ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the Income Tax Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person whose income for the twelve months 1st July, 1930, to the 30th June, 1931, consisted of salary, wages, allowances, pension, superannuation, or retiring allowance, stipend, rents, interest, dividends, or annuity, and whose gross income within the meaning of the Income Tax Acts amounted to £50 or upwards, and every other person or company liable to make any return under the said Act or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me, in the prescribed form, such return on or before the 31st day of August, 1931.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is, under the said Acts, liable to be prosecuted, and to pay a penalty of not more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

THE PORT PHILLIP PILOT SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1928*, the Pilot Superannuation Board, with the approval of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendment of the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund Regulations 1929 (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations shall be read and construed as one with Regulations relating to the Port Phillip Pilot Sick and Superannuation Fund 1929, made by the Board on the 6th day of May, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 14th day of May, 1930 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations"), and shall take effect on and after the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, on which date Regulations numbered 4 and 5 of the principal Regulations shall be repealed.

4. *Sea and Harbour Pilots with Less than Ten Years' Service.*—A sea or harbour pilot who has not completed ten years' service as a duly licensed pilot shall not be entitled to a pension from the fund, nor shall his widow or child, or children, be entitled on his death to any benefit therefrom: Provided, however, that where any such sea or harbour pilot dies before completing ten years' service, or is so disabled by sickness or accident as to necessitate his retirement from the Pilot Service before he has served for the said term of ten years, there shall be paid to him, or his executors or administrators, for the benefit of his widow and child, or children, from the fund, a gratuity of such amount as shall be determined in accordance with the next succeeding Regulation.

5. *Determination of Amount of Gratuities to Sea and Harbour Pilots.*—The Secretary to the Board shall, at the end of every month, record in a book to be kept for the purpose, the amounts which for that month have been contributed to the fund from the earnings of sea and harbour pilots respectively, and shall divide such amounts by the number of pilots for the time being constituting the full complement of licensed pilots in each service, and the sum so ascertained shall be recorded as aforesaid, and shall represent the proportion which for that month is deemed to have been contributed by each pilot. The total amount of gratuity payable to any pilot, or his executors or administrators, under the last preceding Regulation, shall be the sum of the amounts recorded as being contributed for every completed calendar month of his service as a pilot.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Pilot Superannuation Board, held this 16th day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

*Health Act 1928.***GENERAL SANITARY REGULATIONS, 1931.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of August, 1931.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* (No. 3697) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "General Sanitary Regulations 1931," and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be divided into parts, as follows:—

Part I.—Introductory.

Part II.—Closets, cesspools, urinals, public sanitary conveniences, and disposal of nightsoil.

Part III.—Storage, collection, removal, and disposal of refuse.

Part IV.—General and supplementary.

PART I.—INTRODUCTORY.

REPEAL.

2. The General Sanitary Regulations 1925 are hereby repealed.

APPLICATION.

3. Except as otherwise provided herein, these Regulations shall have application throughout the State.

INTERPRETATION.

4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Approved" means approved in writing by the Commission or the Council, as the case may be.

"Cattle" means and includes horse, mare, gelding, rig, colt, filly, ass, mule, bullock, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, ram, ewe, wether, lamb, goat, kid, and pig of any kind.

"Closet" means any structure whatsoever used for the purpose of or in relation to defecation not connected with the sewers of a sewerage authority, or an approved septic tank system, and includes a cesspool-closet.

"Contractor" means the person who has contracted with a Council or with any person to collect, remove, and dispose of nightsoil and/or refuse.

"Council" means Council of a municipality.

"Depot" means any land, place, or premises used for or in relation to the treatment or disposal of nightsoil.

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

"Nightsoil" includes all human excrementitious or faecal matter and human urine.

"Pan" means any removable receptacle in a closet used for the reception of nightsoil, whether chemical substances are placed therein or not.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by or under the *Health Act 1928*.

"Premises" includes messuages, buildings, land, and hereditaments of every tenure; and also any machinery, plant, appliance, or vehicle used in connexion with any trade carried on at any premises.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes, (except nightsoil and sewage) produced or accumulated in or about any premises.

