REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE LABELLING OF MEAT.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Act 1919 (No. 3041) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and on the recommendation of the Food Standards Committee, doth hereby amend the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1924 as follows:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Meat Labelling Regulations 1929, and shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1924, and any regulation amending the same, and shall come into operation on publication thereof in the Government Gazette.
- 2. The Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1928 (Regulations relating to the Labelling of Meat), published in the Government Gazette, at page 1740, on the twenty-seventh day of June, 1928, are hereby repealed.
- 3. For the purposes of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
 - "Imported" means imported from any place outside of Victoria.
 - "Meat" includes carcass or any part thereof.
- 4. Every person who exposes for sale any meat which is or has been frozen shall---
 - (a) affix and keep affixed thereto a label bearing the word FROZEN in letters of not less than eighteen points; or
 - (b) exhibit and keep exhibited in a prominent position in relation to such meat a placard bearing the word FROZEN in letters of not less than seventy-two points.
- 5. Every person who sells any frozen meat shall attach thereto or to the package containing the same the word FROZEN in letters of not less than eighteen points.
- 6. Every person who sells any imported meat shall attach thereto or to the package containing the same the word JMPORTED in letters of not less than eighteen points.

BY-LAW No. 7.

SUMMARY of a By-law of the Shire of Keilor made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 7, for—

- (a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting upon or within 10 feet of any street
- (b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings, or of fences abutting upon or within 10 feet of any street or road.
- or within 10 feet of any street or road.

 (c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings, or fences erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by this By-law, and to sell the material and to apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, hoardings, or fences, and in paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.
- (d) Appointing fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under this By-law, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.
- (e) Regulating and restraining the removal and re-erection within the municipal district of wooden buildings.
- (f) Prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke vents, or stove pipes.
- (g) Prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling-house or any shop or any dwelling-house and shop combined may thereafter be erected.

- (h) Regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building.
- (i) Providing that every dwelling-house thereafter erected shall have attached thereto, for the exclusive use of the occupier thereof, a prescribed area of open land
- (j) Providing with respect to buildings hereafter erected for the minimum area to be covered by any dwellinghouse or any dwelling-house and shop combined.
- (k) Providing with respect to buildings thereafter erected for—
 - (i) Regulating or limiting the height of buildings;
 - (ii) Means of escape from buildings in case of fire, and the prevention of fire in buildings;
 - (iii) The ventilation and lighting of buildings;
 - (iv) Exits from and stairways in buildings other than private dwelling-houses; and
 - (v) The minimum size of any dwelling room.
- (1) Regulating the height, thickness, and construction of material of the party walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and of the materials for and the mode of enclosing the same.
- (m) 'lequiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time, or in such manner, as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council, or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council.
- (n) Regulating the erection of tents.
- (o) Leaving any matter or thing to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution, or by any officer authorized by the Council in that behalf, either generally, or for any case or cases, or in any particular case, in so far as regulating or restraining the erection or construction of buildings.
- (p) Repealing By-laws and Regulations inconsistent with this By-law.

By-law No. 3 of the Shire of Keilor is repealed, and By-law No. 7 shall apply to and have operation within the whole of the municipal district, and shall come into operation immediately upon its publication in the Victorian Government Gazette.

Clause 4 of the said By-law sets forth definitions and clauses 5 to 8 refer to the minimum area of allotments; the depth and width of frontages. Clause 9 prescribes the distance of buildings from boundaries. Clauses 10 to 12 fixes the minimum area to be covered by any dwelling-house, shop, or any dwelling-house and shop combined. Council may dispense with these requirements in the case of certain existing building allotments.

Clauses 14 to 57 provide for the exemption of certain buildings from the provisions of the By-law, and contain general provisions as to buildings, including area and height of rooms; materials and construction; thickness and height of walls; shape and dimensions of portices or verandahs, erection of hoardings, position of out-houses, detached rooms, and tents.

Clause 58 provides that the surveyor may object to materials and require same to be removed, whilst clauses 59 to 64 refer to the quality of material and the component parts of mortar and concrete. Clause 65 provides for timber to be sound, and clause 66 prohibits the use of old or second-hand material without the consent of the surveyor.

Clauses 67 to 70 contain provisions relating to the removal and re-erection of wooden buildings. Clause 71 refers to the pulling down and removal of buildings, and clauses 72 and 73 to ruinous and dangerous buildings and structures which the Council may require to be secured or removed.

Clauses 74 to 84 provide for notice of intention to build or demolish, and lodgment of plans, and the powers of the Council in case of default. Clause 85 refers to the erection of fences, including materials to be used and details of construction. Clause 86 provides for the removal of unsound or defective material as required by the surveyor, and clause 87 ixes the penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of the By-law at a minimum of 10s. and maximum of £20. Clauses 88 to 90 provide for dispensing with the requirements of the By-law in any special case or under exceptional circumstances, and sets out the terms and conditions.

