LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

Important Notice to Electors.

IT is hereby notified that all persons who are holders of electors' rights issued before or on the 1st December, 1928, must, not later than the 1st December next, obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names retained upon the new General Electoral Lists, which will be made up forthwith after that date.

Neglect of this action will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from such Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new rolls in February, 1930.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are advised to apply early to the Registrar.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any roll of ratepaying electors for any division of a province may obtain an elector's right for such province.

Persons of foreign birth who desire to obtain electors' rights must, if not already naturalized, obtain letters of naturalization, without which they are not qualified.

Each applicant for an elector's right for the Legislative Council should provide himself with a Sixpenny duty stamp necessary for payment for the right.

BAIRNSDALE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1930.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following By-law determining the rates and charges to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply within the Urban District of the Trust during the year 1930:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the occupiers or owners of land, houses, tenements situated within the Urban District of the Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such land-holders or tenements situated on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which land, houses, or tenements if not on such street are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes for the year commencing on the first day of January, 1930, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1930. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges:—

- (a) On every house or tenement of £25 annual municipal valuation or under, Twenty-five shillings per annum.
- (b) On every house or tenement above the municipal valuation of £25, at the rate of One shilling for every One pound of such valuation.
- (c) On all vacant allotments of land, at the rate of One shilling for every One pound per annum of the municipal value thereof with a minimum of Five shillings, except where there is a water service to the allotment, when the minimum charge will be Twenty-five shillings.
- (d) For water supplied from the Wharf, at Bairnsdale, for shipping and other purposes, a minimum charge of Sixpence per hundred gallons, or Sixpence for every fractional part thereof, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

- (e) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust or water supplied under the terms of sub-section (g) of section of this By-law, One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (f) Water supplied to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, and butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other domestic purposes may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (g) Water supplied to Government departments, mechanics' institutes, churches, cricket clubs, and bowling greens shall be charged by agreement or measurement at the discretion of the Trust.
- (h) Private water troughs shall be charged for at the rate of Twenty-five shillings per annum where the valuation of the property on which such troughs are situated does not exceed Twenty-five pounds; such trough charge of Twenty-five shillings shall mean to include the rate of valuation. Where the valuation of the property exceeds £25, the trough to be exempt from rating purposes, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- (i) The charge for water supplied to market gardens or fruit gardens shall be at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, by measurement, at the discretion of the Trust, a meter to be fixed at the expense of the ratepayer.
- (j) For water supplied for new buildings being erected, at the rate of 1 per cent. on the contract for labour and material of all stone, brick, concrete, and plastering work, or any work where water is used, and to be arranged for before the work is commenced.
- (k) The service for conveying the water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of the consumer shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—

1. For domestic premises with annual municipal value of £40 or over, a three-quarter inch service may be allowed at the discretion of the Trust. For domestic supply of premises not exceeding £40 annual municipal valuation, half-inch diameter.
2. For the supply other than domestic purposes and for supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall order in each case.

- (l) Each house or tenement must be provided with a separate service from the main.
- (m) Water supplied to market gardens, nurseries, or for any other irrigation purposes, shall be charged for by meter, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, in addition to the usual rate of a domestic supply on the basis of valuation. A separate service from the main for domestic supply may be allowed for at the discretion of the Trust.

2. The rate and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this By-law shall be paid by and recoverable from the occupier of the premises, or owner, or the person requiring, receiving, or using supply of water.

3. The said rate and charges for water supplied otherwise than by meter or by special agreement shall be payable in advance on the first day of January, 1930.

All charges for water supplied by meter or by special agreement shall be payable half-yearly, or at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust. The first payment shall, in respect of rates, be made at the time when owner or occupier shall become liable to pay rates for the supply of water hereinbefore mentioned. In construction of the By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Waterworks Trust.

