PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

THE BALLARAT SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

RATING BY-LAW No. 10.

THE Ballarat Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law:—

The following rates are hereby made under the provisions of the Sewerage Districts Acts, and shall be levied upon the net annual value of all rateable properties within the Ballarat Sewerage District:—

1. Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a special rate of Threepence in the pound on the net annual value of all rateable properties within the said District which are not sewered properties.
2. Of any land or tenement situate within the Ballarat Sewerage District, a sewerage rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound of the net annual value of all rateable "sewered property" within the said District.
3. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of January, 1931, and ending with the thirty-first day of December, 1931, and shall be payable on the thirty-first day of March, 1931, at the office of the Authority, situate at the Water and Sewerage Offices, Ballarat.
4. If any rateable property which is unsewered at the time of the making of the aforesaid special rate becomes during the year 1931 a "sewered property," there shall be levied upon such property a proportionate part of the special rate for unsewered properties for the portion of the year it remained an unsewered property and also a proportionate part of the sewerage rate for the portion of the year after it has become a sewered property, and such property shall be deemed to have been lawfully rated accordingly.
5. For making and levying such rates the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any of such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.
6. Such person or persons as the Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by the Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the first day of December, 1930, and was confirmed by the said authority on the fifteenth day of December, 1930.

TRARALGON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1931.

A BY-LAW for making a rate for the year 1931 on the rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Traralgon Waterworks Trust, which district has, for the purpose of the *Water Act 1928*, been proclaimed an Urban District; also for dealing with the charges for the sale of water by measure from the works of the Trust.

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid on the annual value of all rateable property in the Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate for the Shire of Traralgon, but no such rate for tenements shall be less than One pound five shillings (£1 5s.).

For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land the municipal value of which does not exceed Five pounds per annum, the sum of Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.). When such value is over Five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound.

When water is supplied by measure to persons within the area of the Trust for domestic or other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of such property if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

When water is supplied solely for other than domestic purposes, the charge shall be to persons within the area of the Trust One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and to persons outside the area, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be supplied during the year ending the 31st December shall be 10,000 gallons. The charge hereby made shall be payable on demand by the Trust.

The Trust may, by notice in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within a month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the specified time, at his own expense, provide a meter.

When water is supplied for use on any land exceeding 5 acres in area, such water will be supplied by measure only, and the owner or occupier of such land must provide a meter.

In all cases not herein provided for the Trust shall make such special provision as may be deemed necessary.

The service pipes from the mains, being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes, the owner or occupier shall, in every instance in which damage caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be guilty of an offence.

If any person neglect to repair such service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into premises of such person, after having received notice from the proper officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water flowing into the premises either by cutting off the service pipes or otherwise as the Trust may see fit until the necessary repairs have been effected.

The Trust may at any time when found necessary repair or renew any pipes and stopcocks laid for conveying a supply of water to any tenements, and may charge the owner thereof with the cost of providing and laying, repairing, or renewing the same, and such cost shall be a debt due by such owner to the Trust, and shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

The foregoing rates are made payable on the first day of March, 1931.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

Stopping Places on Routes.

APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

AMENDMENT OF PLUMBING AND GASFITTING REGULATIONS
(No. 3).

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the *Apprenticeship Act 1927* (No. 3546), the Governor in Council did, on the 12th day of February, 1929, make Regulations entitled *Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations* (No. 3): And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Regulations: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (3) of section 29 of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, and of any other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said regulations as follows, that is to say:—

In Regulation 7 before the words "The number of apprentices" insert the sign and words "(a) Subject to paragraph (b) hereof"; and after paragraph (a) add the following paragraph:—

- (b) In cases, however, where less than two journeymen are employed, an employer may, upon the Commission being satisfied that a proper vacancy for an apprentice exists and with the approval of the said Commission, employ one apprentice.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).REGULATIONS REGARDING THE MANUFACTURE,
REPAIR, MANIPULATION, STORAGE, OR USE, IN
FACTORIES, OF INFLAMMABLE MOTION PICTURE
FILM, CELLULOID, OR OTHER NITRO-CELLULOSE
PRODUCTS.

