SHIRE OF LILLYDALE.

PROPOSED RE-SUBDIVISION.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915* (No. 2686), section 46, the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 36th and 44th sections of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to be at least one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being on the municipal roll for the Shire of Lillydale, and they desire that the said Shire be re-subdivided into four Ridings, viz., North-western, Eastern, Western, and Southern Ridings, in lieu of three Ridings as at present.

The petitioners state that the reasons for desiring re-subdivision are that the existing South-western Riding is too large to be represented by three Councillors only, and that the revenue of the above Riding is more than half the total revenue of the Shire.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 1974.—FLOOD PROTECTION RATE.—ECHUCA (HIGH-STREET) FLOOD PROTECTION DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. A Flood Protection Rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound of the rateable value of all lands within the Echuca (High-street) Flood Protection District is hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all such lands for the service rendered to such district by the flood protection works constructed for such service.

2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1927, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1928, and shall be payable on the 13th day of January, 1928, at the office of the said Commission, at Rochester.

3. Such person or persons as the said Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

4. For making and levying such rate the value of the lands set out in the valuation made, in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts, by Alfred Stephen Kenyon, valuer, returned on the 4th day of September, 1926, and adopted by the said Commission on the 6th day of September, 1926, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands, unless altered or amended as provided by the Water Acts, and if so altered or amended, then the net annual value of such lands set out in such altered or amended valuation.

The foregoing By-law was made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 23rd day of December, 1927, and the common seal of the said Commission was hereunto affixed the 4th day of January, 1928, in the presence of:—

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by Order on the 21st day of December, 1927, pursuant to the provisions of section 15 of the *Motor Car Act 1915*, made the following Regulations, viz.:-

"In respect of all roads lying within the boundaries of the area commencing at a point being the intersection of the railway line from Warrnambool to Koroit and Port Fairy with the Government road leading from Koroit to Southern Cross, thence on the north along the said railway line to its intersection with the Nine-Mile Creek-road; thence on the west by the said Nine Mile Creek-road and Belfast-road to O'Brien's-lane; thence south-easterly along O'Brien's-lane to Barkly-street; thence on the south by Barkly-street bearing easterly to Lake-street; thence on the east by Lake-street and McVicar-street to the commencing point within the boundaries of the municipality of the Borough of Koroit, it is hereby declared and ordained that the rate of fifteen miles an hour is the limit of speed which shall not be exceeded by any motor car while travelling or in motion on any part of the roads within the boundaries of the area above specified, and that no person in charge of any motor car shall on such part drive or allow the same to be driven at a rate in excess of the speed so limited."
