Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREAD CARTERS BOARD.

Note.—(a) On the 14th December, 1926, the powers of the Bread Carters Board were extended to enable it to fix rates for persons employed in or in connexion with any stable in which are stabled the horses used in his trade or business by any person subject to the Determination of the aforesaid Board.

(b) This Determination on 17th May, 1928, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Sandringham, and Warrnambool; the south ward of the City of Box Hill; the Towns of Geelong West and Newtown and Chilwell; the Boroughs of Eaglehawk, Echuca, Hamilton, Ringwood, Sebastopol, and Wonthaggi; the Shires of Blackburn and Mitcham, Dandenong, Mocrabbin, and Mulgrave; the Moorpanyal Riding of the Shire of Corio; the Township of Kangaroo Flat in the Shires of Marong and Strathfieldsaye; such portions of the Shires of Ballarat, Bungaree, Buninyong, and Grenville as are within a radius of 3 miles of the Ballarat Post Office; such portion of the Shire of Huntly as is within a radius of 10 miles of the Bendigo Post Office; such portion of the Shire of South Barwon as is within a radius of 5 miles of the Geelong Post Office; and such portion of the Shire of Colae as is within a radius of 2 miles of the Colae Post Office.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons wheresoever employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in the business of a baker or seller of bread," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 17th May, 1928, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
