NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT ALL FISHING IN OR TAKING OF FISH FROM THE GELLIBRAND RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES ABOVE OR UP-STREAM FROM THE LOWER GELLIBRAND BRIDGE FROM 1ST MAY TO 15TH DECEMBER IN EACH YEAR.

I T is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proelamation prohibiting all fishing in, or the taking of fish from, the Gellibrand River and its tributaries above or upstream from the Lower Gellibrand Bridge, from the first day of May to the fifteenth day of December in each year.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION. By-Law No. 1985.—Rate and Charge for Water Supplied.— North Wonthaggi Urdan District, within the Wonthaggi Waterworks District.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth heroby make the By-law following:—

- 1. All previous By-laws and Regulations relating to the subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked. subject-matter herein shall be and the same are hereby revoked, but not so as to relieve, discharge, or absolve any person from liability to pay any rate or charge made in accordance with the provisions of the revoked By-laws or Regulations, for payment of which rate or charge such person may have become liable prior to or at the date of this By-law coming into operation; or to abrogate or diminish the power of the said Commission to recover and enforce payment of any such rate or charge; or to annul or stay any proceedings taken or business initiated as in conformity with the provisions of the By-laws or Regulations hereby revoked prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation, but the same respectively may be continued and carried to completion. and carried to completion.
- 2. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the North Wonthaggi Urban District, within the Wonthaggi Waterworks District:—
 - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is

 - (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Fifteen shillings for the period hereinafter set out.

 (2) On lands on which there is no building situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Twelvepence in the pound of the valuation of such lands. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such lands shall not be less than the sum of Two shillings and sixpence for the period hereinafter set out.

 (3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates

- 3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning with the 1st day of January, 1928, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1928, and shall be payable on the 13th day of April, 1928, at the office of the said Commission, at Wonthaggi.
- 4. For making and levying such rates, the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.
- 5. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Eightpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.
- 6. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges for water supplied.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FURNITURE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 14th April, 1923, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the 17th January, 1928, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to:—

- (1) Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in repairing any new or second-hand article of furniture, usually made or partly prepared by cabinetmakers, chair and couch makers, upholsterers, wood carvers, frenchpolishers, and wood turners;
- (2) Any person or persons or classes of persons employed in-

 - (a) fixing or repairing new or second-hand furniture or seating in buildings; or (b) french, wax, or lacquer polishing new or second-hand furniture or fittings in or in connexion with buildings,

has made the following Determination, namely:-

- (1) That on the 14th April, 1928, the last previous Determination shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) (a) Any person employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of furniture or in preparing any new or secondhand article of furniture shall be paid Sixpence per hour in addition to the lowest rate fixed by the Board, unless the following are provided by the employer, if required in the performance of the work:—Benches, wood or iron cramps over 2 ft. 6 in., hand screws (in excess of four), gine pots and glue brushes, and varnish brushes.

(b) Any employee engaged at frenchpolishing shall be supplied with all materials, including rags, brushes, and kit-box.

(4) DEFINITION OF A JUVENILE WORKER.—A juvenile worker is a person under 21 years of age (other than an apprentice or an improver) engaged in the following work:—

(7) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rates shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
