Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

### DETERMINATION OF THE CHAFF-CUTTERS BOARD.

Norg.-(a) This Determination on the 5th June, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(b) When the Order in Council appointing this Board was passed, the words printed below in italics were not included.

The Governor in Council, by order dated 3rd August, 1921, added to the Board's powers, and for convenience of reference these powers are printed in this form.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

(a) employed in the process, trade, or business of chaff-cutting, corn-crushing, or compressing fodder; or in the trade of corn cleaning or corn grading;

(b) employed in carting or driving in carting or driving in connexion with the trade or business of chaff-cutting, corn crushing, or compressing fodder,"

has made the following Determination, namely :--

(1) That on the 5th day of June, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.
