#### DETERMINATION OF THE WICKER BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 1st July, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1923 (No. 3677), the Wages Board which now has power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any goods made of bamboo, wicker, reed tex, or any substitute therefor, or employed in preparing or manufacturing reed tox, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of July, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

#### (4) OVERTIME .-

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), and Boxing Day; and double time shall be the rate for all work done on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), and Christmas Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the Special Rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

#### PIECE-WORK RATES.

- 6. (a) The lowest piece work price payable to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following schedules shall be the price fixed by such schedules in respect of such article.
  - (b) Where the material is not stated in the schedules the article may be made of willow or cane.
- (c) Any piece-worker who works more than 48 hours in any week shall for such extra time be paid 5½d. per hour in addition to his piece-work carnings.

#### COUNTRY BREAD BOARD.

Note.—This Determination, on the 6th July, 1931, applied to the whole of the State Outside and Excepting the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined by the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677) and the Order in Council thereunder; and such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; the township of Kangaroo Flat, in the shires of Marong and of Strathfieldsaye; the township of Spring Gully, in the shire of Strathfieldsaye; and such portions of the shire of South Barwon and of the Moorpanyal Riding of the shire of Corio as are within a radius of five miles of the Geelong Post Office.

#### IN THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

N the matter of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677),

In the matter of an Appeal by the representatives of the employers on the Country Bread Board against the Determination of the said Board, dated the 23th October, 1930.

Wednesday, the 24th day of June, 1931.

(Before His Honour Mr. Justice Lowe, Mr. Francis James Kyle, and Mr. Frederick Mills Hunt.)

The above-mentioned Appeal, coming on for hearing by this Court on the 27th, 28th, and 29th May, 1931, and this day. Upon Reading the Appeal, and Upon Hearing what was alleged by Dr. A. D. Ellis, of Counsel, and witnesses for the employers, and by Mr. George Hayes, of the Operative Bakers Union, and witnesses for the employees: This Court doth Order and Determine:—

(1) That on the 6th day of July, 1931, the Determination of the Country Bread Board, dated the 28th October, 1930, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination "as to the lowest prices or rates of payment for breadmaking or baking."

#### (3) OVERTIME-

- (a) That any employee (other than an apprentice) who works in any week for any time in excess of 44 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.(b) That any apprentice who works in any week for any time in excess of 44 hours shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours, and thereafter at the rate of double time.
- (4) WEEKLY HOURS.—That the number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 44.
- (5) TIME RATE.—That any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid for each hour worked up to 22 hours, at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of thirty-three per centum.
- (6) Special Rates.—That time and a half shall be the rate payable for all work done on New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, 21st April (Eight Hours Day), 3rd June (King's Birthday), Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.
- (8) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

#### DETERMINATION OF THE FIBROUS PLASTERERS BOARD.

Note.—This Determination on the 1st July, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria.

In accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677), the Wages Board appointed "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of—

- (a) Manufacturing fibrous plaster, or making architectural ornaments of fibrous plaster, plaster, or cement;
- (b) Fixing or finishing fibrous plaster on walls or ceilings of buildings;(c) Architectural modelling,"

has made the following Determination, namely:--

  - (a) For work done at such distance as prevents the employee from returning to his home the same night—6s. 6d. per day extra, with a maximum of 35s. 9d. per week.
  - (b) For any other work—

    An amount equal to the fare, by the most economical means of travel, from and to the "centre" to and from the place of employment.

    "Centre" shall mean the Flinders-street Railway Station if the employer's factory is within a radius of 10 miles therefrom, and shall, in all other cases, mean the employer's factory.
  - (4) Time of Beginning and Ending Work.—The time of beginning and ending work shall be—

If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

Note.—The right to be paid ordinary rates for holidays upon which no work is done shall be forfeited by any employee who wilfully absents himself from his employment on the working day immediately proceding or following the holiday in question.

(7) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—All payments of wages shall be made not later than five minutes after the time of ceasing work on Friday. In the event of payment being made more than five minutes later than the time fixed above, the employee shall be paid all reasonable travelling expenses incurred and shall also receive payment at the prescribed rate for the time lost as a result of such delay in payment.

(8) PAYMENT WHEN ENGAGED BUT NOT EMPLOYED.—Any employee whose services are not required after he has presented himself for work as directed by the employer or his responsible representative shall be paid the sum of five shillings in addition to any expense necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job.

(9) Transport at Night.—Any employee who completes his work during the night after trams and other, public conveyances have ceased to run shall, unless provided with means of transport by the employer, be reimbursed for any expense necessarily incurred in reaching his home.

(10) Meal Money.—Any employee who is required to work overtime for more than two hours on any day and who has not been notified on the previous day that he would be required to work such overtime shall, unless provided with a reasonable meal by the employer, be paid an allowance of Two shillings.
