For distances beyond 100 miles the fare shall be 1s. 6d. additional for each 10 miles or part thereof.

The amount of guarantee to be lodged with the Commissioners shall be 12s. per line mile, minimum £9 per train.

A rebate of 10 per cent. of the gross revenue earned from the sale of railway tickets issued for special trains will be allowed to the promoters, provided that such rebate does not reduce the earnings of the special train or trains below the amount of the guarantee.

(2) *Suburban Weekly Periodical Tickets—*

First and second class weekly tickets computed at one quarter of the adult monthly fare available from Sunday till the following Saturday shall be issued between all suburban stations and Melbourne, and between any two suburban stations under the conditions applicable to suburban monthly tickets.

These tickets shall not be issued at any reduction on the adult fare.

DEVENISH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1928.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Devenish Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Ry-law for the year 1928:—

The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. A rate of Four shillings and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-six pounds and not more than Thirty-six pounds.

2. A rate of Three shillings and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirty-six pounds and not more than One hundred and fifteen pounds.

3. A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at One hundred and fifteen pounds and not more than One hundred and fifty-five pounds.

4. A rate of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at One hundred and Fifty-five pounds and upwards.

5. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each house and tenement of the annual municipal value of less than Twenty-six pounds shall be Five pounds.

6. The minimum rate to be paid in respect of each allotment of land of whatever annual municipal value shall be Ten shillings, excepting on such allotments on which is erected a stand-pipe, the rate shall be Two pounds.

Such rates and charges are hereby made payable in advance on the first day of January, 1928.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint are hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC
RECREATION AT BOORHAMAN.

WE, Michael O'Keefe, Frank George McCormack, Richard Martin Sammon, Arthur Cluny McDonald, Michael Byrne, Michael McKenzie, and Alfred George Benney, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the Parish of Boorhaman, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding (20) twenty in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for

cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on fences, trees, seats, or buildings, nor roll or throw stones, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, nor shall any article be sold in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve or enclosure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. All persons tenting or hiring any stand, buildings, or enclosures for fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

11. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve for any purpose whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use of the ground, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.

12. No person except members of the Committee of Management shall be permitted to enter any stand, pavilion, or other building or any enclosure within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall be permitted to discharge firearms within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No persons except labourers or workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

THE Council of the City of Caulfield, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for the Recreation and Convenience of the people in the Parish of Prahran, at Murrumbena, and known as the "Warrein Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1915* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1915*.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any dwelling, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.
11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.
12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve on Sundays.
13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fetes, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.
14. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
15. Every person offending against these Regulations shall be liable to expulsion from the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1915*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five Pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. Where the driver of a vehicle or the rider of a horse or other animal proceeding along roads (other than Victoria-street, Bridge-road, or Swan-street) which join or intersect Church-street would, if he continued, arrive at the same point at the same time as the driver of a vehicle or the rider of a horse or other animal proceeding along Church-street, the driver of the vehicle or the rider of the horse or other animal proceeding along the roads (other than those hereinbefore named) which join or intersect Church-street shall, unless a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council controlling or regulating traffic at any of the said junctions or intersections shall otherwise order or direct, slow down and allow the driver of the vehicle or the rider of the horse or other animal proceeding along Church-street to pass in front of him.

4. The driver of a vehicle and the rider of a horse or other animal when driving or riding along roads which intersect the following roads or thoroughfares, viz.:—

- Victoria-street,
- Bridge-road,
- Swan-street,
- Church-street.

shall cross or proceed from the building alignment on one side of the roads or thoroughfares last mentioned to the building alignment on the other side thereof in a slow and cautious manner.

5. The driver of a vehicle upon any road, street, or thoroughfare shall cause such vehicle to be drawn as near as practicable to the footway on his left or near side and parallel thereto and brought to a standstill on the approach of and during the passage of any fire engine or other vehicle apparently proceeding in charge of a fireman to a fire, provided that the fire engine or such other vehicle has given reasonable warning of its approach.

6. In the construction of this By-law the term "vehicle" means any description of vehicle upon wheels except vehicles used on tramways.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district where applicable.