"Sewerage authority" means any sewerage authority within the meaning of the *Sewerage Districts Act 1928*, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust.

"Source of water supply" includes river, creek, stream, water-course, lake, lagoon, swamp, marsh, spring, reservoir, or well, if the water therein or therefrom is or is likely to be used for drinking purposes by man or for domestic purposes, or for any purpose in connexion with the preparation, manufacture, or sale of food, or in connexion with a dairy farm or dairy.

"Suitable sanitary conveniences" means prescribed or specified sanitary conveniences conveniently situated, properly constructed, and sufficient in number, and, if necessary, separate sanitary conveniences for the use of each sex with approaches thereto properly separated for the sexes.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

"Tip" means any land, place, or premises (other than an incinerator or destructor) used for or in relation to the disposal of refuse.

"Trench" means an excavation in the soil suitably prepared for the proper and efficient disposal of nightsoil.

"Urinal" means any structure whatsoever used for the purposes of or in relation to urination.

PART II.—CLOSETS, CESSPOOLS, URINALS, PUBLIC SANITARY CONVENIENCES, AND DISPOSAL OF NIGHTSOIL.

CLOSETS.

5. The proprietor of every premises not connected with the sewers of a sewerage authority shall provide thereon suitable sanitary conveniences, and where any such proprietor has failed or neglected to provide such conveniences the Council shall by notice in writing require the proprietor within a time therein specified to provide same.

6. No pan-closet shall be erected or constructed on any premises except in such a position as will admit of the pan being from time to time removed from such closet and from such premises without being carried through any dwelling-house or public building, or through any building or premises in which any person is or may be employed in any manufacture, trade, or business.

Provided that if the Council is satisfied that in respect of any particular premises it is impracticable to conform with the provisions of this regulation, the Council may, consistent with the preservation of health, modify such of the requirements as the Council deems fit.

7. Every closet shall be completely air-disconnected from every room used for sleeping, living, or dining purposes; or in which any food is stored, prepared, cooked, or served; or wherein persons are or may be employed.

8. No closet shall be erected within 50 feet of any source of water supply, or within 50 feet of any building in which milk or cream is kept or stored for sale, or where cows are milked.

Provided that in the case of any particular premises where the Council is of the opinion that it is impracticable to conform with the provisions of this regulation the Council may, subject to such conditions as the Council imposes, permit the erection of a closet at a less distance than 50 feet from such source or building.

9. Every person who proposes to erect a new closet or reconstruct an existing closet on any premises in any city, town, borough, or township shall give written notice to the Council of his intention so to do, and such notice shall include the design and arrangement and the dimensions of and material to be used in the erection or alteration of such closet.

10. Every new or reconstructed pan closet shall have—

- (a) its internal dimensions, not less than 3 ft. 6 in. in width, 5 feet in length, by 7 feet in height from floor-line to wall-plate level;
- (b) weather-proof walls formed of brick, stone, concrete, or wood or other approved material, and at least two of its walls shall be exposed to the open air, and the door shall be in one of such walls except in the case where an approved air-lock is provided;
- (c) weather-proof roof formed of slates, tiles, galvanized iron, or other approved material;
- (d) a suitable door capable of being fastened from the inside when shut; Provided that the Council may in the case of any particular premises modify this requirement;
- (e) an impervious floor of brick and cement concrete, flagstone, or other approved material having its surface impervious, horizontal beneath the seat with a gradient downwards from the riser to the front wall of not less than half an inch per foot, and such floor shall be nowhere less than 3 inches above the surrounding ground level;
- (f) a space of suitable dimensions for the reception of the pan or pans and the internal surfaces of such space shall be as smooth as practicable;
- (g) a seat (covering the top of the pan space) with an ovoidal opening of suitable dimensions for an adult or child (as the case may be), and the anterior margin of such opening shall be at least 3½ inches behind the internal surface of the riser and the posterior margin at least 1 inch forward from the back of the pan rim when the pan is in position for use, and such opening shall be provided with a hinged fly-proof cover;
- (h) the pan so placed in the pan space that the upper rim thereof shall not be more than 1½ inch from the under surface of the seat;
- (i) a door giving access to the pan space for the purpose of removal of the pan either from the interior or the exterior of the closet building, and such door shall be properly fitting, hinged, and strongly made, and shall be so placed that the pan may be conveniently removed and replaced in its proper position;
- (j) the pan space under the seat fitted with guides and stops so that the pan may be easily introduced into its proper position;
- (k) the pan space flyproof (when the pan door and the cover over the opening in the seat are shut), and a flyproof air-grating situated in the lowermost part of an external wall of the pan space having a clear airway of at least 12 square inches and an upcast outlet ventilating shaft not less than 9 square inches in cross-sectional area extending beneath the soffit of the seat to above the roof; and every such outlet ventilating shaft extending vertically to such a height that the mouth of the shaft shall be at least 6 feet higher than any adjacent window, door, or other opening of any habitable or occupied room:

