BY-LAW NO. 1988.—RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER SUPPLIED.—MITIAMO URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District.

(1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

(2) Of lands on which there is no building, situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such lands.

(3) Of any tenement or land on which there is no building situate otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down, and which tenement or land is not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenement or land is over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof—one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1928, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1928, and shall be payable on the 4th day of May, 1928, at the office of the Commission, at Pyramid Hill.

3. ORDER APPROVING OF A DEVIATION FROM A
DEVELOPMENTAL ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF
NARRACAN.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1915* (No. 2635) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the deviation hereinafter referred to from the existing Thorpdale-Yarragon road, in the Shire of Narracan (declared to be a developmental road under the Developmental Roads Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 4th June, 1919, on page 1327) should be made by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said first-cited Act has caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said deviation is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land and constructing the said deviation: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said road being made, that is to say:—

All that piece of land in the Parish of Moe, and being a roadway one chain or more in width, the western boundary of which commences at a point on the northern boundary of allotment 16 of the said parish, distant 99 deg. 44 min. 2,536.9 links from the north-western angle of said allotment; thence south-westerly, southerly, south-easterly and generally south-westerly through that allotment, across a one-chain road and generally southerly and south-westerly through allotment 18 to a point on the southern boundary of that allotment, distant 279 deg. 44 min. 796.4 links from the junction of the western boundary of the existing Government road through the said allotment 18 and the said southern boundary.

CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

REGULATION NO. 54.

A Regulation of the City of Footscray made under section 2 of Part 4 of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1915* in force in the city by virtue of a By-law of the above-named city and numbered 28 for the proper management and control of the Municipal Children's Library of the City of Footscray.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray make the following Regulation for the management and control of the City of Footscray Children's Library:—

1. The Footscray Children's Library, belonging to and under the control of the Footscray City Council, shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the Library committee of the said Council, acting by and through the Town Clerk of the said City.

2. The Children's Library shall be open for the exchange of books on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays from 12.30 p.m. to 5 p.m. and from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., and on Saturdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

3. Children between the ages of 9 and 15 years and resident in Footscray shall be entitled to borrow books provided they deliver to the librarian a guarantee signed by a ratepayer of Footscray or the head master of the school where they attend.

4. The librarian may issue cards to children who, for age or other reasons, do not fulfil the conditions.

5. Children upon entering the Library must first return books and obtain borrowers' tickets before selecting other books. Borrowers must exchange books personally. The librarian will undertake neither to receive nor issue books by post.

6. All books borrowed must be returned within fourteen days (Sundays and holidays included) from the latest date stamped in the book. All borrowers not complying with this condition shall incur a fine, to be paid to the librarian, of 1d. per day or portion of a day. In case of loss or damage the borrower or his guarantor must replace the book or pay to the librarian the value of any book lost or damaged within one week of the day on which the injury has been notified to him. The librarian shall have power to assess the value of such book or books.

7. Children must not lend books borrowed from the Library.

8. Children changing their residence must notify same at once to the librarian.

9. Children must see that books are in good order before taking them from the Library. If any book be found to be written upon, or otherwise injured, borrowers must report the same to the librarian.

10. Any child returning a book which has been written upon or otherwise injured while in his charge shall within a week replace or pay to the librarian the value of the book. Parents or guardians of children shall be held responsible for such damage.

11. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book is required by another borrower. The librarian has the power to refuse to lend a child more than one book a week.

12. The librarian shall have the power to refuse to lend books to any child who does not comply with the Library rules, or who, in the opinion of the librarian, for other reasons should not be entrusted with books.

13. In cases of infectious illness in the family, the child, his parent, or guardian shall at once notify the librarian and return books for fumigation.

14. Every book must, under penalty of 2s. 6d., be returned to the Library at such times as shall be publicly announced.

15. Subject to the directions from time to time of the Library committee, the librarian of the said Council, or the person for the time being in charge of the said Library, shall be charged with the carrying into effect of these Rules and Regulations.

Resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council on the 12th March, 1928, and confirmed on the 23rd April, 1928.

A By-law of the City of Oakleigh, made under section 75 (b) of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 33, for the purpose of Preventing or Regulating the Deposit of Refuse and Rubbish upon Lands under the control of the Council.

- (3) Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Two pounds sterling (£2).

BY-LAW No. 30.

