undamaged every 20 feet.
10. Leaves and twigs removed under this licence shall not be mixed with leaves from private lands at any time before or during distillation.
11. The licensee shall be directly responsible for all work and cutting on his licensed area.
12. The licensee shall not sublet nor in any way transfer the control of his area to any other person without the consent, in writing, of the Commission previously obtained, and the payment of a fee of 5s.
13. The royalty due and payable to the Commission on demand under this licence shall be One penny or such other rate as may be fixed by the Commission, for each pound weight of oil distilled from the leaves. The licensee shall furnish to the Forest Officer before the fifth day of each month a statement signed by the proprietor of the still showing the quantity of oil and number of vats distilled during the preceding month from leaves obtained under this licence.
14. The licensee and the proprietor of the still at which leaves, twigs, or branches are delivered shall keep a true and correct record of all such leaves, twigs, and branches delivered at the still under this licence, and also a record of each vat distilled. The books containing such records, and all dockets, invoices, and accounts of sales or deliveries of oil shall at all reasonable times be produced and made available for inspection by the Forest Officer.

15. The licensee shall thoroughly and effectively protect the Forest area within the boundaries of his licensed area from fire, and shall extinguish any fire which may break out on such or may spread to it. Failure or neglect to carry out this duty shall render this licence subject to immediate cancellation by the Commission.

16. In the event of the area being damaged by fire, the licence may be cancelled unless the licensee satisfy the Commission that neither he, nor his workmen or servants, directly or indirectly, were in any way responsible therefor.

To clause 75, pages 5 and 6, there shall be added the following:—

- For a eucalyptus oil area licence, per annum, £1.
 - For the preparation of eucalyptus oil area licence, 2s. 6d.
 - For the renewal of eucalyptus oil area licence, 1s.

On and from the date upon which this Regulation becomes effective, the fees to be paid to an appointed member of the Railways Classification Board, who is not an officer or employee in the railway service, shall be as follows, namely: in respect of each occasion upon which such a member of the said Board actually attends at a morning session or at an afternoon session of the said Board a fee of One pound eleven shillings and sixpence. Provided that the maximum fee payable in respect of attendance on any one day shall not exceed the sum of Three pounds and three shillings.

2. Sub-clause (b) of clause 1 of Regulation No. 4, made the twenty-fifth day of March, 1924, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the second day of April in that year, is hereby repealed.

3. This Regulation shall become effective on the first day of March now next.

A LAUNDRY WORKERS BOARD TO BE APPOINTED.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (a) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons engaged in the occupation of a person employed at laundry work, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of—

The Boarding Houses Board,
The Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board,
The Hotel and Restaurant Board,
The Shirt Board, and
The Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board.

- (b) Order that a Wages Board consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons engaged in the occupation of a person employed at laundry work, but not including persons subject to the jurisdiction of—

The Boarding Houses Board,
The Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board,
The Hotel and Restaurant Board,
The Shirt Board, and
The Storemen, Packers, and Sorters Board.

Also that such Wages Board may be in any regulation determination, order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Laundry Workers Board, and the area or locality within which the Determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Sandringham, and Warrnambool, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS AND TOBACCONISTS' SHOPS WITHIN A RADIUS OF HALF A MILE OF THE SORRENTO POST OFFICE.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition certified by the Municipal Clerk of the municipal district of the Shire of Flinders, as signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping hairdressers' and tobacconists' shops respectively within the locality to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for hairdressers' shops and tobacconists' shops within a radius of half a mile of the Sorrento Post Office within the Shire of Flinders to be kept open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday in each week until the hour of Nine o'clock.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF WALPEUP.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Walpeup, within the municipal district of the Shire of Walpeup, of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

(1) All shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Township of Walpeup, within the municipal district of the Shire of Walpeup, shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 98 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, as amended by section 4 of the Factories and Shops Act 1919 (No. 3048), so far as the closing hours of all such shops on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays are concerned.