Provided that where the pan space has two external walls furnished with flyproof air-gratings having not less than 12 square inches of clear airway each, it shall not be necessary to provide a ventilating shaft as prescribed.

11. The proprietor of any premises upon which there is any closet which is not in accordance with the provisions of these regulations shall, when required by the Council, alter, demolish, or remove such closet and provide a closet which is in accordance therewith.

12. Every pan-closet shall be kept provided with a pan in accordance with the requirements of the Council's By-law.

13. Every person who has occasion to use any closet shall, before leaving the same, replace the cover over the seat opening, and every person who has need to open the pan door shall securely close same immediately after the need is over.

14. The Council at least once a week shall in the case of—

- (a) a double pan service cause the pan in use to be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed with its contents from the premises and a clean pan in good order to be left in its place;
- (b) a single pan service cause the contents of the pan to be transferred to the bulk receptacle provided for the purpose; the pan to be cleansed as far as practicable and an adequate quantity of disinfectant to be placed in the pan prior to replacement.

CESSPOOL-CLOSETS.

15. The Council of any shire may specify any area or areas of the municipal district within which cesspool-closets may be constructed.

16. No person shall construct a cesspool-closet in any city, town, or borough, nor in any shire except in such part or parts of the shire as may be specified by the Council.

17. Every person who proposes to construct a cesspool-closet shall notify the Council of his intention so to do and supply particulars as to design and structure.

18. The above-ground structure of every cesspool-closet shall with such modifications as may be necessary comply with the requirements prescribed in relation to pan-closets.

19. Where the cesspool of any cesspool-closet has become full, the proprietor of the premises shall—

- (a) in the case of an impervious cesspool remove or cause the contents thereof to be removed and disposed of, in such manner and in such place as the inspector directs;
- (b) in the case of a pervious cesspool fill up or cause the same to be filled up with dry loam, ashes, or such other suitable material as may be directed by the inspector.

URINALS.

20. (1) The proprietor shall in the case of any particular premises specified by the Council provide such urinal accommodation for the use of the occupants of or persons employed on such premises as the Council may require.

(2) Such accommodation shall be adequate for the purpose and sanitarily constructed, and efficient provision shall be made to the satisfaction of the Council for the disposal of the urine.

PUBLIC SANITARY CONVENIENCES

21. The Council of every city or town shall, and the Council of every borough or shire may, and (when required by the Commission) shall, provide sanitary conveniences for the accommodation of the public, and maintain same in a sanitary state.

22. Public sanitary conveniences shall be so placed and designed as to secure—

- (a) convenient access for the public;
- (b) adequate privacy for the persons using the same and for each sex where accommodation is provided for both sexes.

23. No person shall foul any portion of any public sanitary convenience nor derange or interfere with or damage any portion of the structure or fittings of any such sanitary convenience, nor waste nor remove therefrom any toilet-paper or deodorant provided therein.

