MILDURA LOCK-UP TO BE A POLICE GAOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments has certified that the Mildura Lock-up is fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by section 7 of the *Gaols Act 1915*, do hereby proclaim the said lock-up to be a “police gaol.”

ARTICLES DEEMED TO BE POISONS.

AMENDED SECOND SCHEDULE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Poisons Act* 1915 it is among other things enacted that the several articles mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Act shall be deemed poisons within the meaning of the said Act, and on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, amend the said schedule by adding to any part of such schedule or removing therefrom any article specified in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the said Board, and pursuant to section 4 of the above-named Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said Second Schedule shall be amended as herein set forth, and that the articles set forth hereunder shall be deemed to be poisons under the Second Part of the said schedule within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Second Part.

1. In place of item 6 in Part II. of the Second Schedule substitute the following, namely:—

“6. Barbituric acid and all organic or metallic derivatives of barbituric acid, whether described as veronal, veramon, propional, medinal, barbital, dial, luminal, sodium luminal, or by any other trade name, mark, or designation.”

2. In item 7 of the said schedule, after the words “Barium, salts of,” add the words “except barium sulphate.”

3. In place of item 32 in the said part of the said schedule substitute the following, namely:—

“32. Lysol and all saponaceous preparations, whether in solid or liquid form, containing three per centum or more of cresylic acid.”

4. In place of item 33 in the said part of the said schedule, substitute the following, namely:—

“33. Mercury—poisonous salts and poisonous chemical compounds of, and all preparations or admixtures containing poisonous salts or poisonous chemical compounds of mercury.”

5. In place of item 41 in the said part of the said schedule, substitute the following, namely:—

“41. Paraldehyde, its preparations and admixtures.”

6. To the said part of the said schedule add the following new items, namely:—

“53. Ammonia.—The official liniments included in the *British Pharmacopœia* when containing more than one per centum of free ammonia (by weight).

54. Thallium, its salts, preparations, and admixtures.”

The foregoing amendments of the Second Schedule of the *Poisons Act* 1915 were recommended by Resolution of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria at its meeting held at Melbourne on the fourteenth day of August, 1929.

Poisons Act.

AMENDMENT OF PART III. OF SECOND SCHEDULE TO THE POISONS ACT 1915.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the *Poisons Act* 1927 in any case where the Governor in Council considers that any substance (whether or not the same is at the commencement of the said Act included in either of the other parts of the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1915) is not of such a nature as to make it necessary for the safety of the public that all the provisions of the Poisons Acts applicable to poisons should apply to such substance, but is of such a nature that its sale and use should be subject to certain conditions and restrictions under the said Acts, the Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, may, by Proclamation, insert the name of such substance in the Third Part of the Second Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1915: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do consider that each of the substances specified hereunder is not of such a nature as aforesaid, but is of such a nature that its sale and use should be subject to the conditions and restrictions under the said Acts, and on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation insert in the Third Part of the said Second Schedule the substances following and declare that the sale and use of any of the said substances shall be subject to the said conditions and restrictions, namely:—

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Third Part.

1. After item “6. Ether” in the Third Part of the said schedule, add the words “and all preparations or admixtures containing five per centum or more of ether.”

2. After item “13. Silver nitrate and its solutions” in the Third Part of the said schedule add the following substances, namely:—

14. Acetanilide (antifebrin) in any admixture or preparation for internal use.

15. Chloralamide—and its preparations or admixtures.

The names of the above-mentioned substances were recommended for insertion in the Third Part of the said schedule by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria by Resolution passed at its meeting held at Melbourne on the 14th day of August, 1929.

Poisons Acts.—Amended Fourth Schedule.

POISONOUS SUBSTANCES AND PREPARATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Poisons Acts it is among other things enacted that on the recommendation of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, amend the Fourth Schedule to the *Poisons Act* 1915 by adding thereto or removing therefrom any poisonous substance or preparation specified in such schedule: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State,

and on the recommendation of the said Board, do by this my Proclamation amend the said Fourth Schedule as follows, namely:—

Poisons Act 1915.

FOURTH SCHEDULE.

Part I.

1. In place of item "Ammonia—all liquid preparations or admixtures of ammonia containing one per centum or more by weight of ammonia (NH₃) in solution or in the form of ammonium hydroxide" substitute the following item:—

"Ammonia—all liquid preparations or admixtures of ammonia (excepting medicinal preparations for internal use) containing one per centum or more by weight of ammonia (NH₃) in solution or in the form of ammonium hydroxide."

Part II.

2. Add new item "19(a) Carbon bisulphide."
3. Add new item "19(b) Carbon tetrachloride."
4. Add new item "19(c) Copper sulphate."
5. Add new item "19(d) Potassium bichromate."
6. Add new item "19(e) Zinc—Sulphate of zinc and zinc sulphocarbonate."

The foregoing amendments of the Fourth Schedule of the *Poisons Act 1915* were recommended by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria by Resolution passed at its meeting held at Melbourne on the fourth day of August, 1929.

AMENDMENT OF CARPENTRY AND JOINERY REGULATIONS (No. 2).

At the Law Courts, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of August, 1929.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927* (No. 3546) the Governor in Council did, on the 26th day of March, 1929, make Regulations entitled *Carpentry and Joinery Regulations* (No. 2): And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulations: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 27 of the *Acts Interpretation Acts*, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

At the end of the first paragraph of Regulation 11, add the following:—

except in the case of joinery mills or joinery workshops where the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the said trades shall not exceed the proportion of two apprentices to every three journeymen or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer.

And the Honorable Frank Groves, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ELECTRICAL TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

At the Law Courts, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of August, 1929.