A By-law of the Shire of Alberton, made under section 198 of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and the provision of Part 5 of the 13th Schedule to the said Act, and numbered 30, for amending By-law No. 26 of the said shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of every other power and authority enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Alberton do order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and on the day immediately following its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
2. This By-law shall be read and construed with the said By-law number 26 of the said shire.
3. Clause 18 of the said By-law No. 26 is amended by substituting therein for the figures "750" the figures "600."
4. Clause 19 of the said By-law is repealed, and the following clause substituted therefor:—

"19. No person shall erect, build, or construct, or cause to be erected, built, or constructed, any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house unless the site or curtilage thereof shall have a superficial area of at least six thousand feet and have a frontage of not less than forty feet and a depth of not less than one hundred and fifty-five feet to a street or road, and in the case of any corner site fronting two streets or roads an area of open space of three thousand feet and in all other cases an area of open space of four thousand feet shall be left free of all buildings: Provided, however, that where any piece of land being an allotment of a subdivision of land made prior to the date of this By-law coming into operation and registered at the Office of Titles or in the office of the Registrar-General is smaller in area or frontage than that prescribed, a dwelling house may, with the permission of the Council of the said Shire, be erected on such land"

5. Clause 20 of the said By-law is repealed.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the said shire on the eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and was confirmed by the said Council on the fifth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

SHIRE OF CHARLTON

BUILDING REGULATIONS.

A By-law of the Shire of Charlton, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and any amendments thereof, and numbered 13, for carrying out certain of the purposes provided for in the said section, viz.:—Regulating the sizes of building allotments, and also generally regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed or required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof; appointing fees to be charged and received by the Council of the Shire of Charlton for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council, and for any other purposes in connexion with the foregoing powers.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and the Ratepayers of the Shire of Charlton order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and any By-law of the Shire of Charlton already in existence and which is contrary to or in any part inconsistent with this By-law is hereby repealed to the extent to which it is contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith.

2. No person shall repair, alter, erect, build, or construct, or cause to be repaired, altered, erected, built, or constructed, any building contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

3. Fees.—No person shall commence any building or any additions to any building without having first paid to the Council the following necessary fees in accordance with the following scale:—

Fees.—New buildings, a ground floor area of 200 square feet or less, 5s.; of an area over 200 square feet, 10s.; each stable, shed or outhouse not exceeding £5 in value 1s.; whereby such exceeds £5 5s. Additions to Buildings.—Where the value of the addition or alterations as estimated by the Surveyor does not exceed £20, 1s.; where the value exceeds £20 but not £50, 5s.; where the value exceeds £50, 10s.; for each tent a fee of 1s.; and the fee for permission to erect a tent covers only a permit to erect a tent during the year ending 30th September of the annual period during which the tent may have been erected. If it is desired to retain the tent a fresh permit must be obtained on or before the first day of October in each year. The decision of the Council or the Surveyor, subject to review by the Council, as to the area of a new building or the value of an addition under this clause, shall be final and conclusive.

4. *Plans and Specifications, &c.*—No person shall proceed to erect or cause to be erected, or constructed, any shop, house, building, tent, hoarding, or addition to any existing building, unless with the approval of the Council, and shall give the Council or its Surveyor not less than seven clear days' notice in writing of his intention to build, and shall accompany such notice with the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the proposed erection or building, specifying the number of the lot, plan, or subdivision or Crown allotment, and giving the dimensions and area of the land on which it is proposed to build.
- (b) A plan with dimensions marked thereon showing the ground plan, road frontage, and the finished aspect of the building or erection.
- (c) A specification giving particulars of all materials proposed to be used in the construction and finishing of all walls, partitions, verandahs, porches, chimneys, outside doors and roof.
- (d) An estimate of the cost of the proposed work when finished.
- (e) Such other particulars in writing as shall be necessary to enable the Council or its Surveyor to determine if all the provisions of this By-law have been complied with. A written permit, to erect a building, tent or addition obtained pursuant to this clause shall expire after 12 months from its grant unless extended by resolution of the Council.

5. *Distance from Street.*—No building which is intended to be used as a dwelling house, and no addition to any such building shall be built, constructed, or erected, within a distance of 15 feet measured horizontally from any building line of the street or road the building or erection is intended to or shall front.