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and revoke Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, if the Minister has certified that any manufacture, plant, process, or labour used in factories is dangerous to life or limb generally, may make such Regulations as may be deemed necessary and reasonably practicable to decrease or prevent danger from such manufacture, plant, process or labour: And whereas the Honorable John Lemmon, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, has certified that the manufacture, plant, process or labour connected with the manufacture, repair, manipulation, storage, or use in factories of inflammable motion picture film, celluloid, or other nitro-cellulose product is dangerous to life or limb generally: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers hereinbefore recited, as well as under all other powers by the said Act him enabling in that behalf, doth make the following Regulations regarding such dangerous manufacture, plant, process, or labour, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS REGARDING THE MANUFACTURE, REPAIR, MANIPULATION, STORAGE, OR USE, IN FACTORIES, OF INFLAMMABLE MOTION PICTURE FILM, CELLULOID OR OTHER NITRO-CELLULOSE PRODUCTS.

The occupiers of all factories in which or in connexion with which there is manufactured, repaired, manipulated, stored, or used inflammable motion picture film, celluloid, or other nitro-cellulose products shall take such steps as are necessary to comply with the following requirements:—

- (1) For the purpose of these Regulations "Nitro-Cellulose Product" shall mean:—
- (a) Inflammable motion picture film containing nitro-cellulose as a main constituent, and includes scrap film or stripped film derived or obtained from nitro-cellulose film;
- (b) Photographic or X-ray film which contains nitro-cellulose as a main constituent;
- (c) Celluloid or other solid substance, material, or compound, having nitro-cellulose as a base, and intended to be used for further manufacture.

Storage.

- (2) Each reel of inflammable motion picture film shall be kept in a separate non-combustible receptacle with a tight-fitting cover. Scrap film shall be kept in closed, substantial metal, or metal-lined containers.
- (3) Except as hereinafter provided all nitro-cellulose product shall be stored in cabinets or fire-proof rooms used exclusively for the purpose, and constructed and installed in accordance with the rules of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria so far as the same are applicable.
- (4) Cabinets shall not exceed 30 cubic feet capacity, and shall be substantially constructed entirely of non-combustible material. All internal fittings of cabinets shall be of metal or other fire-proof material, and the doors shall be made smoke-proof and self-closing.
- (5) The doors or shutters of every fire-proof room shall be kept closed, except when nitro-cellulose product is being placed in or removed from the fire-proof room.
- (6) Every cabinet or fire-proof room shall be so placed that a fire, if occurring therein, would not endanger any workroom, ventilation shaft, stairway, passage, or exit from the factory, or the contents of any other cabinet or fire-proof room.
- (7) At the entrance to every fire-proof room there shall be displayed a notice in the following form and composed of red letters not less than 2 inches in height:—

Danger, Celluloid Store.

- (8) No smoking materials, matches, or anything likely to ignite or decompose nitro-cellulose product shall be in any cabinet or fire-proof room. Smoking shall be prohibited within or in close proximity to any cabinet or fire-proof room. "No smoking" signs shall be posted in prominent positions.

No artificial light shall be used inside the fire-proof room, except a permanently installed incandescent electric light safely enclosed in an outer casing of glass or other suitable material.

A pilot light shall be provided on the outside of the fire-proof room to indicate whether the inside lights are on or off.

- (9) On any premises not more than 1,000 lb. of nitro-cellulose product shall be kept in cabinets, nor shall there be more than 500 lb. in any one cabinet, or more than 10,000 lb. in any fire-proof room.
- (10) Fire-proof rooms in which the quantity of nitro-cellulose product stored exceeds 1,000 lb. weight shall be situated:—
- (a) in a single-story building which is used solely for the storage, manufacture, repair, manipulation, or use of nitro-cellulose product, or on the top floor, or on the roof of a building when such top floor or roof is used solely for a similar purpose: Provided that the fire-proof room may be situated in any single-story building, or on the top floor, or on the roof of any building in such circumstances as the Administrators may approve and under such conditions as they may impose;
- (b) in a building (not exceeding two stories in height) which is occupied entirely for the purpose of repair, storage, or distribution of motion picture films.

- (11) Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in these Regulations the provisions thereof relating to the storage of nitro-cellulose product shall not apply to collodion cotton which is wet with water or alcohol, but such collodion cotton shall be packed in tins or cases which will prevent the escape of the contents in the form of vapour or otherwise, and shall be stored in isolated buildings appropriated exclusively for the purpose.

- (12) Notwithstanding the provisions of these Regulations unexposed photographic and X-Ray films packed in original packages or cartons, the total volume of which does not exceed 500 cubic feet, may be stored in any storeroom separated from other parts of the building by fire-resisting partitions and doors, and provided with a suitable system of automatic sprinklers.

