## ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 3884. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One Million three hundred and twenty-five thousand six hundred and forty pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty and One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this sixth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty, and in the twenty-first year of the reign of His Majesty King George V.

## GENERAL ORDER.

We the Honourable Frederick Wollaston Mann (a Judge of the Supreme Court of Victoria nominated by the Chief Justice thereof), and Morris Mondle Phillips, Master-in-Equity, and Edgar Henry Trebilco, Taxing Master (two persons nominated by the Governor in Council), being a majority of the persons authorized in that behalf under the provisions of the *Supreme Court Act 1928*, in exercise of the powers conferred upon us by the said Act do order and direct in manner following:—

1. This Order may be cited as the *Solicitors Remuneration Order 1930* No. 2, and shall come into force on the first day of December, 1930, but shall not affect the rights of a Solicitor or client in respect of matters pending on the said date.

2. After Part G. of the 3rd Schedule of the *Solicitors Remuneration Order 1929* there shall be inserted:—

### PART H.

FOR NEGOTIATING FOR OR PROCURING AN AGREEMENT FOR A LOAN WHEN THE MONEY IS IN FACT LENT AND THE SOLICITOR IS EITHER THE LENDER OR ONE OF THE LENDERS.

When the Solicitor is either the lender or one of the lenders, no remuneration shall be charged for negotiating or procuring the loan, except in the following cases:—

1. When the solicitor arranges and obtains the loan from a person for whom he acts and subsequently by arrangement with his client lends the money and executes or signs the security in his own name, he being in fact trustee or agent for the person aforesaid.
2. When the solicitor contributes portion of the money in fact lent, and arranges and obtains the remaining portion from another person not being his partner as a solicitor, nor being a co-trustee with him in relation to the money lent.

In either of the foregoing cases a charge for negotiating or procuring an agreement for a loan may be made at the rate prescribed in Part G. in respect of the amount so obtained from such other person.

No stable, coach-house, garage, green-house, fernery, aviary, or other outbuilding shall be erected so that any part of the same shall be within a distance of fifteen feet measured horizontally of the building line of any street or road which the allotment on which the same is proposed to be erected shall front.

2. No stable, coach-house, garage, green-house, fernery, aviary, or other outbuilding shall be erected so that any part of same shall be nearer to the building line of any street or road which the allotment on which the same is proposed to be erected shall front than the part of the main dwelling-house or shop which is on or is proposed to be built on such allotment which is nearest to the said street.

3. Provided always that in any particular case where, in the opinion of the Council, it is impracticable or undesirable to insist upon compliance with all the foregoing provisions of this By-law, the Council may permit the erection of any stable, coach-house, garage, green-house, fernery, aviary, or other outbuilding nearer to the street than would be permissible under the provisions hereinbefore contained; but any stable, coach-house, or garage erected in accordance with this proviso shall be built of brick, stone, or concrete, and any stable, coach-house, garage, green-house, fernery, aviary, or other outbuildings so erected shall be of a design first approved, in writing, by the Council or by its surveyor, who is hereby authorized on its behalf to give such approval.

4. No person shall build or erect any stable, coach-house, garage, green-house, fernery, aviary, or other outbuilding save in accordance with the provisions of this By-law.

5. The provisions of this By-law are in addition to and not in lieu of those of any other By-law applicable to buildings of the nature hereinbefore specified.

6. Clause one of this By-law shall operate throughout such parts of the municipal district as have in accordance with By-laws 76, 83, and 84 of the City of Sandringham been prescribed as residential areas. All other provisions of this By-law shall operate throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Sandringham.

7. Any person who shall be guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

(3) For the transfer of a licence—Ten shillings (10s.);

(e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and

(f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

By-LAW No. 56.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* and section 6 of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* and numbered 56, for or with respect to—

- (a) the placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways, for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
- (b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences, and applications therefor;
- (c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
- (d) prescribing fees—
  - (1) for the granting or renewal of a licence;
  - (2) for the transfer of a licence;
- (e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
- (f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. In this By-law—

“Council” shall mean the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin.

“Licence” shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

“Municipality” shall mean the municipality of the Shire of Moorabbin.

“Petrol pump” shall mean any pump for supplying motor spirit, and shall include a portable petrol pump.

“Portable petrol pump” shall mean a petrol pump which is constructed on wheels and is not fixed in or on the footway and is not allowed to remain on the footway.

“Regulations” shall mean the Regulations from time to time made and in force under the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*.

2. Any person may apply for a licence in respect of any petrol pump placed in, on, or under any footway in any highway within the municipal district of Moorabbin used or to be used by such person for the purpose of the business carried on or to be carried on by such person of selling or supplying motor spirit. Every such application shall be in the form of the First Schedule to this By-law. Every licence granted shall be in the form of the Second Schedule to this By-law.

3. It shall be the duty of every person to whom a licence has been granted under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928* to maintain in a safe and efficient condition, and free from leakage and in accordance with this By-law, all petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps.

4. Every licence shall expire on the 30th day of September next following the date of issue, and shall after such 30th day of September be of no force and effect:—

(a) There shall be paid to the Council in respect of every licence for a petrol pump other than a portable petrol pump in or on any footway a licence-fee of Three pounds three shillings per annum.

(b) No fee shall be payable to the Council in respect of any licence for a portable petrol pump.

(c) Provided that where a licence is granted for any number of months less than twelve months a proportionate reduction of the fee based on the number of months unexpired shall be made by the Council.

5. No licence or renewal of a licence or transfer of a licence shall be granted unless the fee prescribed in such case has first been paid.

6. Where a licence granted under the provisions of this By-law is about to expire the Council may, upon application being made to it in the form of the Third Schedule to this By-law, renew such licence for a further term of one year.

