STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 2189:—SPEED URBAN DISTRICT WITHIN THE TYRRELL WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for the Speed Urban District within the Tyrrell Waterworks District:—

No hose or pipe shall be attached to any pipe or tap for the purpose of watering ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, except where the water is charged for by measure. Syphon pumps will not be allowed except where the water is supplied by measure.

3. Before any plumber, workman, or other person affix any meter or any service-pipe to any pipe of the Commission, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any meter or pipe of the Commission, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commission, he shall obtain from the Commission a licence to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such meter, pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall open any ground so as to uncover any pipe the property of the Commission, without giving three days' notice to the Commission or its proper officer of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commission, without the permission, in writing, of the Commission or its proper officer being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, valve, pipe, or other work the property of the Commission, shall be guilty of an offence.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission, or with any service-pipe connected therewith, without giving three days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with such pipes, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the proper officer of the Commission, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commission or a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commission or its proper officer, shall be guilty of an offence.

6. No meter for measuring the water supplied to any tenement shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by the proper officer of the Commission. Every such meter shall be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.

7. The Commission, notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, may, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water-meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, or meter of smaller size, Ten shillings.
For any meter of larger size than $\frac{1}{2}$ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ per centum upon the cost of such meter, fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall become due and be paid yearly, in advance, on the first day of the month of September in each year. Such hired meters shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Commission, except as to external injuries, the cost of repairing which shall be borne by the hirer.

8. In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of a meter hired from the Commission, he may, by notice in writing, require the Commission to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of the removing, testing, and replacing, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, it shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead thereof at the cost of the Commission, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Commission who shall cease to occupy the premises on which such meter is fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Commission of his intention to do so, shall be guilty of an offence.

9. If any meter cease registering, or be found to be out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Commission may estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order and until repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year.

10. Meters, other than such as are hired from the Commission, will be tested on delivery thereof at the office of the Commission, at Ouyen, and a fee of One shilling shall be charged for each test.

11. The Commission, by its officers, may, at any time after six days' notice, in writing, of its intention, attach a check meter to the service-pipes of any consumer, either inside or outside the premises of such consumer; and may, for such purpose, enter such premises at any time between the hours of Ten in the forenoon and Four in the afternoon, and then and there do all things necessary therefor.

12. Any person supplied with water by the Commission who shall wilfully or negligently allow such water to run to waste shall be guilty of an offence; and, in the event of continuing the same, shall be guilty of a further offence for each day, after notice from the Commission, on which such waste is continued.

13. All water troughs supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be lined with metal, so as to be watertight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically and for preventing overflow. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water troughs shall be of greater capacity than twenty-five gallons. Should any trough or fitting thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto may be cut off until efficiently repaired.

14. If any person supplied with water by the Commission does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, or fails to pay any rates or charges lawfully due by him, or fails to do anything which under this By-law ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Commission may, in addition to any other remedy, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

15. The charge to be paid for water supplied by measure from the pipes of the Commission shall be Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons.

16. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measure in each case where water is supplied from the pipes of the Commission shall be as follows:—

- (1) Where the supply is for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes, the quantity which, if charged for at Twenty-four pence per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to that payable in respect of the premises so supplied under the provisions of any By-law of the Commission for making and levying rates, if such premises were supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) Where the supply is solely for other than domestic purposes, a quantity which, if charged as provided by the last preceding clause, would give a sum of Twenty shillings for any continuous period of three months.

17. In the construction of this By-law the word "person" shall extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; the expression "proper officer" shall mean an officer or servant of the Commission authorized to perform any act or to accept service of any notice or to execute any function on behalf of the Commission.

18. Any person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any Court of competent jurisdiction.

OMEQ WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW FOR MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make and levy the following rates and charges for the year 1929 upon all lands and tenements within the Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement on which a dwelling house is erected, of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound ten shillings sterling.
 2. On every unoccupied allotment of land of the annual municipal value of Five pounds or under, the sum of Ten shillings.
 3. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds, a rate of 10 per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation.
 4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings shall be made.
 5. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Two pounds shall be made.
 6. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.
 7. In all cases not herein provided for, the Trust shall make such provision as may be deemed necessary.
 8. No service-pipe shall be more than three-quarters of an inch in diameter, unless at the discretion of the Trust.
 9. Such rate shall be payable yearly in advance on the first day of January, 1929.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

SHIRE OF RIPON.

WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

By-law No. 35, Making and Levying a Rate for Water Supply Purposes.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the By-law following for the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council:—

PART I.

1. A rate for the year hereinafter mentioned is hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands and tenements which are rateable property within the meaning of the *Local Government Act 1915*, within the Water Supply District of the Ripon Shire Council, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Municipal District of the said Shire within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure, and such rate shall consist of the rates and charges hereinafter specified.

PART II.

The Beaufort Water Supply.

2. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Beaufort Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement (including vacant allotments supplied with water) save as hereinafter specified, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the net annual value of such house or tenement, but in no case, save as hereinafter provided, shall such rate be less than the minimum sum of Twenty shillings, and in addition to such rate there shall be payable a further sum of Five shillings for each garden upon a tenement, and a further sum of Five shillings for each horse kept or usually watered on such tenement. For each water trough supplied with water, such trough having a ball tap attached thereto, the sum of Ten shillings; for each steam boiler supplied with water, the sum of Fifteen shillings; for each syphon supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made. For water supplied to public buildings, a charge of Four pounds per annum will be made.

- (b) On every piece of land not having a building thereon, and to which water pipes are not laid, but having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any main pipe laid for the supply of water from the Beaufort Water Supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such land, or opposite some portion of such frontage, the minimum sum of Ten shillings. Nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to apply to land adjoining and used in connexion with any other tenement.

3. "The Beaufort Water Supply" means and includes the reservoirs (with their respective systems of reticulation) known as Jackson's Reservoir and the Goldfields Reservoir, situate to the north and south respectively of the Township of Beaufort, and the springs and races which feed such reservoirs.

PART III.

The Joint Water Supply.

4. The rates and charges hereinafter mentioned are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the joint water supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- On every house or tenement being rateable property within the Municipal District of the Council, and which is supplied by the Council with water from the race by pipe laid from the race to such house or tenement and having a tap attached thereto, the sum of Thirty shillings per annum.
5. "The Joint Water Supply" means the race running from the springs at Mt. Cole to Jackson's Reservoir.

PART IV.

The Waterloo Water Supply.

6. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied from the Waterloo Water Supply otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, that is to say:—

- On every house or tenement being rateable property within the Municipal District of the Council, and having a frontage to any street or road along which there is any pipe laid for the supply of water from the Waterloo supply, provided such pipe or some portion thereof is laid in the street or road opposite the frontage of such house or tenement, or opposite some portion of such frontage, the sum of Thirty shillings per annum.
7. "The Waterloo Water Supply" means the "Waterloo Reservoir" (with reticulation therefrom) situated on or near the boundaries of the Parishes of Raglan and Beaufort, and being about five miles in a northerly direction from the Township of Beaufort.

PART V.

8. Such rates as aforesaid are made and shall be levied for the year beginning on the first day of October, 1928, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1929, and shall be payable at the office of the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Ripon, at the Shire Hall, Beaufort, immediately after the expiration of one month from the publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette* of the notice required by the Water Acts.

9. Such person or persons as the said President, Councillors, and Ratepayers may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

Tenders should be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box on or before Noon on Wednesday, 27th March, 1929.

NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the full period and fee of Five shillings for licence are forwarded.

TENDERS will be received before Noon on Wednesday, 27th March, 1929, for the right to depasture stock on the following unappropriated portions of land subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 121 of the Land Act 1915 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the Schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

CONDITIONS.

F. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions

of the Land Acts, except under the 121st section of the Land Act 1915, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council.

2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Land Acts may think fit.

3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.

4. Subject to these conditions the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.

5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.

