## DETERMINATION OF THE WICKER BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination on the 1st July, 1931, applied to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928* (No. 3677), the Wages Board which now has power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any goods made of bamboo, wicker, reed tex, or any substitute therefor, or employed in preparing or manufacturing reed tex, has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 1st day of July, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

Provided that no person shall be employed working overtime at less than 9d. per hour.

(5) SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the rate for all work done on New Year's Day, Foundation Day (26th January), and Boxing Day; and double time shall be the rate for all work done on Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours Day (21st April), and Christmas Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the Special Rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

## PIECE-WORK RATES.

6. (a) The lowest piece-work price payable to any person for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing any article of the description referred to in the following schedules shall be the price fixed by such schedules in respect of such article.

(b) Where the material is not stated in the schedules the article may be made of willow or cane.

(c) Any piece-worker who works more than 48 hours in any week shall for such extra time be paid 5½d. per hour in addition to his piece-work earnings.

(3) ALLOWANCES.—The following allowances shall be paid to persons employed outside the employer's factory in connexion with the fixing or finishing of fibrous plaster:—

(a) For work done at such distance as prevents the employee from returning to his home the same night—

6s. 6d. per day extra, with a maximum of 35s. 9d. per week.

(b) For any other work—

An amount equal to the fare, by the most economical means of travel, from and to the "centre" to and from the place of employment.

"Centre" shall mean the Flinders-street Railway Station if the employer's factory is within a radius of 10 miles therefrom, and shall, in all other cases, mean the employer's factory.

If any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays the special rate shall only be payable for work done on the day so substituted.

NOTE.—The right to be paid ordinary rates for holidays upon which no work is done shall be forfeited by any employee who wilfully absents himself from his employment on the working day immediately preceding or following the holiday in question.

(7) PAYMENT OF WAGES.—All payments of wages shall be made not later than five minutes after the time of ceasing work on Friday. In the event of payment being made more than five minutes later than the time fixed above, the employee shall be paid all reasonable travelling expenses incurred and shall also receive payment at the prescribed rate for the time lost as a result of such delay in payment.

(8) PAYMENT WHEN ENGAGED BUT NOT EMPLOYED.—Any employee whose services are not required after he has presented himself for work as directed by the employer or his responsible representative shall be paid the sum of five shillings in addition to any expense necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job.

(9) TRANSPORT AT NIGHT.—Any employee who completes his work during the night after trams and other public conveyances have ceased to run shall, unless provided with means of transport by the employer, be reimbursed for any expense necessarily incurred in reaching his home.

(10) MEAL MONEY.—Any employee who is required to work overtime for more than two hours on any day and who has not been notified on the previous day that he would be required to work such overtime shall, unless provided with a reasonable meal by the employer, be paid an allowance of Two shillings.