7. Every application for the renewal of a licence shall be lodged with the Council at least fourteen days before the expiration of the licence, and shall be accompanied by the annual licence-fee hereinbefore prescribed.

8. The Council may refuse to grant or renew or transfer any licence where the pump in respect of which an application for a licence or transfer or renewal of a licence is made is not placed or proposed to be placed in front of premises occupied or to be occupied by the applicant for the purpose of carrying on the business of selling or supplying motor spirit.

9. No licence shall be transferred save in accordance with the following provisions:—The person desiring to transfer the licence shall first make application in writing to the Council for the approval of the Council to such transfer, and shall enclose with such application a transfer of the licence, in

writing, signed by the licensee, and an acceptance of such transfer (conditional upon the approval of the Council being granted thereto) by the transferee, and shall pay to the Council a transfer-fee of Ten shillings.

10. Immediately on the approval by the Council of any transfer of licence being given, the policy of insurance hereinafter referred to be taken out by the transferor shall be transferred to the transferee, or the transferee shall effect a new policy in a company of repute to the same effect.

11. Every licensee under the provisions of this By-law shall, before the petrol pump is erected in respect of which such licence is granted, or if erected prior to the application, before the petrol pump is used for the sale or supply of motor spirit, insure himself, and thereafter at all times keep himself insured during the currency of such licence and any renewal thereof, in some insurance company of good repute against all damages and liabilities for which he may become liable to any person arising from the use, control, or possession by him of such petrol pump in the sum of at least Five hundred pounds. Every licensee shall, on demand, produce to the Council, or any duly appointed officer of the Council, the said policy of insurance and the receipt for the premium for the then unexpired period of the licence.

12. A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump, or any part thereof, or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal.

13. Every licensee whose licence shall have expired and has not been renewed, or whose licence shall have been cancelled under the provisions of the *Petrol Pumps Act 1928*, shall within seven days after such expiry or cancellation remove the petrol pump referred to in such licence, and all apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith in, on, or under the footway.

14. No licensee shall cause or permit the petrol pump in respect of which his licence is granted, or the apparatus, pipes, and appliances connected therewith, to be altered in design or position without first obtaining the consent of the Council.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Moorabbin.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin, made under the *Local Government Act 1928*, for appointing a standing place in Bentleigh for motor cars.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

(a) "Motor car" means a motor car as defined in paragraph (e), sub-section (7), section 197, of the *Local Government Act 1928*.

(b) "Driver" means any person in charge of a motor car.

That portion of Nicholson-street at Bentleigh within the Shire of Moorabbin as, commencing at a point on the eastern side of Nicholson-street thirty feet from the northern boundary of Centre-road, is bounded as follows:—On the east by the eastern side of Nicholson-street in a line bearing north for a distance of three hundred feet, on the north by a line bearing in a westerly direction ten feet, on the west by a line bearing in a southerly direction three hundred feet, on the south by a line bearing in a westerly direction ten feet to the commencing point, is hereby appointed a standing place for motor cars.

2. A driver of a motor using the above-appointed standing place shall place such car therein as close to the kerb as possible in such a manner that the car will face in a southerly direction, and shall not be more than three feet from the kerb nearest to it or in such other manner as a member of the Police Force or an officer of the Council for the time being in charge of such standing place may direct.

3. The standing place may be used by drivers of motor cars at any hour of the day or night.

4. Any person committing a breach of the provisions of this By-law or disobeying the proper directions of a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council for the time being in charge of the standing place shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5.

(6) SPECIAL RATES.—That time and a half shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day, and King's Birthday ; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

(7) WEEKLY DAY OFF.—Every stoker shall be allowed, by rotation or otherwise, one clear day off in each week. A week shall be deemed to commence from the starting of the morning shift on Monday in each week.

(8) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—Payment of wages due up to 6 a.m. on the preceding Monday shall be made on Thursday of each week, or in accordance with the practice existing at the time of the making of this Determination, provided that such wages shall be paid not later than Friday of each week.

(9) ANNUAL LEAVE.—Every employee who serves an employer continuously for one year shall be allowed by the employer leave of absence in that year or in the following year for a continuous period of one week of seven days.

(10) ABSENCE THROUGH SICKNESS OR ACCIDENT.—(a) Any employee not attending for duty will lose his pay for the time of such non-attendance, unless he produces or forwards within twenty-four (24) hours of the commencement of such absence, a medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the management that his non-attendance was due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill-health, necessitating such absence.

(b) In the case of personal accident or personal illness necessitating such absence referred to in (a), the pay for the week in which such accident or illness occurs shall be calculated on his pay at ordinary rates for the six working days up to and including the day such accident or illness occurs. Provided, however, that if such accident or illness necessitates absence beyond the week in which same occurs, the employer will for such period of absence not exceeding in all ten days, pay the employee in the manner hereinbefore provided. The maximum amount of pay for days not worked owing to such accident or illness necessitating absence as aforesaid shall be a total of ten days' full pay in any year. For the purpose of this clause, a year shall be calculated as follows :—

(4) SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.—Double time shall be paid for all work done on Sundays, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day (28th January), Eight Hours Day (21st April), Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named public holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

(5) DAY AND HOUR FOR PAYMENT OF WAGES.—All payments of wages shall be made within a quarter of an hour from the time of the worker ending work on each pay day.

(6) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Four hours' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(7) PIECE-WORK.—The Board determines under the provisions of Section 150 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* that any employer may fix and pay piece-work prices to any person employed at any work in the process, trade, or business of an ironmoulder, provided that any such employer shall base such piece-work prices on the earnings of an average worker working under like conditions, and such piece-work prices shall be fixed so that an average worker can earn not less than the wages that are fixed by the Board for such work.