7. The taking in of stock for agistment or otherwise allowing the use of the land, or part thereof, without the authority in writing by the Minister, is forbidden.

8. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip-panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.

9. That where improvements are authorized under section 123 of the Land Act 1915 the licensee shall notify, on completion, that such improvements have been made, otherwise the work will not be recognized.

10. The interest in this licence shall not be transferred without the consent of the Minister, and the payment of a fee of Ten shillings.

11. The licensee shall be liable to forfeiture if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with these conditions.

12. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

13. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is forbidden, and he shall not be entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling or other stock and for persons desiring to take water for domestic purposes.

15. The licensee shall destroy all noxious weeds on the land, and on the half-width of the adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of noxious weeds under the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1922* in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

Any place or requirement can be tendered for, and may be accepted separately. Should, however, a Tenderer not desire to accept a Contract in part of the requirements of any Station, he should write against such Station the words "All or None."

Tenders must be accompanied by the Preliminary Deposit shown in margin on the Tender Form in Bank Cheque or Bank Draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, which will be retained as security from the successful Tenderer until the due fulfilment of the Contract. The deposit will be forfeited in the event of the Tenderer, after the time fixed for the closing of Tenders, withdrawing or attempting to withdraw his Tender, or for the successful Tenderer failing to enter into the Contract for the supply at any place within ten days of notice of acceptance of same.

Preliminary Deposits of unsuccessful Tenderers will be returned on their application.

Tenders are not required at a fixed price, but must be submitted at any of the following:—(a) at ruling Market Rates; (b) at a percentage below ruling Market Rates; (c) at a percentage above ruling Market Rates, delivered to the above-mentioned Stations.

The Ruling Market Rates will be those published for prime or best quality for each item in the first issue of the Argus newspaper in each calendar month, and will rule for such month. In the event of two prices being published in the same issue for the same quality of the same item, the intermediate price will be taken as the Market price for the month.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All Forage to be of best or prime quality, properly bagged or trussed. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the Contractor, be ordered at one time. Bags to remain the property of the Contractor, and to be removed at his expense.

2. The quantities stated in the Schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should any additional horse or horses be required to be stationed at any station, the Contractor will be required to supply the extra forage.

3. The Contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of 6 miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may at any time be stabled at the Police Depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within 48 hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the Department to purchase the same at the risk of the Contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the Officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a Board of Survey, composed of persons named by the head of the Department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a Board of Survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a Board of Survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the Contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required will subject the Contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State of Victoria for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a Contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of the Contractor failing to carry on the contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the Contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

Local Government Act 1915.—Fourteenth Schedule.

SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

A By-law of the Shire of Beechworth, made under sections 197, 497, and 498, and Part I., clause 9, of the Thirteenth Schedule, numbers 41, 42, 43, 44, and 45 of the Local Government Act 1915, and numbered 43, for regulating the conditions under which cattle may be driven on to any road or street within the Shire for the purpose of grazing there with the Council's consent.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1915, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Beechworth order as follows:—

BY-LAW No. 43.

1. That any ratepayer of the Shire of Beechworth shall be entitled to and may apply to register a number not exceeding twenty-five head of horned cattle and twelve head of horses in each of the quarters of the year provided in clause 7 hereof.

2. Applications to be registered shall be in the form in the schedule hereunder, supplied by the Council, and shall be signed by the applicant, and the applicant shall make a statutory declaration as to the bona fides of his ownership of the animals sought to be registered.

3. Such forms shall specify (inter alia) the particulars and descriptions and brands or apparent brands and marks, age, and sex of the stock desired to be registered, and the roads or streets, and the riding or ridings of the Shire on which the applicant desires to graze such stock.

4. Such form of application shall be submitted to the Council for approval.

5. If the Council approve the application it shall issue a consent in the form to be approved by the Council to the applicant.

6. The charges or fees, subject to increase or decrease by a Resolution of the Council from time to time for grazing, shall be—

- (a) For each head of horned cattle above the age of six months, Four shillings per quarter.
- (b) For each horse above the age of six months, Six shillings per quarter.

