FURTHER PROROGUING PARLIAMENT AND FIXING THE TIME FOR HOLDING THE
THIRD SESSION OF THE TWENTY-NINTH PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of
Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS The Parliament of Victoria stands prorogued until Tuesday, the twenty-fifth day of June, 1929:
Now I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of
Australia, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria until Wednesday, the
third day of July, 1929, and I do hereby fix Wednesday, the third day of July, 1929 aforesaid, at the hour of
half-past Twelve o'clock in the afternoon, as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the
said Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, in the State Parliament Houses, situate at Spring-street,
in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of
the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day
of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, and in the twentieth year
of the reign of His Majesty King George V.
