REGULATIONS .-- LEAVE OF ABSENCE--CHAPTER XIV.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers of the powers vested in him, hereby amends Chapter XIV., of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

For-Clause 7 Read-

- 7. Leave of absence may be granted to officers for the purpose of attending naval and military training, on the following terms, viz.:—
 - (a) Officers who are members of the Citizen Forces, whether serving voluntarily or as trainees, and who are required to attend the annual training prescribed in Part XII. of the Defence Act 1903-1918.

Where the amount of pay which the officer would have received if he had remained on duty exceeds the amount of pay received as a member of the Naval or Military Citizen Forces—with pay equal to the difference, provided that if the officer so desires, the amount of leave of absence granted may be deducted from recreation leave due.

(b) Officers when attending a school, class, or course of instruction.

instruction.

Instruction.
Without pay, provided that, if the officer so desires, the amount of leave of absence granted may be deducted from recreation leave due.
The leave shall be granted subject to the convenience of the Department, and for the purpose of attending one school, class, or course of instruction annually.

Applications for leave under sub-clauses "(a)" and "(b)" must be accompanied by evidence of the necessity for attendance. A certificate of attendance must be furnished at the expiration of the leave.

(c) Officers who are required to perform the training required by section 127 of the Defence Act 1903-1918, as Senior Cadets.

With full pay on production of evidence that attendance is necessary.

(d) Officers holding commissions and serving voluntarily in Cadet units, for the purpose of attending compulsory camps or parades.

On production of evidence that attendance is necessary—with full pay, if no pay is received from the Commonwealth Government. If pay is received, but is less than that which would have been received if the officer had remained on duty—with pay equal to the difference, provided that, if the officer so desires, the amount of leave of absence granted may be deducted from recreation leave due.

(c) Leave of absence shall not be granted under this clause in respect of any period of training required of an officer for failure to become efficient as a trainee, or while undergoing training or detention for an offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE STORAGE OF PETROLEUM, ETC.. CITY OF RICHMOND.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Mclbourne, the seventeenth day of April, 1928.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

Mr. Lemmon Mr. Jones

Mr. Disney Mr. Williams.

HEREAS by section 11 of the Local Government Act 1921 (No. 3167) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations applicable to the whole of Victoria, or to such municipal districts (including the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong) as are specified therein for or with respect to regulating the keeping and storage of petroleum, or any product of petroleum (including kerosene), turpentine, or other volatile or inflammable liquids, and carbide or other combustible substances: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section of the said Act and all other powers him enabling in that behalf, doth hereby make the following Regulations, and doth provide that the said Regulations shall apply and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Richmond, and furthermore that such Regulations shall be deemed to be in substitution of any By-law or By-laws made by the said Council of the said municipality for the purpose for which these Regulations are now made, and shall take effect from the first day of May, 1928.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

Storage of More than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or More than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

- 1. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises more than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:
 - (1) The site of all buildings shall be first approved of by the Council.
 - (2) The buildings shall be constructed with walls of brick concrete, iron, or other non-inflammable material except that in the case of a galvanized-iron structure the lower portion of the walls must be in brick.
 - (3) The floor of such buildings shall be made of earth, concrete, or brick. The roof of such buildings shall be constructed of incombustible material.
 - (4) To prevent outflow the lower portion of all walls to be without break or opening, the capacity of such enclosed space to be at least 25 per cent. of the total volume of volatile fluids kept, stored, or re-tained in any such buildings.

Storage of Less than 50 Gallons of Petrol, &c., or Less than 250 Gallons of Kerosene, &c.

- 2. Every person who shall keep, store, or retain in or upon or about any buildings or premises less than 50 gallons in the aggregate of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or less than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test shall comply with the following requirements:
 - el close test shall comply with the following requirements:—

 (1) In quantities not exceeding 50 gallons in the aggregate of any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto if such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of metal or other approved material including winchesters, so securely closed that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom, and if all due precautions are taken to prevent accident by fire or explosion and to prevent the escape of any such volatile fluids into a sewer or drain, and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits, startways, or adjoining premises, except that a reasonable quantity not exceeding 12 gallons in the aggregate of the said volatile fluids may be kept in separate glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint so securely closed or stopped that neither liquid nor vapour can escape therefrom and if the position of storage is free from other easily combustible goods and will not menace exits or stairways.

(2) In quantities not exceeding 250 gallons of petroleum or any product of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test provided such volatile fluids are kept in substantial vessels of glass, earthenware, or metal, and are suitably closed or stopped, and the position of storage will not menace exits, stairways, or adjoining premises.

Precautions to be Taken when Volatile Fluids are Stored in Bulk Containers.

3. Every tank or other container used for the purpose of the storage or keeping of any volatile fluids shall when not in use be kept tightly closed to prevent the escape of such fluids or any vapour or gas emitted therefrom.

Precautions to be Observed in Buildings.