The First Schedule includes conditions for determining the rates of buildings of the domestic, warehouse, and public building classes, and the scale of fees to be paid for the respective classes, for chimneys and flues, and miscellaneous fees.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to the 12th day of January, 1929, and confirmed the 2nd day of March, 1929, and the common seal of the Council attached in the presence of—

Police Offences Act 1915.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE COMMITTEE OF THE VICTORIA AMATEUR TURF CLUB.

E, James Grice (Chairman), Benjamin Chaffey (Vice-Chairman), Clive Baillieu, Merson Sheldon Cooper, William Irving Winter-Irving, and Hubert Percy Willis, being a majority of the Committee of the Victoria Amateur Turf Club, conducting race meetings on the race-course known as the Caulfield Race-course Reserve, and licensed under the Police Offences Act 1915, in pursuance of the powers and authority conferred on us by the said Police Offences Act 1915. hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, rescindall Rules and Regulations heretofore made by us under the Lotteries, Gaming, and Betting Act 1906, and in lieu thereof, with the like consent, make the following Rules and Regulations:—

- 1. The following portions of the race-course are hereby specially set apart for the carrying on by approved and permitted persons of the business or vocation of bookmakers, and/or bookmakers' clerks:—
 - (a) That part of the Grandstand Enclosure delineated and coloured red on the plan hereunto annexed, and marked "The Ring";
 - (b) That part of the Guineas Enclosure delineated and coloured red on the said plan, and marked "The Guineas Ring";
 - (c) That part of the Flat Enclosure delineated and coloured red on the said plan, and marked "The Flat Ring".
- 2. No person shall carry on or be permitted to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk on any part of the race-course other than the portions set forth in the last preceding Regulation. Any person carrying on the business or vocation of a bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk in contravention of this Regulation, shall be guilty of an offence, and when found so carrying on business, may be removed from the race-course by the Committee, or its officers or servants, or any member of the Police Force, and shall be liable—
 - (a) for a first offence to a penalty of not less than Five nor more than One hundred pounds or to imprisonment for a term of not less than seven days, nor more than three months; and
 - (b) for a second offence to a penalty of not less than
 Twenty-five nor more than Two hundred pounds, or
 to imprisonment for a term of not less than one
 month, nor more than six months; and
 - (c) for any subsequent offence, to imprisonment for a term of not less than three nor more than twelve months.

BOOKMAKERS AND BOOKMAKERS' CLERKS.

3. Every person desiring to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker at race meetings on any of the portions of the race-course specially set apart by these Regulations for that purpose, shall make application, in writing, to the Committee for permission so to do. Such application shall be in the form from time to time prescribed by the Committee, and shall state on which of the said portions specially set apart such person desires permission to carry on the said business or vocation.

- 4. If the person so applying is approved by the Committee, and pays in advance the fee or charge prescribed by these Regulations for a permit, the Committee may, in its discretion, issue a permit to him to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker, and to employ one approved bookmaker's clerk holding a permit under these Regulations.
- 5. Every-permit issued to an approved applicant by the Committee shall be in writing, in such form as the Committee may from time to time prescribe, and shall state the period in respect of which it is issued, and the portion or portions of the race-course specially set apart under these Regulations whereon he is to carry on the business or vocation mentioned in such permit, and that the permit is issued by the Committee and accepted by the applicant subject to these Regulations, and any amendment or alteration thereof for the time being.
- 6. Every such permit, until revoked, under these Regulations, or determined by effluxion of time, shall be evidence that the person named therein is approved and permitted by the Committee to carry on the business or vocation mentioned in such permit at race meetings subject to these Regulations, and on such portion or portions of the race-course specially set apart by these Regulations for that purpose as are named in such permit.
- 7. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of, or act as, a bookmaker's clerk on any portion of the race-course specially set apart by these Regulations for that purpose unless he is first approved and permitted by the Committee so to do.
- S. Every person desiring to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker's clerk at race meetings on the portions of the race-course specially set apart for that purpose under these Regulations, shall make application, in writing, to the Committee in such form as may be from time to time prescribed by the Committee.
- 9. If the person so applying is approved by the Committee, and pays in advance the fee or charge prescribed by these Regulations for the issue of a permit to a bookmaker's clerk, the Committee may, in its discretion, issue a permit to such approved person in such form as the Committee may from the the prescribe. time to time prescribe.
- 10. No bookmaker shall employ any approved and permitted clerk on the said race-course at any race meeting in addition to the approved and permitted clerk covered by such book-maker's permit, unless such bookmaker has paid to the Com-mittee the fees mentioned in these Regulations for a permit in respect of such additional approved and permitted clerk.
- 11. Every permit issued by the Committee under these Regulations to a bookmaker, and/or to a bookmaker's clerk, shall be for a period expiring upon the thirty-first day of August next after the date of the issue of such permit.
- 12. The fees payable to the Committee by every approved person for the respective permits applied for and issued to such person under these Regulations, shall be as follow:—

For a permit to carry on the business or vocation of a bookmaker, including one approved clerk holding a permit-