- (13) The provisions of these Regulations shall not apply to any factory where all due precautions are taken for the prevention of accident by fire, and in which the quantity of nitro-cellulose product in the factory does not exceed that set out hereunder:—

Inflammable motion picture film—25 lb. weight.

Photographic or X-Ray film—packed in original packages or cartons—50 cubic feet volume (including packages and cartons).

Celluloid, or any other substance, material, or compound having nitro-cellulose as a base, and intended to be used for further manufacture—25 lb. weight.

- (14) The occupier of every factory, subject to these Regulations, shall, when required by an Inspector of Factories, cause to be weighed in the presence of the inspector the nitro-cellulose product contained in any store, cabinet, receptacle, or room.

Manufacture, Repair, Manipulation, and Use.

- (15) The manufacture, repair, manipulation, or use of nitro-cellulose product shall not be carried on in a factory until plans of the premises, particulars as to the number of persons to be employed, and as to the arrangements to be made for complying with the requirements of these Regulations have been submitted to and approved by the Administrators.
- (16) All factories as aforesaid shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by Regulation 17 hereof, and approved as provided therein. No material addition shall be made subsequently to such premises, no greater number of persons employed therein, or any alterations made in the working arrangements unless such addition or alteration has been first approved by the Administrators.
- (17) Nitro-cellulose product shall not be manufactured, repaired, manipulated, or used in any room of a factory unless:—

(a) the room is constructed of fire-resisting material: Provided that any room (whether of fire-resisting construction or not) in a single-storey building, or on the top floor of a building may be used in such circumstances as the Administrators may approve and under such conditions as they may impose;

(b) all the doors of the room are constructed of fire-resisting material and are self-closing;

(c) the fittings are, as far as practicable, constructed of fire-resisting material;

(d) the furniture and apparatus are so arranged as to afford unimpeded egress for every person in the room in the event of fire;

(e) all electrical devices, including wiring and switches, shall comply with the State Electricity Commission's Wiring Regulations. Resistances, including exposed heating elements of electric heaters and radiators, shall be so guarded or enclosed as to prevent ignition or decomposition of nitro-cellulose product. Such apparatus shall be so constructed that no external part of the enclosure or guard shall at any time exceed a temperature of 212° F. The top of the enclosure or guard shall be inclined at an angle of not less than 45° with the horizontal;

(f) protected by sprinklers in accordance with the Fire Underwriters' Association's Rules for automatic sprinkler installations: Provided, however, that there shall be at least one sprinkler to each 64 square feet of floor area.

- (18) Adequate means of escape in case of fire shall be provided for every factory and for every room in which nitro-cellulose product is manufactured, repaired, manipulated, or used, and the means of escape shall not be deemed adequate unless:—

(a) at least two safe exists are provided from every such room, and two safe ways of escape from the building are available for all persons employed in the factory;

(b) all doors provided in connexion with the means of escape are so arranged as to open outwards readily.

- (19) The word "Exit" shall be plainly displayed above every escape door in every room in which nitro-cellulose product is manufactured, repaired, manipulated or used. In dark rooms this notice shall be suitably illuminated.

- (20) All hatchways, lifts, or similar openings between any rooms, or between any rooms and other parts of the premises, shall be so constructed, fitted, and arranged that fire or products of combustion or decomposition of nitro-cellulose product will not be likely to pass.

- (21) No open fire or light, or gas or oil stove, or any smoking materials or matches, or anything likely to ignite or decompose nitro-cellulose product, shall be allowed in any room in which nitro-cellulose product is manufactured, repaired, manipulated, or used, and smoking shall not be allowed therein. "No smoking" signs shall be posted in prominent positions.

- (22) In no case shall any door of a fire-proof room open directly into any workroom, unless the fame is suitably screened.

- (23) Nitro-cellulose product in a quantity in excess of that required for the immediate supply and work of any room shall not be brought into or allowed to remain in such room.

- (24) Waste nitro-cellulose product shall not be allowed to accumulate in the workroom, but shall be collected frequently during the day and placed in water in a strong metal receptacle fitted with a self-closing lid, and marked with the words "Celluloid Waste."

- (25) Soldering or sealing of any case or container holding nitro-cellulose product shall be carried out in a special place, as open as possible, and distinct from any room containing other nitro-cellulose product. Efficient steps shall be taken to prevent the solder coming into contact with the nitro-cellulose product.

- (26) If nitro-cellulose product is cut by means of a saw a jet of water shall play continuously on the point of contact.

