IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VII. of the *Public Service Act 1928*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

LEVEE AT PARLIAMENT HOUSE, MELBOURNE.

IN honour of the birthday of His Majesty King George V., His Excellency the Governor (Lord Somers) will hold a Levee at Parliament House, Spring-street, Melbourne, at a quarter to One p.m. on Wednesday, 3rd June, 1931.

Private entree cards will admit recipients to the south door of the Spring-street entrance at Parliament House at half-past Twelve p.m. All others will enter by the north door of the Spring-street entrance at a quarter to One p.m.

On the occasion of this celebration of the King's birthday, His Excellency is especially anxious to receive as many citizens as possible at this, his last, Levee prior to the completion of his term of office as Governor of Victoria, and will therefore be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in their ordinary morning or business dress.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card, on which should be printed, typed, or written in clear handwriting, their names, in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DEFINE THE MOUTH OF DAWHLS RIVER, AND TO PROHIBIT NETTING IN PORTION OF THE NORTH ARM OF MALLACOOTA INLET, ETC.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of the first publication of this notice in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation—(a) defining the mouth of the Dawhls River as an imaginary line running between the two banks of the said river where such river joins the north arm of Mallacoota Inlet; (b) prohibiting during the whole of each year the use of trammels, trawls, and other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing in the north arm of Mallacoota Inlet within or inside an imaginary line running in a south-easterly direction to the opposite shore of the north arm from a fishing boundary post situated on the northern bank of the north arm, approximately one quarter of a mile in a south-westerly direction from the mouth of the Dawhls River; and (c) providing that during the whole of each year trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, whether fixed or unfixed, to be employed in fishing, or any boats having attached thereto or on board or in tow any trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines, shall not be left or allowed to remain in or upon any portion of Dawhls River, Harrison's Creek, or the portion of the north arm in which the use of fishing nets is prohibited.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY, AND RESCISSION AND RE-MAKING OF REGULATION OF SHOPS FOR THE SALE OF FRESH UNCOOKED MEAT WITHIN THE FRANKSTON, MOUNT ELIZA, AND SEAFORD RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF FRANKSTON AND HASTINGS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, upon a petition signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers (exclusive of hawkers and peddlers) keeping shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat within the Frankston, Mount Eliza, and Seaford Ridings of the Municipal District of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings (the said Ridings being formerly known as the North Riding of the said Municipal District) of the particular class to be affected, doth hereby—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR SUPPLY OF GRAVEL IN THE PARISH OF CARISBROOK, SHIRE OF TULLAROOP.

THE Council of the Shire of Tullaroop, being the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 21st January, 1931, as notified in the *Government Gazette* on the twenty-eighth day of January, 1931, as a site for the Supply of Gravel, in the Parish of Carisbrook, Shire of Tullaroop, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, and other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing in the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all the power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.
7. No person shall drive or bring any carriage or vehicle of whatsoever nature into the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
9. No person shall remove any stone, earth, marl, or gravel from the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld, but shall be conditional on the payment to the Committee of such fees as the Committee may from time to time direct for the removal of any stone, earth, marl, or gravel aforesaid. Such fees shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per cubic yard of stone, earth, marl, or gravel removed. Before granting such permission, the Committee may require from any person requesting such permission a deposit of any sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of guarantee for the care in removal of stone, earth, marl, or gravel as aforesaid, and for the due payment of the fees for removal of such stone, earth, marl, or gravel. All fees collected by the Committee of Management, under or by virtue of this paragraph, shall be paid by the said Committee into the Consolidated Revenue of the State of Victoria, and a certified return thereof furnished to the Board of Land and Works at the end of each half-year.
10. In order to prevent the spread of noxious weeds within the Shire of Tullaroop and the Borough of Maryborough, no person shall, notwithstanding anything in these Regulations, remove earth, stone, marl, or gravel containing the roots, corns, bulbs, or seed of any declared noxious weed, from the Reserve without first obtaining permission, in writing, from the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be

forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice, to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of the Council of the Shire of Tullaroop as a Committee of Management.

DETERMINATION OF THE SLATERS AND TILERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons whosoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a slater, roof-tiler, ridger, shingler, or cement tiler (other than a tiler laying verandah or flooring tiles)" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 9th June, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