## MORTLAKE WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR 1930.

THE Commissioners of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust do hereby, under the provisions of the Water Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law to deal with the rateable property within the Mortlake Waterworks District of the Mortlake Waterworks Trust, and with the minimum charges, and the charges for the sale of water from the works of the Trust:—

1. For every house and tenement of annual municipal value of £20 and under, the charge shall be One pound ten shillings.

2. For every house and tenement of annual municipal value of Twenty-one pounds and over, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid.

3. For every shop or place of business, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value.

4. For vacant allotments, the charge shall be as follows:—

Not exceeding  $\frac{1}{4}$  acre—Five shillings;  
Not exceeding 1 acre—Ten shillings; and  
Exceeding 1 acre—One pound.

If any allotment is provided with a water trough, the minimum charge shall be £1, and all troughs must be fitted with a ball cock.

5. The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in case by special arrangement with the Trust, shall be Eighteen pence per 1,000 gallons.

6. For water supplied to public troughs, with or without stand-pipe, the charge shall be Two pounds per trough.

7. For the supply of water to public buildings and other similar properties, the charges shall be as follows:—

Police station residence, Post Office, railway station, and stationmaster's residence—Two pounds.

Mechanics' Institute, Recreation Reserve—One pound ten shillings.

Temperance Hall, Masonic Hall—One pound.

Water supplied to church grounds shall not be charged for. For water supplied to Mortlake Gardens, vegetable gardens, and bowling green, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall not be less than 40,000 gallons.

For water supplied to swimming baths, the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Such supply to be given only when sufficient water is available after meeting other requirements.

8. The Trust may, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for domestic or other purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and will install a Trust meter for that purpose.

9. Should the privately-owned meter on any property become out of order, or cease working, the owner will be given twenty-one days by notice in writing to put the meter in order. If this is not done to the satisfaction of the Trust or its engineer, the Trust will put in one of its own meters without further notice.

10. In every case where a Trust meter is installed, the Trust shall make a charge of Ten shillings per annum for interest and maintenance of such meter, such charge to date from the beginning of the year in which such meter is installed.

11. If any person desires to have the service pipe of the Trust extended to his property, the Trust shall have power to make a special arrangement with him regarding the payment for the water supplied.

12. In the event of any dispute regarding the charge made by the Trust, or in any cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall have power to decide, or to take such action as may be deemed necessary.

13. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable in advance on the first day of February in each year, except where the charge is for water supplied by measure, in which cases the amounts due shall be payable on the first day of December in each year.

14. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates and charges.

In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Mortlake Waterworks Trust.

## SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.

## RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1930.

THE Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following By-law:—

The following are the rates for 1930 which owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the aforesaid Waterworks District shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds and under, a rate of One pound five shillings.

2. For every tenement of more than Thirteen pounds, and not exceeding the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, a rate of One pound ten shillings.

3. For every tenement of more than the annual municipal value of Nineteen pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

4. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be:—Seven pounds annual municipal value and under, a sum of Seven shillings and sixpence; over the annual municipal value of Seven pounds, the rate shall be One shilling in the pound.

5. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the above-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half a mile from the stand-pipe, one-quarter of the above-mentioned rate.

6. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specifically agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 40,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to engines, for cutting firewood, to be charged at the rate of £4 per annum for each engine.

8. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable, in advance, on the 1st January, 1930.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may appoint from time to time for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

ELECTRICAL TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 2).

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of October, 1929.

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927* (No. 3546) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 2)."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

- "Act" means the *Apprenticeship Act 1927*.
- "Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.
- "Registrar" means the Registrar of Apprenticeship.
- "Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

- Electrical Fitting and/or Armature Winding.
- Electrical Mechanics and/or Electrical Wiring.

Term of Apprenticeship.

4. The term of apprenticeship in the said trades shall be five years.

Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.—General Form.

5. The standard form of indentures of apprenticeship in each of the said trades, and the terms, covenants, and conditions thereof shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule to General Regulations (No. 2) with the following additions thereto:—

Additional Covenants, &c., to General Form of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

Employer's Covenants—

- (c) (iii) Make no deduction from the wages of the apprentice in respect of any time lost by reason of compulsory attendance at classes for instruction in subjects of the apprenticeship course.



