VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW No. 288.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law and do hereby repeal so much of the provisions of all previous By-laws as conflicts therewith :—

(1) The mileage rates specified on pages 71 to 105 inclusive of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283), for the carriage of goods classified under Class "C" shall be increased by 2½ per cent. provided however that such of the raw materials forwarded to and manufactured products forwarded on the "Up" journey from Victorian Country Industries specified on pages 207 to 213 of the said Goods Rates Book as are classified under Class "C" rate shall be exempt from the aforementioned increase.

(2) The mileage rates specified on pages 71 to 105 inclusive of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) for the carriage of goods classified under Class "M" shall be increased by 5 per cent., provided however that such of the raw materials forwarded to and manufactured products forwarded on the "Up" journey from Victorian Country Industries specified on pages 207 to 213 of the said Goods Rates Book as are classified under Class "M" rate shall be exempt from the aforementioned increase and provided further that the increase shall not be imposed in respect of unseasoned hardwood timber, Murray Pine timber, or wire netting.

(3) The charges prescribed on pages 106 and 107 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) under the heading "Tariff for Smalls" shall be increased by 5 per cent.

(4) The rate of Class "M" less 10 per cent. prescribed on page 60 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) for the carriage of Sand is hereby withdrawn and in lieu thereof Sand shall be charged the mileage rates prescribed for Class "M" in Clause 2 hereof.

(5) The provisions relating to the Commodity Rates for Coal prescribed on page 207 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) are amended as follows :—

(a) The ordinary rate for the carriage of coal shall be the Class "M" rate prescribed in clause 2 hereof less 5 per cent., provided that the minimum charge shall be 3s. 10d. per ton for distances up to and inclusive of 10 miles.

(b) In respect of coal forwarded by rail on the "Up" journey from any coal-field in Victoria direct to any station, the rate for the carriage of such coal over the whole or any part of the line from the coal-field to Melbourne shall be .882 pence per ton per mile, and the rate for the carriage of such coal on any other line shall be the difference between the Class "M" rate prescribed in clause 2 hereof less 5 per cent. for the mileage journey from the coal-field to Melbourne, or any portion of such journey over which the coal has been hauled, and the Class "M" rate prescribed in clause 2 hereof less 5 per cent. for the total mileage from the coal-field to the station of destination, provided that the minimum charge to be paid by the consignor or consignee shall be 3s. 10d. per ton; and that the freight charge to be paid by the consignor or consignee for the carriage of coal from the coal-field to any station on any other line shall not be less than the mileage rate from Melbourne to such station. Class "M" rate prescribed in clause 2 hereof less 5 per cent. may be charged if in any instance it is cheaper than to compute the freight charges as prescribed in the preceding parts of this clause.

The above are the Owner's Risk rates. The Commissioners' Risk rate shall be computed at 5 per cent. additional on the Owner's Risk rates.

(6) The Commodity Rates provided on page 216 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) for Gravel, Metal, Metal Screenings (Dry), Rubble, Stone Dust, Toppings and Spalls, forwarded to Victorian Shire and Borough Councils, Water Trusts, Country Roads Board, State Electricity Commission of Victoria, State Coal Mine and the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission are hereby abolished and the materials mentioned shall be charged the mileage rates prescribed for Class "M" in clause 2 hereof.

(7) The Commodity Rate provided on page 216 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) for the carriage of Gravel, Metal, Metal Screenings (Dry), Rubble, Stone Dust, Toppings and Spalls for Victorian City and Town Councils and for the Metropolitan Tramways Board is hereby abolished, and the materials mentioned shall be charged the mileage rates prescribed for Class "M" in clause 2 hereof.

(8) The rate prescribed on page 222 of the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) for the carriage of Tar, Mephalt, Asphalt Oil and Bitumen consigned to Victorian City, Town, Borough or Shire Councils, Country Roads Board or the State Coal Mine is hereby abolished and the commodities specified shall be charged the Class "C" rate prescribed in clause 1 hereof.

(9) The several rates and charges prescribed in the Goods Rates Book (By-law No. 283) for Haulage, Storage, Weighing, Demurrage, Loading and Unloading, Hire of Tarpaulins, Detention to Goods Trains Shunting and for the Carriage of Empties at a fixed rate per package shall be increased by 5 per cent.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVES FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP AND PARISH OF FRANKSTON.

THE Council of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land specified hereunder, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1915:—

1. The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 4th May, 1927, as a site for Public purposes, being 5 acres 16 perches in the Township of Frankston, Parish of Frankston, County of Mornington, situated in section 9.

2. The land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 4th May, 1927, as a site for Public purposes, being 6 acres 2 roods 20 and 3-10th perches in the Township of Frankston, Parish of Frankston, County of Mornington.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserves may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserves.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the reserves, stick bills thereon, or cut names thereon, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserves, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the reserves any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the money received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserves, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the reserves, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the reserves (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the Pounds Act 1915.

7. No person shall bring into the reserves any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the reserves or erect therein any dwellings, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the reserves.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the reserves, and any person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and reserves.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the reserves on Sundays.

