NOTICE OF INTENTION TO VARY THE CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE USE OF LONG LINES IN PORT PHILLIP BAY.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamations made the 22nd day of October, 1924, and the 29th day of November, 1927, and published in the Government Gazettes of the 29th October, 1924, and 30th November, 1927, respectively, regarding the use of long lines in Port Phillip Bay, and in lieu thereof prohibiting the use of long lines and the method of fishing known as "long lining" in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Corio and Hobson's Bay) from the 11th day of December in each year to the 31st day of March next following, and providing further that from the 1st day of October to the 10th day of December next following in each year the use of long lines shall be prohibited in the waters of Port Phillip Bay (including Hobson's Bay) northward of an imaginary line running from Mordialloc Pier to Point Cook.

operate.

(c) Sections and terminals points of and stopping places on such routes.

Stands for such motor omnibuses.

Time-tables to be observed by owners of such motor omnibuses operating on prescribed routes or sections

(f) The fares (including maximum and minimum fares for prescribed routes or sections thereof) to be charged for passengers carried by such motor omnibuses.

(g) The maximum number of such motor omnibuses which

(g) The maximum number of such motor omnibuses which may be licensed to operate on any prescribed route.
(h) Reasonable fees for licences granted by the Licensing Authority under this Division, not exceeding—

In the case where the motor omnibus is fitted with no tires other than pneumatic tires—A fee calculated at the rate of One pound for each passenger the motor omnibus is licensed to carry.
(i) Reasonable fees for permits granted by the Licensing Authority under this Division.
(j) Applications for licences or permits under the said Division 2 and the refusal, transfer, suspension, or revocation of such licences or permits.
(k) The form and terms and conditions of and any particulars to be set out in licences or permits under Division 2 of Part II. of the Motor Omnibus Act.

### Petrol Pumps Act 1928. SHIRE OF BASS

BY-LAW No. 22.

A By-law of the Shire of Bass made under Part VII. of the Local Government Act 1928 and section 6 of the Petrol Pumps Act 1928, and numbered 22, for or with respect to—

(a) The placing, fixing, and maintaining of petrol pumps in or on footways and of any apparatus, pipes, and appliances in, on, or under footways for the supply of motor spirit to such petrol pumps, and the removal of such petrol pumps, apparatus, pipes, and appliances;
(b) the granting, renewal, and transfer of licences and applications therefor;
(c) licences and conditions to be contained in licences;
(d) prescribing fees—

for the granting or renewal of a licence;
 for the transfer of a licence;

(e) providing for a proportionate reduction of fees payable in respect of licences granted for any number of months less than twelve months; and
(f) insurance by licensees against liabilities which may be incurred by them in respect of petrol pumps.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1928 and the Petrol Pumps Act 1928, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bass order as follows:-

In this By-law—
 "Council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Bass.
 "Licence" shall mean a licence granted in accordance with the Petrol Pumps Act 1928.

A licensee shall make good any damage to conduits, drains, or pipes under any footway caused by or arising from the installation or removal of a petrol pump or any apparathereof or any apparatus, pipes, or appliances for the supply of motor spirit to such pump, and shall make good any portion of the footway broken up for the purpose of such installation or removal. 13.