- (f) Not hold the apprentice responsible for any damage or injury done to materials, machinery, tools or plant, other than wilful damage due to carelessness.
- (g) Not require the apprentice to work on any holiday or during other than ordinary working hours without his consent.
- (h) Not keep more than two days' pay in hand.
- (i) Not allow the apprentice to work overtime for more than eighteen hours in any four consecutive weeks.
- (j) Provide the apprentice during the first and second years of the said term with all tools necessary for carrying out his work.

**Apprentice and Parent or Guardian's Covenant—**

- (c) At all times while in the employment of the employer conduct himself in a courteous, obedient, and proper manner.

**Mutual Agreements—**

- (10) That the apprentice shall be paid the same allowances as are from time to time paid by the employer to journeymen in the same trade for meal money, fares, travelling time, country work and other matters, or, where such allowances are proportionate to the rates of pay received by journeymen, the apprentice shall be paid only such proportion thereof as the rates of pay of the apprentice bear to such journeymen's minimum rates of pay.
- (11) That the apprentice will replace any of the tools supplied for his use as hereinbefore provided if lost or broken through his own carelessness.

**Form of Indentures where Applicant Admitted to a Year other than the First Year of Apprenticeship.**

6. In cases, however, where an applicant for apprenticeship in any of the said trades has been permitted by the Commission, in pursuance of section 18 (1) of the Act, to be admitted to some year of the prescribed apprenticeship course other than the first year, paragraph (a) of the employer's covenant in the indentures of apprenticeship to be entered into shall be in the form provided in General Regulations (No. 3).

**Incorporation of Certain General Regulations.**

7. The provisions of Regulations 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 of General Regulations (No. 2) shall apply with respect to indentures of apprenticeship in the said trades.

And the Honorable Frank Groves, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## Petrol Pumps.

Licences issued shall expire on 30th September in each year, and prescribed fees therefor shall be—

For each pump, other than a portable pump, at the rate of £4 4s. per annum, for each portable pump at the rate of £1 10s. per annum, and for transfer of a licence 10s.

## Petrol Pumps.

NOTICE is hereby given by the Council of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell that a By-law, No. 18, relative to petrol pumps in or on footways, has been made by the Council and approved by the Governor in Council.

The title and summary of the provisions of such By-law are as follow:—

A By-law of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915*, and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, and numbered 18, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
  - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of every petrol pump, other than a portable petrol pump, in or on any footway—Five pounds (£5);
  - (2) for the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of every portable petrol pump which is used on any footway—One pound one shilling (£1 1s.);
  - (3) for the transfer of a licence—Ten shillings (10s.).
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways, and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
  - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of every petrol pump, other than a portable petrol pump, in or on any footway—One pound one shilling (£1 1s.);
  - (2) for the granting or renewal of a licence in respect of every portable petrol pump which is used on any footway—One pound one shilling (£1 1s.);
  - (3) for the transfer of a licence—Ten shillings (10s.).
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

## SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

## BY-LAW No 15.

A By-law of the Shire of Dundas, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1915* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* and numbered 15, for or with respect to—

- (a) The placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances.
- (b) The granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor.
- (c) Licences and conditions to be contained in licences.
- (d) Prescribing fees—
  - (1) For the granting or renewal of a licence.
  - (2) For the transfer of a licence.
- (e) Providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) Insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dundas order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Dundas.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Licensee” shall mean the holder for the time being of a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Dundas.

“Petrol pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

“Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway, and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

“Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed or to be placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of the Shire of Dundas used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling and supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect.

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway a licence-fee of Two pounds two shillings per annum.

(b) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a portable petrol pump which is used on any footway for the purposes of selling or supplying motor spirit a licence-fee of Two pounds two shillings per annum.

(c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence-fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence, in writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer fee of Ten shillings.

10. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given, the policy of insurance herein-after referred to taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall, before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump, in the sum of at least £500. Every licensee shall on demand produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.

14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, or appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Dundas.
