## Audit Act 1915.

GENERAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING PUBLIC  
ACCOUNTS.

"52. Accounts for salaries, wages, &c., shall be prepared in the following form or forms to the like effect:—

For single salaries, &c., on Form LIA or LIIA annexed hereto.

For salaries, &c., of two or more persons, except as hereinafter provided, on Form LIA or Form LIC annexed hereto.

For salaries, &c., of officers or employees of the Railway Department, on Form LIs annexed hereto.

For salaries, &c., of employees of the Government Printing Office, Lunacy and Penal Departments, General Division, on Form LIC or Form LID annexed hereto.

For salaries, &c., of officers of the Taxation Office, on Form LIF annexed hereto.

Accounts for contingencies shall be prepared on Form LZ or Form LZA annexed hereto.

Accounts for Police salaries and allowances shall be prepared on Form LIG annexed hereto."

"68. When the Permanent Head of a Department inflicts a fine on an officer under his control, a report thereof shall forthwith be made to the Treasurer, in order that arrangements may be made for the necessary deduction from the officer's salary, as provided for in section 179 of the Public Service Act (No. 2713)."

## Education Act 1915.

## THE COUNCIL OF PUBLIC EDUCATION.

## REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 103 of the *Education Act 1915* upon the Council of Public Education, enabling the Council to make Regulations (with the approval of the Governor in Council) "for determining the course of study and training and the examinations entitling persons to be registered as teachers; regulating the granting by the Council of certificates of registration of teachers or of schools, and the form of such certificates; providing for the keeping of the registers and mode of registering, and making additions or revisions defining what schools shall for the purposes of this Act respectively be sub-primary schools, primary schools, or secondary schools (as the case may be); regarding the reciprocal admission of teachers from other States; for or relating to the time and place of meetings of the Registration Committee and the management and conduct of business thereat; and generally for carrying these Acts into effect," the Council doth hereby rescind Regulation III. (17), approved by the Governor in Council on the 25th August, 1927, and in lieu thereof doth make the following Regulation:—

## III. Register of Teachers.

17. Any person who is at least sixteen years of age and has passed the Intermediate Examination or any higher approved examination of the University of Melbourne may receive the permission of the Registration Committee to be employed as a junior teacher in an approved school for the purpose of undergoing a course of training extending over at least two years. If at the end of such course of training such person has qualified for the Leaving Certificate at the University of Melbourne, has passed the examination in the Theory and Practice of Teaching for the Primary Teacher's Certificate (Second Class) of the Education Department, and has passed in Arithmetic at the Intermediate Examination of the University of Melbourne or at the examination for the Primary Teacher's Certificate (Second Class) of the Education Department, he may be registered as a Primary teacher.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 99 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1915* (No. 2630), that the Minister for Mines may, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, make Regulations for (amongst other things) any purpose for which; in the opinion of the said Minister, with the approval as aforesaid, Regulations are by the said Act contemplated or required: And whereas, in pursuance of the powers so conferred and of section 78 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909* (No. 2240) Regulations were on the first day of March, 1910, made as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to make additions to the said Regulations: Now therefore I, Alfred Elliott Chandler, His Majesty's Minister of Mines for the time being, in exercise of the powers hereinbefore conferred, and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby, with the approval as aforesaid, make the following additional Regulations (that is to say):—

To Schedule XV. of the Regulations under the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1909*, made on the first day of March, 1910, add the following:—

4. "Permanent Disablement" as used in this schedule shall mean such disablement, as a result of an accident, as in the opinion of the Board permanently incapacitates a person from following his ordinary occupation, and "permanently disabled" shall have a corresponding meaning.
5. The Board may in its discretion pay to any person declared by it to be permanently disabled such allowance or allowances as are by these Regulations prescribed but so that the amount of such allowance or allowances together with his earnings (if any) shall not exceed the amount earned by him at the date of the accident.
6. Where the Board grants an allowance in respect of the child or children of any person, who, although declared to be permanently disabled, is able to follow some occupation other than his ordinary occupation, the payment of such allowance shall commence only from the date when such person is declared permanently disabled.
7. Paragraphs 4, 5, and 6 of these Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the second day of April, 1910, and shall have effect accordingly.

1. The following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes otherwise than by measure are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements within the Mitiamo Urban District within the Loddon United Waterworks Trust District:—

- (1) Of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) situate in a street in which a pipe for the supply of water has been laid down—a rate of Forty-eight pence in the pound of the valuation of such tenement. Provided that the rate for the supply of water as aforesaid to such tenement shall not be less than the sum of Twenty shillings per year.

3. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Commission in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.

For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for the purposes of such rates be determined by a police magistrate.

4. For water supplied by the Commission for domestic as well as for other than domestic purposes by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Commission) the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements shall be the quantity for which the charge at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the rate which would be payable for the lands and tenements so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, numbered 60, and made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1915*, for the purpose of regulating charges of admission to and the conduct of persons at or within the Show and Recreation Grounds within the said Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1915*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong do hereby order as follows:—

- The Council shall have power to hold entertainments or performances in the Show and Recreation Grounds and to make a charge for admission thereto.
- The Council shall have power to let the grounds to any club, association, or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, or sports, and to authorize such club, association, or person to make a charge for admission thereto.
- No charge or fee for admission to such Grounds shall exceed 2s. for each adult person and 1s. for each child under the age of 12 years unless the Council previously authorize higher charges.
- No person except the President, Councillors, and officers of the Council shall enter any portion of such Grounds when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Council.
- No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under this By-law, shall be required to leave during any entertainment or sports after he has paid for admission until he has been tendered the amount of admission paid by him.
- Such Grounds shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except on such days and at such hours as a charge is made for admission under the authority of the Council.
- No person shall interfere with, or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or walk on the beds, or climb, jump, or get upon or over any of the fences or gates, seats, or other structures, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave therein any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange or banana peel, or any refuse or rubbish whatsoever.
- No person shall engage in training or in cricket, football, tennis, lacrosse, or any like games in the Grounds without the written authority of the Council and payment of any fees or charges that may be fixed from time to time by the Council.
- No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work any of the Council's employees engaged in the Grounds by conversation or otherwise.
- No person shall sell or offer for sale within such Grounds any articles of food or drink or any other commodity or operate any money-making amusement without the written permission of the Council.
- No person shall behave in a disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency within the Grounds.
- No person shall remain in such Grounds at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Council to leave same.