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927* (No. 3546) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to providing for any matters which are or may be the subject of draft Regulations submitted by the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria: And whereas the said Commission has prepared and submitted to His Excellency the Governor in Council draft Regulations for or with respect to the matters hereinafter set out: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

Short Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Electrical Trades Regulations (No. 1)."

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations—

"Act" means the *Apprenticeship Act 1927*.

"Commission" means the Apprenticeship Commission of Victoria.

"Secretary" means the Secretary to the Commission.

Application of Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall apply only with respect to the following apprenticeship trades, viz.:—

Electrical fitting and/or armature winding.
Electrical mechanics and/or electrical wiring.

Applicants for Apprenticeship to Apply for Certificate.

4. Applications by persons desirous to become apprentices in the said trades shall be in the form contained in the Third Schedule to General Regulations (No. 1) made under the said Act.

Applicants may be Examined.—Applicants may be Exempted if possessing certain Educational Qualifications.

5. Applicants for apprenticeship in the said trades may be required to submit themselves for examination at the time and place determined by the Commission to prove that they possess the preparatory educational qualifications required for entry into apprenticeship in such trades: Provided that any such applicant shall be exempted from such examination if he possesses any one of the following educational qualifications, or, in the opinion of the Commission, the equivalent thereof:—

(a) The Intermediate Technical or Junior Technical Certificates of the Education Department of Victoria, the School Intermediate Certificate, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(b) The satisfactory completion as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission of a two years' course of study in a Junior Technical School, or equivalent qualifications approved by the Commission.

(c) The satisfactory completion of the Eighth Grade course of study of the Elementary Schools of the Education Department of Victoria, or its equivalent, as certified by the school authority and approved by the Commission: Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall remain in operation until the 31st day of December, 1930, only, and no longer.

Minimum Age for Entry into Apprenticeship.

6. The minimum age at which persons shall enter the said trades as apprentices or applicants for apprenticeship on probation shall be fifteen years.

And the Honorable Frank Groves, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties, for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..," as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the authorized officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting or removing same must be provided with a licence or permit from the State Forests Department.

3. Orders will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly).

4. The contractor will be bound to place the firewood in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 6 feet for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted, but the contractor must have 48 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the account. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may desire.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

2. The swings or other appliances erected in the playgrounds shall not be used by the same child or children for a longer period than five minutes if any other child or children is or are waiting to use them.

3. No child shall use any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playgrounds except for the special purpose for which they are respectively provided.

4. Cricket or football shall not be played in the Children's Playgrounds.

5. All papers, fruit peel, or other litter shall be placed in the baskets provided by the Council for the purpose.

6. Every person in the Children's Playgrounds shall obey the instructions and directions of any officer of the Council, including the directions and instructions received from all persons appointed as honorary rangers to the Council, in respect to his or her conduct therein.

7. The Council shall not be responsible for any accident arising from the use of any of the swings or other appliances in the Children's Playgrounds.

8. No person shall ride or drive any bicycle or tricycle in any part of the Children's Playgrounds or bring any animal into the same.

9. The Children's Playgrounds shall not be used after sunset.

10. Any duly appointed officer, or honorary ranger, or servant of the Council shall have the right to remove or exclude from the Children's Playgrounds any person who commits a breach of this By-law, or who wilfully damages any appliances or property in the Children's Playgrounds, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BOILERMAKERS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 1st day of September, 1929, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which now has power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the trade of—

- (a) Boilermaking;
(b) Iron or steel working in connexion with—

- (1) Ship or bridge building,
(2) Girder, tank, wagon, or truck making,
(3) Wrought iron or steel pipe making,
(4) Structural iron or steel work.

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of September, 1929, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

PROPORTION.

Apprentices.

One apprentice to every three or fraction of three workers receiving not less than 9s. 8d. per week of 44 hours.

An indenture of apprenticeship prescribed by the Board was approved on 6th August, 1912.

Improvers.

One improver to the first four or fraction of four workers receiving not less than 11s. 8d. per week of 44 hours, and thereafter one improver to every additional four workers receiving not less than that wage.

Provided that if any juvenile worker is employed on repair work he shall be paid 1s. 4d. per day extra.

The above rates include an allowance in lieu of payment for holidays not worked and time lost on account of sickness.

Any person who is employed in any of the above capacities outside a workshop and is placed in charge of six or more adult workers shall be paid 1s. per day above the ordinary rate.

(3) ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances shall be paid in addition to the rates provided in Clause 2:—

Persons other than those on repair work employed on funnels, tanks, masts, buildings, gasometers, chimney stacks—

- (a) At a clear vertical height over 20 feet above the nearest horizontal plane 1d. per hour
(b) " " of 50 feet or over above the nearest horizontal plane 3d. per hour.

Electric or Oxy-acetylene welders or cutters employed on repair work outside the portion of the employer's premises where boilermaking, girder, tank, wagon or truck making, wrought iron or steel pipe making, or structural iron or steel work is carried on, 2s. per shift or part of a shift.

Employees engaged outside a workshop who are unable to journey to and from their work daily, 6s. per shift.

Provided that if the employer engages and pays suitable board and lodging for the employee he shall not be required to pay this allowance.

Travelling Time.—Persons employed on work away from the workshop shall receive—

- (a) The fares necessarily expended in going to and fro.
(b) Payment at rates fixed in Clause 2 for the day shift for time occupied in travelling during the usual working hours of the factory.
(c) On new work—Payment at rates fixed in Clause 2 for the day shift for time occupied in travelling before or after the usual working hours of the factory (over and above the time usually occupied in travelling between the factory and the employee's residence).
On repair work—Payment at the rates fixed in Clause 2 for the day shift for the time occupied in travelling before or after the usual working hours of the factory.

(4) **SHIFTS.**—(a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows:—

(5) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be the rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
