FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the nineteenth day of June, 1928: Now I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Wednesday, the fourth day of July, 1928.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and in the nineteenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