24. No person except by authority of the Council shall write, paint, print, stencil, place or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign, or advertisement upon or otherwise deface the structure or fittings of any public sanitary convenience.

25. All public sanitary conveniences under the control of the Council or connected with a public building to which the public have access after dark, shall during the period of time they are open to the public be kept adequately lighted.

DISPOSAL OF NIGHTSOIL.

26. All nightsoil collected by the Council or any contractor shall be properly, efficiently, and sanitarily disposed of—

- (1) at a depot provided by the Council or a sewerage authority in accordance with the requirements of the Act and regulations; or
- (2) by means of desiccation, incineration, destructive distillation, or by treatment with absorbent substances, or chemicals, or by discharging into a sewer of a sewerage authority or by connecting with an approved septic tank system, or by any other method approved by the Commission.

27. No area of land shall be used as a depot unless—

- (1) it is protected from incursion of storm waters by means of efficient catchwater drains;
- (2) it is above flood level;
- (3) proper provision is made for the interception of drainage from the depot and for the effective disinfection or purification of such drainage before it is allowed to flow beyond the boundary of such area;
- (4) it is kept and maintained so as not to be a nuisance dangerous to health or offensive.

28. No depot shall be situated—

- (1) in the catchment area of any public or domestic water supply; or
- (2) within 880 yards of any dam or reservoir containing or any river, creek, or open channel conveying water of a public or domestic supply; or
- (3) within 440 yards of any building or place where cows are milked, the products of which are sold, or in which milk or milk products are kept or stored for sale:

Provided that where it is impracticable to secure a site for a depot complying in all respects with the requirements of this regulation the depot may be situated at such site as the Council selects subject to the approval of the Commission, and such approval may be given with or without such modifications or conditions as the Commission thinks fit.

29. No Council contractor or person shall—

- (1) dispose of nightsoil in land at any depot except in properly prepared trenches, and all nightsoil so disposed shall be covered with not less than 6 inches of soil on the date of deposit of such nightsoil; or
- (2) dispose of nightsoil at any depot within 50 feet of any road or street or public thoroughfare; or
- (3) again use for the disposal of nightsoil any land wherein nightsoil has been deposited until such latter nightsoil is completely nitrified and in no case within six months of the last deposit; or
- (4) use any land wherein nightsoil is deposited for the grazing or accommodation of cattle within three months from date of the last deposit of nightsoil therein; or
- (5) use any land wherein nightsoil has been deposited for growing vegetables until such nightsoil is completely nitrified, and in no case until at least six months have elapsed since the last deposit of nightsoil therein.

30. Where a pan closet is in use, but where no removal service has been provided, the proprietor of the premises shall dispose of the pan contents in such manner and in such place as the inspector directs.

31. The Council or contractor shall provide at the depot—

- (a) an adequate supply of water; and
- (b) an efficient plant for cleansing pans, apparatus, and vehicles.

PART III.—STORAGE, COLLECTION, REMOVAL, AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

TEMPORARY STORAGE OF REFUSE.

32. Unless exempted by the Council, the proprietor of every premises in every city, town, borough, and township shall provide and keep thereon a proper and suitable receptacle (or receptacles) for temporarily storing all refuse (including animal manure) produced or accumulated on such premises and which is offensive or likely to become offensive:

Provided that the Council may exempt any township from the operation of this regulation.

COLLECTION AND REMOVAL OF REFUSE.

33. The Council shall cause—

- (1) All refuse which is offensive or likely to become offensive to be collected and removed from the premises once in each week, or, in case of specified premises, at such shorter periods as are required;
- (2) All trade or other refuse which is not offensive or not likely to become offensive to be collected and removed from the premises at such periods of time as the inspector directs.

DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

34. The Council shall cause all refuse removed from any premises to be disposed of in an efficient, proper, and sanitary manner at an approved tip, incinerator, or destructor, and no person shall dispose of such refuse except at such tip, incinerator, or destructor.

35. The Council shall cause every tip to be protected against the entrance of cattle, and (where sanitarily necessary), against the incursion of storm waters by means of efficient catchwater drains.

