Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE BRICKLAYERS BOARD.

Note .-- (1) This Determination on the 12th June, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

(2) On the 7th July, 1926, the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed laying or fixing faience or majolica on floors, walls, or ceilings, was taken from the Tilelayers Board and conferred exclusively on the Bricklayers Board.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than labourers) wheresoever employed in the process, trade, or business of a bricklayer" has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 12th June, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

⁽³⁾ ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances shall be paid to persons employed on work away from their employers' place of business

(1) The fares, exceeding 4d. per day, necessarily expended in going from and to the employee's residence to and from his work.

(2) For work done at a distance from the employer's place of business if the employee is unable to return to his home the same night :-

6s. per day for the first seven days, and thereafter 30s. per week extra.
