2. Where the licensee holds land under the said section which is unfenced, he may, in any court of competent jurisdiction, sue the owner of any cattle, sheep, or other animals for damage arising from trespass by such cattle, sheep, or other animals.

The Committee of the Hamilton and District Hospital, under the powers contained in section 65 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922*, and all other powers it thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following By-laws, viz. :—

1. All By-laws in force prior to the date of the coming into operation of these By-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed saving all existing rights.

2. In these By-laws, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Act” means the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1922*.

“Committee” means the Committee of the institution appointed in pursuance of section 52 of the Act

“Contributor” has the same meaning as defined in section 4 of the Act.

“Institution” means the Hamilton and District Hospital.

3. The objects of the institution are—

(a) To afford charitable relief to diseased, infirm, poor, or destitute persons, including—

(i) maintenance and the treatment or cure of or attention to any disease or ailment, or any injury consequent on any accident, medical and/or surgical attendance, medicine, nursing, assistance, and support or aid of any kind or in any form to such persons as are entitled thereto under the Act;

(ii) the care of and attention to women during confinement, and the doing of all things usually incidental to a maternity home.

(b) To provide facilities for a training school for nurses.

(c) To provide for carrying out investigation into ailments, diseases, injuries, or other matters affecting the human body.

(d) To provide the services and carry out the objects and requirements of or contemplated by the Act or any other Act relating to hospitals and philanthropic institutions, or the treatment of patients therein.

4. The common seal of the institution shall not be affixed to any instrument except by the authority of a resolution of the Committee and in the presence of two members of Committee and of the secretary, or such other person as the Committee may appoint for the purpose, and these two members and secretary, or other person as aforesaid, shall sign every instrument to which the seal of the institution is so affixed in their presence.

5. (a) A person who was a life governor immediately prior to the coming into operation of these By-laws shall continue to be a life governor.

(b) The Committee may at any of its meetings elect as life governors—

(i) a person who has conferred a signal benefit on the institution other than by contributing to its funds;

(ii) a person who at any time has, on his own behalf, contributed to the institution at least Twenty pounds in one donation;

(iii) a person nominated as a contributor by any corporation, company, or firm which, at any time, has contributed at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation out of the moneys of the corporation, company, or firm;

(iv) a person nominated as a contributor by the employees of any corporation, company, firm, or employer, who at any time have contributed at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation;

(v) a person nominated as a contributor by the executors or trustees under any will who have allocated at least Twenty pounds to the institution in one donation out of any moneys of the testator not specifically directed to be paid to the institution under the will.

Provided that any such contribution as aforesaid has been made without any right of relief having accrued or accruing in respect thereof to any person, corporation, company, firm, executor, or trustee making the same, or to any person nominated in respect of the same.

6. Life governors shall be deemed to be, and shall have all the rights and privileges of contributors for and during their lives.

7. Each contributor shall be entitled to one vote.

8. The financial year of the institution shall end on the thirtieth day of June in each year.

9. Every meeting of contributors shall be convened by notice inserted at least fourteen days before the day on which such meeting is to be held in a newspaper published in Hamilton, and such other newspaper or newspapers as the Committee may from time to time direct; such notice shall contain a summary of the business intended to be transacted at the meeting.

10. Subject to the provisions of section 56 of the Act every meeting of contributors shall be held on such day, and at such time and place, as shall be determined by the Committee.

11. Immediately before the close of each meeting of contributors the minutes of such meeting shall be read over and confirmed, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy.

12. Upon the requisition, in writing, signed by at least twenty-five contributors, the Committee shall, without delay, convene a meeting of contributors, the occasion for such meeting being stated in such requisition, and in the notice convening such meeting, and no business shall be transacted at such meeting other than that stated in such notice.

13. At the annual meeting of contributors, held in pursuance of the provisions of the Act, in addition to the election of members of Committee and other elective officers, the meeting shall take into consideration the report of the Committee, and audited statements of receipts and expenditure for the year ended on the thirtieth June preceding, and may transact such other business as may be lawfully dealt with.

14. At every meeting of contributors all matters, except contested elections, shall be decided on a show of hands, unless a poll is before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands demanded by at least ten contributors, and unless a poll is so demanded a declaration by the chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or lost, and an entry to that effect in the book of the proceedings of the institution shall be conclusive evidence of the fact.

15. If a poll is duly demanded it shall be taken in such manner as the chairman may direct, or he may adjourn the meeting, to admit of arrangements being made for taking such poll, to a day to be fixed by him, being a day not less than fourteen nor more than twenty-one days from the day of adjournment, and notice of such adjourned meeting shall be given in the manner hereinbefore provided for convening meetings of contributors.