36. No Council contractor or person shall use any tip or part of a tip for the grazing or accommodation of cattle within three months of the last deposit of refuse thereon.

37. Where any tip is in such a state as to be a nuisance or dangerous to health or offensive, the Council shall prohibit any further deposit of refuse (except clean soil or other innocuous material) at such tip, and no person shall deposit any refuse (except such as may be permitted by the Council) at such tip until the Council notifies that deposition of refuse may be resumed.

38. When a Council becomes aware that drainage or wind-blown refuse from the tip may pollute any source of water supply, such Council shall forthwith take such action as may be necessary to efficiently safeguard such source of water supply.

PART IV.—GENERAL AND SUPPLEMENTARY.

39. The Council of every municipality shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these regulations, and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as are necessary for such purposes.

40. Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done by these Regulations, shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and any person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

And the Honorable Robert Williams, His Majesty's Minister of Public Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE MONEY LENDERS ACT 1928.

WHEREAS it is provided under section 7 of the *Money Lenders Act 1928* (No. 3740) that the Governor in Council may make regulations respecting the registration of money lenders (including the prescribing of the conditions for registration and the grounds on which they may be removed from the register) whether individuals, firms, societies, or companies, the form of the register, and the particulars to be entered therein, and the fees to be paid on registration and renewal of registration not exceeding Five pounds for each registration or renewal, and respecting the inspection of the register and the fees payable therefor: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the said provisions, doth make the following regulations:—

1. Application for registration or renewal of registration as a money lender under the *Money Lenders Act 1928* (No. 3740) shall be made to the Registrar-General in the form or to the effect of Schedule one to these Regulations.

2. The application shall be signed in the case of a person or persons by the person or persons desiring to be registered, or by his or her or their legal personal representative. In the case of a corporation the application may be sealed with the common seal of the corporation, or may be signed on its behalf by its proper officer.

3. Whenever any such application is received by the Registrar-General, the proper officer shall immediately endorse thereon a number, and every such application shall be numbered successively according to the order of time in which the same is received, and shall immediately be entered according to such number in the register hereinafter provided for.

4. Upon registration, the Registrar-General shall issue in respect of the same a certificate in the form or to the effect of Schedule two to these Regulations.

5. The renewal of any such registration may be made during the last month of the period for which such registration was effective, and any such renewal shall date as from the day of registration of the renewal.

6. Upon such renewal, the Registrar-General shall give a certificate of renewal or endorse the date of such renewal on the certificate of registration.

7. Upon the change in the place or places of business of an individual registered as a money lender, or upon the change of any kind in a firm, society, or company so registered, or in its place or places of business, the registration of such money lender shall cease to have effect, and shall entail a fresh registration, which must be made within one calendar month of such change.

8. There shall be kept in the office of the Registrar-General, in the form of Schedule three to these Regulations, a register in which the names of all registered money lenders shall be entered, together with the other particulars specified in the said schedule.

9. The fee to be paid in respect of each registration, or the renewal thereof, shall be the sum of Five pounds.

10. A fee of Two shillings shall be paid for the inspection of the entry in the register in respect to the record therein of each registered money lender.

11. Any person may, on the payment of a fee of Five shillings, obtain a certified copy of any entry in such register.

12. The grounds on which the name of any money lender may be removed from the register shall be the conviction for any offence against the provisions of the *Money Lenders Act 1928*, or for any indictable or infamous offence. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, of any such conviction, the registration of such money lender shall, if the Governor in Council so direct, cease to have effect, and his name shall be removed from the register, and a notification of such removal shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

13. Any registered money lender ceasing to carry on business as a money lender may have his name removed from the register by giving notice, in writing, to the Registrar-General.

The Reserve shall be open to the Public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, excepting on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for horse-racing, fêtes, cricket or football matches, sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling and sixpence may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve, and a further sum, not exceeding Five shillings, may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult on those days on which the Reserve is set apart for horse-racing.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted thereon without permission of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind thereon.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle.