6. *Distances from Boundaries or Other Buildings.*—Except as hereinafter provided no dwelling house with an external wall of wood or verandah attached thereto, and no addition with an external wall of wood to any dwelling house or verandah attached thereto shall be built, constructed, or erected:—

- (a) Within a distance of 4 feet horizontally of any side street or road.
- (b) Within a distance of 5 feet horizontally of any land not in the same possession or occupation.
- (c) Within a distance of 10 feet measured horizontally of another building or erection with an external wall of wood in the same possession or occupation. Provided always that any such building or alteration abut on the building line of any street or road at the side of such building or be less than the prescribed distance therefrom, or from land not in the same possession or occupation, provided that the wall or walls which abut or face within the prescribed distance such street, road, or land not in the same possession or occupation, or building, as the case may be, shall be of concrete of approved thickness or of brick or of stone at least $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches in thickness projecting in all cases at least 1 inch beyond the wood work front and back, and at least 1 foot through the roof, covering, or gutter adjoining the same.

8. *Roofs.*—The roof of every dwelling or erection which is intended to be or shall be used as a dwelling house shall be covered on the outside with incombustible or impervious covering, and the walls of sound impervious coverings, and if of wood the material shall be sound weatherboards or block boarding.

9. *Height of Main Rooms.*—The main rooms in every dwelling house hereafter built or rebuilt shall be in every part not less than 10 feet in height from floor to ceiling, and no main room shall have a floor area less than 100 square feet. The minimum height for wash-houses or bathrooms shall be 8 feet.

- (a) Every main room and bathroom in a dwelling house shall have one or more windows formed in an external wall or walls. The area of the window shall be at least one-tenth of the floor space. For the purpose of this clause the expression "main rooms" shall be deemed to mean and include rooms used or intended to be used as bedrooms, dining rooms, ordinary living rooms, and kitchens.
- (b) All rooms shall be ventilated by ventilators communicating directly with the outside air, placed near the ceiling of each room, and of an area satisfactory to the Council.
- (c) The provisions of this clause in reference to the height, lighting, and ventilation of main rooms in dwelling houses shall as far as applicable be extended to all shops.

10. *Walls and Ceilings.*—

- (a) The interior of all walls and ceilings of every building which is intended to be used or shall or may be used as a dwelling house shall be constructed of lath and plaster, wood or approved fire-resisting materials.
- (b) *Bricks.*—Bricks used in any building shall be good, hard, and well burnt; if old shall be thoroughly cleaned before being used.
- (c) *Timber.*—All timber used in any building shall be good hard, and material free from rot, large and loose knots, shakes or other imperfections whereby the strength of the timber may be impaired, and shall not have been used in any previous construction or building unless previously approved of by the Surveyor.
- (d) *Scantlings, &c.*—The following condition shall apply as to spacing and scantling of timber to be used in any building or erection constructed under the provisions of this By-law:—
 - (1) Stumps to be not less than the following dimensions and to be of redgum, jarrah or other approved matured timber:—Sawn Timber—not less than 4 inches x 4 inches fixed on 9-inch x 9-inch x $1\frac{1}{2}$ -inch sole plates spaced 4 feet centre to centre. Hewn Timber—Not less than 6 inches x 6 inches spaced to 4 feet centres.
 - (2) Studs and ceiling joists to be not less than 4 inches x $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches spaced not more than 18 inches apart, centre to centre, properly braced, provided with corner studs not less than 4 inches x 2 inches and for stud walls supported on stumps or brick piers the lower and top plates shall not be less than 4 inches x 2 inches. Where fibre cement or fibre plaster sheets are used studs may be 2 feet apart centre to centre and not of a smaller cross section than 4 inches x 2 inches. Ceiling joists to have no greater span than 8 feet without support.

