## LEVEE AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE ON TUESDAY, 5TH JUNE, 1928.

I N honour of the birthday of His Majesty King George V., His Excellency the Governor, Lord Somers, will hold a Levee at Parliament House, Spring-street, at a quarter to One p.m., on Tuesday, 5th June, 1928.

Private entrée cards will admit recipients at the south door of the Spring-street entrance to Parliament House at half-past Twelve p.m.; all others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at a quarter to One p.m.

In accordance with the custom followed at Levees held by His Majesty the King, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of the services and of public bodies group themselves together as far as is possible. It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress do so. On the occasion of the King's Birthday, His Excellency is anxious to receive as many citizens as possible, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desirable that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting, their name, to facilitate in announcing them to His Excellency the Governor.

## SHIRE OF BULLA.

#### By-LAW No. 10.

Sunbury Recreation Reserve Regulations.

A By-law of the Shire of Bulla, made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 10, for regulating the charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the Reserve known as Sunhury Recreation Reserve, situated in Evans-street, Sunbury, and adjoining the subjury. ing the railway.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bulla order as follows:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, buildings, or any property in the said park, reserve, land or ground, or throw stones or any missile, best carpets, dry clothes, or commit any nuisance, or light fires therein, or lave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter

leave bottles therein, paper, orange peel, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said park, reserve, land, or ground, or lie on the seats, or stick bills on the fences, gates, posts, or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences, or otherwise deface the same, or write thereon.

3. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council shall bring into the said park, reserve, land, or ground, any horse, vehicle, or enter plots of ground therein enclosed for plantation or other purposes.

4. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the reserve except as above provided, and all dogs, goats, pigs, and poultry found in the reserve shall be liable to be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

5. No children under the age of five (5) years of age shall be allowed in the said park, reserve, land, or ground, unless in the charge of adult friends or nurses.

Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly or objectionable manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or committing in the said park, reserve, land, or ground any act of indecency shall be liable to be forthwith removed by the curator or other authorized officer or servants of the Council, or by a constable, and shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. No person except those in the employ of or authorized by the Council shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor car, or other vehicle in the said park, reserve, land, or ground.

8. The Council shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the said park, reserve, land, or ground, and to make a charge for admission thereto.

9. The Council shall have the power to let the park, reserve, land, or ground to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.

10. No charge or fee for admission to such park, reserve, land, or ground shall exceed Two shillings for each adult person, and One shilling for each child under the ago of twelve years.

11. No person except members of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employees of the Council on duty, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports, after he has paid for admission, until he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

12. No person except members of the Council, the shire secretary, shire engineer, and employees of the Council or duty, shall enter any portion of suc

Council.

13. No person shall carry firearms in or through the park, reserve, land, or ground, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds therein unless by authority of the Council.

14. No person shall engage in training, or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games, in the park, reserve, land, or ground, without the written authority of the Council, and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.

15. No person shall play any unlawful game, or make any wagers for money, or by unseemly conduct interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such park, reserve, land, or ground.

  16. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employees engaged in the park, reserve, land, or ground, by conversation or otherwise.

  17. No person shall sell, or offer for sale, within such park, reserve, laid, or ground, any article of food or drink, or any other commodity, or operate any money-making annusement without the written consent of the Council.

  18. No person shall remain in such park, reserve, land, or ground at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave the same.

  19. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or on any structure or erection in such park, reserve, land, or ground.

20. No person shall assemble in the park, reserve, land or ground for fêtes, picnics, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind, or meetings of a like character, without the permission in writing of the Council.

21. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary hereto shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the enclosure known as Sunbury Recreation Reserve.

## ROSEDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1928. THE Commissioners of the Rosedale Waterworks Trust hereby make the following By-law, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water

A By-law for making the rate for the year 1928 on the rateable property within the district of the Rosedale Waterworks Trust, also dealing with the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A rate of Two shillings and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the net annual value of the rateable property within the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements, for the municipal rates for the Shire of Rosedale, but no such rate shall be less than the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, for properties built on.

built on.

For every piece or allotment of vacant land, a rate of Ten shillings shall be paid.

When water is supplied by measure for domestic or other purposes, a charge of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the price payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

When the water is supplied for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied shall be ten thousand gallons for the year ending 31st December, 1923.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using the water for other than domestic purposes solely, that the water to be used is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require the owner or occupier to provide a meter within one month of such notice, and at his own expense.

In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make

at his own expense.

In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make special provision, as may be deemed necessary.

The service pipe from the main, being the property of the owner or the occupier, the owner or occupier of such tenement supplied by such service pipe shall, in every instance in which any damage be caused by such service pipe being leaky, broken, or otherwise out of repair, be guilty of an offence against the Act.

offence against the Act.

If any person neglect to repair such service pipe into the premises of such person, after the required notice from the officer of the Trust that such service pipe required repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise, until such repairs be effected.

The Trust may at any time, when found necessary, repair or remove any pipe or stop-cock laid for supplying water to any tenement, and may charge the owner with the cost of providing, laying, repairing, or removing same, and such cost shall be a debt due to the Trust, and shall be recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of May, 1928, and any such person, or persons, as the Trust may appoint from time to time shall be authorized to demand and collect such rates.

If any person erects, adapts for use, or uses any building contrary to this By-law, it shall be lawful for the Council to serve on the owner or occupier of such building a notice requiring him to pull down and remove such building within a time to be ramed in such notice, and in the event of such owner or occupier refusing or neglecting to comply with such notice, the Council may pull down and removes uch building and sell the materials, and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expense of such pulling down and removel and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner of such building.

4. No person shall use or permit, or suffer to be used by

building.

4. No person shall use or permit, or suffer to be used by any other person, any building (within any such residential area as prescribed as aforesaid) for any purposes save that of a private residence, residential flats, boarding or lodging-house, coffee palace, or place for the accommodation of boarders or lodgers, or of a dressmaker, milliner, or teacher in which no more than three persons are employed, or a business or trade carried on by an individual without any employee or assistant in a private dwelling on which no advertisement or sign is displayed indicating the nature of the business or trade carried on therein other than a plate approved by the Council and affixed to the front of such dwelling.

5. Nothing in this By-law shall be deemed to preclude the continuance of the use of any land or buildings in the said residential area for any purpose for which the same was used

b. Nothing in this By-law shall be deemed to preclude the continuance of the use of any land or buildings in the said residential area for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law or to preclude the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building (in such area) used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership, or for such other purpose as the Council of the said shire thinks reasonable in the circumstances.

6. The expression "person" in this By-law shall include a person or persons, company or corporation, or the lessee, tenant, agent, or employee of any person.

7. Any person wilfully offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against the By-law is continued after notice has been given to the offender by the Council of the commission of the offence, or after a conviction or order of any court in respect of such offence.