- 4. Whenever any person shall have in or upon or about any building or premises more than 50 gallons (or more than 12 gallons if kept in glass or earthenware vessels each containing not more than one pint) of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto or more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test he shall observe the following precautions against fire:—
 - (1) One 2-gallon carbon tetra-chloride or other approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire and to be under the supervision of the Metropolitan Fire Brigade where practicable.
 - (2) At least two iron buckets or other suitable containers each having a capacity of not less than a quarter of a cubic foot, filled with dry send shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of
 - (3) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor and shall after being so used be forthwith removed from the pre-
 - (4) The use of sawdust for absorbing the said volatile fluids is prohibited.

Containers to be Labelled for Retail Sale.

5. Any person who for retail sale fills into small containers on premises any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall have the fire-fighting appliances as mentioned in the preceding section and shall clearly label such small containers with the name of the contents and with the following words:—"Highly inflammable. Beware of the vapours. Keep fire away."

Regulations not to Apply to Storage of Alcoholic Spirits.

6. Nothing herein contained shall apply to the storing of alcoholic (other than methylated) spirits.

Conditions to be Observed in the Construction of Tanks.

- 7. Every person who shall erect or construct any storage tank for the storage of more than 250 gallons of petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile fluids shall comply with the following requirements:—

 - (1) The site of all storage tanks other than underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be first approved by the Council for that purpose.

 (2) Underground tanks not exceeding 1,000 gallons capacity shall be constructed of galvanized steel plate not less than 14 gauge, and be placed not less than 2 feet below the surface of the ground or the lowest floor of any building. Sand shall be filled in over the tank to the level of the ground or floor as the case may require. Tanks shall be adequately ventilated and fitted with safety devices to the satisfaction of the engineer. Filling pipes may be placed where the engineer approves, but so as not to cause any obstruction to the traffic when the tanks are being filled.

 (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the
 - the tanks are being filled.

 (3) Storage tanks which are erected upon or above the surface of the ground or partly below and partly above the surface of the ground shall be enclosed by a wall of brick, stone, or concrete, or an earthen dam of approved construction; such wall or dam shall be in no case of less height than 2 feet higher than the level to which the oil would rise should it escape from the tanks. An opening may be made in the enclosing wall to permit access to the tank but such opening shall contain a liquid-tight door either sliding or opening inward, made of incombustible material, and of sufficient strength to resist any pressure which may be brought to bear on such door by the bursting of the tank enclosed in such wall.

Portable Filling Tanks.

8. Every person who shall have in or upon any building or premises any portable filling tank shall comply with the following requirements:—

- No portable filling tank shall exceed 50 gallons capacity, and shall be—

 (a) constructed of number 12 gauge galvanized steel or of iron not less than three-sixteenths of an inch in thickness, and oxy-acetylene welded or riveted with rivets not more than one inch apart measured from centre to centre;

 (b) mounted on all-metal wheels with rubber tires;

 (c) soldered and painted on the outside;

 (d) fitted with an approved pump for the removal of its contents.

(d) fitted with an approved pump for the removal of the contents.

Every such portable filling tank may be filled and refilled at the kerb line of the footpath by means of a pipe connexion from a similar approved tank, and in no other manner whatsoever, and its contents may be removed by means of such approved pump, and in no other manner whatsoever.

Every person who shall have in or upon any building or premises any such approved portable filling tank in which any such volatile fluid is being kept or stored, shall observe the following precautions against fire:

(a) One 2-gallon approved chemical fire extinguisher shall be kept in such a position in relation to the portable filling tank as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.

(b) At least four iron buckets filled with dry sand shall be kept in position in different parts of the building so as to be easy of access at all times in the event of fire.

(c) Dry sand shall be used for absorbing all volatile fluids spilt or thrown upon the floor, and shall, after being so used, be forthwith removed from the premises.

(d) The use of sawdust for absorbing oils or petrol is

prohibited.

(e) The approved portable filling tank shall be at all times kept near a door leading into the street, and so as to be readily removable from the premises in the event of fire.

Power to Enter and Inspect.

9. Any officer authorized by the Council may for the purpose of securing the due observance of and compliance with the provisions of these Regulations enter and inspect any building or erection at all reasonable times and do therein all such acts and things as are reasonably necessary for the purpose aforesaid, and any persons who shall in any manner interfere with such officer in the execution of his duty shall be guilty of an offence. Offence.

10. Every person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty.

11. Every person guilty of an offence under these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each succeeding day after a written notice of the offence from the Council.

Exemptions May be Made by the Council.

The Council may, if it considers reasonable care will be observed, exempt from any one or more of these Regulations inflammable liquids when kept for private use, provided the store is exclusively used for inflammable liquids, and not less than 50 feet intervene between the store and other buildings or an adjoining property boundary.

NOTE.—Private use does not include inflammable liquids kept for sale or for purely business activities.

Definitions.

