ST. ARNAUD BOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1928.

By-law No. 33.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law :—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1928 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District, that is to say :—

On rateable property in the whole of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust District, a sum of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal valuation of such property.

On every house, tenement, or land situated otherwise than in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water by reticulation from such pipe; and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water—One-half of the before-mentioned rates. And where such house, tenement, or land is over a quarter of a mile of such stand-pipe and within half a mile thereof—One-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

For every quarter acre or less of garden and lawn—Ten shillings per annum.

The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance in one amount on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

In the construction of this By-law the word "Commissioners" shall mean the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Borough Waterworks Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

MOOROOPNA WATERWORKS TRUST

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following By-law :—

The following are the rates and charges which the occupiers or owners of land and tenements liable to be rated within the district of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust shall pay for the water supplied by the Trust :—

1. A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on every house or land valued at Twelve pounds ten shillings or upwards according to the 1927-1928 annual valuation for the municipal rate for the municipal district in which such house or land is situated.

2. For every house or land valued under Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal valuation, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.

3. For water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling per one thousand gallons shall be charged.

4. For every public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of One shilling per one thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending the 31st day of December, 1928, and the rates shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January, 1928.

7. Such person or persons as the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 101.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under section 197, sub-section (6), section 222, section 228, section 604, and section 652 of the *Local Government Act* 1915, and numbered 101, for altering By-law numbered 55, and for preserving good order and decency in the Sports Ground and Public Baths at Grace Park, Hawthorn, including any building used in connexion with the said Sports Ground and Baths, and preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof, and regulating any meeting or gathering held therein, and for the management and use of the said Sports Ground, Baths, buildings, furniture, fittings, or other property or effects used in connexion therewith, and for fixing the amount to be charged for admission to and for use of the same or any part thereof, and for imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1915, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. That the By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under section 197, sub-section (7), section 222, and section 604 of the *Local Government Act* 1903 and the *Municipal Grounds Act* 1905, and numbered 55, shall be altered as follows:—

(a) In clause 1, after the words "beds and borders," there shall be inserted the following words:—"No person on any day upon which any game of cricket or football is appointed to be played at the ground shall either before, during, or after such game, enter upon the playing area at the cricket or football ground without the authority, in writing, of the Council, unless such person be bona fide actively engaged in connexion with the game of cricket or football appointed to be played."

(b) In clause 1 the membership fees and charges shall be altered as follows:—

For the figures "£1 11s. 6d." after the words "Full Member" there shall be substituted the figures "£3 3s. 0d."

For the figures "£1 1s. 0d." after the words "Bowling Member" there shall be substituted the figures "£3 3s. 0d."

For the figures "18s." after the words "Tennis Member" there shall be substituted the figures "17s. 6d."

CITY OF CAMBERWELL.

BY-LAW 52.

Residential Areas &c.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto enabling, and numbered 52, for—

- (a) Repealing Part III. of By-law 49.
- (b) Prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of such residential areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements as are specified in this By-law.
- (c) Amending 3rd schedule of By-law 49 in regard to brick areas.
- (d) Imposing penalties for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Camberwell, order as follows:—

Repeal.—The whole of Part III. of By-law 49 made by the Council on the 19th day of January, 1927, and gazetted on the 13th day of July, 1927, is hereby repealed.

Operation.—This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

Date of Coming into Force.—This By-law shall come into operation, and have effect immediately on its being approved by the Governor in Council, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.

Residential Areas.

1. The areas within the municipal district as hereinafter set out shall be and are hereby prescribed as residential areas, that is to say:—

AREA No. 1.

Bounded on the north by the Koonung Creek, on the east by the eastern boundary of the municipality, on the south by the north side of Whitehorse-road, and on the west by the western boundary of the municipality.

Excluding therefrom the following areas:—

- (1) All the land fronting to or abutting on the north side of Whitehorse-road, between the west side of Union-road, and the east side of Clapham-street, to a depth of 140 feet.
- (2) All the land fronting to or abutting on the north side of Whitehorse-road, from the west side of Brenheal-street to the east side of Austin-street, to a depth of 140 feet.
- (3) All the land fronting to or abutting on the north side of Whitehorse-road, from the west side of Terry-street to the Outer Circle railway, to a depth of 140 feet.
- (4) All the land fronting to or abutting on the east side of Burke-road, from Belmore-road to Head-street, to a depth of 140 feet.

- (11) All the land fronting to or abutting on the south side of High-street, from a point opposite Queen-street to a point opposite Carool-road, to a depth of 140 feet.
- (12) All the land fronting to or abutting on both sides of Bardolph-street, from Raleigh-street (Station-street) to Maverston-street (fronting Burwood station), to a depth of 140 feet.
- (13) All the land fronting to or abutting on the south side of Toorak-road, from the east side of Edna-street (Peate-avenue), to a point 300 feet east, to a depth of 140 feet.
- (14) All the land fronting to or abutting on the east side of Edna-street (Peate-avenue), from the south side of Toorak-road to a point 300 feet south, to a depth of 140 feet.
- (15) All the land fronting to or abutting on the east side of Burke-road, from the north side of Turner-street to the south side of Toorak-road, to a depth of 140 feet.