- (3) Rafters not less than 4 inches x 1½ inches spaced 3 feet centre to centre for galvanized-iron roof, for slate or tiles to be spaced 18 inches centre to centre. Rafters over 6 feet span and under 10 feet to be 4 inches x 1½ inches; over 10 feet and under 20 feet to be 5 inches x 2 inches. Collar beam and tie beam construction is allowed for roofs not exceeding 18 feet span, over 18 feet span to be of truss construction approved by the Surveyor. Floor joists to be not less than 4 inches x 2 inches spaced 18 inches centre to centre on 4 inches x 3 inches, bearers spaced 6 feet apart.
- (4) Vermin plates shall be provided in all walls.
- (5) All wooden buildings to be painted at least two coats.
- (e) No external wall of brick shall be less than 8½ inches thick; or of concrete less than 4½ inches thick.
11. *Attic Rooms.*—Every room wholly or partly in the roof of any building shall be at least 8 ft. 6 in. in height from floor to ceiling throughout not less than one-half its area.
12. In all buildings of brick, stone, or concrete the materials and their compositions shall be subject to the approval of the Surveyor.
13. *Height of External Walls, Wooden Buildings.*—The external walls of all wooden buildings shall not exceed in height 15 feet, measured from floor level to top of wall plates.
14. *Open Space at Rear of Building.*—Every building used as a dwelling must have attached thereto for the exclusive use of the occupiers thereof an enclosed back yard or open space at the rear of the building for at least 1,000 square feet, exclusive of any building thereon.
15. *Damp-proof Course.*—Every wall of brick or stone shall have one approved damp-proof course of asphalt or other impervious material at approved levels for full width of walls.
16. *Floors of Certain Buildings and Ventilation under Floors.*—
- (a) The floor of any building used, or intended to be used for the purpose of carrying on a business as a motor garage, shall have the floors thereof constructed wholly of brick, stone or concrete.
- (b) The space under the ground floor of every building shall have sufficient openings through all walls and sleeper walls under the floor, and an air space of at least 6 inches clear of all earth, such height being determined by the Surveyor.
17. *Minimum Area of Land for Dwelling.*—No person shall build any dwelling house or tent except in conformity with the following:—
- (a) The site or curtilage of such dwelling house or tent shall have a superficial area of at least 7,500 feet and have a frontage of not less than 50 lineal feet to a street or road.
18. *Minimum Area for Two Attached Houses.*—Not more than two houses shall be attached together. The minimum area upon which such attached houses may be erected may be 5,250 square feet; and the minimum frontage of such area shall be 55 feet, and each of such houses shall have a clear space of not less than 10 feet along the side thereof. Also, the dividing wall between the houses must be of brick or concrete with a parapet.
19. *Minimum Area for Combined Shop and Dwelling.*—Shops having a dwelling house or living compartment attached shall only be built on land having a frontage of not less than 16 feet by a depth of 100 feet, and shall have a yard or open space of 300 square feet at the least apart from passages under 3 feet in width exclusive of any building thereon.
- Provided that where any allotment of land smaller in area than that hereinbefore prescribed was in the opinion of the Council owned by any person prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further land cannot be obtained to increase the area of such land the Council may on application, in writing, by resolution carried by a majority of the whole of the number of members of the Council at a meeting of which seven clear days' notice has been given, permit a shop to be erected upon such land.
20. *No Building Allotment to be Reduced in Area.*—No land upon which any dwelling house has been erected shall thereafter be reduced in area below the minimum area prescribed by the By-law.
21. *Verandahs and Porticoes on Street.*—No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any portico or verandah over the footway of any street or road without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing and such portico or verandah shall in no case be of less height than 7 ft. 6 in. above the level of the footway. Where verandah needs repairing or rebuilding to be made height of 7 ft. 6 in.
22. *Roof Openings.*—No opening shall be made in the roof of such verandah for the purpose of affording light unless such opening be properly framed, and glazed with approved glass, protected underneath with fine-mesh wire netting, or of armoured glass, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.
23. *Fowl Houses.*—No fowl house shall be erected or remain at a less distance than 50 feet from any building used as a dwelling house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining. No building of the description referred to in this clause of the By-law shall be erected except at the rear of any dwelling house on the same allotment.
24. *Privies, Closets, &c.*—No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected at a less distance than 20 feet from the door or window of any dwelling house on the same allotment or allotments adjoining, or at a less distance than 50 feet from any street, and shall in every case be effectively screened from public view. There shall be provided for the use of the occupant of every dwelling house at least one closet, and in the case of attached houses at least one closet to each tenement.
- Provided that in case there is a right-of-way abutting on such allotment any privy, closet, or urinal may be erected to the boundary between such allotment and right-of-way.
25. *Septic Tank Installation.*—No person shall build, construct or put in any septic tank, or septic installation, or other works or works for reception, screening, disintegration, precipitation, settlement, clarification, oxidation, or purification of drainage matter without the consent in writing of the surveyor, subject to review by the Council, and such consent shall be given only upon written application by the person desiring such consent, and such application shall be supported by plan, drawings and specifications in duplicate of such septic tank or septic tank installation, which shall fully disclose the situation of the proposed work relative to the nearest habitable building, human food store, public thoroughfare, well, bore, or other sources of water supply, also the nature of the intended process of treating the drainage or residual solids, liquids, or gases thereof, so that nuisance or injury to health shall not be caused thereby, also the form, materials, dimensions, levels, and the extent of the work, and the date concerning the character, volume and extreme rates of flow of the drainage upon which the design thus disclosed shall have been based.
- A fee of 5s. must be lodged with application.
26. *Drainage.*—Proper provision must be made for effectively removing storm water and house drainage away from every building.
27. *Authority to Inspect.*—The Surveyor or Inspector duly authorized at all reasonable times during the process and during fourteen days next after the completion of any building or addition to any building affected by any of the provisions of this By-law, may and is hereby authorized to enter and inspect such building or addition, and the owner or builder thereof shall produce to the Surveyor or Inspector for the time being for inspection the original plans and specifications approved by the Council for the building demanded of him.
28. *Action by Council Prescribed if Building Contrary to By-law.*—If any building shall be partly or wholly built contrary to the provisions of this By-law, the Council by its Shire Secretary, Surveyor, or other authorized agent may give to the owner or builder or leave upon the site of such building fourteen days' notice in writing to bring such building into conformity with the said provisions, or requiring the pulling down or removal of such building, and if default shall be made in complying with such notice and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the said Council by its Surveyor or other authorized agent to enter upon such building and on the site thereof with a sufficient number of workmen, and for the purpose of breaking down any fence surrounding the land on which such building is situated, and to demolish and pull down the said building or any part or parts thereof, and to do any other act that may be necessary for the purpose and to remove the materials thereof to some convenient place, and if the Council in its discretion thinks fit to sell the same in such manner as it thinks fit and all expenses incurred by the Council, its Shire Secretary, Surveyor, or other authorized agent in demolishing and pulling down the said building or any parts thereof, or of removing the materials thereof and selling the same and in doing other acts as aforesaid, and all fees and penalties due by the builder thereof may be deducted and retained by the Council out of the proceeds of such sale, and the Council shall restore the surplus, if any, arising from such sale, to such owner or builder or other person legally entitled thereto on demand.
29. *Notice to Surveyor to Inspect.*—Seven days' notice shall be given in writing by the builder to the Surveyor at the Shire Hall, Charlton, that the framing of any building being erected under the provisions of this By-law is completed and ready for inspection.
30. *Tents and Sleeping-out Rooms.*—No person shall erect or cause or permit to be erected any building, tent, or buildings intended to be used as sleeping-out rooms detached from the main dwelling unless the following conditions are complied with:—
- (a) No detached sleeping-out room or tent shall be erected on any land unless a dwelling house has already been erected thereon, and that the area of such land on which such dwelling stands is not less than 5,000 square feet.
- (b) No sleeping-out room or tent shall be erected within 15 feet of any other building.

