Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE CEMETERY EMPLOYEES BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 8th June, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), and the Order in Council thereunder, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or cates which may be paid to any person employed in or about a cometery as a grave digger, grave decorator, gatekeeper, labourer, or gardener" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 8th June, 1931, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (3) Any employee who is required to handle explosives shall be paid is. per day extra for each day or part of a day on which he handles such explosives.
 - (4) RE-INTERMENTS. -- Persons employed on re-interments shall be paid for each such re-interment:-
 - (a) Where the employee works singly, 7s. 6d. in addition to the ordinary rates. (b) In all other cases, 5s. in addition to the ordinary rates.

(6) OVERTIME.—All work done outside the hours specified as the times of beginning and ending work, or for any work done within such hours in excess of 48 hours in any week, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half.

(7) SPECIAL RATES-

Public Holidays.—Double time shall be the special rate payable to all persons for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Eight Hours Day (26th April), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM ATTENDANTS BOARD.

Note: (1) This Determination on the 26th May, 1931, applied to the whole of the State.

(2) On the 21st December, 1927, the powers of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board were extended to enable it to fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (not including professional employees or nurses) employed in or about a sanatorium for the treatment of persons suffering from any form of tuberculosis.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (not including professional employees or nurses) employed in or about a hospital or benevolent asylum doing any kind of work connected with the carrying on of a hospital or benevolent asylum has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 26th day of May, 1931, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

⁽³⁾ ALLOWANCES.—Persons (other than dressers) employed within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, who handle or dress patients suffering from venereal diseases or patients qualified for admission to infectious diseases hospitals, or handle clothes (not previously disinfected) that are used on or worn by such patients, or handle microscopic slides in connexion with cases of an infectious nature, shall be paid 7s. 6d. per week in addition to the rates provided in Clause 2.

⁽⁴⁾ OVERTIME.—For work done in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed as a week's work.—Time and a half, calculated on the rates fixed without board and lodging.

⁽⁵⁾ HOLIDAY RATES.—Time and a half calculated on the rates fixed without board and lodging shall be the rate for all work done within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, on the following holidays:—New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day, Anzac Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of these holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

- (6) Annual Leave.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted by such employer the following leave at least in each year on full pay—
 - (a) If employed within a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, seven days.
 (b) If employed outside a radius of 20 miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, fourteen days.

Provided that any employee outside the radius mentioned who prior to this Determination coming into force and in his present employment received more than one week's leave per year shall be entitled to fourteen days' leave plus the number of days in excess of one week which he formerly received.

- (7) SIGE LEAVE.—Any employee who furnishes to the Board of Management of the institution or the proprietor of the hospital where he or she is employed satisfactory evidence that he or she is unable to perform his or her duties on account of illness contracted in the discharge of such duties shall, while incapacitated, he entitled to sick leave on full pay for a period not exceeding four weeks.
- (8) A FULL WEEK'S WAGES TO BE PAID.—Any employee (other than a casual worker) willing to work who is employed by a public institution and who works for less than the full working week, viz., 44 hours in the case of seamstresses and 48 hours in all other cases, shall be entitled to the payment of a full week's wage.
- (9) Dressing Rooms, etc.—Dressing rooms, and lunch rooms, shall be provided for non-resident employees and suitable healthy accommodation for resident employees.
- (10) Uniforms, etc.-Uniforms, overalls, caps, and aprons, shall be provided and laundered free of cost for employees required to
- (11) Rubber Gloves, erc.—Rubber gloves and all necessary safety appliances shall be provided free of cost for the use of employees, and an adequate supply of same shall be maintained.
- (12) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee, and any employee failing to give such notice shall be liable to forfeit one week's pay in lieu thereof.
- (13) UNION INTERVIEWS.—During working hours employees of any Public institution subject to this Determination may, with the consent of the Secretary or Superintendent of such institution (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld) be interviewed by the Secretary of the Hospital, Dispensary, and Asylum Employees and Allied Government Officers' Federation of Australia, No. 1 Victorian Branch, or have their union contributions collected by the steward of the said organization.
