CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED WITHIN THE SHIRE OF CORIO.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.,

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928 (No. 3799). I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act, within the Shire of Corio, viz.:—

Asphodelus fistulosus, L., "Onion Weed."

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ALTER THE CLOSE SEASON FOR NETTING AT SYDENHAM AND TAMBOON INLETS.

I T is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the Victoria Government Gazette, to move II is Excellency the Governo in Council to revoke so much of the Proclamations made the 24th August, 1914, and 1st October, 1918, and published in the Victoria Government Gazettes of the 2nd September, 1914, and 9th October, 1918, pages 3910 and 3036, respectively, as relates to Sydenham and Tamboon Inlets, and in lieu thereof to make a Proclamation to the following effect, viz.:—

- (1) Prohibiting the use of trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in Sydenham Inlet and Tamboon Inlet, within in each case an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlets enter the ocean, from the first day of December in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year.
- (2) Restricting the use of nets to be used in fishing in the above-mentioned inlets as follows:—

(a) No person shall use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.

(b) No person shall use at the same time a total length of more than 700 fathoms of "mesh" or "set" net (or nets); provided that, in the case of 'mesh" or "set" nets, every mesh of which measures 44 inches or over, the total length of net (or nets) permissible under this condition shall be 1,200 fathoms. Provided further that in case of two or more persons working together in a boat each shall be allowed to use his complement of "mesh" or "set" net as prescribed herein.

(c) No person shall use at the same time a "seine" or "hauling" net and a "mesh" or "set" net.

THE Council of the Shire of Werribee, the duly appointed Committee of Management of such portions of the Reserve for Public purposes in the Parish of Truganina, as are indicated by red colour on plan marked T.11.5.1928, attached to Lands Department, Correspondence C.70845, and of the strip of land in the Parish of Truganina, at Altona, lying between high-water mark and low-water mark in Port Phillip Bay, as indicated by red colour on plan marked A.18.10.29, with the Correspondence aforesaid, which areas are known as "Altona Foreshore Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the Land Act 1928:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person offending against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct shall remain on the "Foreshore Reserve."
- 2. No person shall demage in any way the trees, marram grass, or any other vegetation on the "Foreshore Reserve." nor light any fires, nor burn any materials thereon.
- 3. No person shall climb or jump over any of the fences on, in or around the "Foreshore Reserve," stick bills thereon, or cut names on or otherwise disfigure, injure, or destroy the said fences, trees, seats, or other improvements therein.
- 4. No person shall put in or on the "Foreshore Reserve" any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals or vehicles without the permission of the Committee of Management.

- 7. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the "Foreshore Reserve," shall enter any plot therein which may be enclosed for plantation of trees, shrubs, or grass.
- 8. No person shall moor and/or use any boat on the "Foreshore Reserve," without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, but no person shall drive any stake on the "Foreshore Reserve" between high and low water marks for the purpose of mooring boats, &c., or for any other purpose, and all boat, &c., moorings whether covered with water or not shall be of such a nature as not to be liable to cause injury to any person. Anchors or grapplings shall not be used as moorings, and all moorings shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management.
- 9. No person shall erect any bathing-box or any boat-house on the "Foreshore Reserve" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed advisable by the Committee of Management.
- 10. No person shall erect or place any bathing-box or boathouse on the "Foreshore Reserve" except such is erected, built, or constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications in respect of which permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management was obtained.
- 11. Every person bathing from the "Foreshore Reserve" shall be decently attired from neck to knee in a two-picce Canadian costume, or a one-piece skirted costume, or a one-piece costume with "V." The definition of "neck to knee" to read "from two inches below pit of neck to four inches above knee."
- 12. No persons shall throw or cause to be thrown any stones or any hard substance on the "Foreshore Reserve," and no person shall play cricket, hockey, rounders, golf (or any other similar game), with a hard or solid ball, nor play football on the "Foreshore Reserve."

- 13. No person shall drive or ride any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle on the "Foreshore Reserve."