(2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
(b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday; and
(c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF WALPEUP.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and pedlars) keeping shops within the Township of Walpeup, within the municipal district of the Shire of Walpeup, of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

(1) All shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, tobacconists' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1915) within the Township of Walpeup, within the Municipal District of the Shire of Walpeup, shall be exempted from the provisions of section 77 of the Factories and Shops Act 1915, as amended by sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Factories and Shops Act 1919 (No. 3048).

(2) All such shops shall be closed in each week during the whole of each year from the hour of—

- (a) Nine o'clock on the evening of Saturday;
(b) Seven o'clock on the evening of Friday; and
(c) One o'clock on the afternoon of Wednesday.

And the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM PORTION OF THE PLENTY RIVER NEAR GREENSBOROUGH FOR A PERIOD OF THREE YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from that portion of the Plenty River between a point known as "The Pipes" (about one and a quarter (1¼) miles north of the Township of Greensborough) and the junction of the Plenty River with the Yarra River, for a period of three years.

PROCLAMATION

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts, and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Lerderderg River and the Werribee River upstream from its junction with the Lerderderg River from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August in each year, both days inclusive.

In all cases the country of origin of the articles offered must be stated, and the total cost of each item extended in the columns provided.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board. *Cheques, Savings Bank deposit books, fixed deposit receipts, State or Commonwealth Treasury bonds or Government debentures, or reference to securities on existing contracts will in no case be received or entertained as preliminary deposits.* Preliminary deposits will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application.

The amount of the deposit required with each tender must be enclosed and the amount must be clearly written in and the designation stated, whether marked cheque, bank draft, or bank notes, as the case may be.

Security will be required, either in Bank Guarantee (Bank to be approved by the Tender Board), Victorian or Commonwealth Government debentures, Savings Bank deposit book, or fixed deposit receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, the preliminary deposit will be forfeited, and, in addition, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, then his tender is to be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual; and that for a breach of this condition the preliminary deposit will be forfeited and the tender declared informal.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for ——" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne, which office they must reach by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. Except where actual quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. Under this contract goods may be ordered by any department of the Commonwealth, but it shall be optional on the part of the contractor to supply.

3. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture.* In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

4. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

5. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

6. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of 6 miles from the General Post Office.

7. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officer ordering the goods.

8. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in clause 7, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 8.

10. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. Where practicable, the use of more than one account form for each Department or sub-Department must be avoided. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Clause 8.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering, or replacing them, when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 15, and 16 of these Conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding fifty pounds as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 8. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned, on a legibly written business label.

15. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Department or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 16. (In the case of the Commonwealth Departments, however, the Commonwealth consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend as in Clause 13 of these conditions.

16. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted, as in Clause 8.

17. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instances provide, in writing on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, then the tender is to be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the Honorable the Treasurer, may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works through the Board of Land and Works or State Rivers and Water Supply, Forests, and Electricity Commissioners, or on account of the Land Settlement and Purchase Board or Country Roads Board, or for the Federal Government, or for the Railway Department, or for supplies for Technical, High or Higher Elementary Schools, or for the Metropolitan Parks and Gardens, or for supplies to the Aborigines, or for connexions and fittings for Drills and Batteries; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-24, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. The foregoing provision, however, shall not apply to contracts for imported goods in which fixed and definite quantities to be delivered at stated times are expressed in the Schedules. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in Clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE STOREMEN, PACKERS, AND SORTERS BOARD.

This Determination on the 29th February, 1928, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely :—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the 20th April, 1926, has had the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person employed—

- (a) as a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter,
(b) in assisting a Storeman, Packer, or Sorter,
(c) as an assembler, collector, or checker of goods in course of receipt or despatch.

(5) SPECIAL RATES FOR SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), King's Birthday (3rd June), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the days so substituted.

(6) TIME RATE.—Any person (other than those in potato or onion stores, on wharfs, or in wharf sheds, customs railway sheds, or fumigating sheds) employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the maximum number of hours fixed in this determination be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.

(7) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(8) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 144 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1915*, No. 2650, that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices for wholly or partly packing or sorting any articles for which wages rates are fixed, provided that such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages rate fixed by the Board for such work.
