  - "Approved" means approved in writing by the Council.
  - "Clean Container" means any glass china porcelain metal or other approved receptacle for serving ice cream or similar food, milk or any beverage which has been thoroughly cleansed by washing in clean hot water or clean running water or by any other approved means and maintained in a clean condition prior to service.

"Proprietor" includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control of any shop stand stall booth cart or vehicle in or from which ice cream or similar food, milk, or any beverage is sold.

"Single service container" means any prepared paper or other receptacle for serving ice cream or similar food, milk, or any beverage and intended for one service only.

"The Council" means the Council of the municipality to the municipal district of which the provision in which the term is used applies.

- 4. No person shall sell by retail for immediate consumption any ice cream or similar food, milk, or any beverage unless such ice cream, food, milk, or beverage is served-
  - (a) in a clean container; or
  - (b) in a single service container.
  - 5. The proprietor shall-
    - (a) effectively protect all single service containers from contamination prior to service; and
    - (b) destroy or cause to be destroyed every single service container forthwith after use by any customer.
- 6. The Council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters and things as are necessary for such purpose.
- 7. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and any person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

11. No person except labourers and workmen employed in Management.

11. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