13. Any person renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No person except labourers or workmen employed in the reserves shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees and shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

WE, Ernest James Andrew, Albert Henry Charles Price, Hubert Rutter, William John Capewell, Wilfred Kent Hughes, and George Henry Jennings, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 28th May, 1913, as a site for public recreation in the Town of Eltham, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

11. No person shall hawk, sell, or offer for sale within the Reserve any article or commodity without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at the time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure; and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of a guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

13. No person shall perform in any band of music or take part in any public entertainment in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

15. PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES.

REGULATIONS IN CONNEXION WITH THE VOTE OF FOUR THOUSAND POUNDS (£4,000) FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS, GARDENS, AND OTHER RESERVES, UNDER THE CONTROL OF BOROUGH COUNCILS, TRUSTEES, COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT, ETC.

A SUM of Two thousand two hundred and fifty pounds (£2,250) shall be distributed in such manner and on such terms and conditions as the Minister of Lands shall approve, and the remainder (£1,750) shall be dealt with as follows :—

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings (5s.) may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, having a claim on the vote, for every One pound (£1) expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land, and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister of Lands may approve, in such park, garden, or other reserve, between 1st January, 1927, and 31st December, 1927, out of the funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Lands on or before the 1st day of May, 1928. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made on Form "A," and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form "B".

2. The term "Locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve, from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park, garden, or other reserve, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purposes, between the 1st January, 1927, and 31st December, 1927, but it shall not mean or include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates nor the balance of any subsidy paid by the Government at any period prior to 1st January, 1927.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park, garden, or other reserve shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1927 (*vide form "A"*) and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of One thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds (£1,750) they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. The foregoing shall not apply to parks, gardens, and other reserves within the limits of the City of Melbourne (except the Royal Park) or to the Albert Park, South Melbourne, and St. Kilda.

CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

REGULATION No. 244.

A Regulation of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 1 of Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1915, adopted by the Council by By-law No. 108, and numbered 244, for the purpose of regulating bathing within the City.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. That Regulations numbered 212 and 213 be repealed and the following clauses enacted in lieu thereof.

Bathing Places.

2. No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing in any part of the City, except at the following places which are hereby set apart as bathing places, viz.:—

- (a) That part of the foreshore of Hobson's Bay commencing at the centre of Fraser-street, north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point distant 100 yards south-easterly from the south-eastern boundary of the Middle Park Baths.
- (b) From a point 100 yards north-westerly from the western side of the Middle Park Baths along the shores of Hobson's Bay north-westerly to a point distant south-easterly from the east side of Kerferd-road Pier 100 yards.
- (c) From a point distant 100 yards north-westerly from the north western boundary of Stubb's Gentlemen's Baths, north-westerly along the shores of Hobson's Bay to a point 100 yards distant south-easterly from the south-eastern side of the Pickles street Drainage Pier.
- (d) At all other places within the City bathing is prohibited, except in the baths permanently provided for that purpose, namely, Stubb's Gentlemen's Baths, Stubb's Hot Salt Water Baths, Stubb's Ladies' Baths, and the Middle Park Baths.

Time.

3. No person shall bathe or undress for the purpose of bathing at any of the places set apart by the Council, and other than those permanently provided as aforesaid between the hours of 10.30 p.m. and 5 a.m., on every day of the week.

Dress.

4. (1) No person shall bathe unless dressed in a two-piece Canadian bathing or similar skirted costume.

(2) No person clothed only in a bathing costume shall sit, lie, loiter on or run along the beach or seashore, but shall proceed in a direct line to and from the dressing place.

(3) No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his bathing costume in any place open to the public view.

5. No male over the age of 8 years shall trespass on any dressing shed reserved for the use of females, and no females over the age of 12 years shall trespass on the dressing shed reserved for males, except for the purpose of rendering assistance in cases of accident.

6. No person shall play games in, loiter, bring any rubbish, filth or other offensive matter into, or damage, disfigure, or write upon any of the dressing sheds or enclosure set apart by the Council.

Behaviour.

7. No person shall behave in an unseemly, improper, riotous, or noisy manner, to the annoyance of the public, or shall blaspheme, use profane or obscene language, or behave in an indecent manner in or upon any part of the beach, foreshore, or water set apart or used by the public for bathing purposes, or in connexion with such purpose.

8. No person shall ride, drive or lead any horse or other animal upon or along any part of the seashore at any other than a walking pace.

Sunbasking.

9. No person shall engage in sunbasking on the beach unless his or her bathing costume is covered by short knickers, overcoat, kimona, or other suitable covering.

Bathing Horses, &c.

10. Bathing of horses or other animals is prohibited within the limits of the City of South Melbourne, except on that part of the foreshore between the Pickles-street Drainage Pier, and a point 75 yards distant south-east therefrom, and then only between the hours of 5 a.m. and 9 a.m., in this area.

11. The Council is duly empowered by these Regulations to fix, by special order, charges for the use of shelters, lockers, or other conveniences.

12. All Bathing Regulations within the City shall have application to all persons of the age of eight years and over.

This Regulation shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of South Melbourne, and to within 300 yards seawards from the boundary of South Melbourne on the shore of Hobson's Bay, as set forth in Part IX. of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1915.