13. No person shall spit or expectorate on any structure or erection in such Grounds.

14. All dogs and goats and all poultry found within the Grounds will be destroyed, and the owner shall be liable to pay compensation for any damage done. This clause shall not apply to shows held by the Dandenong Agricultural Society, the Dandenong Kennel and Poultry Club, or any kindred society.

15. No game or sport of any kind or description shall be played or engaged in during a Sunday.

16. *Definition*.—"Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Dandenong. "Grounds" shall mean the Dandenong Show and Recreation Grounds.

17. *Penalty*.—Every person who shall by any wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Resolution for passing this By-law was adopted on the fifteenth day of January, 1929, and confirmed on the twenty-fifth day of February, 1929.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers and authorities conferred by section 5 of the *Justices Act 1915* (No. 2675) and sub-section (4) of section 8 of the *Marriage Act 1928* (No. 3620), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additional Rules (that is to say):—

1. Notice of intention to apply to the Court of General Sessions of the Peace to hear and determine any complaint under Part III. of the *Marriage Act 1915* where the Court of Petty Sessions, police magistrate, or justices have refused to make an order may at any time within seven days from the date of such refusal be given to the clerk of petty sessions and to the defendant.

2. The said notice shall set out shortly—

- (a) Particulars of the complaint.
- (b) The decision of the Court of Petty Sessions, police magistrate, or justices, which shall be verified by a certified extract from the Petty Sessions Register.
- (c) The grounds of such application.

3. Every application as hereinbefore provided for shall be entered for trial not less than two days before the day on which the next practicable Court of General Sessions is ap-

pointed to be held; otherwise such application shall be dismissed with costs unless the court otherwise orders, and such entry thereof shall be made by delivering to the clerk or deputy clerk of the peace a memorandum signed by the applicant or by his solicitor on his behalf in accordance with Form 74 provided in the Second Schedule to the *Justices Act 1915*, together with a copy of the notice of application.

4. The notice required by these Rules to be given by an applicant shall be in writing, signed by him or by his solicitor on his behalf, and may be served by delivering the same to the defendant personally, or to some person at the last-known place of abode of the defendant, apparently an inmate thereof and apparently not less than sixteen years of age, or in any other manner directed by any justice in case he is satisfied that service as hereinbefore provided cannot be promptly effected.

5. Upon the hearing of any such application by a Court of General Sessions, no objection on account of any defect in the form of setting forth any ground of such application shall be allowed, and no objection to the reception of legal evidence offered in support of any grounds of such application shall prevail unless such Court of General Sessions is of opinion that such ground of application is so imperfectly or incorrectly set forth as to be insufficient to enable the party receiving the same to inquire into the subject of such statement and to prepare for trial.

6. Where any Court of General Sessions is of opinion that any objection to any ground of application or to the reception of evidence in support thereof ought to prevail, such court, if it thinks fit, may cause any such ground of application to be forthwith amended by some officer of the court or otherwise on such terms as to payment of costs to the other party or postponement of the trial to another day in the same or the next subsequent sessions, or both payment of costs and postponement as to such court appear just and reasonable.

7. In all cases of such applications the attendance of persons to give evidence or to produce documents or to give evidence and produce documents at the hearing of the application may be enforced by the Court of General Sessions in the same manner and by the same means as their attendance is enforced at the hearing of cases in Courts of Petty Sessions.

8. The decisions of the Court of General Sessions of the Peace upon the hearing of any such application as to the sufficiency of the statement of any ground or grounds of such application, and as to the amending or refusing to amend the statement of any ground or grounds of such application, shall be final and shall not be liable to be reviewed in any court by means of a writ of *certiorari* or *mandamus* or otherwise.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in section one hundred and fifty-nine of the *Justices Act 1915* in the case of any such application the Court of General Sessions before which the same is heard and determined, if so required by any party to such application, may in its discretion state the facts specially for the determination of the Supreme Court thereon, in which case that court may determine the same, any Act to the contrary notwithstanding; and the Supreme Court shall have full power to determine how and by whom the costs of the proceedings in the Supreme Court and in the Court of General Sessions, in the Court of Petty Sessions, or before the police magistrate or justices are to be borne. Any such case may be determined by a single judge sitting in court or in chambers, and there shall be no appeal from any determination of a single judge, but any single judge if he thinks it desirable may refer such statement of facts for hearing and determination by the Full Court on the request of any of the parties thereto.

10. If on any such application the chairman of general sessions when required by any party thereto refuses to state the facts specially for the determination of the Supreme Court as aforesaid the said party may apply to the Supreme Court for a rule or order *nisi* calling on such chairman to show cause why such facts should not be stated as aforesaid, and the Supreme Court may make the same absolute or discharge it with or without costs as it thinks proper.

The said chairman upon being served with any such rule or order absolute shall state the facts specially for the determination of the Supreme Court thereon as aforesaid accordingly.

And the Honorable Ian Macfarlan, His Majesty's Solicitor-General for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