7. Such charges or fees shall be payable quarterly in advance to the herdsman of the Council, and the quarters shall begin on the first days of the months of January, April, July, and October, in each year.

8. Any person entering stock during the currency of any quarter shall pay for the unexpired portion of the quarter, but not less than one month's fees shall in that case be accepted.

9. The Council shall have a discretion as to the number of horned cattle or horses which each applicant shall be entitled to register under clause 1 hereof, or to graze upon certain roads or streets from time to time, and the Council may regulate the increase or diminish the numbers to be grazed in any quarter.

10. No consent shall be given to any person to graze any sheep, entire horse, or bull on any road or street within the Shire of Beechworth, and any such animals found upon any road or street will be impounded by the Council's herdsman, as will any horned cattle or horses found grazing upon any road or street without the Council's consent under this By-law.

11. The Council shall not be responsible or liable for any loss by theft or death, or for any injury or damage to or straying of any animal grazing under the aforesaid consent, nor for the supply of a sufficiency of grass or water, and the consent to graze shall be applied for and obtained strictly under these conditions.

12. Calves and foals under six months of age, the progeny of the registered cows or mares, may run with their mothers free of charge up to that age limit.

13. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent the operation of section 17 of the Police Offences Act 1915, nor shall the Council be responsible or accountable in any way to the owner of an animal for any penalty incurred by such owner under such section, or for the impounding of any animal by the owner or occupier of property abutting upon any road or street in the Shire, or by any other person.

14. Every animal registered must have a tag attached thereto as may be directed by the Council or its herdsman, such tag to be supplied by the Council at the time of registration, and to be and remain the property of the Council, and must be returned to the Council or its herdsman by the registered owner at the termination of any grazing period or earlier if so determined by the Council, or in the event of such animal being sold, and any animal found grazing on any road or street in the Shire without the prescribed tag attached, shall be conclusively deemed to be unregistered.

15. A registered owner of animals shall acquaint the herdsman of the fact of the sale, or death, or removal, or withdrawal of any registered animal, and, in case of sale, of the name and address of the purchaser.

16. Any consent given by the Council may in its discretion be withdrawn either wholly or in part, and either as to all or any of the animals included therein, or as to all or any of the roads and streets covered thereby at the end of any quarter then current or earlier on a report by the herdsman that, in his opinion, any animal is suffering from any form of complaint or disease, or is a nuisance or dangerous, or is in the habit of breaking or getting through fences, or that feed or water are scarce or insufficient.

SHIRE OF HUNTLY.

BY-LAW No. 9.

A By-law of the Shire of Huntly, made under the Health Act 1919, for the Better Sanitation of the Township of Elmore.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1919, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Huntly in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the sanitary area of the Township of Elmore, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Inspector” means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

“The Commission” means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises, on which there is erected a pan-closet, shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and as set out in detailed sketch plan, which may be seen at the office, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of night-soil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and so soon as the double-pan system shall be introduced and adopted, shall also provide a lid capable of being litted tightly to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive gases, vapours, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge or other approved material or materials presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with night-soil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles. Each pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an air-tight lid to be affixed. The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, saw-dust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil, which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet, to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

- (a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and
- (b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal, and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. After the coming into operation of the double-pan system at least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity, the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be thoroughly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause such night-soil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such night-soil be disposed of in trenches, such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the night-soil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken up soil upon the night-soil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of night-soil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the night-soil and washings in any trench, such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to, but not less than 18 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the night-soil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in, in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass, or any forage, or cereal crops, or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve, shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which night-soil has been deposited, provided that vegetables, or seeds of vegetables, shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of night-soil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of night-soil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other fluid shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the night-soil.

21. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground shall, on every such occasion, be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water, subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60 lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes, in a steam-tight box or chamber; or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of accol, cyllin, korol, izul, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the Council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of night-soil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean and disinfected daily at the depot and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any night-soil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any night-soil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things, and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by this Council the 13th day of September, 1928, and confirmed the 8th day of November, 1928.