- 13. In addition to the fees or charges above-mentioned, every bookmaker and bookmaker's clerk shall pay the charges from time to time prescribed under the Regulations of the Trustees of the Caulfield Race-course Reserve, for admission to the reserves in which the Rings mentioned in the permit issued to such bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk are respectively located.
- 14. Any person who at any race meeting carries on the business or vocation of a bookmaker, on any of the portions specially set apart for the purpose by these Regulations, without a permit issued by the Committee authorizing him so to do, shall be guitty of an offence, and when found so carrying on business, may be removed from the race-course by the Committee, or its officers or servants, or any member of the Police Force.
- 15. Any person who at any race meeting carries on the business or vocation of a bookmaker's clerk, or acts as such on any of the portions specially set apart for the purpose by

- these Regulations, without a permit issued by the Committee authorizing him so to do, shall be guilty of an offence, and when found so carrying on business or acting as a bookmaker's clerk, may be removed from the race-course by the Committee. or its officers or servants, or any member of the Police Force.
- 16. Any bookmaker having a permit who at any race meeting on the said race-course makes a bet for or with any jockey or apprentice, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 17. Any bookmoker's clerk having a permit who at any race meeting on the said race-course makes a bet for or with any jockey or apprentice, or with any youth apparently under the age of twenty-one years, or with any female, shall be guilty of an offence.
- 18. Any bookmaker having a permit, or any bookmaker's clerk having a permit, who at any race meeting on the said race-course-
 - (a) is drunk and disorderly;
 - (b) assaults any person, or makes use of any profane, indecent, obscene, or blasphemous language, or any threatening or abusive words, or otherwise mis-conducts or misbehaves himself;

shall be guilty of an offence.

- 19. Any bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk guilty of an offence against these Regulations may be removed from the race-course by the Committee, or its officers or servants, or any member of the Police Force, and shall, if no other punishment is expressly provided for such offence, be liable to a penalty of not less than Two nor more than Twenty pounds.
- 20. If any bookmaker or bookmaker's clerk having a permit be convicted in a Court of law of any offence punishable by imprisonment, or of any offence under these Regulations, or be shown to the satisfaction of the Committee to have—
 - (a) obtained his permit by misrepresentation or concealment of any material fact; or
 - (b) made a bet, or have any transaction with a jock y or apprentice under such circumstances as, in the opinion of the Committee, indicates bribery or coruption; or
 - (c) made default in payment of any bet made by him; or (d) misconducted or misbehaved himself on the said race-
 - course; or
 - (e) been guilty of any malpractice, or dishonorable or improper conduct in connexion with horse-racing or betting on the said race-course or elsewhere; or
 - (f) been disqualified by the Committee, or stewards, or governing body of any racing club; or
 - (g) offended against Regulation 10 hereof,
- the Committee may (whether they have exercised any other powers under these Regulations or not) revoke his permit and withdraw their approval and permission, and shall not be under any obligation to repay to such person any portion of the fee or charge which he has paid for such permit.

STALLHOLDERS AND HAWKERS.

- 21. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a vendor of fruit, confectionery, soft drinks, or foodstuffs at any race meeting on the said race-course without the permission of the Committee.
- 22. To every person permitted as aforesaid to carry on the business of a vendor of fruit, confectionery, soft drinks, or foodstuffs, there shall be issued a permit stating the period during which and the part of the race-course on which he is to carry on the said business or vocation, and that such permit is issued by the Committee, and accepted by the vendor of fruit, confectionery, soft drinks, or foodstuffs subject to these Reculations. Regulations.
- 23. Any person carrying on the business or vocation of a vendor of fruit, confectionery, soft drinks, or foodstuffs without permission, and any person so permitted who at any race meeting on the said race-course—
 - (a) is drunk and disorderly; or
 - (b) assaults any person, or makes use of any profane, indecent, obscene, or blasphemous language, or other-wise misconducts or misbehaves himself,

may be prevented by the Committee from carrying on the said business or vocation, and may be removed from the said race-course by the Committee, its officers or servants, or any mem-ber of the Police Force, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty of not less than Two nor more than Ten pounds.

24. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a hawker or pedlar of goods, wares, or merchandise at any race meeting on the said race-course, and any person so found carrying on the business or vocation of a hawker or pedlar of goods, wares, or merchandise in contravention of this Regulation, may be removed from the race-course by the Committee, or its officers or servants, or any member of the Police Force.

CATERERS.

25. No person shall carry on the business or vocation of a caterer at any race meeting on the said race-course unless he be approved by the Committee and permitted so to do.

26. Any person not so approved and permitted who at any race meeting on the said race-course carries on the business or vocation of a caterer, may be prevented by the Committee from so doing, and removed from the said race-course by the Committee, its officers or servants, or any member of the Police Force, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty of not less than Two nor more than Ten pounds.

GUNEDAT

27. No person shall carry on any business or vocation other than those hereinbefore provided for at any race meeting on the said race-course without the approval and permission of the Committee, and any person carrying on any business or vocation other than those hereinbefore provided for, may be removed from the said race-course by the Committee, its officers

or servants, or any member of the Police Force, and shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty of not less than Two nor more than Ten pounds.