16. The Committee shall appoint from amongst its members a returning officer not being a retiring member of Committee who shall conduct the election of members of Committee and other elective officers, and he shall have power to appoint deputy returning officers if he shall consider it advisable to do so, and he shall make the necessary arrangements for conducting such election.

17. In the event of two or more candidates securing an equal number of votes the returning officer shall have a casting vote or votes.

18. Every candidate, at an election for an elective office, may appoint a scrutineer for such election.

19. Every contributor, desirous of voting through the post at any meeting of contributors, or at any election by contributors, shall apply in the case of taking a vote at a meeting of contributors to the secretary, and, in the case of an election to the returning officer, who will issue a ballot-paper and special envelope, such ballot-paper shall be returned to the secretary or the returning officer, as the case may be, contained in such special envelope, which must be signed by the contributor on the inside of the flap.

20. All postal ballot-papers must be in the hands of the secretary at the time of taking the vote, in the case of taking a vote at a meeting of contributors, and of the returning officer at the close of the poll in the case of an election.

21. A contributor shall vote for the full number of candidates to be elected, otherwise the vote shall be informal.

22. The Committee shall consist of the president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and twelve members.

23. No salaried officer or paid servant of the institution shall be entitled to be elected to any elective office.

24. No person shall be capable of being or continuing a member of Committee who shall hold any office in or place of profit under the institution, or be concerned or participate in any manner in any contract with the institution or the Committee, or in the profit thereof, or in any work to be done under the authority of the same, provided that such disability shall not apply to any member of any incorporated company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty members when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, nor to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements; and provided further that no member of Committee shall vote or take part in the discussion of any matter before or under the consideration of the Committee in which he shall either directly or indirectly, by himself, or his partners, or associates, have any pecuniary interest.

25. The Committee may from time to time appoint from among its own members such sub-committees as it may consider necessary.

26. The Committee shall meet at the institution for general business on the second Tuesday in each month, at the hour of Eight o'clock p.m., or at such other time and place as the Committee may from time to time decide, and for special business at such time and place as may be necessary or expedient.

27. Notice of all meetings of Committee shall be sent to, and so as to reach, each member of Committee, by the secretary at least twenty-four hours before the time of meeting, stating any special business to be transacted.

28. The Committee shall proceed to business so soon after the hour of meeting as there shall be a quorum present, and if, at the expiration of thirty minutes from the hour of meeting, there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to such day and hour as the members then present shall decide, not being more than fourteen days from the day appointed for such meeting.

29. No business shall be entered upon until the minutes of the previous meeting of the Committee have been confirmed, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

30. No resolution of the Committee shall be varied or rescinded until one month after such resolution has been passed, and then only upon notice of motion, and by an absolute majority of the Committee.

31. Every notice of motion in Committee shall be given in writing, be signed by the member giving it, and be delivered to the secretary at least seven days before the meeting of Committee at which it is to be moved. A motion, notice of which has been duly given, if it be not moved at the meeting of Committee immediately following such notice either by the member who has given notice or by some other member in his behalf, when it comes on in due course, shall, unless postponed by leave of the Committee, be considered as dropped, and shall not be moved without fresh notice.

32. The Committee shall control the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and discharge all medical officers, officials and servants, frame rules and regulations for regulating its own procedure for the conduct of all medical officers, officials and servants, and for the management of the institution, prepare and present a report and statement of receipts and expenditure to the annual meeting of contributors, and generally conduct the affairs of the institution. It may from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations not inconsistent with the Act, or these By-laws for the internal management of the institution, and, in particular, for prescribing the duties of the House Committee, treasurer, secretary, auditors, medical officers, matron, sisters, nurses, trainees, probationers, and all other members of the staff, and for the more efficient carrying out of these By-laws.

33. Subject to By-law No. 35 hereof all accounts for payment shall be passed by the Committee before payment, and a list thereof embodying a warrant for the issue of cheques shall be signed at the meeting of Committee by the chairman.

34. The Committee shall, at its first meeting after the annual meeting of contributors, appoint from amongst its own members a House Committee of three members, two to form a quorum. In addition to such three members the president and vice-presidents shall, by virtue of their respective offices, be members of the House Committee. The House Committee shall elect its own chairman at its first meeting.