For the purposes of this clause, "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any structure nor any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths, or any structure or erection in the Reserve.

11. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission of the Committee of Management, in writing, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

12. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasions of any fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

14. No persons, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

This Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force, and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under the *Local Government Act*, and numbered 275, for the purpose of fixing fees for persons using, and the management of the Tennis Courts provided by the Council in Albert Park.

Night Tennis—For casual players, 6d. per set of twenty minutes' play; minimum charge for use of Court, 2s.; use of Court per hour, 6s.; use of Court per night of three hours, 7.30 p.m. to 10.30 p.m., £1.

4. Only such persons appointed by the Council for the purpose are authorized to issue tickets and collect payment from all persons using the Courts.

5. All players using the Courts must exhibit their tickets at any time when requested to do so by the person supervising the Courts or by any officer or employee of the council or Albert Park Committee, and players unable to produce such tickets must pay the fee prescribed.

6. Players, upon arrival, must register their names upon the notice board at the Courts, under the direction of the person supervising the Courts on behalf of the Council.

7. The right to play shall be in the order of registration on the board, under the direction of the person supervising the Courts on behalf of the council.

8. Should other players be waiting to play on the Courts in their turn, the players using the Courts must make way for them at the conclusion of the set then being played.

9. Tennis shoes must be worn by all persons using the Courts.

10. Onlookers must not trespass on the Courts nor interfere with persons playing on the Courts.

11. That no person or player shall enter or remain on the Courts whilst in a state of intoxication.

12. That no persons or player shall behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, or offensive manner or use any indecent or offensive language on the Courts.

13. That no persons or player shall carelessly or negligently break or improperly interfere with any portion of the Courts or appurtenances thereof.

14. That no person or player shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any person employed at the Courts.

15. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the Council may refuse admission to the Courts to any person.

16. The Council reserves to itself the right of closing the Courts for repairs or other purposes without incurring any liability to any person.

No person shall use any profane or indecent language, or language calculated to promote a breach of the peace, within the area of the tip, or within the hearing of any person engaged on the tip, and shall not interfere in any way with the Council's employees engaged on or in connexion with the tip.

Every person committing a breach of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677).

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 4 (BUTCHERS, COUNTRY).

NOTE.—(a) This Determination on the 15th August, 1931, applied to the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, as defined in the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)* and the Order in Council thereunder; such portion of the city of Sandringham as is not included within the said District: the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol; and the Moorpanyal and Peak Ridings of the Shire of Corio.

(b) On the 16th day of March, 1914, the power given to the Country Shop Assistants Board to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in or in connexion with a butcher's shop as a shop assistant, packer, storeman, or carter," was conferred exclusively on this Board.

IN accordance with the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928 (No. 3677)*, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of meat, or maker or seller of small goods," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That on the 15th August, 1931, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.—

Any of the above times may be varied by mutual consent, but in no case shall the total spread of hours be increased.

(4) OVERTIME.—The following rate shall be paid for all work done:—

- (a) Outside the hours fixed in Clause 3 } Time and a half.
 (b) Within the hours fixed in Clause 3 in excess of 48 hours in any week }

(5) MEAL INTERVALS.—(a) One hour shall be allowed for a meal between noon and 2 p.m.

- (b) Where an employee is required to commence duty before 7.30 a.m., one hour shall be allowed for breakfast.

(6) PAYMENT FOR HOLIDAYS.—All employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Foundation Day, Eight Hours Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, King's Birthday, Anzac Day, and one Picnic Day in each year.

(7) ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted six days' holiday in each year on full pay.

(8) SICK LEAVE.—All employees necessarily absent on account of sickness shall be allowed six days' sick leave each year on full pay providing satisfactory evidence is produced to the management or employer within 24 hours of the usual hour for commencing work.

(9) TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.—Except in a case where an employee is inefficient or has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker.

(10) SPECIAL RATES.—Double time shall be the rate payable for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, 26th January (Foundation Day), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, or Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.