2. The use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of all classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements, is hereby prohibited within the whole of such residential areas.

Such prohibition shall, however, not apply to any single worker who carries on a trade, industry, manufacture, or business in a private dwelling-house, and does not use mechanical power.

3. Nothing, however, hereinbefore contained shall preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, re-building, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, re-building or extension involve the use of adjoining land which, immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, was in the same ownership, or for such other purposes as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

BRICK AREAS.

The third schedule of By-law 49 shall be amended by the inclusion of the following street as one to which the provisions of Part IX., section 1, of such By-law shall apply, viz.:—

Howard-street. Both sides.

Penalties.—Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings, and not exceeding Twenty pounds, for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after written notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any court (as the case may be).

CITY OF SANDRINGHAM.

BY-LAW NO. 78.

A By-law of the City of Sandringham made under section 75 of the *Health Act 1919*, and numbered 78, for the carrying out of certain of the purposes provided for in the said section, namely, for regulating the provision, use, and control of receptacles for the collection of refuse and rubbish, and the removal, replacement, cleansing, and disinfecting of receptacles for refuse or rubbish.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1919*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Sandringham order as follows:—

1. All receptacles for refuse or rubbish in or upon any land upon which a shop is erected, or upon which, in the opinion of the Council of the said City of Sandringham, it is intended to erect a shop, shall be placed by the owner or occupier of such land at the rear of such land along and on a street or road or a right-of-way not less than ten feet in width having direct and unobstructed access into some street or road, and shall be removed and replaced at the rear of such land.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

3. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

Disposal of Refuse and Construction of Manure Pits.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of all other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of McIvor, in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the said Act with regard to the subject dealt with into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law No. 27, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Township of Heathcote, being part of the Shire of McIvor.
4. No person shall place or deposit any house refuse or garden refuse in any street, road, right-of-way, creek, reserve, or Crown lands.
5. At every stable within the Township of Heathcote there shall be provided a manure pit, constructed of concrete or brickwork in cement, so that it will be impervious, and the walls thereof shall be not less than nine inches in thickness, and the floor shall be paved with brick or concrete to a thickness of not less than three inches, the material of such floor to be impervious; and the capacity of each such pit shall be not less than one and a half cubic yards.
6. Such manure pit shall be provided with a hinged fly-proof cover, and shall be kept constantly covered except when manure is being deposited therein or removed therefrom.
7. The proprietor of every stable shall from time to time deposit, or cause to be deposited, in such manure pit all manure produced on the premises.
8. Every stable shall have the floor constructed of impervious material properly graded and drained.
9. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding One pound sterling for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Providing for the Disposal of House Refuse, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1919*, and of any other powers thereunto enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of McIvor, in the name of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following By-law, being No. 28, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Township of Heathcote.
 4. The occupier of every house, building, or premises within the Township of Heathcote, being part of the Shire of McIvor, shall provide and keep thereon a covered receptacle or receptacles constructed of non-absorbent materials, and each receptacle shall not exceed 56 lb. in weight when filled, and shall cause all house refuse, rubbish, or garbage produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises to be from time to time deposited in such receptacle or receptacles.
 5. Every such receptacle shall be kept constantly covered except when such refuse or garbage is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom, and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep the same in an inoffensive condition.
 6. Once a week on such day in each week as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of house refuse from such house, building, or premises such occupier shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed close to the entrance of such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle or receptacles may be conveniently removed by the person or persons authorized in that behalf by the Council.
 7. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way.
 8. If any person commit a breach of this By-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the Township of Heathcote and the Township (Village) of Costerfield, being respectively parts of the Shire of McIvor, and unless exempted by the Council, shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.
4. The occupier of any premises on which there is a closet or privy shall cause the space under the seat of each closet or privy on such premises to be prepared, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause the closet or privy to be kept in a fit state for such service.

5. The Council shall cause every closet to be supplied, and kept supplied, with two pans for the reception of night-soil, and a lid to closely fit the same, and shall cause one or other of such pans to be kept under the seat aforesaid.

6. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto an appliance or apparatus which, when closed, effectually covers the seat of such closet or privy whereby disinfectant and deodorizing fluid is automatically discharged into the pan in such closet or privy.

7. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall cause to be kept in such appliance or apparatus a supply of disinfecting and deodorizing fluid efficient for disinfecting and deodorizing the contents of such pan.

8. The occupier aforesaid, or other person having the control or management of the premises, shall from time to time after the said closet or privy has been used, close or cause to be closed the said appliance or apparatus, and keep such appliance or apparatus closed on the seat of such closet or privy.

9. The Council shall, at least once in every week, cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed with its contents from the premises in the daytime, and another pan to be left in its place.

10. Before leaving any pan in a closet or privy, the Council shall cause same to be properly cleansed and tar-painted inside, or treated by some other equally efficient means.

11. The occupier aforesaid or other person shall not contract for the removal of night-soil from such premises, except in accordance with this By-law.

12. The Council shall have the power, in lieu of making a rate, to make a charge on each occupier for the pans supplied and for the removal of the night-soil and the other work herein directed, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

13. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or it shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).