35. The House Committee shall meet once at least in each fortnight, and oftener if necessary, and shall have power to admit patients, and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals between meetings, it shall inquire into all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the institution, or for any other cause which it shall deem sufficient, recording in the minutes the reason for the non-admission or for dismissal. The House Committee may suspend any officer of the institution, pending inquiry by the Committee; it may engage and discharge nurses, trainees, and servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly or yearly tenders, and recommend any to the Committee for acceptance, it shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally.

It shall fortnightly inspect the wards, kitchen, and other portions of the institution; it shall check the tradesmen's monthly bills and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the Committee for payment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the institution under the direction of the Committee. It shall examine the secretary's cash and other books of account, and compare same with bank pass-book; check additions, and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the treasurer; it shall give all needful instructions to the secretary, with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of contributions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the Committee at the monthly meetings, and shall, in conjunction with the president or a member of the Committee appointed for the purpose, and secretary, be empowered to make necessary special payments in

the intervals between the monthly meetings; it shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly receipted, and shall examine the returns prepared for Government, and annual statements of accounts. It shall also perform such other duties as the Committee may from time to time direct. The House Committee shall make a report, in writing, to each monthly meeting of the Committee.

36. In all cases where books and vouchers are checked by the House Committee, the signature of some member thereof shall be appended with the date of examination.

37. The secretary shall receive all moneys on account of the institution, and issue official receipt forthwith. Such moneys shall be deposited without delay to the credit of the institution in such bank as the Committee may from time to time determine.

38. All payments shall be made by cheques which shall be signed by the treasurer or a member of the House Committee, and countersigned by the secretary, or such member of the Committee as the Committee may appoint for that purpose.

39. Prior to signing any cheque a member of Committee shall require production of the warrant referred to in By-law No. 33 hereof, and upon signing such cheque he shall endorse such warrant with a memorandum that such cheque has been so signed by him; special payments may, nevertheless, be made in accordance with By-law No. 35 hereof, such special payments to be included in the next warrant authorized by the Committee.

40. Two auditors shall be elected at the annual meeting of contributors, and they shall have access to the books and accounts of the institution at all times, and shall, if they think fit, make reports from time to time to the Committee; they shall, during July in each year, examine the annual financial statement with all books, accounts, and documents relating thereto, and list of contributions, and shall verify their accuracy, and make any report thereon as they shall think fit to the annual meeting of contributors.

41. The president, vice-presidents, treasurer, and auditors shall retire from their respective offices on the day of the annual meeting of contributors, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected thereto.

42. The secretary shall furnish the Committee with a fidelity bond in such amount not being less than Two hundred and fifty pounds as the Committee may from time to time decide, with such company as the Committee shall direct; the premium payable in respect of such bond shall be paid out of the funds of the institution.

43. No medical officer, member of the staff, or other person employed by the Committee, shall take directly or indirectly a fee, reward, or gratuity from any patient or visitor, or from any tradesman, or other person supplying or desirous of supplying requirements to the institution, or from any contractor or other person carrying out, or desirous of carrying out, any work or undertaking at the institution, and any infringement of this By-law shall render the offender liable to immediate dismissal.

44. Except in the case of accident or emergency no patient shall be admitted to the institution, save on a ticket of recommendation signed by a contributor and member of Committee, certifying that the person named therein is unable to pay for adequate medical attention and relief; such ticket of recommendation shall be in such form as the Committee may from time to time determine.

45. The reception and retention of patients into and in the institution shall be at all times subject to the approval of the House Committee, and shall be subject to the further provision that the funds and accommodation of the institution admit of such reception and retention.

46. No insane person except on remand for medical examination, and no person having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted to the institution except in the special wards (if any) provided for the purpose; no person shall be admitted as an in-patient who, in the opinion of the honorary medical staff, or the resident medical officer, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient; except under special circumstances, no person shall be admitted as a patient from a district where a hospital of a similar type to the institution exists; provided that the House Committee shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases.

47. Every patient, and every parent or guardian of a patient, who is a minor, shall, when called upon by the House Committee so to do, whether before or after admission, furnish a statement of his or her circumstances in life, setting forth such particulars of his or her, and in the case of a married person, of his wife's or her husband's (as the case may be), real and personal property, earnings, liabilities, and otherwise, as the Committee may from time to time determine.

48. No By-law shall be altered or repealed unless such alteration or repeal is confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose.

49. It is hereby declared that the foregoing By-laws and rights, powers, and obligations created thereby are to be construed as auxiliary to and not in derogation or diminution of any rights, powers, and obligations subsisting irrespective of such By-laws.
