Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE NICKEL WARE BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 12th October, 1929, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely :—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and such portion of the City of Sandringham as is not included within the said district; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making nickel silver articles of table ware," and whose powers were, by Order in Council, dated 16th November, 1920, extended so that it may "fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of making articles of table ware of any base metal," has made the following Determination, namely :—

(1) That on the 12th October, 1929, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or any work done within such hours in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed for a week's work in any week, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours, and thereafter double time.

(4) TIME WAGES.—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one-half the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, 26th day of January (Foundation Day), and Anzac Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