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "approved" means approved in writing by the engineer for the time being of the said City of Richmond or any deputy appointed by the said Council of the said municipality to act for him. "Person" includes firm, corporation, or company; and "volatile fluid" includes any of the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and also includes petroleum or any products of petroleum, turpentine, or other volatile, fluids mentioned in these Regulations that will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at not below 73 deg. Fah. Abel close test if such are stored in immediate contiguity with the volatile fluids mentioned in the Schedule.

REGULATION No. 1.

REGULATIONS FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST, AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.

WHEREAS by section 32 of the Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1915 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes following:—

- (a) Prescribing the mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under this Act are to be convened;
 (b) prescribing the form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under this Act;
- (c) regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of every such Trust and the numbers of members to form a quorum thereof, and the appointment of the chairman of each Trust; and
- (d) generally for carrying into effect the provisions of this Act:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 32 of the above-recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the Railway Lands Acquisition Acts, and known as the Darling to Glen Waverley Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulations following, wire:

- 1. First Meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
- 2. Time and Place of Meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.

 3. Quorums of Meetings.—There shall be present at least three members at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of two members, avoluting of the Chairmen.
- exclusive of the Chairman.
- 4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the-first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, and thereafter annually, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman for one year if he remain a member of the municipal Council of his district, and may be willing to get
- 5. Vacancy of Chairman, how Filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such received. meeting.
- 6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal Council of his district, and be willing to set willing to act.
- 7. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
- 8. Special Meetings.—The Trust may hold special meeting, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any three members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
- 9. General Conduct of Business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
- 10. Meetings, Notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
- 11. Minutes of Meeting to be Read at Subsequent Meeting.

 —At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting of a question for the confirmation

of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.

- 12. Order of Business of Meetings.—After the signing of the minutes, as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
 - (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
 - (11.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
 - (III.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
 - (IV.) Presentation of reports of committees.
 - (v.) Payments.
 - (VI.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
 - (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
 - (VIII.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
 - (IX.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
 - (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

- 13. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.
- 14. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.
- 15. Notice of Motion to be Given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding
- 16. Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.
- 17. Motions to be Moved in Order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.
- 18. Motion to be Moved by Member giving Notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.
- 19. Mover of Motion Appointing Committee to be a Member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.
- 20. Draft of Address or Petition to be Submitted at Previous Meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.
- 21. Order, &c., of Debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.
- 22. Nature of Motion to be Stated .- Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.
- 23. No Motion to be Withdrawn without Leave.-No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.
- 24. Motion to be Seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- 25. Mover of Motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 26. Motions, dc., how Decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

- 27. Resolutions, how Revoked or Altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.
- 28. Priority of Members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.
- 29. Members to Stand while Addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.
- 30. Points of Order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussion or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.
- 31. Members not to Digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.
- 32. Members to Apologize for Disorderly or Offensive Expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a salisfactory apology to the Trust.
- 33. Members Called to Order to Sit Down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.
- 34. Members Twice Offending to be Liable to a Penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
- 35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any receting of the Trust, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.
- 36. Members may Demand Documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
- 37. No second Amendment until Previous One Disposed of.

 No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 38. Mover of Motion to have Right of Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
- 39. No Discussion on Motion for Adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.
- was so interrupted.

 40. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.
- 41. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
- 42. Lapsed Order of the Day may be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

- 43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust.
- 44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the committee.
- 45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.
- 48. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his didlity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received and from whom. He shall pay the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary, and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

CITY OF PORT MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 97.

A By-law of the City of Port Melbourne, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the Local Government Act 1915, and under section 6 of the Police Offences Act 1915, and numbered 97, for regulating street traffic and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915 and by the Police Offences Act 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Port Melbourne order as follows:—

1. (I.) The Council may, by notice in writing, signed by the Mayor, or, in his absence, the Town Clerk, from time to time fix or appoint or alter in any street or lands or place under the control of the Council any of the following matters or things, namely:—

(a) Safety zones;
(b) stopping places for licensed motor buses to pick up or set down passengers;
(c) parking areas for motor cars, motor cycles, and other vehicles; and

(d) stands for licensed motor cars or other licensed hackney carriages plying for hire.

nackney carriages plying for hire.

(II.) Any safety zone, stopping place, parking area, or public stand as aforesaid shall be indicated by a notice, or by a copy of the said notice, and shall thereupon be deemed to have been duly fixed or appointed under this By-law.

(III.) Any such safety zone, stopping place, parking area, or public stand as aforesaid, whether fixed or appointed by this By-law or otherwise, may be discontinued or abolished by the Council by order and by removal of the notice relating thereto.

No person in charge or control of any motor car, motor cycle, or vehicle or animal shall cause any obstruction to the traffic upon any street or land or place under the control of the Council.

A person in charge or control of any motor car, motor cycle, or vehicle or animal which, in the opinion of any member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, or person authorized in writing for that purpose by the Council, is causing, or is likely to cause, an obstruction to the trafficupon any street or any land or place under the control of the Council shall forthwith, if so directed by such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council, or authorized person, remove the same, either from the vicinity to some such adjacent part of that or some other street, land, or place as is indicated by such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council or authorized person.