- (c) No sleeping-out room or tent shall be erected unless the area of the floor thereof shall not be less than 72 square feet or more than 300 square feet and shall have a minimum floor dimension in any one way of not less than 6 feet with floors constructed of wood.
- (d) The height of the walls of each sleeping-out rooms or tents shall not be less than 6 feet measured vertically from the floor, and the outside wall shall be boarded up for at least 3 feet from the floor.
- (e) An air space for ventilation either open or with a gauze covering shall be provided along the top of each wall equal in area to one-third of the floor space.
- (f) Not more than one person, for each 60 square feet of interior floor space shall be permitted to sleep in any sleeping-out room or tent.
- (g) In this clause sleeping-out rooms shall mean any room, building or erection detached or unattached from any dwelling and used for no other purpose other than sleeping apartment.

31. *Projections.*—No coping, cornice, string course, fascia window, window dressing, portico, balcony, balconette, bridge connecting building, balustrade, and architectural projection shall project beyond the building line of any street or alley unless it be of brick, stone, tile, artificial stone, slate, cement, or fire-resisting material other than wood. No projection shall extend more than 3 inches beyond the building line at any night less than 8 feet from the level of the footway; every porch; gangway, outside landing, and outside step shall be of fire-resisting material and shall not project beyond the building line of any street or alley.