- (27) If the Chief Inspector of Factories is satisfied that, by reason of the small quantity of nitro-cellulose product stored or in use in any premises at any one time, or for any other sufficient reason, all or any of the provisions of these Regulations are unnecessary for the protection of the persons employed on such premises he may, in writing, exempt such premises from all or any of such provisions, subject to such conditions as he may impose. The Chief Inspector may, at any time, revoke any such exemption.

CONSTITUTION OF COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS TO DECIDE AN APPEAL AGAINST DETERMINATION OF THE WATCHMEN'S BOARD.

WHEREAS the Wages Board (herein referred to as the Watchmen's Board), appointed under the Factories and Shops Acts to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed in the occupation of a watchman, did, by a certain Determination made on the fourth day of October, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the fourteenth day of October, 1930, following, determine the lowest prices or rates to be so paid: And whereas the representatives of the employers on the said Board have, in the prescribed manner, appealed against the said Determination to the Court of Industrial Appeals under the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677): Now therefore it is hereby ordered by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf vested in him by the said Act, that a Court of Industrial Appeals, consisting of the President, His Honour Mr. Justice Lowe, and Charles Herbert Grant, of H. V. McKay, Massey-Harris Pty. Ltd., Sunshine, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, duly nominated by the representatives of the employers on the Watchmen's Board, to represent the employers, and Harold Thomas, of 10 Station-street, Moreland, a person who has been bona fide and actually engaged in the trade concerned for at least six months during the three years immediately preceding nomination, duly nominated by the representatives of the employees on the said Board, to represent the employees, be and the same is hereby constituted to consider and deal with the appeal aforesaid against the Determination of the Watchmen's Board, and to revise or alter the said Court's own Determination from time to time in form and manner as provided by law.

MEMBER OF A WAGES BOARD REMOVED.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1928*, *inter alia*, the Governor in Council is empowered to make Orders and Regulations for the purposes therein mentioned and whereas certain Regulations were made under the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Act on the nineteenth day of June, 1928: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the said Regulations be amended as follows (that is to say):—

Clause 3. Interpretation of Terms.—"Vaccine" shall include any material which contains any micro-organism of the products thereof which are the cause or are suspected of being the cause of any of the diseases included in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

Clause 18. Schedule A.S.—After the words "State of Queensland" wherever they occur add "or Northern Territory or Central Australia", and after the words "Cattle Tick Infestation or Tick Fever" add "or Buffalo Fly".

Clause 20.—After the word "Queensland" wherever it occurs add the words "or Northern Territory or Central Australia".

Clause 21.—After the words "from Queensland" wherever they occur add the words "or Northern Territory or Central Australia", and after the words "Texas Fever" add "or Buffalo Fly", and in lieu of the words "at the Queensland border" substitute the words "at the crossing concerned".

Clause 22.—After the words "from Queensland" add "or Northern Territory or Central Australia", and after the words "Texas Fever" add "or Buffalo Fly", and in lieu of the words "on the Queensland border" substitute the words "at the crossing concerned".

Clause 35.—In lieu of the words appearing therein there shall be substituted the following:—"No person shall supply to any other person or shall use on any stock any vaccine without the written consent of the Chief Inspector of Stock. Such written consent may provide such conditions to be observed in the use of such vaccine as may be deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector of Stock."

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Board* 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the Council of any municipal district or any country district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and form part of such fire district: And whereas the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby declare that, pursuant to the provisions of section 5 (1) of the aforesaid Act, the portions of the Shires of Eltham and Heidelberg comprised within the following boundaries shall, from the 1st day of January, 1931, be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF PAYWIT, KNOWN AS "ST. LEONARD'S FORESHORE RESERVE."

WHEREAS by the 181st section of the *Land Act 1928*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Rules and Regulations for the care, protection, and management of all Public Parks and Reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portion of the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay, in the Parish of Paywit, at St. Leonard's, as is indicated by red colour on plan marked P/28.11.29 attached to Lands Department Correspondence C.78520, and known as "St. Leonard's Foreshore Reserve," hereinafter referred to as the "Foreshore Reserve":—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person offending against decency in dress, conduct, and/or language shall remain on the "Foreshore Reserve."
2. All persons bathing from the "Foreshore Reserve" shall be decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
3. No person shall permit any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals to enter in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management, and any cattle, goats, pigs, horses, or other animals straying therein shall be liable to be impounded.
4. No person shall destroy, disfigure, break down, carry away, or otherwise injure or damage any buildings, fences, seats, or other erections, trees, shrubs, plants, or other vegetation in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve," nor post bills upon, or write, paint, or carve any words or other device upon such buildings, fences, trees, shrubs, seats, or other erections.
5. No person shall erect any bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or other structure upon the "Foreshore Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained, in writing, and no such permission will be given to any person until such person has submitted and the Committee of Management has approved of, the plans and specifications of such bathing-box, boat-house, shed, or other structure.
6. All buildings on the "Foreshore Reserve" must conform to plans and regulations as to position and design approved by the Committee of Management.
7. No person after having obtained the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management shall use or cause or permit to be used any bathing-box, boat-house, or other erection for residential purposes.
8. No person shall camp or erect any tent for residential purposes in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve" except in such places as shall from time to time be set apart for such purposes, and then only on obtaining a permit to do so upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management shall determine.
9. No person shall bring or place any motor car, dōcle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve" except in or upon such portions thereof as shall from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management as parking areas.
10. All persons using such parking areas for the accommodation of any motor car, motor cycle, cycle, buggy, gig, cart, or other vehicle shall pay such fees as shall be from time to time fixed by the Committee of Management, but the maximum fee therefor shall not exceed the sum of One shilling (1s.) per day.
11. No fires shall be lighted or material burned upon the "Foreshore Reserve" unless by express permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
12. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure on the "Foreshore Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management first obtained in writing.
13. No assemblies or meetings for fêtes, galas, or concerts, or for the purpose of public worship or preaching, or public speaking, or meetings of a like character shall take place upon the "Foreshore Reserve" without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
14. No person shall play or perform in any band of music, or take part in any entertainment of any kind in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve" for the purpose of gain without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
15. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stones or hard substance on the "Foreshore Reserve."
16. No person shall play cricket, football, hockey, rounders, baseball, golf, or any similar game with a hard or solid ball on the "Foreshore Reserve" without the permission of the Committee of Management.
17. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, airgun, or any firearms in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve," except by permission of the Committee of Management.

18. No person shall engage or take part in any motor car or motor cycle racing upon the "Foreshore Reserve," and it shall be an offence for any person to ride or use any motor cycle, car, or other vehicle on the "Foreshore Reserve" in any way or manner that may endanger the safety of or cause bodily harm to any person.

19. No person shall moor and/or use any boat in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve" without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

20. No person shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, any paper, bottles, fruit skins, food, or other litter or refuse in or upon the "Foreshore Reserve," except in receptacles provided upon the "Foreshore Reserve" for that purpose by the Committee of Management.

21. No person, except a workman or labourer duly authorized by the Committee of Management, shall enter upon any enclosure or plot upon the "Foreshore Reserve" set apart or enclosed for the plantation of trees, shrubs, grass, flowers, or other vegetation.

22. No person shall break any glass of any kind upon the "Foreshore Reserve," or leave thereon any substance likely to cause injury to another.

23. All fees payable and received for camping, agistment, parking of vehicles, use of bathing boxes, sites for sheds, tents, booths, bathing-boxes, or other structure, or for any other purpose or purposes, shall be expended in the maintenance, upkeep, and improvement of the "Foreshore Reserve" and an account thereof furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

24. Camping Fees.—For tent accommodating one to five persons, 5s. per week or portion thereof, with addition of 1s. per week for each person in excess of five.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he or she has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND WATER SUPPLY IN THE PARISH OF GUNDOWRING, AND KNOWN AS "UPPER SANDY CREEK RECREATION RESERVE AND WATER SUPPLY RESERVOIR."

WE. George Henry Moore, Robert Seaton, Daniel Bernard O'Neill, John Lyecester Tanson, Ernest Arthur Nisbet, William Griffiths, Charles Martin O'Neill, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved as a site for Public Recreation and Water Supply in the Parish of Gundowring, and known as "Upper Sandy Creek Recreation Reserve and Water Supply Reservoir," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 20 (twenty) in any one year) as the Reserve, or any part thereof, may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or other amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall cut down or remove from the Reserve any live or dead timber.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

6. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, amusements, or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs the use of the grounds so set apart upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

7. Persons renting or hiring the Reserve or any portion thereof for any use whatsoever, and who make any charge to the public for admission to the ground, shall pay to the Committee of Management a fee for the use thereof, such fee to be fixed by the Committee of Management, but shall not exceed the sum of £5 5s. per day.

8. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

9. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

11. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

14. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and any person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve on the order of the Committee of Management.

15. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

16. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or other amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

17. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