32. *Hoardings, Signboards, &c.*—Save as hereinafter provided no person shall alter or add to any hoarding, signboard, or erection for advertising purposes without first obtaining the consent of the Council and unless such hoarding, signboard or erection is erected, built or constructed, altered or added to in accordance with the plan and specification prepared by such person and previously approved of by the Council. No hoarding, signboard or erection shall be within a distance from the building line of any street or road equal to the greatest height of such hoarding, signboard or erection and the lowest parts of such hoarding other than the main supports thereof shall not be less than 3 feet from the level of the land.

33. *Greenhouses, Ferneries, Fences, Builders' Sheds Exempted.*—This By-law shall not apply to any fence, greenhouse, fernery, conservatory, or to any shed or building on areas of more than 2½ acres used entirely for agricultural or gardening purposes, or to the temporary offices and sheds used by builders during the construction of any building at or about the site of such building for a period not exceeding 6 months.

34. *Government and Municipal Buildings Exempted.*—This By-law shall not apply to any building of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, the State of Victoria, or the Shire of Charlton.

35. *Definitions.*—In this By-law save where the context is inconsistent therewith:—

- "Surveyor" means the Surveyor, Engineer, or Acting Engineer for the time being of the said shire.
- "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Charlton.
- "Dwelling house" means a building used or constructed or adapted to be used wholly or principally for human habitation.
- "Hoarding" means any board or sign used for advertising, direction or display purposes greater in their dimensions than 3 feet.
- "Secretary" means the Shire Secretary or Acting Shire Secretary for the time being of the said shire.
- "Shop" means a building in which goods are regularly offered or exposed for sale or in which meals or refreshments are regularly offered or provided for payment and also includes saloons, or shops of barbers or hairdressers, offices of agents and auctioneers. A bona fide private boarding-house shall not be included in this definition by reason only of the fact that meals or refreshments are occasionally supplied to persons other than boarders.
- "Street" or "road" means and includes "street" and "road" and "private street" and "private road" as respectively defined in the *Local Government Act 1915*, section 3.

36. *Areas to which By-law Applies.*—This By-law shall apply and have operation within the following area:—
Township of Charlton.

37. *Old Buildings.*—Before any building or erection is removed into the Township of Charlton from any part outside the said shire, or from any part of the said shire to another part thereof, the owner or person carrying out the removal shall give to the Council not less than fourteen clear days' notice in writing of his intention to remove and re-erect such building, and shall with such notice supply the following particulars:—

- (a) The situation of the building which it is proposed to remove.

(b) The situation of the land upon which it is proposed to re-erect or place such building.

(c) A plan giving the dimensions of the building, particulars of any alteration to be made thereof, and a tracing or copy of such plan to be retained by the Council.

(d) A specification giving particulars of the construction of such building and of the alterations which it is intended to make thereto when the building is re-erected, and shall at the same time procure satisfactory evidence that the building has not been condemned by any authority as dilapidated, insanitary, or unfit for human habitation.

On receipt of such notice the Council shall instruct the Building Surveyor to inspect such building or erection before removal and he shall report to the Council whether in his opinion such building when removed and re-erected will be in compliance with the provisions of the By-law and Building Regulations of the Council or not. If the Building Surveyor certifies that such building when removed and re-erected will be in accordance with this By-law and the Building Regulations then the Council shall grant a permit for its removal and re-erection but not otherwise.

38. *Fences.*—Where, in the opinion of the Council, any fence atutting on or within 10 feet of any street or road within the township area is in a dangerous or unsightly state, the Council may, by its Building Surveyor or any officer authorized in that behalf serve notice in writing on the owner of such fence, requiring such owner forthwith to take down, secure or repair such fence as the case might be.

39. *Brick Area.*—Commencing at the intersection of Learmouth and High streets; thence westerly to the intersection of Halliday and High streets, also between High-street and new concrete bridge shall, and is proclaimed a brick area, that is—no person shall erect any building within a distance of 80 feet from High-street boundary unless it is of brick, stone, or concrete.

40. *Penalties.*—Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and if such offence is continued to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds per day for each day such offence is continued.

BY-LAW No. 41.
